

# Landowners Weigh-In on Wind Ordinance

A public hearing scheduled during the May 18th meeting of the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners to gather public comments regarding a proposed wind energy conversion system ordinance attracted several landowners from the Corona area.

Members of the Corona Landowners Association (CLA) submitted comments in writing to the board of county commissioners prior to the public hearing and, on Tuesday, asked the commissioners to consider

their recommendations before adopting any ordinance to regulate the rapidly emerging wind energy industry.

In a letter to the county board, the CLA claims 28 member ranches encompassing 200,000 acres of land in the Corona area. The letter further states that "the land owned by the CLA members is in the heart of the wind rich resource area of Lincoln and Torrance counties, and to the best of our knowledge the CLA members represent approximately 90 percent by numbers and acreage of the landowners in the area who have entered into definitive wind lease and easement

agreements with wind energy developers."

Mack Bell, chairman and director of the CLA, spoke first during Tuesday's hearing to address the proposal of adopting a Lincoln County wind energy ordinance.

"We just feel that the ordinance, as presented, is so restrictive, especially to us in the Corona area where so much of what's in the ordinance just really is not appropriate for us," Bell told the county commissioners. "The developers that we've been working with for going on three years now have basically said that if this

ordinance is passed (they) won't pursue going forward with a wind farm in the area. They would just move into Torrance County where there is no ordinance."

Bell asked the county commissioners to stall adoption of the ordinance until sometime after a workgroup could be formed to develop the ordinance in a manner that is more closely designed to local needs and situations.

"Let us be a part of that group so that we end up with a good, responsible ordinance for Lincoln County that addresses all of the concerns that

## Veteran's Memorial Service at Fort Stanton May 29

Memorial Day is a special holiday that recognizes veterans that served and sacrificed to gain and maintain the freedoms we enjoy here in the United States.

Saturday, May 29 at 11:00 a.m. a special service will be held at the New Mexico Merchant Marine and Military Memorial Cemetery at Fort Stanton to honor veterans and merchant marines. The public is invited to attend.

The service will be opened by Larry Holt and will include the invocation, presentation of colors, Pledge of Allegiance

to the Flag, singing of the National Anthem and singing of Crosses and Friends by Reggie Peninger. There will be a 21 gun salute and Taps.

Fort Stanton originally opened in 1855 and operated continually under the United States Army and for a brief period by the Confederacy Army until 1896. In 1899 the United States Public Health Service opened the Merchant Marine Tuberculosis Hospital at the old fort and continued until 1953. The fort then became a state tuberculosis hospital and later a hospital and training

school for people with developmental disabilities. The past few years the fort has been a women's correctional facility and a substance abuse habilitation center.

The cemetery, which is located a short distance from Fort Stanton on state road 220, was opened in 1899 and has remained in operation for 111 years. The first burial was in 1899 and since that time 1,720 veterans of the armed forces, merchant marines, their dependents and staff have been buried there. The cemetery remains open for veterans and their dependents.

## Lincoln County Clean Energy Conference

Governor Richardson recently announced a multi-million dollar solar project for Eastern NM and with the development of the Wind Farm in Corona, Lincoln County is poised to embrace this emerging economic opportunity. cation are required.

## County Renews Manager's Contract

It comes as no surprise that the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners chose to renew county manager Tom Stewart's contract for another year.

The commissioners had nothing but praise for the job Stewart has done for 13 years, and especially at a time when so many governing bodies are scrambling to get their budgets in line and out of the red.

County attorney Alan Morel began the discussion of the manager's contract renewal.

"I think the strong fiscal condition that Lincoln County is in is due in large part to Mr. Stewart's stewardship," Morel said. "His only fault is that he refuses to take a vacation."

Morel reminded the county commissioners that Stewart has not received a raise in salary since 2008, and added that other county employees have been granted a six percent raise beginning in July.

"Given that Mr. Stewart didn't receive an increase last year, I would recommend a 10 percent this year. I'm assuming he would take less than that, but I think he's worth every penny of

that," Morel continued. "I know that's hard to swallow considering the economic condition that everybody else finds them in, but I think Lincoln County's in the best fiscal condition of any municipality or government in the State of New Mexico, probably the entire United States," he said. "He's worth the money and I recommend you try to keep him."

Stewart said that he has been invigorated by the projects the county has on the horizon, and said that he especially looks forward to the building of a new county-owned healthcare clinic in Capitan.

"I love my job," Stewart told the commissioners matter-of-factly.

County commissioner Eileen Sedillo commended Stewart for a job well done.

"Of course, you have employees under you that are a big help and we appreciate all of them, but you've been a good leader," Sedillo told Stewart.

County commissioner Jackie Powell said that she would challenge any other county to come up with a list of completed projects comparable to the accomplishments of Tom Stewart.

"You look at every single one of the projects, it's (a list) a couple of pages

long, it was on time, on budget, complete, complete, complete, complete," Powell said. "That takes a lot of doing."  
Sedillo said that she would like to tell the other county employees as well as the public, who might have something to say about the amount of Stewart's salary, that they should not judge until they've tried to walk in his shoes.  
"He does a tremendous job," she said.  
County commissioner Don Williams said that, from a personal standpoint, he feels that the county manager makes the job of the county commissioners much easier than it might otherwise be.

"Every time I ask about a problem that a citizen might have, he has handled it professionally and immediately," Williams said.  
County commissioner Dave Parks added that among the most important things the county commission does are to set policy and hire a good manager, then "leave him the heck alone" to do his job.  
The board of county commissioners unanimously approved the renewal of Stewart's contract with an increase in salary of 10 percent, setting his current pay at \$110,000 annually.

## C'zozo Park Fees Are Not in Place Yet

On Tuesday, May 10th, Carrizozo resident Judy Fitzpatrick presented a response to the town council's approval of a new policy setting fees for use of the municipal parks. The new policy was accepted by the trustees in April, but has yet to be officially implemented pending more public input.

"You all said that you were going to charge the organizations that use the parks every year," Fitzpatrick said, "but there are only two. There is Music in the Parks and there's the Street Fair."

The Music in the Parks summer concert series bring musical groups to each of the town's parks on one day of the month through the summer at no charge to those who want to attend. The annual Labor Day Street Fair generates revenue that is used to provide scholarships to Carrizozo students.

Fitzpatrick told the town council that the Cowboy Days celebration, which occurs every two years, does not take place in the parks; it is based around the Carrizozo Heritage Museum.

"You really only have the two, the Music in the Parks, which is all volunteer work; everybody's asked to donate money so we can pay the band, and Street Fair," she said.

The proposal to charge fees of \$75-\$100 for use of the parks stemmed from a need to increase the town's revenues, but some argue that the gross receipts taxes generated by the people attending events held there more than make up for the costs to the town for use of the parks. Fees collected through the new policy, if implemented, would likely generate less than \$1,000 annually, but Carrizozo Mayor Mike Petty has stated that every penny counts in today's tight economy.

# \* Inside the Capitol

**SANTA FE** -- How does a political party go about putting together a winning ticket for governor and lieutenant governor? The answer is: it doesn't. At least not in New Mexico.

Under our present system, candidates for governor and lieutenant governor run separately in party primaries. The winners then run together as a ticket in the general election.

It is not a process designed to produce dream tickets. At the federal level, presidential primary elections end on the first Tuesday in June. The winning candidates then have nearly three months to pick a vice presidential running mate before the national conventions in late August.

That allows ample time to balance a ticket with someone who can draw votes from constituencies with which the presidential candidate is weak.

There's no such luck in New Mexico. Voters choose separately who they think would be the best governor and lieutenant governor. If they happen to be two white guys from Albuquerque,

who live next door to each other, go to the same church and are both in the state Legislature, that's the breaks.

Political parties try to get the word out about advantageous pairings but it doesn't do much good since parties have policies about not taking sides in primary elections.

For a nicely balanced GOP ticket a pairing of Allen Weh with Kent Cravens wouldn't be considered as desirable as a pairing with John Sanchez or Brian Moore of Clayton. There are some worries about how New Mexicans would accept a Susana Martinez-John Sanchez ticket.

On the Democratic side of the ballot, it is likely no accident that all five lieutenant governor candidates are Hispanic. At least two Anglo candidates talked about getting in the race. When both chose not to enter, rumors flew about deals involving nice positions for them in a Danish administration.

The Democratic situation this year is unusual. Seldom has there been a lone Democrat or Republican in an open gubernatorial primary. This has led to talk from

all five candidates about how much they could help Denish by being on the ballot with her.

The candidate with the most difficult claim of a good fit is state Sen. Linda Lopez. A team of two women from Albuquerque might be a difficult sale.

The candidate with the best ticket-balancing argument is Rep. Jose Campos of Santa Rosa. Denish likes to talk about her Hobbs roots but a running mate who has spent his life in rural New Mexico would be a help to her.

Campos has another advantage. He is not close to Gov. Bill Richardson. The Republican ticket's heaviest ammunition is going to be directed at tying the Democratic ticket as tightly to Richardson as possible.

Denish has been working hard at distancing herself from Richardson ever since the grand jury investigation kept the governor from going to Washington. And that is when GOP leaders started referring to the Richardson-Denish administration.

Actually governors and their lieutenant governors never are close. It always is a forced marriage. The situation worked reasonably well as long as lieutenant governors stayed home.

When the legislature allowed the option of a full time lieutenant governor in 1971, it didn't specify any duties. Governors have come up with a handful of busy-work items but never has a lieutenant governor really been a part of the governor's team.

Or as Denish puts it, "I've never been one of the good 'ol boys." But that doesn't matter, the GOP has been combing through everything it can find to join the two at the hip.

With pay to play such a major issue, contribution records of Richardson and Denish will be compared for donors to both campaigns.

If former state Democratic Chairman Brian Colon or RailRunner honcho Lawrence Rael runs with Denish, that will be another tie-in to the Richardson administration.

explained. "I think it's because of rabies and stuff like that."

Petty said that he has not had an opportunity to review the laws governing municipal animal control responsibilities, and Culler warned of the possibility of a lawsuit if someone is bitten or otherwise injured because the town fails to respond to a call for an animal running at large. She said the need for an animal control officer increases in the summer months when children are out of school.

Petty said that he would look into the problem sometime before the June meeting of the town council, and have an answer for Culler at that time.





everyone has," Bell requested. "We're not opposed to an ordinance; I think it's a good thing," he added, "but we would like to have some input as to what's in the body of this."

Bell also told the county officials that there is no need to rush the adoption of an ordinance because the wind energy developers have estimated that the year 2013 would be the earliest date on which any wind farm construction might begin.

Among the objections of the proposed ordinance offered by the CLA is the idea that it will serve to deter the development of wind energy within the county, and that the county would be attempting to regulate certain facets of the industry that are already regulated by other agencies. In its letter to the county board, the CLA writes "The proposed ordinance appears to the CLA members to have been drafted for a much more urban environment, and consistently places aesthetic values over economic interests."

County commissioner Dave Parks seemed to agree with the CLA that the drafted ordinance contained elements inappropriate for the vast rural areas of northern Lincoln County when he referred to the document as an "off-the-rack" ordinance.

County commissioner Eileen Sedillo recommended that a committee be formed to include the CLA as well as Mel Patterson, who drafted the ordinance for the county.

County attorney Alan Morel said that the company that drafted the ordinance for the county has reviewed the comments presented by the CLA.

"Actually, I think we're looking at probably adopting 80 percent of the comments that you've made as being acceptable changes to the ordinance," Morel told Bell. "I don't think we have as much to disagree with as we may have started out with."

that his company is working with several of the landowners in the Corona area, and agreed that responsible development was an important issue. He asked that the county include input from development companies when considering the ordinance. Representatives from Shell Wind Energy and the White Sands Missile Range expressed the same sentiments.

Local rancher Stirling Spencer also asked the county commissioners to actively support the proposal to build the planned SunZia transmission lines project, which would be utilized to carry wind generated power to other parts of the southwest.

"I think the whole thing goes away if the line don't come in," Spencer said. "Without that, it won't happen."
