Summer camp for Catholic boys and girls from ages 9-15 will be conducted again this year at Camp Villa Madona under the direction of the Catholic Youth Organization, it was announced today by the Rev. James Madden, camp director.

The camp is located in the beautiful Lincoln National Forest 15 miles north of Ruidoso in a wooded area about 8500 feet in elevation. Log cabins housing six to eight campers and one counselor are used for shelter. They have enclosed showers with hot and cold running water.

The camp is located at the foot of Mon Jeau Peak in the shadow of "Old Baldy", or White Mountain, providing a picturesque background of rugged beauty for campers.

The camp also has an area where tents may be pitched. The usual camp activities, athletic, hikes, crafts, camp fire sessions and riding are featured.

In addition, the camp program includes daily Mass and receipt of the sacraments. Father Madden will be in camp at all times. Nuns from the El Paso diocese will supervise the girls' program.

**MEETING SET FRIDAY NIGHT**  
A meeting of directors of the Chamber of Commerce set for Thursday night has been postponed until Friday night at 6:30 at the Chamber of Commerce building.

Seminarjans will help with the boys' program.

First session of the camp will be for girls June 11-15. The next session will be for boys, June 18-22 and alternately thereafter for eight weeks.

"The camp has a modern kitchen with good facilities, expert camp cooks using balanced means to provide meals of home-cooked quality and flavor," Father Madden said. "A registered nurse will be on hand daily to supervise a modern dispensary."

A hospital and resident physician and surgeon are located in nearby Ruidoso.

The camp fee is \$15 a week, which includes food and its preparation, lodging, accident and health insurance and adult supervision but does not include transportation to the camp.

### Village Trustees Study Airport Improvement

Ruidoso's board of trustees in a special called meeting held here Tuesday evening studied prior commitments and contracts signed in the proposed \$625,000 airport improvement project set up by the Robert Pearson administration, and decided, without a vote, to let the project proceed as originally outlined. It must still have the approval of the Federal Aviation Agency to go into construction, however.

The improvements, to include a wider, longer landing strip, a taxi strip, paved tie-down area, 15 new hangars and a terminal building, plus removal of some trees and some land leveling, are to be paid for through federal grants from the Federal Aviation Agency, through loans from the Community Facilities Administration to be repaid from airport revenues, and through sales of a \$67,000 general obligation bond voted by the citizens.

Village Clerk Jim Hine told the News there were no visitors at the called meeting. A discussion of some of the personnel connected with the airport engineering firm of Falow, Moore, Bryan and Fairburn, who will be here to expedite the project, was held in the meeting, the minutes revealed.



PROFILE OF A STATE

The flat prairie of southeastern New Mexico held little interest for the first oil scouts who visited there in the early 1920's. But when a wildcat well heralded a new discovery in a nearby Texas county, the oil scouts took a second look. And in 1927, Midwest Refining Company decided to drill. The well went below 4,000 feet and hit oil that tested 700 barrels a day. The Humble Oil Company followed with a 9,000-barrels-a-day gusher, north of the village of Hobbs, and the boom was on!

Today, gas pipe lines from southeastern and northwestern fields are supplying not only New Mexico cities, but Arizona, California and the Northwest — to the cash register tune of \$28,000,000 a year. And the value of New Mexico's oil industry has grown to more than \$300,000,000.

It has been a succession of booms since. New fields were opened, old fields extended. New towns sprang up, old ones expanded and doubled, tripled and quadrupled in population.



Pipelines are on the scene in copper production too. They return water from Kennecott's Precipitation Plant to dumps for recovering copper from waste rock. Using water again and again is one of many conservation measures practiced at Kennecott.

In northwestern New Mexico, there was a small boom in oil, too, in the twenties. And some development of gas to supply nearby cities. Then in the fifties, extension of gas pipe lines to California encouraged widespread wildcatting, and the boom of southeastern New Mexico was duplicated in northwestern New Mexico.

When I read the remarks in your WATERS concerning our airport, I couldn't help thinking of a letter I ran across the other day which I wrote the President of our Company in 1949, advising that we would soon be called upon to do, date to help keep our new hospital open. I went on to say that my brother and I had attended a council meeting two years before to try to help the councilmen persuade the people who were pushing the building of a hospital that the \$15,000.00 a year it was estimated it would take to keep it open would be a terrific burden on a community the size Ruidoso was then.

There were a few shaky years, but ten years later, the hospital was not only self-supporting, it was necessary to double its capacity, and the new wing was no sooner built than it became apparent to the Board of Directors that had better start making plans for further expansion.

Ruidoso has grown steadily for many years, but it started booming during World War II and hasn't stopped. It is very puzzling to me that with the fast growth of the Race Track bringing more people

especially with the tremendous start made by the Sierra Blanca Ski area this last winter, any element of the town could suddenly stop progress and exhibit a lack of confidence in the destiny of this town which is going to keep growing in spite of anyone's efforts to hold it back.

I certainly do not think any improvements made to the airport will be wasted.






