## School board issues call for bids on summer home

The Ruidoso Municipal School Board of Trustees issued a call for bids on the house built by the school building trades class as a part of the regular meeting of the board held last Tuesday evening at the school administrative offices. The house, a 24' x 40' structure with 996 sq. ft., will be sold to the highest bidder, with bids set to be opened at noon on Monday, June 24. The A-frame building may be inspected by those wishing to bid each weekday from 8 a.m. until noon and from 1 p.m. until 4 p.m. It was noted that this building is the finest that has yet been constructed by the high school class. It is located just east of the high school building.

A letter from Harry Wugalter of the state board was read to the board concerning the recently held budget hearing, on which the board was commended, and he noted that Johnson-O'Malley contracts had not yet been signed. It was reported that the budget hearing had required about 4 1/2 hours to complete.

A letter from Leonard Delayo was also read, dealing with the Career Education Mobile Unit for the Nob Hill School and other schools in the county. Funding for the project, which will be carried totally by the state, has not as yet been approved and a final decision will require that approval.

Budget transfers for both the 1973-74 and the 1974-75 budgets were approved.

Bids were opened on athletic equipment and the board voted to authorize Athletic Director

Doyle Howell and Principal Tom Hansen to study and accept the lowest and best bids. Portions of several bids are expected to be accepted.

The board voted to accept the resignation of Linda Bates, high school distributive education teacher; Linda Jenkins, high school aide; Linda Skellett, 2nd grade teacher; and Janet Kozlowski, 3rd grade teacher. All of the teachers sent letters of thanks to the board for being allowed to work in the system. Those hired by the board were: Cindy Paxton, 2nd grade teacher; Lana Vance Bailey, three-fourths contract music teacher; and Otto Temple, Nob Hill custodian. The music teacher position had been under discussion for some time and the board followed the recommendation of Supt. Pat Valliant in hiring someone for the position. Mrs. Bailey will teach classes for the 4th, 5th and 6th grades and a choral group for the high school.

A Johnson-O'Malley summer learning and experience program to be held in the Carrizo area for Indian students was approved. The project is funded by the federal government.

Pat Valliant and Trustee Dave Parks reported on liability insurance for school board members and noted that the state Association of School Boards was now preparing a blanket policy to cover all board members in the state. Parks stated that he felt that board members were not now adequately covered.

The board went into executive session, the purpose of

which was not reported, and upon their return adjourned. The next regular meeting of the board will be held July 16, 8 p.m. at the school administrative offices just east of the high school.

## Chamber sets 13 ads for June



Ruidoso's cleanup drive is progressing beautifully, village manager James Hine said Tuesday — and "That's the big one," village engineer Jack Kannady, Sr., said Tuesday, as the 125 horsepower pump was started to pump water into the pipes in the vicinity of the Gavilan treatment plant.

"The cooperation of private citizens in personally hauling debris to the storage area donated by White Mountain Development Co., north of the airport is gratifying," Hine said Wednesday morning.

In addition Hine noted "village crews are systematically covering the streets" and "countless truckloads of trash and debris" are being hauled every day.

The response to date indicates that the village will be unable to complete the cleanup drive this week," Hine said, "and, in view of this fact, it appears certain that the council will seek authority from Bill McCarty, of White Mountain Development Co., to make the collection site available for an additional week."

To follow up on the council's cleanup drive, Hine said, "If the public cooperates and assists the council in their efforts to keep Ruidoso free of unsightly debris, it seems logical that the governing body will budget funds to continue the endeavor." Hine suggested that perhaps extra employees could be utilized, once a continuing plan

is to provide debris removal for every street in Ruidoso is worked out. "It all depends upon how receptive the public is to the idea."

"WATER CONSERVATION is still as important as it has been and Hine noted that all residents "should continue to conserve water by using it for absolute necessities," until receiving notice from the village council that the water shortage problem no longer exists.

Hine noted an increase in water meter connections during the past five years of 888, in providing figures on water consumption in Ruidoso during YR. GALS. USERS

The relatively low figure for May of 1973 resulted from the abundance of snow the winter of 1972-73, with the spring runoff making a plentiful supply of water available.

"These 888 new water-users, many of them in tourist facilities in which the demand for water is great, coupled with the extreme drought conditions have resulted in this tremendous demand for water," Hine said, "and if every user in Ruidoso will conserve water to the utmost, there's a possibility we can get through this trying period with a voluntary restricted use program."

## Village of Ruidoso Downs solves water crisis problem

Mayor J. J. DiPaolo reported Monday evening, at the regular monthly meeting of the village council of Ruidoso Downs, that the water situation in the village now appeared to be in top shape following the tying-in of the Denton Field well to the water system. Water is now being pumped from the well and officials are looking into the possibility of setting a storage tank on the property. Earlier, when the village was running short of water, Charlie Denton had given the village permission to use the well as a supplemental water supply.

DiPaolo was in Santa Fe during the week to request \$6200 in emergency funds for the water department from the State Department of Finance. The village has purchased one storage tank to be placed above the existing tank and thereby assure water pressure to village resi-

dents living higher up the mountain above the village. The council heard a report on the fire truck ordered last year and were told that the new truck would be delivered Thursday of this week. Fire Chief Ray Walker went to Albuquerque last week for a preliminary test of the new piece of equipment and has noted that it is acceptable. The vehicle was ordered while Jay Posey was serving as Fire Chief for the village.

A plat of White Angel Mesa Subdivision, submitted by Earl Prior, was approved by the board. The subdivision is located near Biscuit Hill.

It was announced that a course in First Aid would be given on Monday nights at the Fire Department for anyone wishing to take the course. Darrell Stierwalt will instruct for the sessions.

The next regular meeting of the board will be held June 24, 8 p.m. in the village hall.

BUBBA CASCIO WINS SECOND TRAINER HONOR

Nicodemus jockey-of-the-week again

Three jockeys — Jerry Nicodemus, Jerry Burgess and Gary Sampter — fought tooth and nail all week for the Jockey-of-the-Week title at Ruidoso Downs.

But it was Nicodemus going home with the award for the second time in a row.

Nicodemus stung for five wins, five seconds and four thirds. His biggest effort came when he qualified for swinging in the finals of the upcoming \$358,705 Kansas Quarter Horse Futurity — the world's third richest race.

Nicodemus is now only a single notch behind the pace setting Jerry Burgess. The latter kept up a brisk momentum by posting four wins, two seconds and two thirds. Sampter struck with four victories, four seconds and six thirds.

Orona, who hold down the mid-section of the Top Ten, are also humming along. Each boasts a win average of 25 per cent.

In the trainer division, Bubba Cascio, like Nicodemus, won his second straight weekly honor. Cascio saddled four wins, four seconds and two thirds from only 14 starters.

Cascio is moving at a tremendous clip. He leads the pack with a 13-14-7 record out of only 32 starters. This means his win average is a thumping 20 per cent, and his in-the-money percentage is a staggering 52.9.

H. C. Werner, who's tied with Cascio in seasonal wins, is another sharpshooter. His win percentage stands at a robust 22.4.

Trainer Carl Wooten, despite Wayne Morrison and Larry punching out two wins over the

weekend, slipped back a notch and is now in fourth place. He was superceded by Bob Arnett. Racing action resumes Thursday and extends through Sunday. First post each day is 1:30 p.m. Saturday's highpoint is the \$4,000-added Flying Charm Stakes at 870 yards. Sunday will feature the \$25,109 Rio Grande Kindergarten Futurity at four furlongs.

Robert Kazmayer, the well-known lecturer and commentator, recently made a penetrating observation on our internal weakness. He said: "The real danger in the U. S. today lies not in Washington, but at the grassroots. Governments have always tended to usurp more and more power to themselves. In every free organization there is the seed of tyranny. That's why eternal vigilance is the price of liberty. The real danger in the U. S. lies with the millions who are apathetic. Democracy is going by default. Men and women are being promised, by their government, things — things which that government cannot deliver, not over any protracted period of time — for no government can go on promising more and more people more and more of everything, without telling anyone that someone has to pay the bills. Lulled into a false security by these promises men are exchanging their liberties, their initiative; their dignity, their heritage as free men, for a bunch of trophies, most of which are imported from countries which are already dependent on the U. S. for support. "There's no sense in kicking the government, as if it were something separate and apart from us. The government is what we make it by the public servants we elect to office. In late years, there has been a disgraceful increase in the "gimme" attitude indulged in by individuals, by local governments, and by various groups, all seeking special favors and benefits This represents the "get-something-for-nothing" psychology in its worst form. And it is exactly the kind of thing which starves freedom and fattens tyranny."

## HOW MUCH HOT WATER?

One of the items frequently overlooked when remodeling or buying a new home, is the capacity of the hot water heater. First notice of this oversight normally is discovered while under a hot shower when it turns ice cold prematurely. But, then it is too late. So, here's a short course on the subject.

The capacity of storage water heaters is rated in two ways and is usually imprinted on the nameplate of the tank. One number tells you the capacity of the tank, and the other number shows the recovery rate per hour. The sum of the two numbers gives you the number of gallons of hot water a tank can supply in one hour.

A tank of 30 gallons capacity with a recovery rate of 40 gallons will supply 90 gallons an hour which should be plenty for a family of five in a home with two baths and an automatic dishwasher. A family of four without the dishwasher should be able to get by on a 30 or 40 gallon tank with a 30 gallon recovery.

# Inside The Capital

By FRED BUCKLES

**RUIDOSO** — Primary elections set the stage for a slambang campaign for governor between Republican Rep. Skeen and Democrat Jerry Apodaca in the main event, Nov. 5.

Lincoln County number one Skeen of Pieacho, won 29 of the 32 counties en route to a convincing 2-1 victory over his nearest rival, Albuquerque attorney Jack Eastham, and two other opponents.

The vote was Skeen, 28,030; Eastham, 14,663; James Lindberg Hughes, 4,858; and Walter Bruce, 3,142.

Sen. Apodaca of Las Cruces won nine counties but he showed general strength throughout New Mexico. Apodaca compiled 44,606 votes to 34,368 for Sen. Tibo Chavez, Belen; 25,079 for Sen. Odie Echols, Clovis; 23,750 for ex-State Rep. Bob Mayfield, Albuquerque; 12,648 for Albuquerquean Drew Cloud and 6,519 for Santa Fean Boston Witt.

Santa Fean Tonya Anya edged Frederick B. (Ted) Howden of Belen for the Democratic attorney general nomination in an upset, 61,725 to 59,524. In the Democratic State Corporation Commission primary Charles Rudolph of Santa Fe ousted incumbent John Abraham of Santa Fe easily.

Espanola accountant Max Sanchez shaded Santa Fean Earl Davidson in a close race for the Democratic state auditor nomination, 58,388 to 55,599.

Ernestine Evans of Santa Fe won renomination easily for secretary of state in the Democratic primary over Betty McDaniel Lujan of Santa Fe. Edward M. (Ted) Murphy, the Bernalillo County assessor, won the Democratic nomination for state treasurer over two opponents.

Phil Lucero of Espanola, a Land Office attorney, was nominated by Democrats for state land commissioner over two opponents.

Sen. Bob Ferguson of Artesia easily won the Democratic lieutenant governor nomination in a 5-man field. Republicans nominated Rep. Virgil Rhodes of Albuquerque for Lieutenant governor.

Views of Sens. Apodaca and Ferguson are poles apart. But Ferguson will help Apodaca in Southern New Mexico to reduce Skeen's strength. Apodaca is moderate-liberal. Ferguson is conservative.

Skeen is conservative. Rhodes is moderate-conservative. Skeen challenged Apodaca to a series of debates on campaign issues. Apodaca will probably debate Skeen but arrangements will be made later.


Skeen will move primary campaign manager Jim Lee into a research assignment in the general election drive. Lee will look into environmental, land use planning and water resource evaluation for Skeen. A general election campaign manager for Skeen had not been picked.

Apodaca will retain Chris Brown as campaign manager and Richard de Uriarte as public relations director. He may add staffers.

Election results damaged Gov. Bruce King's prestige. Gov. King supported Sen. Tibo Chavez heavily. Besides, Bruce's brother, Rep. Don Kins, was upset by Ricardo Montoya in a Democratic primary for renomination in House District 45, (Santa Fe-Sandoval).

Chavez lost Santa Fe County. Gov. King's home, to Sen. Apodaca by a wide margin.

Bob Mayfield was a surprisingly strong fourth in the primary. Sen. Echols ran third but Mayfield was on Odie's heels. Echols said he will not seek a leadership post in the 1975 Senate. Odie is co-whip for majority Democrats now.

His Senate seat is not at stake after Jan. 1 if he is elected as governor. The general election campaign pits two aggressive, energetic campaigners in Apodaca and Skeen with strong convictions. The general election will offer voters a clear choice between Apodaca's liberalism and Skeen's conservatism.

Watergate is likely to play a minor role in the general election campaign for governor. For U. S. House seats Lt. Gov. Robert Mondragon, 33, is the Democratic nominee in District 1 against incumbent Rep. Manuel Lujan Jr., Albuquerque.

Rep. Harold Runnels, Lovinton Democrat, will be heavily favored over Donald Trubey, 34, of Portales, an Eastern New Mexico University professor. Runnels will be seeking his third term. Trubey is a conservative Republican in his first race.

Senate President Pro Tem I. M. (Ike) Smalley of Deming won renomination in the Democratic primary over Frank Luchini, Truth or Consequences electrical contractor.

Smalley is unopposed in the general election. Sen. Smalley, an attorney, carried Luna and Hidalgo Counties but lost Sierra County to Luchini. Skeen beat Eastham in Socorro County. Chavez edged Jerry in Socorro County.

Lt. Gov. Mondragon reported election campaign contributions. They included: Herman Tabet, Belen, \$260; Mr. and Mrs. Willie Campos, Santa Rosa, \$100; Mr. and Mrs. Steve Gonzales, Los Lunas, \$120; J. B. Martinez, Tios, \$155; Martin Vargas, Taos, \$150; Craig Vincent, San Cristobal, \$100, and Celso Tafuya Jr., Truchas, \$100. Mondragon contributions to May 13 totaled \$19,803. Expenditures amounted to \$19,985.

Mondragon is a Guadalupe County native. He attended Santa Rosa Schools.

Ruidoso's economy is favorable. The handle at Ruidoso Downs for the first 10 days of racing was up 20 percent-plus from \$2,109,255 to \$2,540,512. The Ruidoso population jumped from 2,216 in 1970 to about 3,800 at present, up 71.5 percent. Building permits, water connections, gasoline tax and gross receipts tax collections are up substantially.



**HER BROTHER'S KEEPER?**  
When Kate's brother became a widower, she moved in with him and took over the care of his household. Three years later, he too passed away. At the probate of his estate, Kate put in a claim for "services rendered."

"Although my brother and I never discussed money," she told the court, "I just took it for granted that eventually I would be paid for my work. After all, I didn't have to do it. I was not my brother's keeper."

## Your Social Security

"Most retirees bring in the necessary papers to start their claim for social security benefits, but we find that ordinarily an applicant for disability benefits does not," Mrs. Christine Graves, social security field representative stated today.

But the individual circumstances can make a big difference. In another case, a man sought payment for carpentry, painting, and cement work he had done on the house of his late brother.

This time, the brothers had been living separately, with their own separate families. In this situation, the court decided that the claimant could reasonably have expected to be paid, even without any agreement to that effect.

The extent of the services, too, may be a factor. A sister who took over the management of her brother's home also took over the burdensome task of nursing him. He was seriously ill, and needed almost constant attention.

After his death, a judge ruled that the sister was indeed entitled to wages for her efforts. The judge said that even for a loving sister, this was an extraordinary amount of service.

 Folks, as you will see I am gadding about again. Each time I go to my daughter's near Sacramento, California, I take a different route. I thought I was going straight from Las Vegas, Nevada to Sacramento, but I found I was 'side-tracked' and was to arrive three hours later at my destination. 

### THE PICTURE OF HEALTH

**WHAT IS A FEVER?**  
It's hard not to worry when your kids run a fever, but if you remember that a high temperature is not a sickness itself, you can begin to determine what is really wrong.  
The term "fever" is simply used to describe an unusually high body temperature. Although everyone varies a little, most people have a mouth temperature between 98° and 98.6° F.  
There are two ways to measure temperature. The first is to use a mouth, or "oral," thermometer. The second is to use a "rectal" thermometer which is put into the rectum—the body opening of the intestinal tract. A person's intestinal temperature is .5 to .7 degrees higher than his mouth temperature. Your temperature usually is a half-degree higher in the afternoon than in the morning.  
Although the rectal thermometer is most accurate, the mouth thermometer is usually more convenient. Leave a thermometer in for three minutes. Remember that hard exercise may raise the temperature in a healthy person to 102° F, and a hot bath may raise it to 100.4° F. A hot drink can raise your mouth temperature several degrees while a cold drink may

lower it for as long as an hour.  
What causes fevers? Part of your brain acts as a "thermostat" to control your body temperature by changing the way the skin holds the heat. Although there are many unusual causes of fever, the most common are infections which cause the body's "thermostat" to "reset" the temperature at a higher level. This is why a fever usually indicates that something is wrong in the body.  
Sometimes the causes of a fever, like a cold, are obvious. If you don't know what is causing the fever, you should see your doctor or clinic. The causes of a fever are treated.  
Should you treat a fever just to bring the temperature down? Yes. With children under five, temperatures of 104° F and sometimes even 102° F may cause convulsions or seizures. You can usually keep the temperature in a safe range by giving one baby aspirin for every year of your child's age every four hours. It is not necessary to bring the temperature all the way down to normal.  
If aspirin doesn't work, try sponging the child with plain cool tap water for a few minutes. In children over five years old and adults, it is a good idea to treat the fever since the high temperature causes uncomfortable chills, muscle aches and headaches. A fever is not dangerous in an adult or child over five unless it goes above 105° F.  
Aspirin, while it is the best medicine for a fever, must be treated as the powerful drug it is. People who cannot take aspirin can take a substitute called Tylenol. People with ulcers, for example, should never take aspirin, buffered aspirin, or most pain relievers sold without a prescription. People taking certain kinds of heart medicines must check with their doctors before using aspirin. Anyone with a tendency to bleed easily should avoid aspirin. And, of course, keep aspirin bottles out






