to the base. Fair-Snow coverage not sufficient to cover all trails completely. some obstactes may be showing on any or all trails.

Poor-Many obstacles (bare spots, stumps, rocks, etc.) showing on all trails. Some lifts and some trails may be closed due to insul-

A. Trails and/or lifts may be closed at any time at the discretion of the management due to insufficient snow, difficult skiling conditions, or for any other reason the management deems necessary.

B. There may be times when all trails do not have the same conditions or the top of the mountain may not have the same conditions as the bottom. In this situation the report will be issued on the management's best judgment of the average conditions.

C. The New Mexico State Highway Department maintains the highway with the finest snow removal equipment available and as a result the highway conditions can easily change from bad to good within the hour.
