OSCAR SAMELSON BUYS HOLLYWOOD INN



The first load of the massive equipment for the Skyride to be erected here arrived last Friday and another load came in on Wednesday of this week. Workmen finished pouring the concrete for the lower terminal last Monday. Workmen are now assembling the huge timbers which will stand on the concrete forms. A 100 horsepower Cle-Trac arrived Wednesday, complete with winch. This will be used to erect some of the towers and cables.

Bill Hart this week gave some interesting figures regarding the Skyride which he hopes to have installed and ready to operate by July first. It has been used for years at Magdalena as a means of transporting ore from the American Mining and Smelting Co. to the American Wire Rope Tramway was manufactured by A. Leschen and Sons at St. Louis, Missouri. They ship these tramways all over the world as they are the best means known for transporting ore over rough terrain. There are 24 cars on the line. Each car can be converted into comfortable seats that will hold two people.

The Skyride will be capable of transporting 48 people to the top of Moon Mountain each trip. Customers will be let off at the top of Moon Mountain and will be allowed to stay as long as they wish to enjoy the scenery—then they may board another seat and return to the bottom. The Skyride will definitely be safe for transporting people since it was designed to transport hundreds of ore that weighed five times as much as the people that will be carried.

Cable alone on the tramway weighs over 20 tons. The Skyride operates in the same manner as a chair-lift at a ski run. Prices for the ride have not been determined but it is said that they would be in line with other rides throughout the country.





**CORONA**

The Corona Roping club held a goat roping contest at the Chadwick ranch 12 miles east of Corona last Sunday, May 18, members of the club are planning to have a real calf roping contest, and other forms of entertainment at the Chadwick ranch. Everybody welcome.

The Boone Contracting company of Clovis and Portales has been removing some timber from pasture lands belonging to the following ranchers: E. T. Bond, Archie Per-

kins, Noble Snodgrass, L. L. Argonbright, Harry Ryberg, and A. C. Hester. They expect to remove more timber from other ranches in this section this week and next. The newly cleared land will be seeded to grass.

Rev. and Mrs. Merle Rice and daughter, Carolyn, and Miss R. Lovelace spent the week-end in Hot Springs (T or C).

Work at the Helm and French mines started again. Some blasting and work on the mine shafts were done last week, and several more men were put to work this week. It is reported that work may be in full swing at the mines in a couple of weeks. The mining of bastnaesite, a substance of "rare earth" used in jet engines is being mined. A \$15,000 mill, all electric, will be in use ten miles south of Corona at the Gallina Station. Probably sixty or 100 men may be employed. Mostly local help will be used. Two car loads of the ore was shipped last fall to Chicago. The mine was re-named recently "The Corona Corporation." The Lindsey Light and Chemical company of Chicago has controlling interest in the mine.

The fencing of the right of way is finished, culverts and underpasses have been completed, and most of the roadbed has been graded. The rock-crusher crew started Tuesday of this week, and the actual blacktopping of the road is getting underway.
