May 15 Deadline Asked For Action On Track Agreement


Ruldoso village board of trustees Thursday night last week voted a salary increase for city employees, settling on raises of a 6% increase for those earning under \$4,800 per year, 4% increase for those making \$4,800 to \$6,000 per year and 3% increase for those earning more than \$6,600 per year.
