### The County Agent Reports

March Last Month  
New Mexico wool growers who desire to participate in the national wool incentive program for 1969 must file applications before April 30, 1969.  
According to Jack Ruttie, sheep

and wool marketing specialists with the New Mexico Wool Growers' Association, the program will run from April 1, 1969 to March 31, 1970 and is available for application forms and details are available at county ASC offices.

The incentive price for shorn wool has been set at 65 cents per pound. The rate for payment is based on the national average price received for wool by all growers. The amount of payment is then based upon a percentage needed to bring the national average price up to the incentive price of 65 cents. Payments are made during the summer after payment rates are determined from the national average selling prices. To be eligible, a sale must be complete. If any condition of sale is not settled by March 31, the sale can not be considered complete.

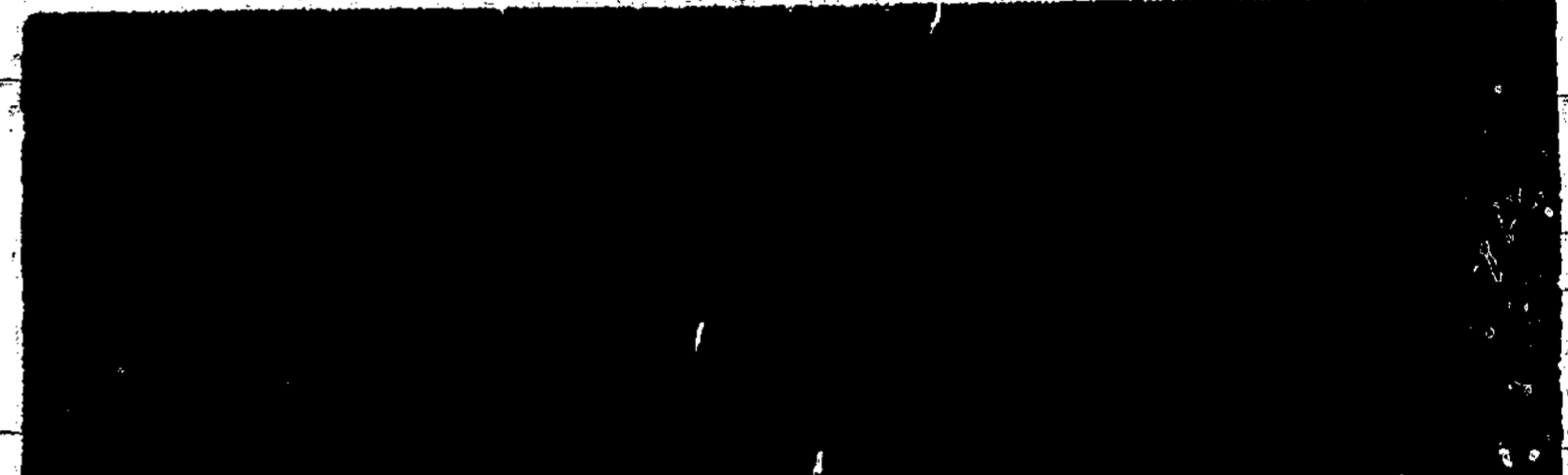

**Growth Of Area  
Is Reflected  
In CPS Expansion**  
Growth of Ruidoso in the last few years is reflected in figures reported by Joe Coe, district manager here for Community Public Service Co., who spoke before the local Rotary Club in its noon luncheon Tuesday at the O. E. S. Hall. Coe said in January of 1945 C. P. S. had 450 customers (or meters) and two employees; in January of 1950 982 customers and four employees; 1955 1170 customers and five employees and in 1960 1912 customers and 11 employees. Waitage used has also shown a similar increase, with 126,108 kilowatt hours consumed in January of 1950, 261,484 in 1955 and 451,330 in the first month in 1960. He said the company's payroll has more than tripled in 10 years, growing from \$1,150.00 the first month in 1950 to \$1,513 in January, 1955, to \$3,848 in the first month of this year.
