groups. These additional foods should add enough calories to complete your food energy needs for the day. Children need enough food energy to support normal growth; adults need enough to maintain body weight at a level most favorable to health and well-being.,
Try to have some meat, poultry, fish, eggs, or milk at each
meal.

## OTHER FOODS

To round out meals and meet energy needs, almost everyone will use some foods not specified in the four food groups. Such foods include sugars, butter, margarine, otherfats. These often are ingredients in'a recipe, or are added to other foods during preparation or at the table.
