Crime Stoppers versus drugs.
The word "drugs" in bold letters in a banner headline of the local newspaper figures to strike a responsive chord with readers.

Reactions might range from fear struck in the heart of parents with school-age children, to wincing from Chamber of Commerce or real estate types who would prefer our town's image untainted, to "right on" from those who acknowledge a problem and are glad to see something being done about it.

We prefer the latter.
"I think it's a very very serious problem here," said Crime Stoppers president Richard San doval, who suggested the organization target drug sellers by offering a reward for information leading to arrests and indictments.

The drug problem underlies other types of crime, Sandoval noted. He makes the point that selling drugs is a felony crime, and that it teaches kids who buy drugs to break the law.

Thus the target of the new program is the seller who supplies children-the person who is in a position to alter a child's life.
"I think if we can stop the drug pushers selling it to the kids ... then we will have done o tremendous service," Sandoval added.

Ruidoso can learn from the example of other resort towns-notably Aspen and lately Taos-that get stuck with the stigma of drugs. We are in a position to choose which way we want to go, and Crime Stoppers has taken a step in the right direction.-IP
