

Illegal Dumping Cases Facing Prosecution

The Greentree Solid Waste Authority (GWSA) heard at its April 27th meeting that three more illegal dumping cases from the Cedar Creek area near Ruidoso are under investigation by the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office. Other cases are pending from several Lincoln County locations as evidence is being collected and reviewed by the GWSA security coordinator and the sheriff's office.

GWSA operational supervisor Debra Ingle also stated in a related report that the NM Department of Transportation had delayed removal of all solid waste dumpsters in the Tinnie and Arabella area for 90 days pending construction of a new GWSA solid waste site at the

Espuela arena. But, almost as the NMDOT delay was issued, GWSA equipment and crew were dispatched to the Arabella area late last week to pick up vast amounts of overnight illegally dumped material. The additional cost of removal is assumed by other GWSA customers.

In other business, the GWSA board at its April 27th meeting:

*Waived accounts receivable or late fees on \$529.99 in county residential accounts after review by the county assessor's office.

*Reviewed plans for traffic flow changes into and out of the Alto Water and Sanitation District solid waste collection center.

*Heard the results of recent OSHA and Workers Comp inspec-

tions at both transfer stations. There were several violations regarding safety clothing and subcontractor - electrical equipment noted by inspectors. Violations were corrected the same day.

*Heard a report that the GWSA security coordinator is now providing periodic grounds cleanup at major solid waste disposal sites across the County.

*Approved a NM Environment Department grant resolution/application for the Town of Carrizozo.

*Appointed Roger Allen to the Lincoln County Recycling Committee replacing Brad Treptow who resigned in February.

*Approved a Letter of

Plant Sales Help Library Grow

The Capitan Public Library will host its annual Plant and Garden Sale this Saturday, from 8:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.

The library, directed and operated by an all volunteer workforce, has held the plant sale each spring for more than a decade as part of its fund-raising programs.

According to Pat Garrett, the library's director, somewhere between 20 and 30 library volunteers have worked to put together this year's sale, which includes plants for indoors as well as garden varieties, and a colorful collection of totems and crafty decorations for the yard and garden. The event also includes a bake sale, homemade cookies, brownies, cakes and the like, Mother's Day gift items and the book store will be open.

"We're having some really new and different craft items for sale, yard art, gifts for Mom," Garrett told The News earlier this week. "We're going to have a huge selection of succulents."

She said a lot of the library's volunteers take care of plants year round just to offer them up in the spring to support the library's plant sale. Some are started from seeds or cuttings; many come in hand decorated planters

and pots. Garrett recommended arriving early to take advantage of the large selection of garden décor, plants and baked goods that will be available on Saturday.

The Capitan Public Library is located at 101 East 2nd Avenue, at the corner of Lincoln and 2nd.

Forest Biomass is Being Considered for Energy Use

Dealing with the byproducts that stem from maintaining a healthy forest can present multiple challenges; the very small slash portions of downed trees and thinned underbrush is costly to dispose of. Small diameter trees, those too small for use as lumber products, can make good fuel wood but are very labor intensive to collect and process. Recent trends are encouraging many to look for more efficient means by which those woody byproducts can be used as renewable energy sources.

In April, Lincoln National Forest District Ranger Buck Sanchez appeared before the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners to talk about the potential renewable energy possibilities of woody biomass forest products.

"My report is a culmination of information on woody biomass," Sanchez told the county commissioners. "I led a group that canvassed members and agencies within the greater Ruidoso

working group that's been quite successful over the years to look at the potential for woody biomass utilization as well as a renewable energy source."

Sanchez said that he and the group of people he worked with in researching woody biomass potentials developed a list of questions regarding the available technology and existing infrastructure and industry of the area, as well as raw materials and natural resources in and around Lincoln County.

"The group I worked with came up with some conclusions and recommendations for you to consider," Sanchez said.

He reported that the challenges associated with the development of energy from the byproducts of forested land areas include transporting the potential fuel products to

industrial locations. He also pointed out that current science and technology indicates that heating systems and products are the most efficient way to use woody biomass to create energy.

"The existing corridors along State Highway 54 and U.S. 70 and the existing rail system seem to be the place to go," Sanchez said. "Transportation is an incredible challenge."

Woody biomass energy has the least value or profit, when you compare it with the value or profit gained from the use of wood in construction or furniture making, Sanchez said.

"Many of the agencies involved in the greater Ruidoso working areas have attempted over the years to think of ways that could bring about a better way of integration

of the existing businesses and sources of raw materials from the National Forest or other public or private lands," he continued. "The group came up with a recommendation about developing an agricultural cooperative. It could be initiated as an incubator concept that would involve the South Central Mountain RC&D that could arrange for research development, could coordinate the land and biomass resource spaces on private, state, federal and other lands, coordinate and facilitate business planning, market development, equipment lease and purchase, technical and financial support from an array of government and private agencies and organizations," he said.

"Part of what this model would be about is moving forest products,

people, their cultures, and learned many valuable lessons that I will take forward. I am thankful for the passion and public service ethic of the employees I worked with on the Lincoln National Forest."

LINCOLN COUNTY TREASURER reminds Lincoln County property owners, they must pay their Second Half Property Taxes by May 10, 2010 to avoid penalty and interest.

ACCORDING TO N.M. STATE STATUTE 7-38-83, TIMELINESS-B. ALL ACTS REQUIRED OR PERMITTED TO BE DONE BY MAIL ARE TO BE POSTMARKED ON THE REQUIRED DATE

The Lincoln County Treasurer's Office does honor the postmark, but your mailed payment **MUST BE POSTMARKED BY May 10, 2010.** If you mail a payment on May 10, 2010, request the postmaster stamp the post date in your presence, to insure the postmark of that date.

INTEREST shall accrue at the rate of one percent (1%) per month or any portion of a month. (Statute 7-38-49 NMSA 1979).

PENALTY on taxes that become delinquent, shall be imposed at one percent (1%) of the delinquent tax total, or a minimum of five dollar (\$5.00), for each month they remain unpaid. (Statute 7-38-50).

By N.M. State law, property taxes are the personal obligation of the property owner, whether or not the tax bill was received. Mail payments or contact us at the address and phone number below should you have questions regarding your property tax bills.



SANTA FE -- "Being a legislator is a great job to have at a time like this." Those were the words, or very close to them, of former state Rep. John Mershon, an Otero County Democrat, back in 1982.

At the time, New Mexico was plummeting into an economic downturn almost as severe as we have at present. Mershon was the longtime chairman of the House Appropriations and Finance Committee and an ardent supporter of smaller government.

Rep. Mershon saw an opportunity to trim government programs that had continually been added to the state budget over the years. During those lean years, traditional state responsibilities such as education and law enforcement, increased as a percentage of the budget.

This time around, state lawmakers don't seem to be looking at eliminating any recently added government services so much as they are in making across-the-board cuts.

There may be some hope, however. A newly-created Government Restructuring Task Force will take a look at consolidating state agencies and eliminating some.

It came about as a result of a group Gov. Bill Richardson appointed last year to make recommendations on how state government can save money.

Former Gov. Garrey Carruthers headed the effort, which in one short month produced some restructuring suggestions that got lawmakers thinking. As Carruthers said at the time, "We should never let an economic crisis go to waste."

And maybe it won't go to waste. Something has to be done. New Mexico's financial decline isn't over yet. As one member of the restructuring panel warned, "We're going to have to make some ugly decisions."

Making ugly decisions isn't something most elected officials like to do. But at this point they are all faced with tough decisions. It has reached the local level where school boards, city councils and county commissions will have to make drastic cuts.

This is budget-making time for all local governments. Their new fiscal years begin on July 1. And none seem to be

enjoying their jobs right now. They live among the people whose jobs and services they have to cut.

One of their first big decisions is whether to raise taxes or reduce services. For school districts, it is a no-brainer. They can't raise taxes for anything but building construction and maintenance. So they must cut services.

Municipalities and counties can levy additional gross receipts taxes. The only place, of which this writer is aware, that is even considering such a move is Rio Rancho. So all local governments are faced with making major cuts.

Some are starting at the top. In Santa Fe, the school board has cut its own payment for attending meetings and its travel budget. Top administrative salaries are being cut two percent.

In other districts, assistant principals are being eliminated, principals are being assigned more than one school to administer and administrators will have to take over some teaching duties.

In cities and counties, director positions are being eliminated, recreation facilities and libraries will have shorter hours and fire and police hirings will be frozen.

And here come the traffic cameras again. At least one city is contemplating installing them in order to take some workload off police.

Retirees, who have returned to work and are drawing a paycheck and a retirement check, are being targeted. In most cases governing bodies originally intended to dismiss them all but then discovered many are in positions for which replacements are difficult or impossible to find.

But the aforementioned cuts usually won't do it all. Personnel will be affected. In most local governments, personnel are 80 percent to 90 percent of the budget so that is where the savings are to be found.

In most cases, it means employees will assume more duties. In schools, it means class sizes will increase.



business and biomass away from being primarily grant driven to more market driven and sustainable in that way," he said. "The idea is to have a cooperative that becomes the intersection of the clearing house for the needs that woody biomass as renewable energy, where those needs are with the available programs to support those needs, to help move those needs forward," he said.

Sanchez said that another recommendation for the utilization of woody biomass products would be to develop a comprehensive resource inventory.

"That could become the information that is a catalyst for the existing

industries to work to help capture this opportunity or to attract others, if there's room for that," he suggested.

The final recommendation to the county commissioners was that a representative be appointed from Lincoln County to lead and facilitate continued renewable energy initiatives and the promotion of economic development.

During the meeting of the county commissioners, other presentations were made regarding several other forms of renewable energy and the potential to harness that energy locally. The News will report on those presentations in future issues.
