New Fish Regulations To Begin April 1

year olds, mark the main changes for New Mexico's 1974-75 fishing license year, which

begins April 1. The changes, instituted by the 1973 Legislature, also license vendors' fees.

Trout stamps, required April 1 for fishing in trout streams March 31, 1975. and lakes, cost \$3.00 if they are to be attached to: a \$12.00 residents-only general hunting and fishing license; a \$5.50 resident town of Wiliamsburg. year-round fishing license or a \$10 non-resident, year-round fishing license.

affixed to: the \$1.00, residentsonly junior-senior fishing ense; the \$2.00 resident or nonthe \$5.25 five-day, non-residents orly fishing permit.

The trout daily bag and possession limit is eight trout of any species. There is a special size limit in Cabresto Lake and the lower Red River below the hatchery, where no more than two trout in the regular eighttrout limit can be more than 12 inches long.

The \$1.00 junior-senior fishing license can be purchased Ly resident anglers who are 12 or 13 years old or who are 65 years old or older. Non-residents 12 or 13 years old or 65 or older must purchase regular, nonresident fishing licenses.

The Fisheries Division of the Department of Game and Fish emphasized that the only legally unlicensed anglers are those who have not reached their twelfth birthday at the time of purchase.

A one-day license, formerly available only during the summer months, can now be purchased at any time of year.

The vendor's fee, is added to the license and stamp cost at the rate of 50 cents for licenses costing more than \$5.50 and 25. cents each for licenses and stamps costing \$5.50 or less.

Youngsters and oldsters who are both anglers and hunters can realize a small savings by purchasing a junior-senior license with trout stamp - \$2.50, including vendor's fees - and a general hunting license for \$9:50, including vendor's fees, for a total of \$12.25. The law requires a \$3.00 trout stamp to be attached to the \$12.00 general hunting and fishing license — a total of \$15.75, including

The trip to Secorro for Christine's first run was of course one filled with pride for the Halbrooks; one gets the impression that a 50-year railroader like Halbrook had just a tinge of mixed emotions about the event, and the rapid changes that railroading has undergone in the past few decades.

He recalled the four hours of filming as Christine took the huge train up and down the line for newsmen from every network and wire service to record the special event.

He recalled the days, years ago, when an engineer in his twenties was unheard of. "You would spend at least 20 years braking and shoveling before making the move to the righthand side of that cab," he pointed out. "And only a very few of the thousands working toward it, would make it to that

"Now you attend school for less than 10 months and learn everything you need to know about driving that train," he

But one thing remains clear in your mind after talking to Halbrook, if the change had to come, he couldn't be more proud that it happened with Christine.
