

## Two Traffic Deaths Occur **Un County Roads**

Traffic deaths totaled two last week-end on highways in Lincoln County.

William Franklin King, 29, 4827 W. Ninch St., Amarillo, who was a member of the Texas Highway Patrol, was pronounced dead on arrival early Friday morning of Eastern New Mexico Medical Center in Roswell, after a truck smash near Border Hill, 27 miles west of Roswell.

King was pinned between the steering column and top of the cab, and apparently was killed instantly. Body was discovered by two passing Atlas Van Line truckers, Robert Becker and A. J. Thempson; both of Chicago, at 4:45

The 1956 2-ton Dodge truck King was driving was headed east on U. S. Highway 70-380 when the truck rate off the road to the right for 378 feet. King attempted to whip back, went up an embankment, struck a culvert and the truck flipped over on its top. King suffered a crushed chest. An inquest was acheduled for Friday afternoon in Hondo, the fatal
