The laying hen doesn't work after dark so, as the days continue to get shorter, the time each hen devotes to laying is also reduced. And less hours on the job means fewer eggs laid.

Actually, lights do more than just lengthen the working day. Added light influences the pituitary gland which leads to stimulation of the hen's reproductive process. Some increase in feed consumption follows in order to provide the necessary nutrients for egg formation.

sinaped reflector 16 inches in dismeter at the base and 4 inches high. At a height of 5 feet above the floor, such a light will give a sufficient intensity over an area of about 200 square feet.

All-night lights are gaining fayors with some poultrymen. With this plan, intensity of illumination is reduced (a 15-20 watt bulb is used) with the object being to provide just enough light to enable hens to find food or water at any time of night. egg formation.

Response of layers to light is both prompt—usually from 7 to 10 days—and of considerable magnitude. Experimental tests have shown that birds can be made to lay "round-the-clock" depositing about half their eggs at night or will completely reverse their schedule and lay all eggs at night—all by the manipulation of lights. To perform these last two tests, all natural light was eliminated. Several different lighting plans may be used. Lights can be turned on in the early morning and off at daylight or you can turn lights on at dusk and off a few hours later. Some poultrymen prefer to use a combination of morning and evening lighting. Automatic switches are a great convenience but are not necessary.




