## Capitan Council Mandates Building Permits

Capitan property owners will now be required to obtain a building permit from the village before building any type of structure larger than 10 feet by 10 feet.

Following a recommendation from the Capitan Planning Commission, the village council voted last week during its regular monthly meeting to move an item of the municipal code from the subdivision section to the building regulations section, and to add a requirement for the purchase of a \$25 building permit.

Village clerk Kay Strickland said that the subdivision section of

the village code contained language that addressed construction requirements and violations that applied to building permits, and that the planning commission proposed moving those requirements to the section addressing building regulations.

"What they wanted to do was to start having a permit that's required, and charging a fee of 25 dollars, so we'll know what's going on," Strickland told the village trustees. "I guess we've had some things coming in that we didn't know about until they already had it going."

The permit requirement will apply to commercial and residential construction including mobile or modular homes. The penalties for the

failure to get a permit from the village can be a shut-down of the construction site and fines of up to \$300.

Virginia Watson-Jones, a resident of Capitan, asked if the village would waive the permit fee for those who have already obtained a building permit from the state, and the trustees said no.

Mayor Sam Hammons added that every municipality in the state requires building permits.

Watson-Jones said that the Village of Ruidoso has very "Draconian" building permits, divided into electrical, construction and plumbing aspects, and asked if that was what the change in the Capitan village code was leading to.

"It's just to make sure that, even out in the subdivisions, in other words, nobody can advantage of (the absence of) rules," trustee Ricky LaMay responded. "Not really rules, but we'll know what's going on."

Watson-Jones asked how non-compliance with the permit requirement will be enforced, and police chief Randy Spear fielded the question.

"If we get notified of it, we can go out there and see if they have a permit from the Village of Capitan and all permits from the State of New Mexico. If they do not, call a building inspector and along with us we'll shut it down," Spear said, "unless it's agricultural. If you're building a chicken



coop, can't touch it."

When asked if a very large barn, 8,000 square feet, would qualify for the agriculture exemption from the permit requirement, Spear said that one would have to check with the state about that, and LaMay said that a permit from the village would be required.

LaMay suggested that having the permit requirement included in the subdivision section of the village code gave residents the impression that it didn't apply to construction outside of the subdivisions, and that moving the language to the building regulations sections should make it clear that it applies to any property inside of the village limits.

Few people were present to discuss the issue although, Strickland pointed out, the public hearing was advertised for two weeks prior to the meeting. The adopted change will also be publicized for two weeks to notify residents of the change.

"It's official after that two weeks," Strickland said.

Trustee Diane Riska said that she has been involved in some discussion of the need for building permits.

"It sounds good to me," Riska said. "I know we've talked about things happening in the city limits and; the village, we don't even know

that the building is going up or the trailer is moving in. I think it's good for the village to know what's happening before it happens."

Watson-Jones asked if the planning commission would be proposing any regulations to control what kinds of mobile homes will be permitted within the village limits.

"Is that something that the planning board is going to consider?" she asked. "Because once we get them in, we're stuck with them."

LaMay said "one step at a time", and Spear said that what kinds of structures are allowed is determined by the restrictive covenants of the subdivisions, and that the village cannot enforce those covenants.

"That's a civil issue. That is not a criminal issue," Spear said.

He referred to some A-frame structures that were brought into Capitan from Ruidoso and have since been closed by the state.

"Now, we're going to have to give him the ultimatum, you're going to do something or we'll do it," Spear said. "We can consider it a health and safety issue."

The Capitan Village Council, with trustee Jim Davis absent, unanimously approved the planning commission's proposal to rearrange one section of the village code and require a \$25 building permit.

## Regional Capital Outlay Legislative Hearings Set

A series of Legislative hearings to obtain citizen and community comments for State Capital Outlay funding has been announced by the Southeastern New Mexico Economic Development District/Council of Governments (SNMEDD). The hearings will be held throughout the five county region covered by SNMEDD.

Hearings will take place in Alamogordo, Carlsbad, Roswell and Ruidoso Downs. Local governments, community based non-for-profit organizations and others seeking assistance in acquiring funding assistance for capital construction or equipment projects from the State of New Mexico are encouraged to attend the hearing in their county.

Hubert Quintana, executive director of SNMEDD, in making the announcement, added that, "It is critical that those seeking Capital Outlay funding assistance attend one of the hearings."

The hearings will provide those seeking funding the opportunity to meet face to face with their local Legislators to discuss their funding needs and the reasons to have the State assist with their proposed project.

The proposed projects must have a project of life of at least 10 years and cost no less than \$25,000. Capital Outlay projects that are approved by the Legislature and Governor will be funded by State issued Severance Tax Bonds or General Fund Bonds.



### Billy the Kid May Still Get His Pardon

**SANTA FE** - So now it's a petition that has Gov. Bill Richardson considering a pardon for Billy the Kid. Originally, last March, Richardson wanted to stage a trial, using Billy the Kid historians and a professional filmmaker.

Responses from those familiar with the Kid's story were positive for the first month or so, as long as the trial was conducted in a scholarly and dignified manner. But the tide soon turned against a pardon as others heard of the plan.

Some felt a pardon would be a bad message to the young. Others called it a publicity stunt. And some alleged it was a payoff to a big political contributor. Then descendants of Gov. Lew Wallace and Sheriff Pat Garrett weighed in against a pardon.

That evidently slowed down preparations for a pardon hearing. The loss of gubernatorial staff may also have been a factor as employees scrambled to find other jobs. But it didn't lessen the governor's enthusiasm for a pardon. Most governor watchers figured he'd find a way even if it were a last-day announcement.

And a pardon petition by a prominent attorney was evidently the plan. Randi McGinn, an Albuquerque plaintiffs attorney and wife of Supreme Court Chief Justice Charlie Daniels, volunteered to review the situation and petition for a pardon.

This occurred six months ago. That's about a month after public opinion began turning south for the governor's trial. McGinn is from Alamogordo so she knows descendants from both sides of the Lincoln County War and has talked to them. McGinn says she also read every book she could find on Billy the Kid. That's quite a few.

Amazon.com lists 1,326 books.

The closest she could get to Gov. Wallace promising a pardon to the Kid was a statement that he had the authority to exempt him from prosecution.

To anyone but a plaintiff's attorney, Wallace's statement is a long way from saying, "I will pardon you." Sure, Wallace led Billy to believe they had a deal if Billy testified in a murder trial in which Wallace was interested.

And Billy did get a raw deal from New Mexico's justice system, which was controlled by the corrupt Santa Fe Ring. But granting a pardon based on Wallace's statement that he had the power to grant one is a stretch. Wallace decided not to exercise that authority.

McGinn's pardon petition focuses on the Kid's indictment for the killing of Sheriff William Brady since that was the context in which the pardon question was considered. It does not consider the Kid's killing of the two deputies after he had been convicted and sentenced to hang.

Gov. Richardson and McGinn say they are interested in hearing what New Mexicans feel about McGinn's pardon petition. Richardson wants all replies to be in writing and confined to the content of McGinn's petition. So replies will not be considered if they address Gov. Richardson's motives or the effect of the pardon on the younger generation.

The deadline for replies is December 26. That gives the governor and McGinn a week to read the replies and make a decision before Richardson's term ends December 31.

The possibility seems small that Gov. Richardson won't grant the pardon requested by McGinn's petition. By the time you read this, descendants of Garrett


