The accident marked the first fatal traffic mishap during the long 5-day Fourth of July holiday weekend and according to many long time residents, the first 4th of July fatal accident they can remember, happening in Ruidoso.

The accident, reported to the Ruidoso Police Department shortly after 1:30 p.m., involved Oliver's small foreign made automobile and a late model car driven by a 16 year old Denton, Texas youth. Neither the driver of the Texas licensed vehicle or the passenger in the car, also 16 and from Denton, Texas, were injured in the mishap.

Oliver reportedly was heading east in the outside lane of Sudderth Drive, over one hundred yards from the Carrizo Hill intersection, when he apparently swerved into the Texas car which was heading west. Following the impact the two cars came to a stop thirty feet from each other with the Texas car nearly facing in an easterly direction. The front of Oliver's car was totally mangled as a result of the impact.

The Ruidoso resident was pinned inside of his automobile for nearly twenty minutes as Ruidoso Police officers, headed by Ruidoso Chief of Police Paul M. Lukens, Jr., Ruidoso Firemen and other volunteers worked to remove him from the

wreckage. In addition four off-duty Ruidoso Police officers went immediately to the scene and assisted in traffic control as the heavy holiday traffic was backed up in double file for nearly a mile in both directions. Two New Mexico State Police units also assisted in the traffic control. Two Ruidoso Fire Fighting units were also called to the scene to assist in removing Oliver and because of the fire hazard created by leaking gasoline from Oliver's car. There was no fire nor was the equipment used other than as a precautionary

THE FAMILY LAWYER MISSING FACTS

Harry was the man who had robbed the supermarket, and jury found him guilty of the crime. Not until after the verdict did Harry's lawyer find out that two other witnesses told police Harry was 'definitely not the man.

Was this grounds for overturning the verdict? The prosecutor didn't think so.

"We are not obliged to do the other side's homework for them," he told the court. "If they failed to dig up this information on their own, that is just too bad."

But the court ruled that the verdict could not stand. The judge said the purpose of a trial is not merely to punish the guilty but also to fee the innocent.

This is a general principle of law, reinforced by the Canons of Ethics of the American Bar Association. A prosecutor must not suppress evidence capable of establishing the innocence of the accused.

The principle applies not only to guilt liself but also to the de-

A yellowing of ornamental plants at this time of year usually means that there is an iron deficiency in the soil. Known as iron chlorosis, this deficiency causes ornamentals to become light green, yellow or white in the areas between leaf veins. The more severe the deficiency, the paler the color, with acute shortage causing browning and eventually death of the plant.

Ruidese Dewns, Sunland Park Set Dual Race

A two-part quarter horse stake exclusively for juvenile fillies has been slated for Ruidoso Downs and Sunland Park.

The novel idea was approved. over the weekend during the meeting of the New Mexico State Racing Commission at Ruidoso. The race, billed as the Rui-

doso-Sunland Twin Sister Futurities, carries a purse of \$10,-000-added and is expected to reach a gross total of about \$150,000 in the initial runnings. "We feel there is a strong need for a race of this type, and our discussions with horsemen have

indicated enthusiastic support for the idea," remarked Ruidoso General Manager Richard Thompson. The new futurity also represents another unique idea-for New Mexico, at least-in that. horsemen need not indicate the. name or breeding of the nominees at the time of the initial

payment. In this regard, Thompson noted, the new futurity is similar to a successful format now being used at Hollywood

Park and Santa Anita. The first part of the Twin Sister Futurities will be run at Ruidoso Downs on July 1, 1973, The distance is 350 yards, the weight, 120 pounds. The trials will be

staged on June 22.

The trials for the second half have been slated for Oct. 20 1973, at Sunland Park, with the finale booked for Oct. 28, The distance for the Sunland edition will be extended to 400 yards. Track officials are projecting an estimate gross of \$75,000 for each half.

With the value being set at a fair market price. and property to be rendered at 33 1/3% of that value, after years of rendering the property at approximately 15% of the actual value, a good deal of confu- Mrs. Carl Janzen. sion now exists.

re-appraisal, therefore, should lighten the tax burden on many citizens who had attempted to pay their fair share.

No estimate can, as yet, be made concerning the rate of taxation per \$1000 valuation, but if budgets for political bodles (village, school, etc.) remain the same or nearly the same, taxes should remain at much the same level. Therefore, budgets for the county, villages and school will be exceptionally important for next year. Under state law the County Commission is not allowed to tax more than 20 miles with the state maximum set at 10, mills. This amount does not include bonded indebtedness, which requires a

With the reappraisal program scheduled for completion this fall, the all-new County Commis-/ sion will be faced with adjustments for the 1973-74 budget and i the County Assessor will be required to devote a great deal of time to keeping the tax rolls up to date. If some method of keeping county records current on property values is not found, within six months the reappraisal will be useless. A state provision has been made for the county to receive an additional to mill to maintain the re-appraisal program and this duty will fall to the assessor.

After the difficulties that the county has had in the reappraisal project, it seems that the end is now in sight, and, that the final result should be good for everyone,
