A decrease in average weekly hours worked in all major industrial groups resulted in smaller weekly earnings in spite of a alightly higher average hourly Carnings.

Mining employees averaged the highest weekly earnings, \$72.70; while construction workers averaged the highest hourly earnings, \$1.88, during February.

The February Increase in employment is a normal sessonal climb, Miera states.


