Stay Alive In '55

Pari-Mutuel Handle Sets New Records; Betting Will Easily Pass Million Dollar Mark Over Holidays

With the pari-mutuel handle already at \$782,273 for the first six days of racing in the 1955 season at Ruidoso Downs, this holiday week-end coming up should put the track at a point away from a million dollars when the last ticket is cashed in (or torn up) on Independence Day Monday.

This week-end sets three days of racing, three of 13 days during this month—with most of the week-ends having three-day cards on schedule. Betting each day this year so far has run about 30 percent higher than in 1954, track officials declare.

Some of the finest races of the season along with the most attractive purses will be offered as the Downs opens a gigantic three day week-end Saturday.

Last year a total of over \$180,000 was wagered on the Fourth of July.

Ruidoso has scheduled a three-year-old quarter horse derby this year and racing fans will have an opportunity of securing a preview of many of these derby prospects in action in the tenth race for Saturday.

B. Ferguson's Diamond, one of the top three year-olds of the country, has been entered along with six others including such standouts as Secc Jimmie, Top Gun, Bella St. Mary, who won a good race on the coast last week.

Other entries include Gold Note, who finished close in last week's quarter horse feature.
