

'PINKY' JONES TO LEAD NEW POLICY DEVELOPMENT

Ken Cole resigns as Chamber president

The Reverend Ken Cole Thursday, in a surprise move, "stepped aside" as president of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, a position to which he was elected July 18.

Named as his successor, by the directors, was Roy L. "Pinky" Jones, first vice president and prominent Ruidoso Realtor and insurance agent.

Cole, elected first vice president May 16, succeeded Earl Scott, who resigned due to moving to Bakersfield, California.

"Due to the Chamber's present financial crisis," Cole said, "I believe my stepping aside will make a stronger case for solicitation of funds by having a business man instead of a professional man as president."

"There is nothing personal in my decision. I am making this move simply to strengthen the Chamber. I will remain an active member of the board of directors."

After being named as the new Chamber president Jones said: "Cole's resignation is being accepted with understanding appreciation. He literally stepped aside, not down, and his experience as a director will be beneficial as the Chamber develops new programs designed to better serve Ruidoso."

As president, new proposals to be explored by Jones and the directors include an expanded advertising promotion to attract skiers from a wider area and the development of new tourist attractions during April, October and November.

Prior to moving to Ruidoso in 1973, Jones had a varied business career in Lovington.

From 1941 to 1955, he was a coach and later a principal with the Lovington school system. In 1956 he left the schools to join Liberty National Bank in Lovington as senior vice president.

Jones was elected mayor of Lovington in 1967 and remained in that office until 1968.

After serving the bank for 18 years, Jones moved to Ruidoso and purchased High Country Agency, a real estate and insurance company.

"I left the banking business to come here," he said. "I felt there were more opportunities here and I've never been sorry."

A past president of both Ruidoso and Lovington Rotary Clubs, Jones is a member of the Ruidoso Multiple Listing Service and has served as Lincoln County Democratic chairman for two years.

He and his wife, Charline, have two children Mike 25, Salt Lake City, Utah, and Janet, 23, Albuquerque.

Christmas tree cutting area, regulations set

Permits for cutting Christmas trees on Snokey Bear District of Lincoln National Forest will be available at the ranger station beginning today, a forest service spokesman said.

About 2,100 permits for juniper and pinon will be sold on a first-come, first-served basis at a fee of \$1 for trees up to 10 feet tall. For trees exceeding 10 feet, an additional charge of 50 cents per foot will be assessed.

Instructions for cutting trees in the Ruidoso area include:

- No cutting outside the designated

area. Detailed maps of the site, located east of Ruidoso Downs, will be furnished with the purchase of a permit.

- Trees must be cut close to ground level with the remaining stump less than six inches in height.

- Each permit is good for one Christmas tree and only one tree is allowed per family.

- No cutting of trees on private land.

- The bright orange, adhesive backed permit should be placed around the tree base and firmly attached immediately after cutting.


- Do not drive off main roads.

"Normally at this time of year, the areas will be covered with snow with the temperature in the 10 to 30 degree range," the forest service spokesman said.

"You should be prepared for these adverse conditions with tire chains, snow tires, shovels and warm clothing."

If conditions warrant, only vehicles with chains or four-wheel drive vehicles will be allowed in the cutting areas.

Office hours at the ranger station, located on Highway 37, north of the stoplight are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., daily through December 23. The office will be closed Thanksgiving Day.

Chamber of Commerce taking Ruidoso's skiing attractions to Mexico

John Hobbs — honestly — was going to take a cooler full of fresh Sierra Blanca snow, duly preserved with dry ice, to Mexico to show our "south of the border" skiers just exactly how the powder on Sierra Blanca Ski Resort's slopes looks and feels.

Trouble was, there was no snow on Old Baldy when Hobbs, executive director of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, left Friday morning on his junket to Juarez, Guadalajara and Chihuahua to convince travel agents in those cities that Ruidoso's skiing facilities are second to none — and, as the southernmost skiing area in the United States, the closest to skiing Mexicans.

Hobbs indicated to The News that he

might even contact a few skiing Mexicans directly. That's why he wanted a supply of fresh snow.

"What I'll be doing," Hobbs said, "is promoting the ski area and our community as offering the finest attractions anywhere and pointing out that Ruidoso is the most accessible skiing resort to Mexico's skiers."

This Chamber plan to attract Mexican tourists to Ruidoso for skiing is being conducted under the auspices of "Foremost West" a promotional organization serving Nevada, Utah, Arizona, Colorado and New Mexico with local coordination through the Tourism Division of the New Mexico Department of Development.

Hobbs' trip, as a promotional venture, is supported by Lodger's Tax funds.

Civil preparedness workshop held here

Over 20 Civil Defense director/coordinators from across New Mexico attended a civil preparedness workshop Thursday and Friday at the Ruidoso Public Library.

Under the direction of Cruz Sedillo II, deputy director of the New Mexico Office of Civil Emergency Preparedness, the workshop featured speakers on subjects including nuclear civil protection, civil preparedness training, radiological defense, communications, warning systems, hardware, matching funds and the role of the Red Cross in disaster situations.

Attending from Ruidoso was emergency medical technician Ross Schwarz, representing police chief Paul Lukens; Les Olson, who is the county director/coordinator, and Bud Payne, county ambulance service coordinator and emergency medical technician.

Disaster programs prepared by Civil Defense were reviewed, and the director/coordinators were apprised of changes which have taken place in recent months. "Just because civil defense is one thing today doesn't mean it will be the same thing next year," Sedillo said.

Points covered in the seminar included:

- Twelve counties have been selected, subject to their approval, to receive an intensive 32-hour course in radiological defense, Chuck Starnes, state radiological defense officer, said. Ten of them, including Lincoln County, will be given what Starnes called "ra-dec boxes," containing equipment necessary

for communications in case of mass evacuations.

Under the plan being prepared for Lincoln County, hundreds of Otero County residents would take refuge in Ruidoso, the Hondo Valley, Carrizozo and other areas in the event of a nuclear hit in Otero County. There is less likelihood of a direct attack on Lincoln County, planning officials have said in the past.

Starnes urged that each county assign a "ra-dec" person, to be trained to handle the emergency.


He said, "Selling a ra-dec plan is like trying to sell a refrigerator to an Eskimo — people think that once we have a nuclear war, it's all over. But believe me, it isn't."

Firemen's quick action contains forest fire

Cooperative efforts between United States Forest Service and Ruidoso Volunteer Fire Department fire fighters Saturday morning contained a man started forest fire west of Cedar Creek Campground to two acres.

Firemen were hampered by winds gusting to 42 miles per hour but, Charles Mook, Smokey Bear Ranger District Fire Prevention Officer said to The News

today. "All of us worked together. It was a great effort and, due to the fire starting in a fuel break area, we were able to get it under control quickly."

The first alarm was sounded at 5:56 a.m., Saturday and the second at 6:20. The fire was under control before 9, though fire crews remained at the scene through the day to prevent any flare up.

The investigation into the cause is continuing, Mook said.

Ruidoso man's brother shot

Donald Gladden, brother of White Mountain Elementary School principal Mike Gladden, is in critical condition in an Andrews, Texas, hospital after being shot six times during a holdup last Wednesday.

Gladden, owner of the Gladden Motor Company in Eunice, was shot during a holdup of his business about 9 p.m.

Eunice law enforcement officials are investigating. The gunman used a .22 calibre rifle, striking Gladden once in the right hand, once in the right arm, twice in the chest, once in the stomach and once in the leg.

Mike and Sandy Gladden were taken to Andrews Friday by the Reverend Ken Cole, who said this morning, "He is still in critical condition, although he was improving Sunday . . . The family asks for prayers from concerned friends."

Eunice Police Chief Haclon Howell said Gladden pursued a man who entered his business establishment, took a money bag and ran. When Gladden had nearly caught up with the gunman, he was shot. Wounded, he went back to the service station and called his wife, who brought help, the chief said.

tor/coordinators were outlined by Christine Unger and John Benton, educational specialists with the regional office in Albuquerque.

Courses available include a correspondence course in civil defense, a more advanced program of home study, two courses at Staff College in Battle Creek, Michigan, covering use of the media and international situations, and intensive courses given periodically in the state on particular aspects of civil preparedness.

Joe Seilar of the Santa Fe state office explained the communications network

which has been set up to handle national disasters. He said the National Weather Service will shortly install a nation-wide alert system for use in case of nuclear attack. Receivers may be placed in police departments.

Steps taken by the American National Red Cross to administer aid to persons stricken by all types of disasters were presented by John Rogers, state director of Red Cross disaster services.

Rogers, who in his 29 years of service has been at disaster scenes including the Teton Dam break, the Johnstown, Pennsylvania, flood, the Santa Barbara oil spill and flash floods in Corrales and Truth or Consequences, told stories of steps taken to find 1,000 hamburgers in a hurry

and of the dishonest means used by some "victims" to try to obtain aid for which they are not entitled.

Unlike its stand in past years, Rogers said the Red Cross will cooperate with other volunteer groups handling a disaster.

He distributed charts to the director/coordinators, showing the steps to be taken by governments and by the Red Cross in emergencies.

Other speakers covered areas including literature available to aid director/coordinators, means of obtaining funding and of "cannibalizing" obsolete equipment.

Participants were presented with certificates at the conclusion of the workshop.



Calypso's Search for the Britannic

The never-before-told full story of the mysterious World War I sinking of the British hospital ship Britannic—bigger and mightier than her sister ship Titanic and the greatest seagoing passenger luxury liner ever built until the Queen Mary—will be revealed by Capt. Jacques Cousteau on "CALYPSO'S SEARCH FOR THE BRITANNIC," the first "The Cousteau Odyssey" special to be broadcast over PBS this season, Tuesday, Nov. 22.

A program highlight is the reunion of 86-year-old great-grandmother Sheila Macbeth Mitchell with the remains of the Britannic as it lies today at the bottom of the Aegean Sea. Mrs. Mitchell was a 26-year-old volunteer nurse when the Britannic was struck and sank on November 21, 1918.

Invited by Cousteau to view the liner's rusted, encrusted hull some 60 years later, Mrs. Mitchell flew to Athens, Greece, from her home in Edinburgh, Scotland, and from there went on to join the Calypso team in the Aegean Sea. She travelled to the bottom of the Aegean in the Cousteau Society's diving saucer to view the Britannic in its watery grave.

Mrs. Mitchell recalls what life was like on the Britannic right through to the dramatic moments after the ship was struck and provides her reactions to once again seeing the great ship on which she had served.

The Britannic had been pressed into service as a hospital ship by the British during the First World War. Whether it sank because it struck a mine or was torpedoed was never known until Cousteau and the crew and divers of Calypso discovered and explored the Aegean Sea site where the Britannic lies.


Originally built as a luxury passenger liner, Britannic was repainted for its service as a hospital ship. The entire ship was painted white, with a deep horizontal green stripe and huge red crosses on her sides to clearly identify her for what she was. She had made five safe journeys through submarine and mine-infested seas, transporting 15,000 maimed and wounded British troops back to England.
