


The picture of copper's contribution to the future economy of New Mexico was first seen in the laboratories of Kennecott's Research Center. Exhaustive study and experimentation at the Center developed new methods and equipment for leaching copper from mine waste dumps at the Chino Mines Division. What started as a scientific investigation is now becoming a mining practice reality at Santa Rita's Precipitating Plant. An enlarged water system is being installed to recover the copper leached from the dumps

by water that seeps through the waste rock.

When the project is completed, it will be a keystone in Kennecott's \$6 million expansion program to increase copper production in New Mexico. The new facilities will step up the production of precipitate copper by 45%.

The expansion program, aided by the Research Center, will provide added assurance of a longer life for the economic benefits that spread throughout New Mexico from Kennecott's operations,






