
Eugene W. Newton Funeral Is Held Here Thursday

Rainbow trout range in size from six to nine inches near the boundary of the reservation, and farther upstream it is not uncommon to catch fourteen inch browns. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service stock the streams as often as once a week during the summer months.
