## Health foods misunderstood

The words "organic," "natural" and
"health" are often misunderstood or misused in our vocabulary, especially when applied to our food. All of our usual food supply is in organte form because it
comes from animal or plant sources comes ifrom animal or plant sources, agronomist at New Mexico State University. the organie form. Many are combinations of several foods that, when processed, are " altered in physical form but not in
chemical form. The combination is often
more nutritious than the separate
ingredients. The term grown" food means food or "organically been subjected to pesticides or artificia
fertilizers. Instead the food has bee grown in soil which the humus content may have been increased by the addition of organic matter, On the other hand, the producer may have depended upon the
native fertility of the soil even though it is often too low to produce good yields. The cost of producing food by any means
is increasing rapidly. To produce

have lots of flowers next season as well. The best time to prune any flowering shrub is imme tiately following its blooming period. This allows the plant a full year to grow new wood and set flower
buds for next year. Shrubs and trees which buds for next year. Shrabs and trees which
must be pruned regularly to control their size can be pruned by pinching shoots
during the soft growth stage. This will during the soft growth stage. This will
often eliminate the need for severe prunitg later on. Water sprouts and un-

easily before the tissue becomes woody. When you prune by pinching soft new

American forces since most of the vessels not destroyed were crippled, During the safety.
Two days later on October 13 another Rock. This was an even more disastrous encounter. The American flotilla was completely destroyed as a fighting force. Clarleton took control of Crown Point with
plans to beseige Fort Ticonderoga, but when he decided that winter was too close for an extended seige he pulled his forces back into Canada.
Such a stunning defeat was cause for urther despair among American officials. in the euphoria following the adoption of the Declaration- of Independence, the yoing badly on all fronts. Washington was not doing well on land, and the defeat on lake Champlain might open the new
nation to a massive invasion from Canada.

Such a situation could easily give pause to the more faint-hearted, but it also stiffened the resolve of those who
committed everything to the effort.

In the meantime, in Spanish New Mexico new efforts were underway to reform the structure was the creation of the "comandancia general" or the frontier military district. The commandant in this system was to report directly to the
viceroy in Mexico City. His powers were broad enough so that he could exercise broad and forceful direction and supervision in all military and related matters.
He was to concern himself with instruction and discipline of troops and virtually any matters concerning military defense.

Sounds pretty simple, doesn't it? All you have to do to win a trophy is ride through each section without putfing your foot down. However, if you've never seen an observed trials before, this year's Aspencade Cup competifion will convince you that this is a most domanding sport.

During this event you'll see the Southwest's best trials riders doing nearly uinbelfevable things with their moforcycles as they negotiafe the "nafural hazarads" and aftempt to "incur the minimum loss of points."

Trials scoring is simple. A "dab"[putting a foot down once] costs a rider one point; "footing" [more than two dabs, dragging a foot or paddling.] costs threie points; and a "fallure" [going out of bounds or stopping completely with a foot down, displacing a marker or dismounting] takes five points from a rider's score.

The illustrafions show the manner in which abservers in each section will indicate the status of each rider.

## Here's what trials are all about

What's this? Motorcycles with no Vr-o-oom, Vr-0.0-0-m? No dust? No racing around on the edge of control? Less than 10 mlles per hour? No helmets?
That's the way the first Aspencade Cup Observed Trials will be conducted this Saturday at Two Rivers Park.
Just what is an observed trials meet anyway?
As shown on the map below, the trials course consists of ten sections seldom more than 100 yards long. Each sectlon is a natural obstacie course. Rocks, logs, water
hazards, very steep hilis, off-camber turns, hazards, very steep hilis, off-camber furns, natural obstacle to challenge the machine and the rider's balance and coordination may be encountered in one of the sections. Trials competition is not run against the clock. Speed has no place in the events. Riders are judged on their skill. If a rider touches a foot to the ground (dabbing), even If he dabs more than twice, or drags a foot, or paddles with his feet, he loses thet or paddles with his feet, he loses three
points. If he gets his machine oufside the narrow, three-foot width of the section, or stops, or falls, he loses five points - a fallure.
Observed trials, one of the oldest forms of motorcycle competition in the world, is motorcycle competition in the
comparatively new to U.S. riders.
With land becoming increasingly scarce riders, observed trials is rapidi molocross in popularify. It has several factors in its favor.

It is safer than other forms of cycle competition. Riding is done at extremely slow riders wear no helmets while com peting.

It is quieter. Mufflers and spark arresters are required and a course marshal can propriate noise level it is so quit that normal conversation can be carried on without interruption.
It takes little space. Although a course may run from 2 to 15 miles, the 8 to 10 "sections" where competition is conducted seldom are more than 100 yards long.
Thus, observed trials appeals to the ecology-minded as it does not create noise pollution or scar the land, and it appeals to wives and mothers because it is much safer careening around a motocross course on the ragced edge of control A section, often called
iders, is a short called a trap by novice taining unusual hazards, such as loose rocks, water, logs, mud, sand, off-camber turns, steep hills to be negotiated both up and down, and brush. The entrance and exit are marked by two small flags.

Competltors may walk the course beforehand, checking hazards. Once on their cycles and past the first two flags, however, there should be no stopping.

Riders compete without helmets, not to response at low r.p.m. Throttle control demands a sensitive fouch.
There are four classes: novice, amateur, expert and master. Each rides an increasingly difficult course.
The map below shows only the layout for the expert competition on Saturday. The junior, beginner, novice, and powd courses will be through easier terrain
Competition starts at 10:30 a.m. under the president of the New Mexico Trials Association.
