## County Monitoring Prison Healthcare Costs

County manager Tom Stewart told the Board of Lincoln County Commissioners on December 21, that he foresees a potential budgetary shortfall by around February, and said he planned to ask for the authority to transfer funds in preparation. The potentially problematic costs that Stewart is closely monitoring stem from providing mental and medical healthcare services to detainees held at the county-owned Lincoln County Medical Center. "Under our ordinance, prisoners who don't have insurance are considered indigent," Stewart explained. "We're running well ahead of prior years with regard to care for prisoners in the terms of medical and mental health. I'm in kind of a quandary. I'm contemplating spending general fund money, to the tune of \$50,000, to cover detention center costs, in lieu of reducing our indigent healthcare payments to our citizens. We could say

no, and reduce the indigent healthcare claims to 'pay for detainee costs, but I really have reservations about that because the public is paying that gross receipts tax to assist indigent healthcare," he said. "Even though the detainees are considered indigent under our ordinance, it is our responsibility to provide healthcare to them, and what we have been doing is we've been paying Medicaid rates for the detainee costs in the indigent healthcare program and our general fund has been paying the difference. I'm trying to be responsive to the needs of the

detainees, but at the same time saying wait a minute, hold it, what's reasonable here?" County commissioner Jackie Powell commented that some non-violent offenders, like those who pass bad checks, could be monitored outside of the detention center through the use of electronic "ankle bracelets", and save the county from responsibility for their healthcare. Stewart said he hates to think that people are intentionally getting themselves incarcerated in order to gain access to medical care, but admitted that it is a possibility. "That's the way

I'm leaning," he admitted. Stewart said that he has been corresponding with the District Attorney about the possibility of using the electronic monitoring option on a more frequent basis in cases where the offender poses no threat of bodily harm to anybody. "If they're in there for bad check writing or violating the conditions of release or parole, that's one thing, but if they're violent, then by all means we don't want to release them into the public," Stewart said. County commissioner Dave Parks said that he thought the

## County Supports Veteran Burial Interests at Fort Stanton

Last month, the New Mexico State Monuments Board of Regents announced that the Merchant Marine Cemetery at the Fort Stanton Monument will be closed to future burials of military veterans,

excepting the spouses of Merchant Marines and those employed by the Fort Stanton hospital prior to 1954. Some local veterans have strongly expressed disappointment over the decision to close the cemetery, as they have for years

believed that the cemetery would provide a final resting place for themselves and their spouses, a place close to home and accessible to their loved ones. County manager Tom Stewart has taken up the cause for Lincoln County military servicemen and women by continuing to solicit state officials with requests to reopen at least parts of the cemetery grounds, for our local veterans and their spouses or family members.

Knowing that the state is in dire financial status at this time, Stewart has written letters to the county's state representatives explaining that Lincoln County will not submit any requests for capital outlay funding from the upcoming legislative sessions, instead requesting that some



requirements associated with prisoner detention constituted the largest single, unfunded mandate imposed upon counties by the state.

Stewart said he agreed with Parks, and added that there are some initiatives that say that if an individual is found guilty of a felony, he or she should immediately be transferred to state prison facility. He also said that the Lincoln County Detention Center currently houses a prisoner that has been at the facility for three years.

"We're only supposed to have

people for a year," Stewart said. "For Pete's sake, get the judges to do their job. I don't understand why a person would be in there for three years. It's frustrating, but we have to deal with it."

County sheriff Rick Virden agreed, and said that some of the detainees held at the county's facility have been there for what he called a tremendous length of time.

"It's certainly uncalled for to house those prisoners out there when they should be under the state jurisdiction," Virden said.

type of program be developed that would allow the continuation of veteran burials there.

In his regular monthly report to the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners on December 21, Stewart said that he received a response to his letter to State Representative Zachary Cook. In the letter, Cook said that he appreciated the county's consideration of the state's deficit and desire to add no more to that burden, and asked that Stewart keep him advised of the county's capital outlay needs for the

future.

In response to Stewart's request to reopen the cemetery for veteran burials, Cook wrote that he too was disappointed by the decision of the State Monuments Board of Regents, but pleased that county officials have taken a position to support the interests of those veterans and their families who hope to someday be buried at the facility.

"I look forward to working with the county to establish such a program," Cook wrote.



### 2010 Bad Year for Political Predictions

SANTA FE - After closely watching the New Mexico political scene for over 50 years, it had become fun and easy to predict events of the next year. Regardless of what was said by our politicians, actual events fell into a predictable pattern.

Until two years ago, that is. At almost exactly this same time in 2008, Gov. Bill Richardson announced he would not be leaving New Mexico midway through his second term to join the cabinet of the incoming Barack Obama presidency.

Lt. Gov. Diane Denish's transition team had about finished its work. Bill Richardson was just an afterthought. And then came the bombshell. Gov. Richardson wasn't leaving.

His 500 political appointees, who had been busily assuring Denish of their loyalty, were running over each other in the Roundhouse hallways to reassure Richardson they were still solidly in his corner. And my predictions of what would be happening during a Denish administration could be thrown in the waste can.

Despite losing her chance to take over early as governor, Denish built up a \$2 million campaign war chest and scared out all possible Democratic challengers. And both Steve Pearce and Heather Wilson considered Denish's two toughest possible opponents had decided this wasn't the time to run for governor.

Denish looked unbeatable. It was at that point that I boldly predicted Denish would best Allen Weh for governor. But Susana Martinez came from statewide obscurity to a place on the national stage in less than a year.

This coming year will be equally difficult to call. Who knows how Martinez's first year in the saddle will go? She still is a relatively unknown quantity. I have been chided for putting her on the national stage before even serving a day in office.

But let me remind you that 10 years ago,

when Bill Richardson was still working for the Clinton administration and Gary Johnson had just begun his campaign to legalize drugs, I predicted both would be running for president before the decade was over.

Everyone but Bill Richardson told me I was crazy. I may not be crazy about Susana Martinez's possibilities either. There is ample evidence Martinez still is receiving national assistance to assure a successful tenure in office.

Gov.-elect Martinez made public schools and Medicaid priorities during her campaign. Her choices for cabinet secretaries of the Public education Department and the Human Services Department were both people of national stature - probably not an accident.

A year ago, I picked Reps. Martin Heinrich and Ben Ray Lujan to win their congressional seats again. I demurred on the Teague-Pearce race. I picked libertarian-leaning Adam Kokesh to win the 3rd Congressional District Republican primary.

I based that on Kokesh's fund raising ability and his aggressive full-time campaign. I should have heeded an anonymous tip from a GOP leader that beating Kokesh was a Republican Party priority because the guy was scary.

I predicted New Mexico's economy would remain bad throughout this year despite legislative predictions of a six percent increase. That was an easy one. So was my prediction that ethics reform would continue to receive much lip service but little action.

We heard much about ethics and corruption during the recent political campaigns but it isn't likely to result in any stricter laws.

My prediction that former Gov. Gary Johnson would become more visible nationally but wouldn't get invited to any Republican functions because of his libertarian views on drug legalization and foreign entanglements turned out to be only half right. He has been invited to Republican functions in states with early presidential primaries.

And my final prediction, which proved accurate, was that Billy the Kid would remain in the

news in a big way this year. That was an easy one too because Gov. Richardson was sure to take one last shot at linking his name with the world's most famous New Mexican.

OPEN MEETINGS ACT**

WHEREAS, the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners met in regular session at Carrizozo, New Mexico, on the 16th day of November, 2010, at 8:30 a.m. as required by law, and

WHEREAS, Section 10-15-1(B) of the Open Meetings Act (NMSA 1978, Sections 10-15-1 to 10-15-4) states that, except as may be otherwise provided in the Constitution or the provisions of the Open Meetings Act, all meetings of a quorum of members of any board, council, commission, administrative adjudicatory body or other policymaking body of any state or local public agency held for the purpose of formulating public policy, discussing public business or for the purpose of taking any action within the authority of or the delegated authority of such body, are declared to be public meetings open to the public at all times; and

WHEREAS, any meeting subject to the Open Meetings Act at which the discussion or adoption of any proposed resolution, rule, regulation or formal action occurs shall be held only after reasonable notice to the public; and

WHEREAS, Section 10-15-1(D) of the Open Meetings Act requires the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners to determine annually what constitutes reasonable notice of its public meetings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners that:

1. Regular meetings of the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners shall ordinarily be held each month at a time and place designated in the notice. The agenda will be available at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the meeting from the Lincoln County Manager's Office located in the Lincoln County Courthouse, Carrizozo, New Mexico.

2. Special meetings of the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners may be called by the Chairman or a majority of the members upon three (3) days notice. The notice shall include an agenda for the meeting or information on how members of the public may obtain a copy of the agenda. The agenda shall be available to the public at least twenty-four (24) hours before any special meeting.

3. 4. For the purposes of regular meetings described in paragraph 1 of this resolution, notice requirements will be complied with by the Lincoln County Clerk's permanently posting on the bulletin board at the Lincoln County Courthouse a copy of this resolution, as well as a notice setting forth the days and times of the regular meetings which have been set by resolution. Changes effecting the date of a regular scheduled meeting will be mailed to those broadcast stations licensed by the Federal Communications Commission and newspapers of general circulation that have made a written request for notice of public meetings.

5. For the purposes of special meetings and emergency meetings described in paragraphs 2 and 3 of this resolution, notice requirements shall be met by posting notices in the offices of the Lincoln County Clerk and the Lincoln County Manager. The Lincoln County Manager's Office shall provide telephonic notice to those broadcast stations licensed by the Federal Communications Commission and newspapers of general circulation that have made a written request for notice of public meetings.

7. 
