County growth steady

Lincoln County, with 1.7 persons per square mile, ranks 25th in population out of the 32 counties in New Mexico, according to a study released by the Bureau of Business and Economic Research (BBER) of UNM, Albuquerque.

The study, using round figures, discloses an 11.8% increase in population in Lincoln County from 1970-74.

The 1970 mid-year estimate was 7,600, 7,800 in 1971, 8,000 in 1972, 8,400 in 1973 and in 1974, 8,500.

The population change during the five years amounted to a gain of 900, with provisional figures showing 530 births and 275 deaths for a natural increase of 255. During this period the net migration was pegged at 650.

The Bureau of the Census reported a county population of 7,744 in 1960 which increased to 7,500 in 1970. The BBER estimate of the 1974 population was 8,500.

The Vital Statistics Division, NM Health and Social

Services Department listed 197 births in Lincoln County in 1960, 124 in 1970 with a provisional figure of 168 in 1974. The birth rate per 1,000 population was 25.4 in 1960, 16.4 in 1970 and 19.8 in 1974.

The population per square mile in the county was 1.6 in both 1960 and 1970 and 1.7 in 1974.

In the period between mid-1970 and mid-1974 the average growth in NM counties was 10.1%. Counties exceeding that percentage include Bernalillo 14.1, Dona Ana 11.6, Hidalgo 10.6, Lincoln 11.8, Luna 21.4, McKinley 14.1, San Juan 17.1, San Miguel 10.9 and Torrance 15.1.

Nationwide, according to the survey, the average household consisted of 3.33 persons in 1960; by 1974 the figure fell to 2.97, for a drop of nearly 11%.

For New Mexico the average household in 1960 was 3.75 persons, which dropped to 3.29 in 1974 for a decrease of more than 12%.

In the percentage of population growth, according to mid-year estimates, Lincoln County ranks seventh with a 11.8 increase. Sandoval with 30.3% lead all counties in growth, followed by Luna with 21.4, San Juan 17.1, Torrance 15.1, and Bernalillo and McKinley with 14.1.

Jeep Club finds boy

The disappearance of an eight year old boy Wednesday, resulted in an area wide search after the tad's mother reported him missing. The Ruidoso PD alerted the White Mountain Jeep Club and the search and rescue action was started.

John Harrelson, Jeep Club member, came across the boy in the vicinity of the Whispering Pines Restaurant. The tad explained that his "girl friend had lost her dog" and the two youngsters were making an intensive search of every place they could think of that the dog might have wandered off to.

In a separate incident Wednesday, Sgt. T. J. McBride and Ed Smith, FD member, captured a runaway youth in the Rio Ruidoso behind Mabley Real Estate. The youth had attempted to escape from a picnic group he was a member of.

Sewage operation checked

Two members of the Environmental Improvement Agency checked the operation of the Ruidoso sewage plant Wednesday, to determine if all of the rules and regulations were being followed.

John Wright, chief of the Water Quality Division of EIA of Santa Fe, and Hiram Muse, EIA engineer of Roswell, reviewed, Blair Halladay, Ruidoso sewer department superintendent, said, "our federal effluent discharge permit and found everything in order."

Halladay said that his department must keep daily records of the operation of the present plant, regarding discharge of the effluent into the Rio Ruidoso and that monthly reports must be compiled and submitted quarterly to the state and federal governments. The reports deal with the temperature and purity of the effluent, he said.

Wright and Muse, Halladay said, also met with village manager Jim Hine and the four discussed the proposed Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant that is now in the planning stages to serve Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs.

"Before we can continue planning this new treatment facility," Halladay said, "we must determine the present volume of effluent and come up with a close estimate of the volume once planned extensions of the sewer service are completed. I'm confident that this survey will indicate the need for a treatment plant not smaller than three million gallons and possibly as high as five million."

Blood Services unit here in July

"Blood insurance is good—but it can't help you if there is no blood available", Tony Bendzunna, of Blood Services, El Paso, told the members of the Hospital Auxiliary at their meeting, Tuesday noon, at the Whispering Pine Restaurant. He emphasized the fact that there is a serious shortage of blood available for all the needs in this area, as well as in El Paso.

The idea that El Paso has been supplying blood to Ruidoso for years and now they want it back, might leave us feeling a little cold. This is not, really, the case. For instance, we probably would have lost one of our valued teenagers last week if Blood

Services hadn't sent all the blood of the required type they had in order to save his life.

It would seem a city the size of El Paso would have more blood available, in all types, than would be required by one person. But, a city the size of El Paso also has tremendous demands of its own, including those made by critically ill people from other places who go there for help. The great advances in medicine, and the increase in operations like open heart surgery, the need for blood for newborn babies with RH problems, for people with the bleeding disease hemophilia, leukemia, serious burns and victims of accidents, put a heavy demand on

supplies of blood. Blood can't be "grown on trees" or manufactured from synthetics. The only source is the living human body. Therefore, people in extreme need are dependent upon healthy people who are willing to give of themselves.

Blood Services began in 1943 as the Salt River Valley Blood Bank in Phoenix, Arizona, under the sponsorship of the Maricopa County Medical Society. As the system grew, it became Southwest Blood Banks, Inc.; and when this geographic title was outgrown, it became Blood Services—operating community blood centers in 22 states, serving more than 800 hos-

pitals. Blood Services was a founding member of the American Association of Blood Banks in 1947, the Council of Community Blood Centers in 1962, and is an associate member of the American Hospital Association and a member of the United States Chamber of Commerce.

This is a non-profit organization licensed by the United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare, and by state and local authority when required. "Participation in Federal or state inspection and licensing programs is augmented by a rigid program of self-inspection and quality control." Believing

that blood money is not good, they stopped paying donors for blood—and they do not charge the patient for blood.

The charge, amounting to \$26.50 at present, covers the cost of collection, processing and distribution. There is a lot of laboratory work involved, and each facility is under the medical direction of a local physician who is compensated for his professional services. The mission of the community blood center is to provide hospitals in its service area with total service—24 hours a day, seven days a week—at the most economical rate possible. Where the patient has no way of ever paying the cost of blood needed, they write it off.

No subsidies are sought from fund-raising appeals, community funds or taxes.

Blood Services of El Paso proposes to send a mobile unit to Ruidoso about July 10 in the hope that healthy people in Ruidoso will consider not only the need, and the fact that they might, themselves, have a need some day, but the satisfaction of knowing that, with the help of modern technology, each pint of blood they give can mean life and health to as many as four other people!

To date, Las Cruces is the only community outside El Paso which is giving as much blood as it is receiving!

County airing medical facilities woes

The Lincoln County Commissioners Friday set a special 10 a. m., meeting today to discuss continuation of the present Intermediate Care Facility, which, it was suggested in a budget proposal for the 1975-1976 fiscal year be closed indefinitely, effective June 30.

In discussing the ICF's present staffing and budget, with the monthly cost estimate in excess of \$8,680, county manager Leslie Olson told the commissioners that keeping the ICF open "would be operating in a crisis situation" financially speaking.

The commission previously approved \$25,000, a budget item, for operating of the ICF, but Friday's assessment of the cost to the county was pegged at about \$52,000.

A budget to operate the ICF, based on 85% occupancy of 38 beds at \$550 per bed, per month, to produce \$213,180, was presented to the board by Olson.

Also discussed was a diagnostic and treatment center combined with an ambulance operation.

Olson told the commission that Bob Frankalucci, chief of the NM Licensing Division of Santa Fe, inspected the building facilities last week and noted that all corridor walls would have to be built into the ceiling area, that lighting fixtures would have to be enclosed in sheet rock boxes and a sprinkler system installed to provide one hour fire protection. The roughly estimated cost was pegged at from \$30,000 to \$50,000, by Olson.

The board then tabled action until the meeting scheduled for this morning.

In other action, the commission: —Was told by Jack LeMay, county road superintendent, that it would be "maybe over a year before an oil surface" could be applied to a section of Bonito road, on a stretch of less than one-quarter mile.

The commissioners will seek a firm commitment from the City of Alamogordo, in their 1975-76 fiscal budget on this section of road below Bonito Dam.

—Were informed that the ICC will, if the Rock Island Railroad shuts down present operations, try to provide services on a continuing basis.

—Took no action on the plan of the Mesalero Apache Tribe to return 2,400 acres of land to the reservation.

—Deferred action on naming a replacement for Hugh Stiles on the County Planning and Zoning Commission.

—Received a letter from Gov. Jerry Apodaca stating his "firm support for the completion and development" of the improvement of Highway 37, off of Highway 48 at Angus.

—Were informed by Bill Seelbach, chairman of the County P & Z, that a request will be made to have the government's comprehensive soil survey of Lincoln County "be done as a first priority in the growth area" of the four townships north of, and including, Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs. Seelbach also asked for \$1,500 in county funding for "inspection of culverts and other matters in subdivisions".

—Learned that the county's share of National Forest receipts, due to a drop in timber prices, would approximate \$21,369 or about 25%. Also that the estimated cost of construction of FS Road 8107.1, on Bonito Road, has been pegged at \$50,000. This section is located in the SE 1/4 NE 1/4, Sec. 12, T 10 S, R 12 E.

—Were informed that there might be no funding for the Concentrated Employment Training Act (CETA) personnel, now numbering five in the county.

—Determined that the commission should inspect Gavilan Canyon Road project prior to June 20, and at that

meeting to reassess the current road projects on a priority basis.

—Instructed county manager Olson to write NM's U. S. Representatives on the use of Revenue Sharing funds in the county, with the benefits

derived and needs of the future being spelled out.

—Voted to refer a proposed county animal ordinance, as suggested by Joe Truitt of the Lincoln County Humane Society, to the District Attorney's office for approval.

Directed Leslie Olson to meet with Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs village officials to reach an agreement on such an animal control ordinance.

—Ordered that Cablevision of Lincoln Co., be billed \$500 for damage incurred on Carrizo

Post, Bowser Store, Carrizozo Country Club, Nike Tavern, Silver Dollar and Coe Ranch.

—Ordered that the June 20 agenda include only final budget review and adjustments and a determination of road work scheduling.

Donna My Dear grabs Aspen

Donna My Dear, a 10-1 long shot ridden by Willie Lovell, gave fellow three-year-olds a lesson in pacemaking while gobbling up Sunday's fourth running of the Aspen Stakes at Ruidoso Downs.

The filly got the early jump in the six-furlong spin,

was allowed to coast down the backstretch, then responded to light whipping in the stretch and easily fought off the closing rush of Tamalie Pie and Arran Dunce.

And to really hammer home the victory, Donna My Dear stopped the clock in a sizzling

1:12 flat. This was only a single fraction short of the track mark.

Donna My Dear is trained by Derwood O. Beard for Roy Jones of Sunland Park, N. M. Those among the 5,320 fans who backed her in the betting were well-rewarded with pay-

offs of \$22.40, \$5.80 and \$2.40.

Tamalie Pie, still in second, had good reserves for the stretch and refused to be dislodged. At the wire, the filly held a 2 1/4-length advantage over Arran Dunce.

The gross Purse of the Aspen Stakes was \$5,625, and \$3,375 of that went into Donna My Dear's account. The stakes conquest came on the heels of a romping five-length victory.

Webelo and Yufala Pres, both stakes winners, were unable to fight their way toward the front. Webelo ended up fifth, and Yufala Pres, who appeared to have a rough journey, finished seventh.

Donna My Dear was originally slated to carry 114 pounds, but she was a pound overweight. The extra weight didn't bother her journey in the slightest.

Sunday's co-feature at 870 yards went to the sprint specialist, Requested Honor. The colt, totting Leroy Coombs in a hefty 124 pounds, cruised into the lead around the turn and zipped under the wire with a 2 1/4-length gap. His clocking of 45.66 seconds was less than a second off the track mark.

Norgo, the perennial 870 champ at Ruidoso, had his hands full this time and had to hustle throughout the stretch while finishing second. Requested Honor raced as the second-favorite and paid \$5.80.

"No matter which month she is married in, a bride should give us her new name so we can keep her social security card and her earnings record accurate and up to date," Hassen said. "Then earnings she had both before and after her marriage can be correctly credited to the same record. Earnings women have in jobs covered by social security will determine the amount of their future benefits."

"To get her name changed on her record, a new bride may call or write any social security office. Or, she may pick up a green "Request for Change in Social Security Records" blank at most post offices. If she will take her old card to a social security office she will be able to get a card showing her new name immediately," Hassen concluded.

Protect stone fruits from borers

Borer injury can kill young and old trees alike. Summer bark sprays or paints of lindane will prevent this injury to peach, plum, apricot, cherry and nectarine trees, says John Durkin, Extension entomologist, New Mexico State University.

In late June and early July, peach-tree-borer moths lay their eggs on the trunks of peach and other stone fruit trees. A coat of long-lasting insecticide on the bark when the eggs hatch will kill borers before feeding begins.

Durkin says home gardeners should use one

tablespoon of lindane, 20 per cent liquid concentrate, per gallon of water. If fruit is still on the tree, apply the mixture with a paint brush or a coarse spray to the trunk bark and lower limbs. Do not spray on fruit or foliage.

Also treat two feet of ground around the tree base and any exposed roots. Repeat application every 21 days until frost.

Signs of injury can be seen by digging dirt away from the tree base. Finding gum containing reddish brown droppings and sawdust indicates past or present borer action. A full-grown borer is a worm about one-inch long with a brown head and cream-colored body.

Last draftee reenlists

The last draftee in the 82nd Airborne Division now is a volunteer. Specialist 4 Robert T. Orr has reenlisted for six more years, according to Sergeant Doug East, local Army representative.

Although all draftees were authorized to be released from the Army in November 1974, Orr decided not to get out at that time.

"I just didn't think I would feel right if I would have taken the early out," he said. "But at that time I had no idea that I would be reenlisting and thinking of a career in the Army. Now I think my best chance of job security and a happy life is in staying in."
