## editarial

Here in the land of wide open spaces and rich resources it's sometimes difficult to remember that the human race is adrift on a relatively tiny "spaceship" called Earth.

And, whether we consciously acknowiledge the fact, it is our obligation to see that our methods of sustaining purposes with the lives of the future inhabitants of the spaceship.

Either we consider the future, or destroy the human race by default. Or, as the song says, "the way I live determines the way my people survive.."

Rational and foresighted use of natural resources is not just a noble-sounding pollitical catch phrase. It's a necessity.
The plans by Slerra Blanca Skl area to drill a well for snowmaking purposes seem to be in accord with these goals.

The well, which is to be drilled above the resort near the North fork of the Rlo Ruldoso, would not appear to cause,much interference with the water supply to the vlliage, since the moisture would return to
shed each spring, in the form of melting snow.

The well would increase snowmaking capabilities by more than 400 percent, in acre coverage, and would termedlate and expert slopes located high on the mountain and expert slopes located high on the

The cost of the well - about $\$ 300,000$ - possibly could be recouped in a single year, in revenues to the resort. If natural snow doesn't fall. The benefits to the village economy are Indisputable.
Wells for snowmaking are not a new idea. In other resort communitles of the Rockies and the Eastern United States, they've been in use for years, with relative

The Forest Service shauld take a long look at the effects of such a well on the region's water table. Barring any extreme negative effects, as yot unforseen, the well would seem to be a natural - and environmentally Mother Nature for our economic well-belng during the winter months.

Tourism is perhaps the state's greatest resource, and making wise use of our other natural resources to insure process - and one that is vital to the present and the future of New Mexico. -GJ

been unable to meet the demand of the home buying market. The high annual Inflation rates of the 1870's have pushed the average price of a new home beyond
the means of many Amercans, especlally younger and flrst-time home buyers. While median fannily income increased by 39 percent between 1970 and 1975 , total housing costs for first-time buyers of new
homes increased by 82.4 percent over the same period.
Many home buyers unable to afford new and used single-family detached homes have turned to condominums as an
aiternative.
The most important single reason is The most important slngle reason is converted units, generally cost less to family homes.
A 1980 study by the United States League A 1980 study by the United States League percent of all home buyers natlonwide in
ig7s purchased condominium homes. The medlan purchace price of a condomintium
unit was 544,376 , or bbout 6.3 percent.less unit was $\$ 54,378$, or ubput 6.3 percentil.ess
than the median price of $\$ 58,000$ for all home buyers in the survey. Thus, condominiums because of their lower cost are increasingly the only way
some hoiseholds can afford to homeowners and not spend more than 25 percent of their famuliy income on housing. Other reasons behind the condominitum surge include increasing recognition of the
Income tax deductions allowed homeowners. A buyer cen even afford to purchase a home at a price that results in monthly payments for mortgage (prin-
cipal and interest) expenses, and property topases that are higher than his monthly payments would otherwise be. The reason is that the after-tax costs of home ownerseip can be even less than renting. to be the best Investment they can make in a tume of high inflation. Home values according to the National Association of
Realtors, have risen more rapidly than the rate of inflation in recent years. And as an investment, homes have oupperformed stocks, bonds, and almost
every other investment vehicle of comparable risk in the last 10 years. The importance of two-income household in stimulating demand for home
ownershlo. including converted conownership, including converted con-
dominiums should not be overlooked. A 1877 horne mortgage survey by the U. S. League found that in approximately 47.2 percent of all households, a second income
