

Legislative Council Prepares Digest Of Eleven Amendments To Be Voted On September 15

(Editor's Note: At the request of State Senator M. E. Morgan of Alamogordo the New Mexico Legislative Council prepared a digest of the eleven amendments to the state constitution on which citizens will ballot Sept. 15. The News will present the digest in a series of five articles.)

Justices have been accomplished by making them trustees of the Supreme Court Library. This amendment would permit their salary to be set by law and would remove the salary amount from the Constitution entirely.

TEXT OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT NO. 8
(House Joint Resolution No. 15)
A JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an Amendment to Article 6, section 11 of the Constitution of the State of New Mexico to amend Article 6 section 11 of the Constitution of New Mexico and providing that the salary of the Justices of the Supreme Court be set by law and that the amount of such salary be set by law at the next general or special election.

Section 1. That it is hereby proposed by the Legislature of the State of New Mexico that Section 11, Article 6 of the Constitution of the State of New Mexico be amended by the people of said State so as to read as follows, to-wit:

"11. (Supreme Court Justice Salary)—The Justices of the Supreme Court shall each receive such salary as may hereafter be fixed by law."


