Development Of Eagle Creek As Water Supply For Three Lincoln County Communities Is Declared Feasible In Engineers' Study

Additional Water Supply General There are two principal sources from which Ruidoso can secure a supply of water to meet its present needs. One of these is a series of wells and the other is Eagle Creek. Water Supply Wells for Ruidoso: The U. S. Geological Survey, in cooperation with the New Mexico State Engineer and the New Mexico State Board of Mines, made a reconnaissance study of ground water in the vicinity of Ruidoso in 1943; and they concluded that adequate supplies both in original conditions and in future formations exist in that area to provide the entire demand of the Village if required. Wells have been drilled in the valley between the lower Village limits and Hollywood, and they confirm the findings of the geological survey. However, this water is highly mineralized, having a hardness of about 700 parts per million, which is undesirable for domestic use until it has been softened. A water softening plant, with a capacity of 600,000 gallons per day, would cost about \$60,000. It will cost an additional 20¢ per 1,000 gallons for softening chemicals and other plant expenses, which will amount to about \$18,000 per year if the average flow of water is about 200,000 gallons per day during the next 20 years. Also, since the wells must be located in the lower valley, below the Village, it will require the pumping of all the water against a head of about 800 feet, which will cost about .15¢ per 1,000 gallons or about \$9,000 per year. The cost of wells, pumps and high pressure pipe lines with a capacity of 600,000 gallons per day will cost about \$120,000. This would make the total cost for construction, operating expenses, and chemicals amount to about \$800,000 during the next 20 years, which should be given consideration only if no other source is available. Eagle Creek: The most promising source of additional water supply seems to be Eagle Creek, which is a mountain stream rising on the Eastern slope of the White Mountains at an elevation of about 11,000 feet, and flowing Eastward to the junction with the Rio Ruidoso near Glencoe. At one point in its course, near Alto, Eagle Creek is only five miles north of Ruidoso. The Southern Pacific Company owns the entire flow of Eagle Creek in 1913, and since that date they have been diverting water Northward to points along their railroad north of Carriazo. However, since the Southern Pacific Company has now changed most of their locomotives from steam to diesel power, they no longer require that Eagle Creek water supply and have entered into a contract to sell their rights to Eagle Creek Water Community Water Users Association, consisting of Capitán, Ruidoso and Ft. Stanton, for the sum of \$10,000. This sale price also includes a portion of the pipe line, right-of-way, and title to several hundred acres of land. The Southern Pacific Company secured its water rights on Eagle Creek by Permit No. 782, dated September 6, 1913. This permit approved the diversion of 6 cubic feet per second (20,000 gallons per day) from Eagle Creek by the railroad company, with no prior rights except the superior contractual rights of Fort Stanton to 0.155 cubic feet per second (100-170 gallons per day), to be obtained from Bonita and/or Eagle Creek. The normal flow of Eagle Creek is insufficient to supply the permitted 6 second feet except during spring thaws and summer rainstorms. Chemical analysis of Eagle Creek water indicates that the water is of a good quality and will need no expensive treatment. (To be Continued Next Week)


