## DISTRICT FEDERATION PRESIDENT URGES SUPPORT OF SENATE BILL DEFINING STATE COMMUNITY PROPERTY

Mrs. M. R. Baumgartner of Alamogordo, president of Fourth District New Mexico Federation of Women's Clubs has just returned from Santa Fe where she attended a board meeting of the state organization. Senate Bill 87, the Community Property Bill, was the legislation endorsed for active support by the entire membership of nearly 8,000 women at their state convention.

"With New Mexico growing by leaps and bounds, it is essential that our inheritance laws be modernized," stated Mrs. Baumgartner. "Our women must have the same right that their husbands now have to will their half of the community property. And if their husbands die without a will, they must not have their property tied up in probate and wasted through administration, but should be able to continue to care for their children as well as possible despite the death of the breadwinner. Our women want only to maintain the unity and integrity of the family."




