Opray when the resther warms, but before the leaves are unloided on decidious trees. This spray will control many the most troublesome pests of ornamentals, such as scales, spider mites, bud mites and blister mites some aphids and powdery mildew.

A delayed dormant spray should be applied during the time less buds are swelling until some green tips are showing. On broad-leafed evergreens, such as euonymous, the apray should be applied just as new growth begins.

Check weather forecasts before applying oil. Don't apply the spray if the temperature is predicted to drop below freezing within hours after application.

Choose a warm, calm day to do your "spinying. Never temperatures are below 40 degrees. So very thorough.
