## MAT, FOREST SERVICE, HAVE DIFFERENCES

# SBSR permit tension source

A special use permit for the Lincoln National Forest land on which Sierra Blanca Ski Resort (SBSR) is located was issued by the United States Forest Service to the Mescalero Apache Tribe (MAT) in September of 1963.

The permit wedded the ski area, the government agency and the tribe for a 30-year period.

Both local Forest Service personnel and SBSR manager Roy Parker readily admit that the relationship between the agency and the ski area has been less than harmonious through the years.

Lincoln National Forest Recreation and Lands Staff Officer Stanley Stroup prepared a brief history of the relationship which was completed in January of 1980.

Stroup wrote that on January 6, 1964 (1963-64 was the first year of MAT operation of SBSR), the Smokey Bear Ranger District noted that caretaker personnel were staying in the First Aid building at the ski area, contrary to permit provisions. The District then gave the area manager (Parker's predecessor) until January 10 to correct the situation or cease operations.

Paul Gordon, the present District Ranger, said that the MAT continues to resist him of the incident to this day.

Other problems attended SBSR in its first year under the MAT, according to Stroup's report. It states that in June of 1964, the then District Ranger went so far as to recommend that a permit termination procedure be started due to the MAT's noncompliance with the permit. The Forest Supervisor did not agree, however, the report notes.

This was the situation Parker stepped into when he started as manager July 1, 1964. Though a couple of problems in the first months are noted in Stroup's report, it states that "The 1964-65 winter operations appeared to have proceeded with considerably less problems than the first year, evidently due to better management."

Succeeding years did see discord between SBSR management and the MAT and the Forest Service, however, according to Stroup's history. Among the problem areas listed are: "jerry-built" facilities, season to season changes in site and development plans, an overhead power line which "Parker intended to put in without approval," and construction or installation of other improvements "without authorization."

Stroup's report summarizes a letter written in August, 1967, saying, "District Ranger feels that it is only a matter of time until venture fails and that Forest Service has been too tolerant in the past."

The report mentions a meeting in late 1969 between the Forest Service and MAT Tribal Chairman Wendell Chino. "Also discussed was the subject of replacing Mr. Parker as area manager," the report reads. "Mr. Chino said 'no' and announced that he wanted to get rid of the Forest Service from the ski area."

Problems continued well into the 1970s, with the Forest Service wanting to enforce the special use permit to the letter and the SBSR management acting without consulting the Forest Service.

In September of 1978, Gordon wished the post of District Ranger. Assuming to improve relations between SBSR and the Forest Service, Gordon decided to put an end to the "petty bureaucratic" nonsense. "We went to them and told them, 'we're not going to nickle and dime you any more,'" said Gordon. "We have since received treatment in kind."

Parker acknowledges that Gordon has made a good effort and that relations have improved.

An example of the less strict adherence to the special use permit under Gordon is summer operation of the gondola lift for sightseers. Though the permit states that the gondola is to operate daily from Memorial Day to Labor Day, last summer it ran Monday through Friday from July 4 through the month of August, according to Recreation Forester Randy Herzberg.

"To interpret that thing (the special use permit) as pure black and white—I just can't see it," Gordon said.

"You can't expect a document that's 19 years old to be current—it feels that a new permit would benefit both parties."

Despite improved relations, everything has not been rosy between SBSR and the Forest Service in recent years.

Since the summer of 1978, the agency has wanted to shift the system of figuring the use fee from a straight percentage of net sales to the Graduated Rate Fee System (GRFS), which is in force at all other ski areas on National Forest lands, is a system by which the fee is adjusted each year to reflect the kind of year the area has.

The permit sets a yearly occupancy fee for use of the land. Under the original terms, the MAT paid the federal government an amount equal to one-and-a-half percent of the annual sales plus other income of SBSR.

In the summer of 1978, the fee was revised to 2.26 percent of sales. For the fiscal year of May 1, 1979 through April 30 (the last year for which figures were available), the MAT paid \$74,350 to the United States Treasury for use of the SBSR land, according to Forest Service records.

Numerous other conditions are set forth in the 13-page special use permit document. These cover: fire protection, sanitation, lift safety, ski patrol, insurance, minimum operating schedule, ski school and parking lot snow removal, among others.

Advertising materials of SBSR are regulated under the permit, to the extent that they are required to state that the ski area is located on the Lincoln National Forest.

The permit also refers to a "Forest Officer in charge." In the Smokey Bear Ranger District, this position is called "Snow Ranger" and it is filled by Randy Herzberg.

Although the original special use permit places the snow ranger in a supervisory role, a recent change in philosophy toward ski areas on the part of the Forest Service has redefined the job.

"The main thing in the new direction is to give the permittee the responsibility for public safety, which puts the Forest Service in a monitoring role and not an inspecting role," said Herzberg.

Herzberg, who spends a couple of days a week skiing at SBSR as part of his job, pointed out that the shift in approach does not greatly affect the arrangement between SBSR and the local ranger district. "We've been operating in that sort of mode already," he said.

Herzberg also seems to feel that SBSR is fully capable of providing for public safety. "Their lifts—maintenance and safety—were in extremely good condition," he said. "They are very conscientious about lift safety. If I had to pat Sierra Blanca on the back for any one thing, it would be safety of their lifts and tows."

Another effect of the new direction was to remove the requirement that the Forest Supervisor approve the prices charged by SBSR for lift tickets. Herzberg explained that while formerly the area manager had

to justify prices by presenting a comparison with similar ski areas, the Forest Service would now enter into the pricing process only if it considered rates to be excessively high.

How much the historically discordant relationship between Sierra Blanca Ski Resort and the U.S. Forest Service has contributed (if at all) to the delay in expanding SBSR outside its original boundaries is difficult to say.

At least three other factors seem to have definitely played a part in the delay through the 1970s to the present. The attempt of the MAT to gain title to the land on which the ski area is located and the land into which it plans to expand; the inclusion of the expansion area into the RARE I and RARE II wilderness evaluation programs; and the inclusion of the area into a nationwide National Forest Land Management Plan will be examined in the next article in this series.

# Rodriguez not guilty in Sullivan stabbing

After nearly four hours of deliberation, an Otero County jury handed down a verdict of not guilty in the case of the state vs. Juan Rodriguez, 15, a child.

Rodriguez was charged with two counts of aggravated assault and aggravated battery in connection with the November 28 incident at The Place Arcade in Ruidoso in which 19-year-old Craig Sullivan's throat was cut and 20-year-old David Henry's left arm was cut in a fight.

The trial took place out of Lincoln County as the result of a change of venue requested by the child's attorney Gary Mitchell. The case was tried in a child's court under the jurisdiction of Twelfth Judicial District Judge Robert Doughty. Representing the state was Assistant District Attorney Weldon Copeland.

According to testimonies from Sullivan's friends and others at the establishment that night, Sullivan entered the arcade at about 11:15 p.m., November 28 while a verbal altercation was taking place between a white youth and a Mexican youth, both male. Twenty to 25 people were gathered near the scene, according to several testimonies.

"They looked like they were just about to get into a fight. Craig threw his jacket down and went to the crowd," said Zane Evans, Sullivan's friend. One of the people Sullivan pushed was Rodriguez, who pushed Sullivan back. According to testimonies from eye witnesses Evans, David Henry (friend of Sullivan's), Darin Smith (The Place manager) and Sullivan, that incident caused the break-out of the fight between Rodriguez and Sullivan.

"Craig (Sullivan) popped Juan (Rodriguez) square in the face. He continued to punch without return," Evans said.

Although the testimonies varied slightly in number, most of the witnesses said Sullivan punched Rodriguez approximately five or six times and kicked him in the chest area approximately twice, although Sullivan denied that he had kicked Rodriguez.

"I didn't push him (Rodriguez) in

violence. I was just trying to get through the crowd," Sullivan said in his testimony. "I hit him less than five times and I didn't kick him."

It was when Rodriguez was starting to go down to the floor that witnesses said he came back up with the knife in his hand. "I thought (Craig) (Sullivan) had been punched in the nose. Then I saw his neck was gashed open," Evans said.

At that point, "everyone got real radical-grabbing pool cues," Smith said. Evans described it as general havoc while the crowd chased Rodriguez and his approximately five Hispanic friends out of the arcade.

Apparently during the fight, Rodriguez never called for help or back-up from his friends. "There was no indication he wanted to end the fight," Evans said. "It was a 15 second fight. Juan didn't have a chance to ask for help. Neither did I," said Sullivan during his testimony.

Testimonies from all the witnesses were identical in that they all considered the fight a "fair fight." They also all stated that Rodriguez was losing the fight.

"Juan was not in danger of losing his life," said Jeff Nunnally in his account of the incident. "It was a fair fight until the knife came out."

Immediately following the incident in which Sullivan's neck was cut, Evans and Henry took Sullivan to the hospital within 15 minutes. "There is no doubt in my mind that he wouldn't have lived if they had waited much longer," said Dr. Paul Whitlam, attending physician.

In his testimony, Whitlam described the laceration as extending approximately two inches across the jawbone. Although the cut didn't sever any major arteries, enough small veins and arteries were cut to cause considerable blood loss which resulted in shock.

Whitlam also stated that the laceration caused injury to nerves and the salivary glands, resulting in poor control of the tongue and nerve functions in the lower part of Sullivan's face. Whitlam said he couldn't estimate how long Sullivan will have to put up with the situation.

Rodriguez's testimony was delivered with the help of an interpreter as he

doesn't speak any English. Originally from Juarez, Mexico, Rodriguez is an illegal alien and had been working as a dishwasher in a local restaurant. In his testimony, he said his mother still lives in Juarez, however he has lived on his own since he was 12 and has not seen his mother since he was 13.

At the time of the incident, Rodriguez was living in Ruidoso with approximately nine other people. Earlier in the evening of November 28, Rodriguez said he had been at the same restaurant in which Sullivan was working to visit a friend. Rodriguez testified that Sullivan had told Rodriguez and his friend that they should be careful because several people wanted to kick Rodriguez's friends out of The Place.

Rodriguez and his friends armed themselves with knives for defense and went to the arcade later in the evening. Rodriguez described the fight in the same way as other testimonies had indicated.

"I didn't have a chance to hit him. The punches kept coming. I felt I was falling. I saw there were more coming. I pulled it (the knife) to show them. I saw him coming and I stretched it out. It poked him and he ran to the bathroom. I guessed I cut him. I went out and ran towards the river," Rodriguez said, as translated by the interpreter.

The jury was charged with determining if Rodriguez was acting out of self defense in fear for his life, or if he intended to inflict great bodily harm on Sullivan.

In closing statements, Mitchell stated that the case was racially oriented. "It's 1981 and we still have a problem with race. The burden is on the state to show there was no self defense involved by a reasonable person. What would a reasonable person do?" Mitchell said.

Copeland asked the jury to find Rodriguez guilty on both counts. "It's easy to feel sorry for Juan (Rodriguez)," Copeland said. "But he tried to kill Craig (Sullivan)."

When the jury handed down their verdict, Rodriguez reportedly began to cry. One juror offered the youth a place to live and work if he can obtain a work permit to return to the United States. Rodriguez was sent back to Mexico.

## Developers need land use certificates

The village ordinance requiring that a land use certificate be obtained before a property owner makes any changes to undeveloped land will henceforth be enforced. Planning and Zoning Enforcement Officer John Cupp announced.

Cupp explained that land should not be altered from its natural state without the certificate.

"Before turning one shovel of earth or cutting one tree, a property owner needs to get a land use certificate," said Cupp. He noted that the ordinance applies to land that has not been previously developed.

The aim of the requirement is twofold, Cupp explained. Its first purpose is to protect the land and its natural features, such as trees.

Secondly, it assures that land will not be used for purposes to which it is not suited. The land use certificate requirement also insures that village zoning laws will be followed, he added.

Cupp noted that there have been instances of land being cleared and then left for long periods of time. Village officials plan to prevent this "scarring" of land from now on, he said.

Violation of a village ordinance carries a maximum penalty of a \$300 fine and 90 days in the county jail.

Land use certificates are available from Cupp at the Village Administrative Center.

Ruidoso Fire Department personnel put out the fire. Payne commended the department for its performance.


Besides burning out wood fixtures inside the restaurant, the fire damaged \$7,000 to \$8,000 worth of refrigeration equipment, Payne said.

The structure, which is a converted trolley car, was not seriously damaged.





# Ruidoso cagers take first victory in weekend split

Ruidoso High School's varsity basketball team hit the winning column for the first time over the weekend as it split a pair of non-district games.

Thursday night the Warriors romped over visiting Dexter 77-61 for their first victory of the season. However, Saturday night Ruidoso traveled to Artesia and lost a 81-53 decision to a strong Artesia team. Artesia jumped out to a 26-6 advantage in the first quarter against the Warriors. Ruidoso improved somewhat in the second quarter, scoring 15 points to 24 for the hosts. The teams played fairly evenly in the second half but the hosts had too big a lead for the Warriors to catch up.

Center Bill Richardson led the Warriors' scoring against Artesia with 13 points. Steve Sluder, a 6-3 forward, added 11 points for the Warriors and continued to improve his all-around game. Marc

Delhotal added seven points and guard Wade Wilson had 13.

The Warriors led almost all the way in their victory over Dexter.

Ruidoso took an 18-12 lead at the end of the first quarter and gradually extended it into the second quarter. With Richardson dominating the boards the Warriors increased their advantage to 58-41 with three minutes remaining in the quarter.

However a brief Dexter spurge closed to gap to 42-34 at the halftime break. But the Warriors started a scoring streak of their own early in the third quarter and outscored the visitors 16-7 to take a 58-41 lead. Ruidoso never had less than a 12 point lead the rest of the contest, as the Warrior fast break worked virtually at will.

Richardson led the Warriors with 24 points and Wilson added 16. Delhotal added 14 for the winners.

Coach Barry Nelson had mixed feelings about the weekend split.

"We showed some improvement against Dexter," he said. "But the Artesia game was the worst we've played this season.

They were good jumpers and out rebounded us very badly. We just weren't really ready to play against Artesia."

Ruidoso plays its next contest January 5 at Goddard of Roswell. The Warriors open district 3-AAA action January 9 with a home game against Silver City. Ruidoso also plays in a tournament at Dexter January 21-23.

If the proposed realignment had been approved Ruidoso would have been in the same district with schools like Artesia, Portales, Lovington and present AAAA member Goddard of Roswell. That setup would still involve a lot of travel expenses but not as much as it would be to go to Silver City or Cobre.

This year college bowl game schedule is one of the most attractive in recent memory.

There are a combination of traditional powerhouses and upstarts playing in many of the bowl games.

Washington and Iowa will meet in the Rose Bowl New Year's Day and neither team is a household name in their respective conferences. Iowa hasn't been to the Rose Bowl since 1959 and it, like seven other members of the Big-10, has been overshadowed by Michigan and Ohio State.

The Fiesta Bowl, featuring UAC and Penn State, has those big name schools to draw attention to it. While neither Penn State or USC had the record they usually have this year, they are still powerful teams and this could be one of the best bowl games of the holiday season.

Of perhaps the most interest to local football fans is the Sun Bowl December 26, featuring Houston and Oklahoma. Meither team has a great record but both have exciting, wide open offenses which should be pleasing to the fans.

Oklahoma has a poor record this year but it gave USC all it could handle before losing to the Trojans in Los Angeles early in the season. The Sooners' wishbone offense has a struck terror in the hearts of its opponents for at least a decade.

The Sun Bowl is known for inviting teams with exciting, wide open attacks and offensive oriented players. This year should't be any different. Look for the sparks to fly in El Paso the day after Christmas.

Competition wise there is little difference between the two setups. Silver City played Portales for the AAA state championship in football this fall and Portales won by a narrow 20-16 margin. Artesia has perhaps the most prestigious AAA record in the state but even it suffered a letdown this football season, finishing second to Portales in its district and losing to Aztec in the playoffs.

The real winners in the whole affair are the teams in district 5-AAA. These schools are generally in the immediate Albuquerque metro area and don't have to travel that far to their district games.

With travel and mileage expenses so much nowadays the 5-AAA school representative have to be wearing a big smile on their faces today.

For the rest of the state's AAA schools 500 mile round trips on buses will remain a reality for at least the immediate future.

"We played better than the first time we met them," said White Mountain head coach Dean Hood. "However, they were much improved. They're the best team we've played this season."


White Mountain defeated Holloman 41-17 earlier in the season at the latters' court.

# ComFIRE: fire danger wood shingles

Discussion concerning shake and wood shingle roofs in the Ruidoso area was the main topic at a short Committee for the Improvement of Ruidoso's Environment (ComFIRE) meeting Thursday.

Facts accumulated prior to the meeting stated that, in the case of a fire, there is a 120 percent greater loss factor to houses with wood shingle roofs than to those without.

According to some of the information collected by Ollie Cuddy, village fire prevention officer (FPO), the information "tends to say shake shingles are not that bad."

Committee members present also discussed shingles that can be purchased that are pre-treated with a fire retardant. Although the price of such shingles is approximately twice the price of untreated shingles, the treatment is supposed to be permanent.

Committee members also discussed fire brands that radiate from wood fires. These fire brands, when they strike other inflammable items, are often the cause of fire spread.

One thing Cuddy is working on currently is making sure there are enough fire plugs for each area of land in the village. He is also gathering additional information on the use of wood shingle roofs.

Other topics discussed relating to fires in Ruidoso were construction of the roof and the materials comprising it, and size of lots as it relates to both slope and density.

Herb Brunell, ComFIRE chairman, commended Cuddy on his work as FPO. He also expressed approval in the fire tour, sponsored by the United States Forestry Service in November in which several agencies were on hand to look over the potential fire dangers in the Ruidoso area.


"It alerted people to the dangerous situation here. I appreciate the efforts of all who attended the fire tour," Brunell said.

# The Dreamer

Early New Mexico Features Of Christmas Celebration

Before our English-speaking forefathers brought to these shores the Christmas tree, Santa Claus, the holly wreath and many other features of Christmas celebration, the Spanish pioneers in New Mexico had already been celebrating Christmas customs of remarkable charm and originality — some brought from across the sea and adapted to the frontier life, and others all their very own.

"Lighters of the way" Among these were "Luminaris" (Lighters of the way) to light the way to church for the midnight mass and also for Christ Our Lord to know the way that He might be present with His children at church, and also visit those in their homes far away from church.

One form of the Luminaria is now widely famous in the Southwest and in our country. However there were several different ways of lighting the way. The one familiar to us today is a paper bag, half filled with sand, with the upper edges firmly turned down, with a candle inside. Originally these were placed along the pathway to the church, and all around. Nowadays they are also used to decorate homes at Christmas season. There is a glowing message from these candle lamps which sends a light along its own, of faith and cheer through the night.

Another form of the luminaria was sticks of pitch pine stuck into the ground and the tips lighted, rustic candles, you might say, of the early times.

Perhaps the most striking of all was a great fire built on a high hill to be seen for miles around, a signal to all within its reach, to the sight that there was midnight mass to be celebrated near by.

The old timers in Lincoln County used to tell me that every Christmas eve there would be a great fire on the high hill just north of San Patricio, and that the Church of San Patricio itself was lighted all round with pine torches.

Surely the custom of the luminarias is something native to early day New Mexico and the South west — a land of small settlements, and widely separated homes surrounded by wilderness. This would not be so necessary in settled lands where everybody knew where the churches were.

The Manger Scene The pioneer Spanish in the southwest brought the "Nacimiento" (Nativity Scene) from the land of their forefathers. In New Mexico this Christmas feature, through the characteristic talent for originality of the Spanish and also the Indians — developed into works of rustic charm in a class by themselves.

Maybe one would be, as in the old country, of live figures complete with stable animals and the rooster. Another would be a room along the road or trail cut out of a clay bank, with the sacred assemblage inside in the form of figures carved out of wood (or maybe in a small cave up in a cliff the scene would be represented by clay figures, lighted by candles of pine torch).

One of the most striking are little shelters made of evergreen boughs, of every size and form.

Principal in the manger scenes are always the stable animals. For did not the animals welcome the Mother of our Lord when humankind had turned her away? They warmed the Infant Jesus with their breath on that cold night. And does not the rooster sing Christmas Eve at midnight, "Christo Nacio" (Christ is born) as he did when Our Lord was born?

So the early Spanish, through the Nacimientos, made room in their hearts for the Christ Child's Mother and for Our Infant Saviour Himself.

# Inside The Capitol

SANTA FE—Candid legislators will tell you that among their toughest constituents are those who represent universities.

Educators at the higher level fight for a buck with the zeal normally believed to belong only to a money-loving miser.

Sad to say, those who specialize in education in New Mexico at what is clumsily called the "post-secondary level" some times have even been known to fight just a little bit dirty.

Their representatives before the state Legislature are supposed to be the members of the Board of Educational Finance (BEF), which recommends how state funds should be spent for higher education on the basis of an abstruse formula almost nobody understands.

But the BEF has not in recent years been made up of a lot of dynamic leaders. Many feel that the BEF allows itself to be bullied by the presidents of universities in the state, as though the presidents' presumed superior prestige and their undoubtedly higher salaries reduced the staff of the BEF to a state of Ulah Heep-like humility.

There are occasional and fleeting signs that the BEF has begun to take itself seriously, but almost as soon as that spirit manifests itself one of its representatives, testifying before a legislative committee, turns into a bowl of Jello before our very eyes and destroys any notion that the BEF may be showing the muscle it was originally meant to have.

Most of those in higher education don't hesitate to go around, over and under the members of the BEF when they really want something from the lawmakers. Their lobbying is of the most offensive, overt and devil-take-the-hindmost kind.

And when university lobbyists speak, legislators listen.

After all, except at UNM and maybe NMSU, university folks are talking for the biggest "industry" in their home town. That payroll, not to mention what students spend in everything from laundries to

bistros, can well make the difference between a good financial year and a bad one for the community.

So when the universities show up in Santa Fe to discuss their budgets, the lawmakers are out in force.

Last week, for instance, when the BEF went before the Legislative Finance Committee, these lawmakers just happened to be in town: Senator Mickey Barnett (Portales), Senator Stephen Stoddard (Los Alamos), Representative Barney Barnard (Clovis), Representative Robert Corn (Roswell) and Representative Gary Robins (Portales).

Main reason so many East-Siders were here is that the BEF has a new funding formula for non-instructional aspects of the university system. That formula will cut the amount of money going to Eastern New Mexico U for non-teaching purposes.

Truth to tell, the formula will penalize that school a lot, apparently because its present administration spent too much in recent years on high salaries for administrators and for providing what some think are fairly luxurious quarters for them to nest in.

President Warren Armstrong, boss of ENMU, sounded a little sullen that day when he said he would go along with BEF's new formula, though he didn't for a minute accept its validity.

Armstrong has told his faculty he can now see no reason for cutting any of the from the payroll, though in the last time university funds got tight in Portales that is what he did.

But a cut of half a million bucks can't be easy for ENMU to absorb.

After all, cuts are not what the bosses of our institutions of higher education have accustomed themselves to. You would almost get the impression, from up here, that they thought the music (ever-increasing student bodies and ever-increasing student) was never going to stop.

For most of them in New Mexico, it has.

Dear editor:

"Apology"

As in an earlier date the followers of Christ were either defamed or complimented by the slang term Christian.

The First Apology of a Christian written 1841 years ago best expresses my own feelings.

It is our duty, accordingly, to allow everyone an opportunity to inspect our life and teachings, lest, by keeping people ignorant of our ways, we share the penalty due them for mental blindness. For if, after learning the truth, you fail to do what is just, you will be without excuse before God.

And among yourselves you do not punish accused persons before they are convicted; but in our case you treat our name alone as proof against us, although, so far as the name goes, you ought rather to punish our accusers.

And we have been taught, and are convinced, and do believe, that He accepts only those who imitate the excellences that reside in Him, His temperance, justice, and loving kindness, and all the virtues that belong to a God who is called by no given name. We have also been taught that He in the beginning did His goodness, for man's sake, create all things out of formless matter. And if men by their works show themselves worthy of His purpose, He accepts them, and we are told, as worthy of reigning with Him, delivered from corruption and pain.

Our coming into being at first was not in our own power; and in order that we may follow the things that please Him, He does Himself endow us with rational faculties to choose, and persuades and leads us to faith. We think it to all men's advantage not to be hindered from learning these things, but rather to be urged thereto. And the hindrance which the human laws might effect, the Word, who is divine, would have prevented, had not the wicked demons, taking as their ally the lust of wickedness which is in every man and leads him variously to all manner vice, spread many false and profane and irrelevant accusations against us.

As we said before, we are persuaded that our persuasion is prompted by evil spirits, who extort sacrifices and service from the unreasonable. However if you prefer popular notions to truth, do what you have power to do. But the power of rulers who value common opinion more than truth is like that of robbers in the desert. That you will not really succeed is declared by the Word, who of all rulers after God who begat Him we know is most kindly and just. And even as all men, following their father's advice, seek to avoid poverty and suffering and obscurity, so no good man will choose what the Word forbids us. That all these things should come to pass, our teacher, I say, foretold, He who is both Son and messenger of God, the all Father, and our King, Jesus Christ, form whom we take our name of Christians.

But we know it is not easy suddenly to change a mind possessed by ignorance. We propose therefore to continue a little further, in hope of persuading those who love truth, for we believe it possible to dispel ignorance by presenting the truth.

We warn you first to be on your guard, lest the demons whom we have been accusing deceive you and divert you from reading and understanding what we say. For the strive to keep you their slaves and servants.

enemies. And our endeavor is to persuade those who hate us unjustly to love themselves by the good precepts of Christ, that they too may become partakers with us of the same joyful hope of reward from God, the ruler of us all.

And let those who are found not living as He taught be recognized as non-Christians, even though they profess with their lips the precepts of Christ; for not those who make a profession, but those who do the works, shall be saved, according to His word: "Not everyone who saith to me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven, but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven."

### STOCKMAN BLEW IT

The published heresies of David Stockman, which show a side of the budget director most people never suspected, are very embarrassing to the Reagan administration, and will be a long-lasting impediment to its economic program.

Not to minimize the size of the error of Stockman's judgment, and the damage he has done his cause—both of which are great—but it is the sort of flub that frequently occurs when too much authority and too much responsibility is placed on youthful shoulders.

Even whiz kids have their weaknesses, and these often show up in startling ways when young people are carrying oversized burdens. There is no substitute for the seasoning that the years of experience eventually bring. It is painfully apparent to Ronald Reagan that Stockman doesn't have that yet.

As for the youthful director's confession of his doubts about his convictions, we would only say that time and experience will cure that, too. Stockman has been paying too much attention to his critics, who want instant curative results, just as they have been exacting instant gratification from the economy for two generations. That isn't in the cards.

The central error in Stockman's collapse of conviction is that he believes faith in the system is essential for its success. It isn't. The laws of the market are inexorable. They will work whether we believe in them or not. There's no escaping their results. In fact, that's why we're in the jam we're in today in America: we have ignored economic principles too long.

The laws of the market will work for us, just as they have worked against us, whether we "believe in them" or not. They're totally neutral in their results.

It is true that having a great company of believers would speed the reversal process. But it's totally irrelevant to the ultimate outcome—if the principles are allowed to stay in place.—Hop Graham, The Lovington Daily-Leader







## Disease infects Nam vets

Combat veterans of the Viet Nam war are subject to a disease called Delayed Stress Syndrome, according to the New England Journal of Medicine.

According to an article which appeared in the magazine, signs of the disease are feelings of anxiety the victim may feel with no apparent cause; irritable and impulsive feelings, again with no cause; nightmares and flashbacks which may wake the victim up during the night, screaming and sweating; mood swings from one extreme to another—from euphoria to deep depression; severe anger which may lead to violence; and a numbness and lost feeling.

According to Lucky Mulqueen, local resident and Viet Nam veteran, many people in the Ruidoso area are not familiar with the disease and are not sure how to handle it. Mulqueen and Bob Hagan, also a veteran, have offered their services should anyone feel they may be victims of the syndrome.

Mulqueen is available at 257-2798 while Hagan can be reached at 378-8393 at any time of the day.

Mulqueen says the main point he wants to get across is that victims should not feel guilty or should not feel their masculinity is threatened.

"It's not their fault," Mulqueen said. "Guys shouldn't feel ashamed or inferior, because it is a legitimate disease."

He emphasized that treatment is available to fight the disease. Mulqueen and Hagan offer their services to help in the interim to

get over an immediate crisis. The two have offered to conduct "rap sessions" to discuss such problems with both the veterans and the families.

"The families are confused and the victim doesn't know why he feels the way he does," Mulqueen said.
