NEW SKI AREA HERE PUBLICIZED BY FOREST SERVICE

The U.S. Forest Service has just released a new folder, "National Forest Ski Areas, Southwestern Region," which tells about the 7 principal winter sports areas in Arizona and New Mexico — all of which are located entirely or in part on National Forest land.

The folder includes a key map of the 2 states, a photo and brief description of each area as to lifts, types of slopes, ski shop facilities, restaurants, and lodging accommodations. Ski safety rules are stressed and services performed at these areas by Snow Rangers and the National Ski Patrol are described.

The Arizona ski areas are the Arizona Snow Bowl, Coconino National Forest, Flagstaff; and the Mt. Lemmon Winter Sports Area, Coronado National Forest, Tucson.

Rough Fish Removed From Bonito

Bonito Lake was treated last week for removal of rough fish. With permission from the City of Alamogordo and Holloman Air Base, the work was done by the Game Department and many members of the Alamogordo Wildlife and Conservation Association.

Game Department participants were biologists Ralph Little, Danny Regan and Jim Harrison.

Ray Hess of the Fish and Wildlife Service was present on a Federal Aid inspection, accompanied by E. M. Lang, assistant chief of game management, and Biologist Dick Navarre. Lang and Navarre also assisted with the treatment of the water.

Rough fish killed by the procedure are being collected by WOA members and personnel of the Game Department.

The water will be stocked with rainbow and cutthroat trout when the rotenone has dissipated. Navarre estimates this will take about a month.

 FROM THE HILL CALLED GOLGOTHA. A great deal has been said and written about the "Seven Words" or utterances of Christ while he was hanging on the cross. There is a depth of meaning in these words that cannot be gathered on the surface. They are words for serious meditation. Three of these sayings were spoken to

God and four to man. The great price that the Christ had to pay that man might be free from the power and penalty of sin can be seen in these seven utterances from the cross. "They sing a seven-fold chord of the nature and cost of man's redemption. "The first "Word" from the cross was when Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34). In this prayer Christ intercedes for his enemies and persecutors. He became "The Mediator 'twixt God and man." We do not see anything of self-pity or bitterness in this prayer. Our Master did not complain of the gross miscarriage of justice nor did he say one word about the

seemed to ignore the pain of the crucifixion and prayed, "for them that despitefully used" him, and persecuted him. There is a lesson in this for us today: If we would follow the example of our Lord, we, too, must forgive our enemies. This is possible only when the Spirit of Divine Love is abiding in us. Christ's public ministry began with prayer when John baptized him in the Jordan river. Likewise, his earthly life ended with the prayer of forgiveness for his enemies. As Easter approaches, it is good for us to review the sayings of Christ from the cross and find it profitable as we come to a deepening of the spiritual life. (I). The word of forgiveness. "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do. (II). The word of assurance to a criminal who cries for mercy, "Today shalt thou be with me in Paradise." (III). In the third word, Christ utters the assurance of care and affection, "Behold thy mother." "My God, my God; why hast thou forsaken me?" are words of loneliness and despair that a sinful, unforgiven man feels with the weight of sin upon him. Christ bore sinful man's burden of guilt that man might know the joy of forgiveness and have the constant abiding presence. Now follow the words of suffering, "My thirst." Now, man's spiritual thirst is quenched by the "water of life," which he so graciously has provided. The sixth cry — "It is finished" — is called, "The word of Accomplishment." He finished and thus accomplished all that is needed for man's final and complete redemption. The seventh and last cry from the cross is the uttering of "Words of Commitment." Thus, he yielded up or handed over His sacred spirit into the safe keeping of the Father.

County Agent's Report

Wool sold last week in Roswell from 37c to 53c a pound on a strong market. Several wool sales are expected during the coming week and I would predict that many of the light shrinking clips will sell at over 50c a pound.

Shearing is in full swing in this area with over 70% of the sheep expected to be shorn before the end of the month.

to have it scoured and sell on the clean basis. This cuts the cost of putting the string on and the cost of taking it off.

Prepare to put the delayed dormant spray on your apple trees at bud swell time for miles, scale and other overwintering orchard pests. One of the more effective delayed dormant sprays is a lime sulfur-oil spray. Get your spray materials now so that you will have them when needed. For information on fruit sprays get the bulletin, Fruit Sprays for New Mexico, from the county agent's office in Carrizozo.




