

Excerpts from Mrs. Wedel's inspiring talk, which Mrs. Longabaugh praised highly, are reprinted below: "People have come to realize that science, education and technology, wonderful as they are, will not solve the basic problem of how people get along with each other," Mrs. Wedel said. She attributed the "back to the church" movement to a disillusionment with science and other modern-day gods evident since World War II. "Evidence of the fact that people are now beginning to take religion seriously has been demonstrated in the upswing of church attendance, Bible study and evangelism," she said. Mrs. Wedel praised the movement towards unity of Christian Churches as a "force for world relief and rehabilitation." Uniting to exert the influence of Christianity," she said, "will promote real progress toward world peace."



No insecticide has been fully effective in controlling this sucking insect that thrives on the leaves, basal stems, and roots of the alfalfa. The presence of the aphid makes it exceedingly hard to establish a new stand of alfalfa and it reduces the vigor of an old stand. Growers are using Malathion and Benzene Hexachloride with varied results. Some growers are trying diesel fuel in the spray. At present, Malathion seems to be giving better control than Benzene Hexachloride, but even that is not too good. Parathion can also be

used, but the grower should use proper precautions.

Farmers in the Pecos Valley are trying diesel fuel in the irrigation water and even burning to control the green aphid.
