

# Capitan Flood Plain Areas Expanded

Curt Temple, flood plain manager for the Village of Capitan, spoke to the Capitan Village Council on Tuesday evening to provide an update of the flood plain

mapping project in the Capitan area. Temple reported that the new, updated flood plain maps have been completed, and a large copy of the map showing the flood plain areas of Capitan will be on display at the village hall. The maps reflect the first revision of flood plain areas since they were last mapped in 1975, Temple said.

The new maps show that some areas not considered to be in a flood plain in the past are now part of flood plain areas, including much of the Capitan shopping district and the village hall.

Temple said that a protest

period began on July 7th giving property owners 90 days to prove that their property is not actually in a flood plain. Engineering studies or survey reports will be required to show factual evidence that any property shown on the map to be in the flood plain is not actually at risk for flooding.

"FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) will only accept scientific proof of an error," Temple said. "If you think that your house is not in a flood zone because you've lived there for 50 years, they won't accept that. You'll have to get scientific data to

me. FEM

Any appeal requests not received by FEMA within the 90-day protest period will not be considered.

According to Temple, owners of properties within the flood plains are not required to carry flood insurance, but many mortgage companies will require the insurance for new home buyers.

"One thing we tell everybody is that, on the old maps, you're grandfathered in, if you're out of the

## C'zozo Animal Control Services Still in Limbo

Questions about the future of the Carrizozo Animal Shelter went pretty much unanswered again during the July 12th meeting of the Carrizozo Town Council.

In mayor Mike Petty's absence at the council's June meeting, mayor pro tem Dennis Vega assured Carrizozo resident Rose Kratochvil that her questions regarding the town's animal control services would be answered at the council's next regular meeting.

With Petty back in the saddle at Monday night's meeting,

Barbara Culler, founding member of Miracle's Paws for Pets animal rescue organization, again questioned the mayor about his plans to bring the town into compliance with a state law by hiring an animal control officer, and what he intends to do about the animal shelter that is currently out of operation. Culler reminded Petty that he had, in response to questions she asked in May, committed to having answers for her in June.

"I'm asking again if you have an answer to the state law, state statutes and how the town stands on that for animal control, about an animal control officer and, also, I'd like to ask how the town stands on (its) ordinance for animal control," Culler said.

She continued by citing the town's animal control ordinance's mandate that all animals picked up by animal control officers be held while information about

their identity can be distributed, and that animals not claimed by their owners be offered potential adoption possibilities.

In response, Petty told Culler that a new animal policy has been drafted by the town's attorney and is being reviewed by the mayor, trustees and chief of police, and said that the draft is not available for public review at this time.

"As soon as it's approved, of course," Petty said.

Once the policy has been approved by the town council, it becomes a public document available by law for review by any who ask. Some government entities, like the board of county commissioners, often invite interested parties to participate in the drafting process while considering new policy, but Petty indicated that probably won't happen in this case.

Culler asked if Petty planned to hold a

## Upgrade Approved for Library Thrift Shop

The Capitan Public Library is planning some upgrades to its Not 2 Shabby thrift shop space; Library board president Larry Miller appeared before the Capitan village council on Tuesday evening to seek approval for the changes planned for the village owned building that houses the shop.

"We certainly appreciate the help of the village with the library," Miller told the trustees. "One of the ways the village cooperates with us is to let us use the space at the Not 2 Shabby shop. Without the operation of the Not 2 Shabby shop, it would be difficult for us to maintain the operating costs of \$3,000 a month that it takes to operate the public library."

Miller said that the library board would like to install a carport behind the thrift shop building, and two awnings over the windows in the front of the shop. The carport will have side panels to help protect anything stored inside from wind and rain. The window awnings will help keep the shop cooler inside during the summer as well as dressing up the front.

Three rural health clinics will provide free sports physicals to high school athletes in Lincoln County. Rose Clinic in Capitan, Carrizozo Health Clinic in Carrizozo and the Corona Health Center will provide free sports physicals for their respective community middle and high school athletes.

Capitan's free sports physical clinic will be on Wednesday, July 28 at the Traylor Gym from 1:30 to 4 p.m.

Carrizozo's free sports physical clinic will be on Tuesday, July 27 at the Carrizozo High School Gym from 1:30 to 4 p.m.

Corona's will occur every Wednesday at the Corona Health Center from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Three providers will conduct

the physicals which include Dr. Chris Robinson, Dr. Alfred Varela, Suzanne Carden, CNS, and Ellen Orr Wittman, PA.

Physicals will be open for middle and high school athletes participating on Capitan, Carrizozo and Corona Municipal Schools sports teams.

Parental/guardian consent forms must be completed and turned in when the physical is performed. Consent forms can be picked up in advance from their coach or from their respective school district central office.

## Nogal Mesa Ranchman's Camp Meeting July 21-26

The evening sky fills with colors as the sun slips toward the horizon. The world is quiet, and hushed, as dusk develops. Then the breeze wafting through the trees begins to carry a melody, and soon the distinctive sounds of a piano drift across the evening sky. As the western horizon darkens to blues and purples, more and more voices are raised in song until the air pulses with the music and words of "Amazing Grace."

Thus, with a song and a prayer, evening services begin at Nogal Mesa Ranchman's Camp meeting. It has been this way for 71 years,

as rural folk and their urban friends and neighbors meet together on Nogal Mesa to worship and sing and meet with their Lord.

The first meal will be served on Wednesday evening, July 21st, followed by the first worship service. Thursday through Sunday the schedule is filled with four worship services a day, children and youth activities, and prayer meetings. The evening worship service on July 26th will conclude the 71st annual camp meeting.

The concept of bringing the church to the cowboy was birthed over a century ago in the Big Bend area of Texas. The Bloys Camp Meeting was held each summer in the Davis

Mountains since 1890. Joe Evan's family was one of the early organizers of the Camp Meeting.

Evans became friends with Presbyterian missionary Ralph Hall, a circuit riding preacher. With his saddle and pack horse, Hall traveled the Southwest to spread the good news of Jesus. When Hall arrived at an isolated ranch, he joined in the work of the day, whether it was rounding up cattle, branding, fence building, or bronc busting. When the work was done, Hall would preach.

Evans persuaded Hall that New Mexico needed the same type of summer family camp, where far-flung neighbors could congregate for

fellowship and worship of their creator. When the cowboys and the missionary met on the rim of Nogal Mesa and gazed on the panoramic view of the Tularosa Basin and the distant purple mountains, they felt they had found the perfect site for their new Camp Meeting.

The Mesa has become a holy spot for many people in the ensuing years. First, ranch families came in wagons and horseback to hear the preaching and teaching. Today, cars and pickups pulling motor homes wend their way over the dusty road on the way to Nogal Mesa. Others who can't come to camp make it a point to come for the evening meal and services.

Today, more than 50 families make up a local committee which carries on the work begun in the middle part of the last century. They aren't all cowboys any more, but all are dedicated to God's service and the preaching of His word.

Over the years, this committee has built a wooden tabernacle perched on the rim of the Mesa, overlooking Tularosa Basin. There is also a wooden cook shack, where three meals a day are cooked over open fires in huge, cast-iron kettles. A large bell tolls seven times daily to summon campers for services or meals, signaling either food for the body or the spirit, depending on the time. No camping fees or meal fees are collected, as the Camp Meeting is run entirely on free-will donations.

Tabernacle services will be led by Charles Clary of Ruidoso and Mike Skidmore of Truth or Consequences. Children four to six years of age will meet in the pink trailer and grades one through six meet at the striped tent at 11:00 and 5:00 each day.

The youth will have their own services at 9:00 and 2:00 each day. A hayride and watermelon bust is planned for Friday and Saturday, as well as volleyball games and a special youth service on Saturday night.

All area youth and youth groups are encouraged to attend and participate.

The first bell of Camp Meeting will be rung at 6:00 Wednesday night for supper. At 7:00 choir practice starts, followed by evening worship at 7:30.

Thursday through Saturday, the breakfast bell will ring at 6:00 a.m. Bible study starts at 9:00. This is also the first youth event of the day. At 11:00, children will meet and adults meet in the tabernacle for worship. Lunch is served at 12:30. Youth gather under their tent at 2:00, while their elders wait until 3:00 p.m. for the next service under the tabernacle. Children meet again at 5:00 while the women meet in the tabernacle and the men meet at the prayer tree for prayer time. Supper is served at 6:00, and the evening service is scheduled for 7:30. Sunday's schedule is different only because Sunday School takes the place of the morning Bible study.

After the evening service on Wednesday evening, everyone gathers at the dining hall for cake and ice cream. Ice cream is provided, but the cakes and cookies are made and brought by locals and campers. On Thursday, Friday and Saturday, weather permitting, a bonfire will follow evening services. Stories are told, songs sung, and memories made as the flames throw the sparks skyward into the star spangled night.

The Nogal Mesa Ranchman's Camp Grounds may be reached by turning off of highway 380 at a sign 15 miles east of Carrizozo and five miles west of Capitan, or by turning at the sign on Highway 37 on Nogal Mesa.

Ranchman's Camp Meeting is inter-denominational, meaning that people of all Christian faiths come together to worship. All are invited to join in this year's encampment on the mesa.



public hearing to collect ideas and comments from the public regarding the new policy, an act required before a new ordinance, or amendments of an existing ordinance, can be adopted.

"We can have a public hearing for it, or a public examination of it," Petty said, "but as I say, we're doing it now, we're working on it, and I think we're going to come up with something that you will approve of."

While offering little information about the new animal policy, Petty said that he would be looking for volunteers to take care of the pound and asked that anyone interested in volunteering stop by city hall to do so.

Culler asked what type of services the volunteers would be asked to provide, and if there would be someone place in a position to supervise the volunteers. She suggested that there should be at least one person qualified to determine which animals are or aren't safe for volunteers to handle.

"I believe all of those are in the policy," Petty alluded.

When Culler said that she would like the mayor to hold a public hearing before adoption of the new policy, Petty said that he could examine that option. When ques-



### Billy and the Bomb

SANTA FE -- Mid-July is a momentous time in New Mexico's history. On July 14, 1881, Pat Garrett shot Billy the Kid. The Kid is arguably the world's most famous outlaw. The news quickly traveled around the world.

On July 16, 1945, the world's first nuclear explosion occurred at Trinity Site, north of Alamogordo. According to history, news of that event traveled nowhere but Los Alamos, Washington, D.C., London, Potsdam and Moscow.

First, Billy the Kid's death. Or was it? Over the years various pretenders claimed to be the Kid, arguing that Garrett shot someone else or that the Kid survived the shot through his chest.

Those claims were essentially put to rest in 1950 when the most vocal pretender, Brushy Bill Roberts, a Texan, requested a pardon from Gov. Tom Mabry.

It didn't take long for Mabry and historians who interviewed him to conclude that Roberts had misremembered, or forgotten, too much of his past. Of special concern was Robert's complete lack of any Spanish speaking skills. Billy was fluent.

But the doubt about the Kid's death were reignited seven years ago when the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department surprisingly launched an official investigation into the Kid's death. News of the murder case spread worldwide.

Newly-elected Gov. Bill Richardson got involved with promises to match DNA. He subsequently dropped out of that part of the case but has ignited debate again by expressing interest in considering the pardon for Billy that former Govs. Mabry and Lew Wallace had denied.

Gale Cooper, author of recent books about the Kid has told me of confusion created by the doubt being raised about the Kid's death.

Now, Joe Micalizzi, TheMotionPicture.com and producer of "Billy the Kid's New Mexico," has sent me an article from the Hindustan Times in northern India.

The Times reports Gov. Richardson pledging to pardon the Kid if it is determined that he was

actually Brushy Bill Roberts, buried in Texas. The Times says it received its information from the Daily Express, presumably a major England newspaper.

That is not the way the pardon story started last April but that is what it has turned into in at least some parts of the world. Much more on this later.

\*\*\*

The Trinity test came as a surprise to New Mexicans except for those in Los Alamos. Many family members of those at the site climbed a mountain above town and looked to the southeast for the explosion. Rain held it up. But at 5:29:30 a.m. it happened.

The official word was that a powder house near Alamogordo had exploded and that no one was hurt. For years, it appeared that no one was hurt. But then residents near the site began developing cancer at a much higher than normal rate.

The government denied it for many years until the New Mexico congressional delegation began studying the results of the Los Alamos Historical Document Retrieval and Assessment project.

The study was a 10 year effort to examine every document generated at Los Alamos since its inception that might relate to public health. It was conducted by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Public briefings were held five years into the study and following issuance of a draft final report a year ago. This column reported on both of the hearings.

Both columns resulted in many contacts by residents near the site. These were forwarded to New Mexico's senators with requests that New Mexico residents be added to the list of those eligible for compensation for radiation exposure.

All of our state's congressional delegation now have become co-sponsors of bills to add New Mexico residents to those exposed by the Trinity test or the numerous Nevada tests.

This week the Alamogordo Daily News began a three-part series on the area's downwinders. And, reportedly, health workers are going door-to-door to determine family medical histories.

Much more on this and other radiation developments soon.


