incurred by him by indiscriminate poisoning of orchards. Consult your county agent for information, or your local bee inspector.

Every farmer or orchardist, keeping bees for himself, whether one colony or a hundred, should inform your state college of this fact to insure inspection and elimination of disease. There is some question as to the profitability of keeping a few hives for pollination purposes only. It would be far less expensive to rent colonies from a professional honey producer, where available. Professionals are reluctant to enter a territory where hobby beekeeping is widespread and inspection service is inadequate and farmers do not time their sprays so as to not destroy bees. Poisoning quite often wipes out a beekeeper entirely and loses an entire honey crop.

If you have bees, for whatever purpose, it is to yours as well as the community's interest, to contact your state beekeeper, Mr. Poe, Lou Cruce, or your local county inspector, and advise him where you have your bees and have them inspected. Request a copy of the laws pertaining to bees. He will call at your place, inspect your bees and give you a certificate of health for them. The law provides for complete destruction of bees not complying with the regulations, and having them in boxes, or hives, with movable frames.

Pneumonia, the most disastrous malady of bees, can infect an entire area and destroy the entire population in a given section. Wild bees in trees and caves should be destroyed, for once they are infected, they may spread disease.

Dear Mr. Lamb: I was hoping that someone would answer Paul Baker's remarks concerning the land at Fort Stanton. It would make good reading to have more opinions. I don't believe my neighbors consider Fort Stanton cattle as such great competition. Whether the state or federal government administers the land is of little concern as long as the Indians are dealt with fairly. But Baker's statement that federal agencies are not capable of managing grazing lands is very false. Fort Stanton has been grazed conservatively and profitably under federal management. The Forest Service and Mescaleros have done well with their grazing lands also. Of course, I would be considered prejudiced, so my opinions are not for publication. But what about others? 
