Packaging materials should be
moisture－vapor proof，durable，leakproo and easy to seal and murk．Rigid ccn－ are suitable，as well as plastic bags with or without waxed cardboard covers，Glas canning jars with straight sides can als be used successfully
All vegetables，except green peppers，
should be blanced or heated before freezing．Blanching stops enzyme action and helps preserve color，flavor and Packages should be placed in the coldest section of the freezer for initial freezing Food should be frozen as quickly as only as much food as will freeze within 24 hoirs．This is usually two to three pounds for each cubic foot of freezer space． A readable labeland a current inventory date，the specialiststays．Foods which have been frozen for the longest periods of tim hould be used first．
