

Lincoln County Primary Election Results

A total of 3,129 registered voters in Lincoln County cast votes in the primary election Tuesday with some of those being early or absentee votes. There were 626 Democratic votes and 2,503 Republican votes. The Lincoln County Commission will canvass the votes tomorrow, Friday, June 4 in a special session. 

County's Flood Plain Program Assessed

A representative of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) was in Lincoln County last month to assess the county's flood plain management program.

According to county manager Tom Stewart, Bill Borthwick, Flood Plain Administrator for the New Mexico Department of Homeland Security, came to perform a FEMA Community Assistance Visit (CAV), which Stewart described as essentially an audit and assessment of the county's flood plain program. CAVs are required to be done at least once every five years, Stewart reported during a meeting of the county commissioners in May.

County planning director Curt Temple, who

also serves as the Flood Plain Administrator for the county, the Town of Carrizozo and the Village of Capitan, worked with Borthwick on May 4th and 5th as the CAV was conducted, guiding him through the county and the two municipalities.

Stewart said that the report resulting from the CAV was not expected for a few months, and the county would have 30 days after receiving the report to correct any deficiencies or violations found.

"We do not see any major problems with his inspection and anticipate being able to solve relatively quickly a few problem sites around the county," Stewart said. "Failure to correct deficiencies found during a CAV could result in the county's program being placed on probation and, if that occurs,

50 dollars would be added to the insurance premium of the citizen's flood plain insurance.

"The New Mexico administrator is looking to see that we are enforcing the rules. He noted some areas that needed improvement, in terms of people that have put things in flood plains," Stewart continued, "and you're not supposed to do that."

He said that the state will expect the county to take some kind of action to bring the owners of property in flood plains into compliance with flood plain administrative guidelines, and added that only 11 property owners in the county would be affected if the county's program was placed on probation.

County commissioner Dave Parks said that both Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs have participated the same FEMA program since the 1980s and have never been in the position of having their flood plain management programs placed on probation.

"I don't see any problem at all in Lincoln County complying," Parks said.

County Approves Road Vacation

The Lincoln County Road Review Committee, at the request of the county, has looked into the county's plan to vacate and abandon all roads and alleyways within the 25 acres of land recently purchased by the county next to the Lincoln County Fairgrounds.

Duane Williams, chairman of the road

review committee, reported on the findings of the committee.

"We had a request relegated by (Lincoln County Attorney) Alan Morel to close the road from the gate across the arroyo from the current fairgrounds," Williams explained. "This is a road of long-standing, so we really had to look carefully at might be impacted by this."

Williams said that it turned out that only one group of local citizens generally used the road, primarily Brewer Ranch personnel.

"Mr. Brewer was at the review, on site just south of the Capitan fairgrounds, and he posed no objection to the closure of that road although it is a long-standing road and is used by the ranch personnel," Williams reported.

He said that, because the Brewer Ranch has alternative access that can be used instead of the road that bisects the 25 acres of county property, the road review committee has recommended approval of the vacation and abandonment request.

Morel told the county commissioners that the recently purchased property is bounded on three sides by the Brewer Ranch and on one side by property already owned by the county.

"It really does not impact any additional people in the county," Morel said, and described the road in question as just a little trail that runs through

the property. 

equipment for increasing security, and the county manager and LCDC administrators are considering a rooftop siren that could be activated in the case of another escape.


Stewart reported in May that funding for the new fence and gate might become available after the start of the next fiscal year in July, and a Homeland Security Grant might be the source of at least some of that funding.

"The detention center has taken additional measures," Stewart said. "They do not let inmates out to unload trucks anymore, so they've lost that privilege at least until we get a gate. The vision is to bring the trucks in, close the gate behind them, do their thing, and then make sure there are no inmates in the trucks before they leave," he explained. "We need to correct the situation."

County commissioner Eileen Sedillo said that it seems like the inmates are often one-step ahead of those tasked with guarding them.

"They've got nothing but 24 seven to think of ways to mess with us," Stewart agreed, "and they do a good job."

Security enhancement at LCDC will begin in July, Stewart said. The additional fencing is estimated to cost about \$25,000.

During its meeting of May 18th, the board approved the fees at the same rate as in the previous year.

Those applying for a liquor license from the county must first apply for and receive a license from the state's Regulation and Licensing Department.

The fee for licenses are set as follows: dispenser's license, \$250; club license, \$25; retailer's license, \$250; canopy license, \$250; restaurant license, \$250; special permits, \$25 per day.



SANTA FE -- Congratulations to Tuesday's winners. To the losers, I offer the encouraging advice from former U.S. Rep. Joe Skeen, who often noted that he lost seven elections during his long political career.

That career was capped when he was named chairman of the House Appropriations' Subcommittee on Agriculture.

Being a subcommittee chairman may not sound impressive but the House Appropriations' subcommittee chairmen controlled all the money and were reverently referred to as Cardinals.

I can't tell you who won yesterday since this column wasn't written late last night. That honor goes to the reporters who write for the front page.




