GELDING COMPLETES ALL-AMERICAN SWEEP Higheasterjet captures All-American Gold Cup

Higheasterjet, rejected by the betting iblic in favor of Rule The Deck, dazzled s opposition in Sunday's first running of e \$966,120 All-American Gold Cup at uidoso Downs.

The mighty gelding came out of the starng gate like Joe Louis smelling blood, nd never gave his enemies a chance to itch their breath.

Even Rule The Deck, a 3-5 favorite, ever managed to mount a serious threat. he mare had to churn up the turf for all. he was worth in order to finish second. ueen For Cash got in third.

Higheasterjet earned \$483,060, which ushed his career income up to \$1,495,312. hat made Higheasterjet, once again, the chest quarter horse of all time -- easily irpassing the current earnings record of pecial Effort. The latter holds winnings of ,154,949.

Higheasterjet's awesome conquest of e Gold Cup had historic overtones, since gave him a clean sweep of the Allmerican series — his own version of a Triple Crown." In 1980, the gelding won e All-American Futurity. Last year, he ok the All-American Derby. Sunday's in neatly wrapped things up.

The gelding crossed the Gold Cup finish ne a length in the clear and stopped the 10-yard clock in 21.56 seconds, a seasonal ecord. The previous record of 21.67 was wned by Rule The Deck. No wind was lowing during the Gold Cup journey, Higheasterjet, ridden by W. R. Hunt, eturned \$6.60 to win, \$2.60 to place, \$2.60 show. The gelding is trained by Johnie oodman for G. D. Highsmith of La range, Texas. Rule The Deck, owned by Dirk Jones of atum, had to be content with the runerup paycheck of \$164,240. Jack Wallace as aboard. From the way the gelding exploded out of the Gold Cup starting gate, one could almost suppose he was out to gain revenge for his disappointing defeat in the trials. In front from the first jump, Higheaster-jet — with jockey Hunt flailing away with

the whip - ran a straight-as-an-arrow course near the outside rail. Almost from the start it appeared the big gelding was too good for his opponents. He was never threatened.

Rule The Deck broke in seventh place and gradually made up ground under urging from Jack Wallace. Although the mare closed gamely throughout, she could not approach the winner.

Queen For Cash, after breaking near the front of the pack, ran an even race. She held onto the runnerup slot most of the way, then conceded to Rule The Deck. Baby Hold On, a 13-1 shot, broke well but could not sustain her speed.

The Gold Cup was run cleanly and without incident.

Higheasterjet, a son of Pine's Easter Jet out of Alamitos Doll Two, came out of the Gold Cup with a record of 2-0-1 from three starts this year. Last year, Higheasterjet scored five wins from five starts.

The Gold Cup was his fourth stakes win. His list of credits now includes the All-American Futurity, Rainbow Derby, All-American Derby and All-American Gold Cup.

Higheasterjet will remain, at least for the immediate future, the world's richest

FILL MACKIS CUP, forced into a threefourths length defeat in the recent Billy The Kid Handicap at Ruidoso Downs, squared the record with Double B. Express in Saturday's Mr. Tattoo Handicap. The duel, covering seven and one-half

furlongs as a prelude to the Ruidoso Mile, offered a total jackpot of \$12,800.

On the strength of Double B. Express' conquest of the Billy The Kid Handicap (seven furlongs), the gelding was made a 6-5 favorite in the Mr. Tattoo 'cap. Fill Mackis Cup was relegated to the backup role at 7-5.

In the post-race interviews, jockey Hunt was asked to compare Higheasterjet with Special Effort. He responded this way: "I just think they're both greaf. I don't have anything bad to say about either one of them. Until they run against each other, I don't have to compare one to the other. I like them both so much."

Although careful to remain on the fence on this issue, he was nonetheless lavish in his praise of Higheasterjet. He went on: "Higheasterjet had never had the number 10 post position before. He was always on the inside. He was ready for the Gold Cup and was dead on when the gates opened. He wanted to run. I've always liked this horse. You really can't say enough about him."

Regarding Rule The Deck, Hunt observed: "She's a really good mare. She's never been beaten here this year except for that disqualification in the Classic."

Jockey Wallace, Rule The Deck's pilot, observed evenly: "She ran straight in the Gold Cup and tried hard. But Higheasterjet beat us quite a ways. I think he's probably the best in the world right now."

G. D. Highsmith, Higheasterjet's owner, said he had no idea his horse would turn into the sport's leading money-maker. "You outcome, he replied: "I was worried about Rule The Deck and Queen For Cash, but after any race so far. He's had chips in his

But the outcome was reversed this time as Fill Mackis Cup elected to stay on the lead most of the way. The four-year-old gelding opened up at the top of the stretch, just as Double B. Express was moving into high gear.

Also in the thick of things was Musical King, a 13-1 longshot, who appeared ready to steal the show. But just as the gelding was about to whip by Fill Mackis Cup, he veered in suddenly. Jockey Yickie Smallwood quickly straightened him out to avoid a collision with Fill Mackis Cup, but the misstep caused him to lose stride.

Fill Mackis Cup kept right on rolling and was a head in front of the onrushing Double B. Express when the two zoomed under the wire. The winning time of 1:34 3/5 seconds was only three fractions short of the seasonal mark. Richard Bickel was in the saddle.

Fill Mackis Cup, owned by Mack Yates of Cherokee, Texas, collected \$7,690 in his fourth win of the meeting and returned betting payoffs of \$4.80, \$2.60, \$2.20. Double B. Express, ridden by Casey Lambert under the top load of 122 pounds, earned \$2,816 (which pushed his '82 bankroll up to nearly \$28,000) and refunded \$2.60, \$2.20.

Double B. Express was only a nose in front of Musical King on the wire. The latter carried 114 pounds and returned \$2.60 to show.

Fill Mackis Cup was the secondhighweight at 119 pounds.

Airport Advisory Board hears charter gripes

The Ruidoso Airport Advisory Board (AAB) heard complaints from two charter operators about airport manager Tim Morris' charter service at the first meeting of the reactivated advisory group Thursday. The board adjourned without making a decision on the matter.

The AAB scheduled a follow-up meeting for Thursday evening at 6:30 at village hall. Board member Ben Hall indicated the AAB required time to review material in the airport dispute, and member Myrt Vititow recommended that the charter operators return with their argument this week.

The charter operators, Steve Hightower and Merle Miller, alleged last week that Morris is in a conflict of interest because he has his own charter service at the airMorris' salary is \$25,200 a year. Hine add- airport, isn't it?" Hightower asked. ed the salary is paid directly from airport

revenues. Roy Parker, who was elected chairman of the board in a closed session prior to the discussion of the charter dispute, told

Hightower the AAB is strictly an advisory group, and is thus limited in its power, he stressed. Also in the closed session, Morris was designated secretary of the AAB. His appointment conforms to the resolution creating the board.

At the start of the open session, Hightower interrogated Morris concerning his management of the airport.

Hightower asked the airport manager if the plane he leases for his charter service occupies hangar space that Hightower said recently became available. He asked Morris if persons on a waiting list for hangar space had been excluded from renting the space.

Morris replied that hangar space did

"That's correct," Morris said. He noted

that the real estate company was on a waiting list for airport office space for three years.

Hightower then suggested that future office vacancies be reserved for aviation and airport related services.

Continuing his questioning of Morris, Hightower accused Morris of pocketing the profits from vending machines at the airport.

Morris told the group he keeps the profits because he personally buys the vending machine supplies. Board member Wayne Dacy asked why the village is not responsible for the machines.

Assistant village manager Frank Potter, who previously was airport manager, told the board he also bought supplies for the machines. He said it was necessary because vending machine companies would not service them.

Miller indicated he also does not like the fact a councilman is part owner of Morris' leased plane, and that the proceeds from the charters help on the payment of the plane.

"Ruidoso has changed." Miller continued. "If we're asking for a multi-million dollar airport up on the mesa, some of these antiquated rules have to be updated."

Councilman Al Junge agreed with Miller. "The (vending) machine thing strikes me as odd," he said. He added that the practice is not "deeply ingrained," and can be changed by the council.

AAB member Ben Hall asked Morris how many hours he works per week as manager.

Morris said the council did not designate his hours, but he said he has worked seven days a week in recent months, at an average of 40 to 50 hours a week. Hall then said he felt Morris was fulfilling his duties, "as long as he manages the airport on a profitable basis." Junge noted that the village does not have to subsidize the airport.

Hightower concluded the discussion by asking the board to consider if any other department head would be allowed "to operate a private enterprise that associates with their job."

Members of the board indicated they could not answer the question.

Five great racing days set The next to last weekend of the 1982 running of the \$1 million All-American heat). For the All-American Derby, he

season at Ruidoso Downs gets underway Wednesday.

It's another busy five-day stretch with such high profile events as the All-American Futurity final round trials, the Ruidoso Spring Championship and the \$1 million All-American Derby included in the agenda.

Here's a day by day summary: WEDNESDAY — Three-year-old fillies travel 5½ furlongs under allowance conditions in the topper. The purse is a generous \$5,800. The cast is headed by the fastbreaking Tina Serina. During the recent Sunland Park season, Tina Serina used her frontrunning tactics to good advance. She scored against claimers in the \$5,000, \$10,000 and \$12,500 brackets, then added a win against allowance sprinters.

THURSDAY — The 12-race program includes 11 final round qualifying trails for the \$2,530,000 All-American Futurity. Each of the trials will be run at 440 yards. It'll be a case of running against the clock. A total of 105 two-year-olds will take part in the 11 trials, and those chalking up the 10 fastest times (regardless of finish) will earn a berth in the Labor Day finale. Yankee Win, winner of the prestigious \$728,085 Rainbow Futurity, goes in the third race. Chicks Etta Wind, the upset winner of the \$768,040 Kansas Futurity, drew into the fourth race. Mr. Master Bug, the impressive colt who took a close second in the Rainbow, is in the first race. Other stars included Dynago Victory in the fifth, Painted But in the eight, Speed Hemp in the ninth, Kita Blue in the 10th and Bartendress in the -11th.

FRIDAY — The main item is the \$76,000 Second Consolation of the All-American Derby. The winner collects \$9,700. The distance is the classic 440 yards. Tams Easy Native is the top qualifier at 22.37 seconds. Other standouts include Summer Encounter, Go For Bugs, Viva El Seis, Ponti Bar and The Heat Is On.

SATURDAY - The \$146,000 All-**American Derby First Consolation shares** the billing with the prestigious Ruidoso Sprint Championship at six furlongs. The latter is open to three-year-olds and up and offered a fattened-up added purse of \$17,500. In the First Consolation, such stars as Cute Investment and Rebelier will be slugging it out. The winner collects \$22,000. Cute investment is the top qualifier at 22.25 seconds, and is followed by French Jeans, 22.26; Ms Secret Cash, 22.26; The Pipeliner, 22.28; Miss Boogie Barre, 22.28; Rebelier, 22.29; Pfeffernusse, 22.31; Magic Gold Mine, 22.32; My Prime Rate, 22.33; Texas Viking, 22.36. The Sprint Championship is likely to attract such Ruidoso thoroughbred stars as Fill Mackis Cup, Double B. Express and Banquero. SUNDAY - The headliner is the ninth

Derby at 440 yards. The winner collects \$333,000. Much of the attention will be fixed on Special Effort, last year's historic winner of the Triple Crown for two-year-olds. Carrizo Lodge art director named

Ken Hosmer of El Paso, Texas, has been named art director at Carrizo Lodge, the second full-time art director in the 28 years since art classes were first established at the Lodge.

Previously an art instructor at El Paso Community College, Hosmer said he feels his new position is "a chance of a lifetime to build THE art school." The new art director's plans include offering classes year-round with nationally known instructors. He also intends to add to the schedule workshops in such fields as photography. ceramics and possibly theater.

Hosmer himself has experience in a variety of art fields, including oil, acrylic, watercolor and alkyd painting; as well as photography, printmaking, drawing, jewelry, ceramics and sculpture. He has a bachelor's degree in art education from the University of Texas at El Paso and has studied privately with several well-known artists, including Carl Cogar, Edgar

Whitney, Loren Janzen and Ed Bussard. Hosmer was hired as art director at Carrizo Lodge by Billy Taylor, executive vice president of the Odessa, Texas, firm which purchased the lodge last year. Taylor's wife. Connie, has been acting art director throughout the summer.

"We're really excited about Ken," Taylor said, "We have no problem turning over the program to him."

"We will be working closely with him to make sure the overall goal of Carrizo Lodge is met," Taylor added.

This goal, he explained, is for Ruidoso to be known in the art world as having the major art academy in the United States. To reach this goal, Taylor has planned a national advertising campaign and will put together a slide presentation for Hosmer to take around the country promoting Ruidoso and Carrizo Lodge.

An extensive renovation and development program begun by Taylor at the lodge is also expected to add to its reputation as a leading art retreat. Two restaurants are planned-a buffet to be open by Labor Day and a formal dining

room to be open later in the fall. A package store and gallery will be added and 90 condominiums are scheduled to be finished in November.

"We still want to maintain the original historic flavor," Hosmer assured. The Lodge is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is designated as a registered cultural property by the state of New Mexico.

In addition to appointing an art director for Carrizo Lodge, Taylor said he will hire a general manager, rentals manager and food and beverage director by this fall. By next year, the lodge should employ about 150 people to operate the restaurants, lounge and rental units, Taylor said.

He plans to promote Carrizo Lodge as a good vacation spot for families, as those not taking art classes can enjoy Ruidoso's other attractions.

As art director, Hosmer intends to promote the quality of the instructors who will be teaching at the lodge.

"'I think the art world is going to be hearing about Carrizo Lodge," Hosmer stated.







Warriors tough against Las Cruces

Head coach Darrel Stierwalt and the rest of the Ruidoso High School football coaching staff were generally pleased with the way the Warriors performed in a scrimmage with host Las Cruces High School Saturday afternoon.

The AAAA division hosts did "outscore" the AAA Warriors three touchdowns to none but two of the Las Cruces scores came against Ruidoso's second string defense.

The Warriors offense moved well against the much larger Bulldogs, especially through the air.

"I thought our offensive line did a great job pass blocking," Stierwalt remarked. "Particularly since their defensive line was much bigger than ours."

Las Cruces' defensive line has three or four players over 200 pounds and one man weighed around 250 pounds.

Against these giants, the Warriors' big-

gest offensive linemen were guards Craig Carson (175 pounds) and Chris Sanchez (175 pounds) and tackle Tony Stevens (170 pounds).

Despite the Bulldogs' size advantage, Ruidoso was able to move the ball inside Las Cruces' 20 yard line twice.

Senior quarterback Billy Woodul was effective throwing the ball for the Warriors. Woodul completed seven of 17 passes and had several dropped. One of his completions was a 25-yard pass to wide receiver H. R. Lueras early in the scrimmage.

The Warrior running attack was effective with senior halfback Grady Williamson getting several good gains. He was especially effective going inside against the Bulldogs.

Ruidoso showed a balanced attack, running the ball 23 times and passing 17 times. That may be fairly similar to the kind of attack the Warriors show during the regular season.

"We plan on passing a lot more this year than we have in the past," Stierwalt said. "We'll probably go about 60 percent run and 40 percent pass this year."

Defensively, the Warriors stopped the Bulldog running game well except for one touchdown run and that was against the second string.

Las Cruces gained some passing yardage against the young Warrior secondary but, on the whole, Ruidoso fared well against the Bulldogs defensively.

Williamson is the only member of the Warrior secondary who started last year. The other starting defensive backs are Mike Douglas, Lueras and Curtis Palmer.

"I was really pleased with their effort," defensive coordinator Ronnie Maskew said of his players. "They did a good job and hustled very well."

Ruidoso will continue practice this week. Saturday the Warrior junior varsity will travel to Artesia for a scrimmage. The scrimmage is scheduled to begin at 7 p.m.

NOTES-Palmer and Stevens are transfers from out of New Mexico. Palmer is from Redding, California, and Stevens is from Abilene, Texas. Second string quarterback and safety Cyrus Simmons had apparently the only injury by a Warrior player in the scrimmage. He suffered a twisted ankle while playing on defense.





easing among young people in the hwest. It's probably the result of an insive ad campaign that uses well wn sports personalities to hawk the use p-called smokeless tobacco.

However, smokeless tobacco can be rly as harmful as the kind that proes smoke," said Almeda Goolsby, Exsion health education project leader for v Mexico State University.

oolsby cited a warning recently lished in the prestigious New England rnal of Medicine by Dr. Arden Christen the School of Aerospace Medicine at ooks Air force Base near San Antonio,

)r. Christen's study included elemeny, high school and college athletes and ealed the widespread use of snuff and swing tobacco. One-third of those veyed chewed or dipped, or both. loolsby said Dr. Christen's study also

can show signs of leukoplakia, the technical name for wrinkled, thickened, white leathery areas or oral tissue associated with precancerous conditions. "About six percent of people with leukoplakia develop oral cancer," Goolsby said.

Not only does the smokeless tobacco irritate mouth tissue, but chewers and dippers tend to have greater tooth wear than non-users. Gums also tend to recede in areas where tobacco is held between the lower lip and gum. These facts are confirmed in Dr. Christen's research, Goolsby said.

"Bare tooth roots exposed by receded gums are more susceptible to decay and are more sensitive to heat, cold, some foods and certain chemicals. Also, tobacco that has been sweetened can actually increase tooth decay," she said.

"Tobacco products also decrease the

uff dipping and tobacco chewing are showed that a dipper or chewer's mouth user's ability to taste and smell bitter, salty and sweet foods. As a result, dippers and chewers use more salt on their food and tend to use extra sugar. The extra salt contributes to abnormal blood pressure and is a contributing factor in kidney disease," she said.

Tobacco juices, like smoke, contain nicotine, which is both harmful and habit forming. Nicotine is readily absorbed through mouth tissues and has a direct effect on the body's nervous system.

"Nicotine first causes users to become stimulated, but they may later feel depressed or experience a let down. To keep the stimulated sensation, a person with a nicotine habit needs a booster every 20 minutes or half hour," Goolsby said.

Nicotine affects the heart and other parts of the circulatory system. As nicotine enters the bloodstream, the arteries constrict, blood platelets clot. and the heart rate increases.







Inside The Capitol

SANTA FE - We New Mexicans are not such patsies as some attorneys would have you believe.

They imply that we vote in blocs, Anglos supporting only Anglos, Hispanics only Hispanics and Indians only Indians, but the facts don't bear that out.

That concept of the voting bloc seems to be the main justification behind the suit brought to kill the legislative redistricting the state went through this year.

Lawyers for the plaintiffs in that case appear to hold that members of any minority should be grouped together in voting districts. Further, they seem to hold that whenever that happens those same minority members will inevitably elect one of their own members to public office.

But that's not what New Mexicans have traditionally done.

Figures gathered by Tom Warson, a political consultant here, show we vote in all sorts of unpredictable patterns, which apparently have little to do with what minority or majority groups we belong to,

Warson studied general elections in the state since 1960 and discovered more than 270 cases in which the patterns the plaintiffs in that big federal case looked for did not occur.

Warson's basic technique was to score a county which has about two-thirds of its voters as members of one or another ethnic group as being dominated by that group. Then he looked at the ethnicity of the people they voted for.

One year of especial interest in this case was 1964.

In that year, Bernalillo, Curry, DeBaca, Eddy, Lea and Otero counties, all of which are Anglo-dominated, by Warson's scorecard, went neavily for a Hispanic candidate over an Anglo one. That Hispanic was Joseph Manuel Montoya, and the man he was outdrawing in

those counties theoreticians would say he couldn't carry was Ed Mechem.

That fact, that New Mexicans don't always vote the way textbook theories say they should, must be very memorable to Mechem, who is now one of the judges who will decide this case.

When Democratic candidates for statewide office were asked to list those who are responsible for scheduling their public appearances, two gave names of state employees, who can be phoned on state telephones.

That's not too smart, gang.

State employees are not supposed to be doing partisan political campaigning in any way in their on-the-job hours. You ought to be smart enough to know that. If you want a state employee as a scheduler, you should be careful enough to specify that he or she should be called at home. after working hours.

(Of the two people guilty of this indiscretion, one is running without opposition, so there isn't much anybody has to schedule him for.)

You might add to the remarks above about how New Mexicans break out of ethnic groups when it comes to electing people the observation Lieutenant Governor Bob Mondragon made during his deposition in that federal lawsuit.

When the implication was made that minority members cannot get elected from districts which are dominated by the majority, the LG said that plainly isn't true.

What is necessary in such an instance, he added, is for minority members to put together a coalition with others and to run on non-ethnic issues.

NOISE POLLUTION

A few years back, there was a considerable hubbub over what came to be called noise pollution. The hubbub has died down. Relatively little is said, now, about this problem which once aroused so much concern.

In those earlier times, much was heard concerning noise from street traffic, power mowers, construction machinery, chain saws, and so on. The whine and roar of jets over-flying residential districts near airports came in for a great deal of attention. For instance, during the controversy over allowing the supersonic Concorde to operate in this country, a central argument against the proposal was the Concorde's formidable racket.

Some efforts to curb noise had limited success. It is a fair guess, though, that the

budgetary restrictions. Also, there is the fact that interest in public concerns tends to wax and wane; without a few strong voices to maintain interest, the waning begins. As to noise pollution, the waning has been under way for some time. No one in or out of Congress seems to be speaking against it and proposing remedies.

Meanwhile, the noise goes on. Expert observers tell us that it can do both psychological and physical harm, in some cases permanent damage to hearing. Wanted: new anti-noise pollution champions. — Alamogordo Daily News

Traffic accidents are the leading cause of death and serious injury in childhood, taking more lives than any disease!



Children's safety is up to each of us. No one ever wants to be faced with the anguish of hurting or killing a child while operating a motor vehicle—people do need to think about it.

It is not as if there were a great demand for more work hands. Hundreds of thousands of older youths and young adults desperately are searching for jobs but can't find them. And it isn't as if youths of that tender age don't have more important things to do - studying for example - to better prepare themselves to meet vocational challenges of the future.

The Labor Department wants to permit younger teenagers to work until 9 p.m. on school nights and for four hours a day rather than three hours a day. They are now restricted to three hours a day for a maximum work week of 18 hours.

Pressure for the relaxed standards is coming primarily from the fast food and amusement industries. No doubt some parents would prefer to have their youngsters working rather than home or out on the streets in the evening. And modern youngsters probably favor the proposal because they would like to better afford their expensive tastes.

Yet the Labor Department is directing its efforts to change child labor laws at the wrong segment of the nation's youths. If outdated work restricitons were relaxed for 16- and 17-year-olds, part of the vast crowd of unemployed school dropouts and other young people truly in need of employment might have better luck finding jobs. —Albuquerque Journal

The subject of racial barriers in rock music is too large to. tackle in a single column, and there are those who will say that segregated radio and record sales are factors of taste rather than prejudice. But these three new albums illustrate different facets of the "musical ghetto" phenomenon (which applies to white ghettos as well as black), a phenomenon which started around 1970 and is getting more apparent every year.

The Bus Boys --- "American Worker" (Arista) - The Bus Boys is a predominantly black band (the drummer is a Chicano), which appeals mainly to a white audience. Their music is straight-ahead rock 'n' roll, and they poke constant fun at racial stereotypes. But don't expect to hear them on FM radio. On its second LP, the Bus Boys take tongue out of cheek a little bit, leaving off spoofs of the Ku Klux Klan and white flight and opting for more universal truisms. In a business of labels and pigeonholes, the Bus Boys are difficult --- if not impossible - to categorize. They run the risk of slipping

down the empty space between slots.

Donna Summer --- "Donna Summer" (Geffen) - Miss Summer, who began her singing career as the queen of disco, seems to have decided that the way to remain a superstar is to go for the "adult contemporary" market. Working with Quincy Jones, Stevie Wonder and other luminaries (some of them white), she has released an album that will transcend all color barriers because it is too glitzy, too produced to be associated with anything so basic or human as "soul."

Stephanie Mills — "Tantalizingly Hot" (Casablanca) — Miss Mills has a voice as impressive as Donna Summer's. But because she has been pigeonholed as an R & B performer, she will be


