

Hondo Valley Burgler Convicted

The office of District Attorney Scot Key announced on Monday that Esmeregildo (Ese) Almager was convicted on 11 counts related to the home invasion of Alice Warder Seely and David Hall in the Hondo Valley. The crimes occurred just two days before Christmas on December 23, 2006.

27-year-old Almager and his 17-year-old girlfriend entered the Hall-Seely residence sometime around 3:00 a.m. while the occupants were asleep. Almager was armed with a .223 caliber

rifle and a .357 caliber revolver.

According to the D.A.'s press release and courtroom testimony, Hall was awakened by his dogs during the night and as he left his bedroom to let the dogs out he was met by a shadowy figure in the dark who shouted obscenities at Hall and said he was going to kill him.

Four shots were fired by Almager in the couple's dining room, hallway and bedroom. Hall testified that he was able to escape through a bathroom window to go for help but Seely, who had been sleeping in another part of

the house, was accosted by the intruders as she came into the dining room to see what the commotion was. Having awakened abruptly and seeing yellow smoke from the gunfire, Seely said that she initially thought there was a fire in the house.

Seely, a well-known jewelry designer and sculptor, was ordered at gunpoint by Almager to open the family's safe, which was located in a studio room. Seely and Hall own and operate a jewelry business and the Hondo Iris Farm, with a retail shop in Hondo and a manufacturing shop nearby in the Hondo

Valley.

After emptying the contents of the safe, Almager struck Seely on the head with the butt of the revolver and the two burglars fled the residence with several thousand dollars in cash and much of Seely's personal jewelry collection.

Hall testified that the car used by Almager and his girlfriend was the same vehicle that he had helped a former employee purchase. He testified that he and Seely were quite familiar with the car because they had loaned money to Linda Culures to buy it. Culures is the mother

of Almager's girlfriend who was a coconspirator in the crime.

Several hours after the incident in the Valley, Almager and three others, including the minor girlfriend, went on

a shopping spree purchasing clothing at the Bealls store in Ruidoso for which Almager paid with \$100 bills. The four then went to a room on the second floor of the Super 8 Motel nearby where they were discovered by police.

The Ruidoso Police Special Response Team assisted the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department in evacuating the

C'zozo Chamber Talks Economic Development

The Carrizozo Chamber of Commerce met on Tuesday, February 12th, and the meeting kicked off with discussion of economic development.

Carrizozo town trustee Dennis Dunnum briefed the members on what to expect from a meeting scheduled for 2:00 p.m. on Friday at Wells Fargo Bank.

Dunnum said he had heard that some townspeople had the impression that the meeting was some kind of a "secret meeting" of town officials, and explained that Friday's meeting was simply an opportunity for interested parties to ask questions of Kathie McCormick of the New Mexico Economic Development Department (NMEDD).

The confusion about the meeting may have stemmed from language on flyers and emails that indicated the meeting was called by the town government, which would require a proclamation or resolution approving such a meeting in advance.

Dunnum said that the NMEDD has a program through which it certifies communities before placing them on a list of those actively seeking economic development and new industry. The NMEDD then attempts to assist those communities through a program called the Certified Communities Initiative, Dunnum said.

The application for participation in the program is lengthy. "It's a fairly rigorous process," Dunnum said. The application is used to help in

defining the community, its assets and business environment, to businesses and industries considering setting up shop in New Mexico. "Right now, we're not on anybody's list," Dunnum said.

It was reported that several town officials attempted to get Carrizozo on the Certified Communities list many years ago, but achieved no tangible results.

County commissioner Lichen Lovelace, a former Carrizozo town council member, said that state economic development representatives are stretched too thin and can be unavailable when they are really needed. "It's a slow, slow process and eventually you just give up," she said. She also pointed out that it takes more than one person to see the process through.

Dunnum suggested that making the certified communities list should be a community wide endeavor involving the businesses, schools and citizenry in a concerted effort. "They want every aspect of the community so that, when they present a town to a prospective

Capitan Finances Are In Great Shape

The Capitan Village Council heard a report on the audit of the village's financial records during Tuesday night's regular council meeting and, according to auditor Thad Porch, village finances are in great shape.

"When I first started coming down here, six years ago or so, we had a lot of findings," Porch said. He told the Capitan Trustees that at one point a few years ago the village's audit resulted in 25 findings, which he said was probably a record number. "This year we have cleared all of those findings. We have none left," Porch said. He added that the opinion on the audit for the 2006-2007 fiscal year is unqualified, which he said is as good as it gets. "Qualified means we couldn't quite figure you guys out; disclaimer means we couldn't figure you out and are unwilling to give an opinion; and unqualified means we have no reservations at all," Porch explained.

The auditor reported that the village had assets of \$1,519,738 as of June 30, 2007, and \$270,000 in liabilities. "So you can cover your liabilities many, many times over," Porch said, "and that's a great position to be in. That's a healthy position to be in."

Porch explained that findings are accountants' way of saying that there is a problem inside the government. Findings result when there are

problems associated with internal controls, when something has been done that should not have been done or when things should have been done differently. Porch said. He told the trustees that the village's audit for the 2005-2006 fiscal year resulted in three findings: the investment policy was not complete, some communications with the state auditor were not complete, and infrastructure additions and capital assets were not being sufficiently tracked. "All three of those findings were resolved in the current year," Porch said. "It means the people who are in charge of the accounting process and internal controls said okay, the auditor found some problems, let's fix it."

Although the long list of findings from earlier audits have been cleared up, the village's most recent audit does have three. The new findings, Porch said, are the result of changes in laws and policies at the federal level.

Porch said that government agencies and auditing firms are looking very closely at disaster recovery plans since the attacks of September 11, 2001 in New York, and especially in New Mexico since the town of Hatch lost all of its financial records and other vital data and was unable to recover it.

He said that the three findings in the latest audit reflect new policies associated with disaster recovery, and the Village of Capitan will have

to design a plan.

"We want a road map," Porch said. "If a tornado were to come through here today, how would you get back on your feet tomorrow?" he asked. He suggested that records should be kept regarding the village's hardware and software systems, the names of vendors and how they are contacted, where back up systems are stored and other critical information needed in the case of a disaster. "We'd like a coherent disaster recovery plan," he said.

Village clerk Kay Strickland reported that she has

already begun work on a plan.

Regarding the second finding, Porch said that the U.S. Accounting Standards Board decided they wanted to "sync-up" with the International Accounting Standards Board.

"They found out, to their horror, that the United States is much more lax than most countries of the world as far as internal controls go," Porch said. "So, all of a sudden, we're having to layer on all of these new controls and new standards." One of the new standards looks at whether or not the people in charge of the village's ac-

counting systems also prepare the village's financial statements, and whether or not they are qualified to do so. Porch said that historically, in New Mexico, financial statements have always been prepared by the auditing firms, not village staff, so it's a skill that people have not been required to learn.

To resolve the finding regarding financial statements, Strickland and village treasurer, Shirley Pavlovich have agreed to take some on line courses and be tested for the skills required to prepare

Lincoln County Commission Meets Tuesday

The Lincoln County Board of Commissioners will hold their regular monthly meeting on Tuesday, February 19th, at the commissioners' chambers in the Lincoln County Courthouse complex. The meeting will convene at 8:30 a.m.

A tentative agenda for the meeting includes a public hearing on the adoption of a new county subdivision ordinance. Other items scheduled are the adoption of resolutions spelling out the county's policies on committee membership and public input at committee meetings.

The county commissioners are expected to hear a request from developers of the Lincoln Hills subdivision for the final release of a bond, and mid term budget adjustments will be discussed. The Friends of Capitan, a citizens group formed to oppose exploratory drilling in the Capitan Mountains is also scheduled to address the county officials.

industry, they have some sort of commitment from a broad spectrum of the community," Dunnun said.

Friday's meeting with McCormick is open to the public, and is not an official

meeting of the Carrizozo town council. All interested parties are invited to attend.

Gail Major reported having been contacted by a man in California who made an unusual inquiry. Major said that

the man's father was originally from Carrizozo, and that the man's mother had died in Carrizozo. "The mother died while the father was away on a hunting trip, so the two boys buried their

mom in the backyard of a house here in Carrizozo," Major said. "He couldn't tell us the exact location." Major said she forwarded the man's correspondence to local historians Karen Mills and Johnson Stearns.

Chamber of commerce president Dirk Norris said that a city page has been added to the Town of Carrizozo web site; that page will publish the monthly town council agenda, and currently offers some information about the town's proposed comprehensive plan.

Another page on the web site features Chamber of Commerce meeting minutes and the organization's newsletter.

Norris reported that the number of people logging on to the web site has risen considerably, and it was suggested that the increased interest might be due to the heavily advertised Valle del Sol subdivision.

The chamber is seeking members for some of its committees, including the events committee, the membership committee and the advertising and promotions committee.

Major said that the membership committee needs to be actively attempting to contact community members to invite chamber participation.

Welda Grider reported that the bylaws committee is preparing a new version of the organization's bylaws, and that members will be asked to vote on approval of the new document in an upcoming meeting.

Norris said that the final version will be added to the chamber of commerce website.

Gallery 408 owner Warren Malkerson reported that he

and the chamber of commerce have worked out a payment plan for the organization's purchase of a painted burro. The burro, which is located on the grounds of the Caboose Visitors Center, was purchased by the chamber of commerce for \$650.

A Meet the Candidates forum is scheduled for 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, February 20th, in the county commissioners' chambers at the Lincoln County Courthouse complex. Dean Lollar will moderate the forum which will give

Carrizozo residents an opportunity to ask questions of candidates for town council positions and that of municipal judge.

Norris reported that Fran Mack is organizing a summer concert series to bring live music to Carrizozo once or twice each month during the summer. Norris said that Mack has received a tentative agreement from the New Mexico National Guard Brass Band to play on Sunday, June 22nd.

Concerts will likely take place at Spencer Park and will be free to the public.

Disposing of Hot Ashes

Recently a Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority (LCSWA) truck was on fire with smoke billowing out of the end. The truck was near the Ruidoso Downs Race Track area on Highway 70.

In the solid waste business, he was driving "a hot load," at risk for an explosion, injury, or worse, not to say the dangerous exposure to nearby traffic. Thankfully, a quick response by Ruidoso Downs Fire Department engine #1 and crew to the LCSWA yard, and the fire was extinguished, the solid waste truck readied for reuse following a thorough OSHA lockdown safety inspection. A possible catastrophe was averted.

Fires such as this one are caused by hot ashes from fireplaces and wood stoves being dumped in public trash containers. For the sake of public safety these ashes should be disposed of properly.

More than once a year, fires break out in solid waste trucks, in public and commercial trash containers across Lincoln County. As recently as January 24th, for example, the Cedar Creek household trash compactor was briefly on fire, but quickly extinguished thanks

to a call from an alert, helpful local citizen.

Such fires place solid waste workers at risk as well as firefighters and public safety officers and the general public who can unknowingly continue to use the trash container despite a fire in the making.

What is the proper disposal method for disposal of wood ashes from fireplaces and stoves? Some waste disposal sites have small (cubic yard and-a-half) wood ash dumpsters that may be used. In most locations, however, the homeowner or visitor is responsible for proper disposal and should use water to ensure that ashes are cold and dead.

The household trash and trash dumpster or compactor should never be the place for ashes, hot or cold. Cold, dead ashes make an excellent organic fertilizer for shrubs and trees (a good source of modest amounts of phosphorus and potassium) when applied in reasonable amounts out at the plant's drip line.

motel and apprehending Almager's companions as they attempted to flee the scene.
Almager was arrested after a stand off that reportedly lasted for a few hours after Almager locked himself in the motel room. While in the room, Almager attempted to burn an undetermined amount of cash and stashed about \$3,500 in a fan vent. He placed the 357 revolver in the motel room's safe and broke the key off in the lock mechanism.
According to the District Attorney's office, the cooperation between law enforcement agencies resulted in a speedy and safe resolution to the potentially lethal situation.
Almager's trial took place over five days last week at the Lincoln County Courthouse in Carrizozo. After less than two hours of deliberation, the jury convicted Almager of aggravated burglary, larceny over \$20,000, aggravated battery, conspiracy, tampering with evidence, two counts of aggravated assault, two counts of a felon in possession of a firearm, resisting an officer and criminal damage. With two prior felony convictions, Almager faces maximum sentencing of 73 years. A sentencing date has not yet been determined. None of the jewelry and other personal items stolen in the heist have been recovered.

those statements:
"If they can pass those classes and get that certificate, I'll know they have the skills," Porch said. "It will not change the fact that we prepare those financial statements, but it will say that they have the ability to do it."
The third finding, Porch said, was related to the accounting procedures associated with a loan for a new fire truck.
In other village council business, the trustees heard a request from David Hughes, of Plateau Telecommunications, to erect a cell phone tower on village property. The property, about one fifth of an acre, is the site of the village's communications repeater that enables the two way communication system used by village employees and the Capitan police and fire departments.
Hughes proposed that, if approved, the cell tower could also be used to improve the village communications system by expanding the coverage area.
The mono-pole tower, which Hughes equated to a large light pole, would be 120 feet tall and would not require guy wires. The proposal includes the construction of a 12-foot square building to house equipment.
Hughes said that Plateau Telecommunications would install the tower, allow the village to use it for official communications, and would pay the village \$1,200 annually for lease of the land. Plateau would also cover the cost of maintaining and insuring the tower.
The trustees made no decision in response to Hughes' proposal, saying they wanted a little time to look into the proposal.
They did approve the hiring of Jackie Raines as a new village police officer. Raines is a resident of Capitan and a former Sergeant of the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department.

WEATHER REPORT

There is a high pressure system moving from Alaska and the Arctic Circle southward, and hopefully somewhere near the north side of Arizona it will make an easterly move, bringing in some much needed rain and snow to Lincoln County.

Friday and Saturday it will be quite a bit colder than it has been being, but from all forecasts it is supposed to be the trigger for the rain and snow showers.

On Sunday the high pressure system will move out eastward, taking the colder temperatures and moisture with it, bringing the temperatures for the early part of next week back up to the high 50s and low 60s during the day and nighttime temperatures into the mid to high 20s.

Ski Apache is open and doing VERY limited business. Current snow conditions are considered primary: hard packed, secondary: machine groomed.

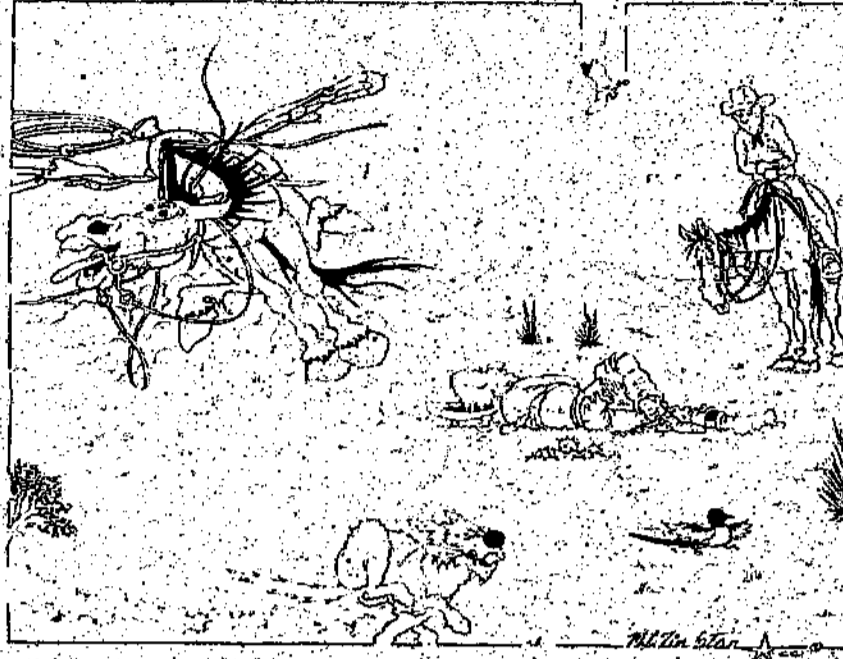

SANTA FE -- When does a New Mexico governor's authority end and a lieutenant governor's begin? In many cases, we don't know. Some clarification not only would be nice, it might be crucial some day.

Attorney General Gary King has issued an opinion stating that Lt. Gov. Diane Denish's acceptance of bills from the Legislature was valid because nothing in state law prohibits the lieutenant governor from accepting legislation on behalf of the governor.

Obviously that means nothing in state law gives her that authority either, which is the argument of the governor's office. So why did King take Denish's side?

The attorney general ruled that the governor's constitutional veto power is an executive encroachment on the legislative function, an exception to the doctrine of separation of powers and, as such, it must be strictly construed.

King cited a 1979 attorney general's opinion as precedent for his opinion. That doesn't carry as much weight as a supreme court opinion but it still puts the attorney general on firm legal ground.

There has been some bad blood between Richardson and the King family since soon after Richardson arrived in the state 30 years ago, but King can defend himself on this position.

Attorney General King also said that it is unclear whether the state constitution requires the governor to keep his offices open

or otherwise make himself available at all times during a legislative session to accept bills presented by the Legislature.

However, King noted, a U.S. Supreme Court decision directs that a governor cannot intentionally evade a legislature's attempt to present a bill to delay the time of presentation and his constitutional duty to act.

Some legislative leaders contend that is exactly what Richardson was trying to do. But James Jimenez, the governor's chief of staff contends that some senators told his staff they would be going home for the evening, so the staff believed it would be all right for them to knock off also.

But the governor's staff did not wait for either legislative house to recess for the evening and Legislative Council Service director Paula Tackett informed the attorney general that the legislative staff had notified the governor's staff that bills would be presented to them Saturday afternoon or evening.

As it turns out, the Senate leaders who had misled the governor's office about quitting for the evening were playing a game with the House, saying they would go home if the House didn't immediately agree to approve its bills without change.

The House capitulated, but the Senate got caught at its own game by giving the governor's staff at least a small excuse to go home on a Saturday evening. Blogger Joe Monahan reports that Gov. Richardson was on

his way to a Lobo basketball game as all this was unfolding.

Regardless of the outcome of the present situation, some clarification of authority and responsibility between the executive and legislative branches should help resolve future conflicts before they occur.

The question of when a lieutenant governor takes over for a governor needs some clarification too. It has been hazy ever since 1971, when the lieutenant governor's office became an optional full time post.

Before that, there wasn't much doubt. Tibo Chavez, lieutenant governor under Ed Mechem in the early 1950s, summed it up best when he observed that his duties consisted of calling the governor's office from his Belen home every morning and inquiring as to the governor's health.

But full time lieutenant governors like to have something to do. Lt. Gov. Casey Luna was the supreme example. Gov. Bruce King never could keep him busy enough.

In December 1993, King was out of state when the Navajos asked for help following a severe snow storm. Luna move in to act only to learn that King's chief of staff already had called out the National Guard.

That was the last straw for Luna. A month later, he announced to run against Gov. King.

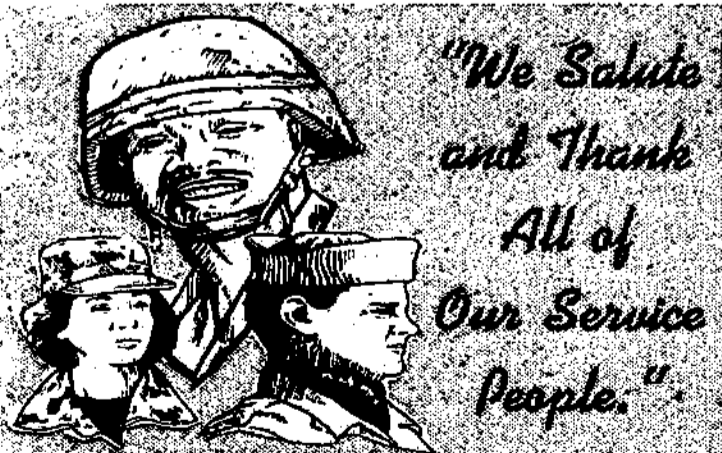

RESOLUTION AND PROCLAMATION OF HOSPITAL MILL LEVY SPECIAL ELECTION RESOLUTION NO. 2007-22

WHEREAS, the Lincoln County Medical Center, the Emergency Medical Services (EMS), and all Lincoln County health and medical clinics are integral to the health care and economic development of Lincoln County; and

WHEREAS, the New Mexico Hospital Funding Act provides a mechanism whereby a mill levy can be approved by the public for the continued maintenance and operation of the hospital and clinics; and

WHEREAS, there expires on June 30, 2008, the existing mill levy, which was approved "to operate and maintain the Lincoln County hospital and clinics... with the Lincoln County Medical Center receiving two and one-tenth (2.1) mills and the Carrizozo Health Center, Corona Health Center, and the Hondo Clinic, in the aggregate, receiving nine-tenths (.9) of a mill, for seven (7) years;" and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to continue the imposition of a mill levy amount to make funds available for purposes in addition to those approved by the 2000 levy, as follows: "to operate and maintain the Lincoln County Medical Center, Emergency Medical Services (EMS), and all Lincoln County health and medical clinics, with the Lincoln County Medical Center and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) receiving two (2.00) mills and all Lincoln County Health and Medical Clinics receiving one (1.0) mill, for eight (8) years"; and

WHEREAS, the County of Lincoln has received petitions containing 10% or more than the number of signatures required according to N.M.S.A. § 4-48B-6 (1978) to call for an election by mail

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of Lincoln County, New Mexico as follows:

SECTION 1. On the 8th day of April, 2008, there will be held in the County of Lincoln a special election for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the County of Lincoln the question of whether or not a property tax should be imposed for the purpose of operating and maintaining the Lincoln County Medical Center, the Emergency Medical Services (EMS), and all Lincoln County clinics.

SECTION 2. The Election will be conducted by all-mailed ballot in accordance with the Mail Ballot Election Act (N.M.S.A. § 1-23-1 et seq., (1978); therefore, there will be no polling places for this election.

SECTION 3. The County Clerk shall accept completed ballots until 7:00 PM on April 8th, 2008.

SECTION 4. The polling place for the receipt, counting, and tallying of the ballots in this election shall be in the County Commission Chambers in the Lincoln County Courthouse, 300 Central Avenue, Carrizozo, New Mexico, through the Office of the County Clerk.

SECTION 5. At such election, the following question shall be submitted to such qualified registered electors of the District:

LINCOLN COUNTY MEDICAL CENTER, EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES (EMS), AND ALL LINCOLN COUNTY HEALTH AND MEDICAL CLINICS MILL LEVY QUESTION.

SHALL THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF LINCOLN COUNTY BE AUTHORIZED TO IMPOSE A LEVY OF THREE HUNDREDTHS (3.00) MILLS AS PROVIDED IN THE HOSPITAL FUNDING ACT TO OPERATE AND MAINTAIN THE LINCOLN COUNTY HOSPITAL, EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES (EMS), AND ALL LINCOLN COUNTY HEALTH AND MEDICAL CLINICS? THE FUNDS FROM SAID LEVY WILL BE DIVIDED WITH THE LINCOLN COUNTY MEDICAL CENTER AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES (EMS) RECEIVING TWO (2.00) MILLS AND ALL LINCOLN COUNTY HEALTH AND MEDICAL CLINICS, RECEIVING ONE (1.0) MILL, FOR EIGHT (8) YEARS.

SECTION 6. The tax contemplated by the hospital mill levy question is authorized by the Hospital Funding Act, N.M.S.A. § 4-48B et seq., (1978) as amended and supplemented.

SECTION 7. The County's qualified electors are eligible to vote on the Election Questions. No judge or clerk of the election shall allow a person to vote unless he or she is duly registered as a voter with the County Clerk.

SECTION 8. Persons desiring to vote at the Election must be registered to vote. Any person who is otherwise qualified to vote and who is not currently registered may register at the office of the Lincoln County Clerk on or before 5:00 PM on March 11, 2008.

SECTION 9. This proclamation shall be filed with the Lincoln County Clerk after adoption by the Board of County Commissioners of Lincoln County. Thereafter, but not less than fifty (50) days before the date of the Election, the Lincoln County Clerk shall publish the proclamation once each week for three (3) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the boundaries of Lincoln County. The proclamation shall conform to the requirements of the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, (42 U.S.C. § 1973aa-6) as amended, Hospital Funding Act (Section 4-48B-1 et seq., NMSA 1978), and the Mail Ballot Election Act (Section 1-23-1 et seq., NMSA 1978).
