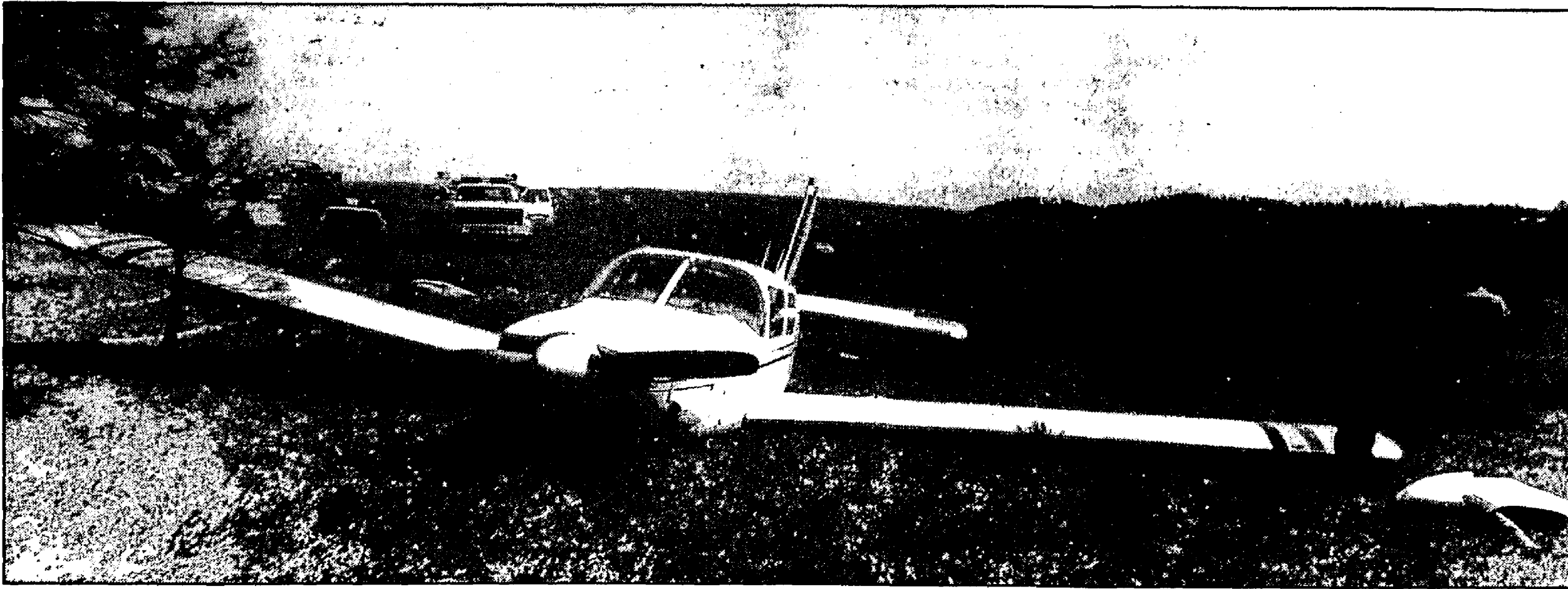

## Council declines Woman's Club purchase offer

Future plans for the Ruidoso General Federated Woman's Club building and for the Ruidoso Adult Recreation Committee highlighted discussion during a regular meeting of the Ruidoso Village Council Tuesday.

The council told about a dozen members of the Woman's Club, on hand for Tuesday's council meeting, that the building they have been using for 35 years is not for sale.

"We couldn't sell it for \$14 million," said Village Councillor Ray Dean Carpenter during lengthy discussion of deed covenants that preclude selling the property to anyone.

The organization was back before the council regarding a club resolution presented during the last council meeting requesting approval to purchase the clubhouse and establish a historical foundation and museum.

If the building cannot be sold, the club requested a 99-year lease.

Club president Charlotte Jarratt explained during the last meeting how funds generated by a museum would help the non-profit organization better maintain the building and serve the community.

Village Attorney Underwood reported that a deed search had revealed very stringent covenants regarding the transfer of the property in Skyland subdivision. Underwood said if the village transferred title of the property to

any other entity, the property would revert back to the original owners.

Underwood also said that he was reluctant to recommend that the village enter into a long-term lease because of a new state law on transfer of village property.

The governing body passed a motion asking Underwood to research the legal ramifications of a long-term lease, and instructing him to enter into negotiations with representatives of the Woman's Club. When an agreement is reached, Mayor White suggested that the matter be the subject of a special meeting.

Jarratt, speaking for the club, said the members need help because of mounting insurance and maintenance costs on the building.

The community is watching this very carefully," said Jarratt. "Again, we have no support," she added.

Councillor Jerry Shaw initiated a discussion on the Adult Recreation Department and the newly established Adult Recreation Committee (ARC). Shaw, an advisor to the committee, also served on the forerunning ad hoc committee, which was disbanded when the permanent committee was formed.

Shaw questioned the council on the status of recommendations made by the ad hoc committee. Items to be accomplished through funding from the last fiscal year budget included painting the Adult Recreation Center van, applying a sign to the van and installing a large sign to better identify the

center, said Shaw.

Items approved from the current budget included increased funds for postage and transportation, said Shaw. Those line-item increases were to be reflected in increased services, she added.

"It was my understanding that those things were going to be done," said Councillor Victor Alonso.

Hine explained that the van was

waxed rather than painted, and that the signs are being planned. Councillors indicated confusion as to whether services were to be expanded during the new fiscal year.

The manager provided councillors with a copy of a letter he had received complaining about the lack of transportation services for elderly citizens through the center.

## Citizen protests police actions

Don Hancock, owner and operator of Gypsy Train Barbecue, Tuesday told the Ruidoso Village Council of an incident involving the Ruidoso Police Department, in which he said he was "accused of stealing his own property," and later "ordered out of the police station."

Hancock's business is located in a trailer in the Safeway parking lot on Mechem Drive. He told councillors that the problem began when two police officers came to his restaurant Monday to check out a tip that the trailer was stolen.

"The thing was cleared," Swenor told the council. "Mr. Hancock feels that we should reveal the name of that complainant," he added. Jim Alston of the department said Wednesday that the names of sources are never revealed.

Hancock, who said he was rudely treated at the police station and asked to leave, participated in an executive session

with the council during the meeting. After that closed meeting Hancock revealed that Sergeant Mike Lovelace Tuesday had "screamed" at him and demanded that he leave police headquarters.

"I want Lovelace fired. That's the only thing that will satisfy me," said Hancock. According to Hancock, councillors took no action during the executive session.

In the open meeting Swenor revealed that the officer "has been chastized. I do not tolerate my people being idiots," he added. Swenor had no comment on the executive session.

"The incident is closed as far as we're concerned," said Alston.

"I'm pursuing legal action," said Hancock in a Wednesday interview. "He (Lovelace) has no business being in law enforcement," he added.

Lovelace was unavailable for comment late Wednesday.

## Clerk answers charges made last week

There are two (or more) sides to every story, said Fran Siddens Wednesday. The Lincoln County Clerk visited The News to tell her side of a story.

She provided a copy of her letter to Secretary of State Clara Jones in which she addressed charges made by Coleta Elliott, president of the Lincoln County Democratic Women's Club (LCDWC), and Charlotte Jarratt, past president.

Elliott and Jarratt issued a complaint Friday after conferring with Governor Toney Anaya and Jones in their Santa Fe offices. Their charges also were sent to the state Attorney General.

To charges that she has been reluctant or refused to train deputy registrars, Siddens answered that in an April 19 letter she encouraged registrars to attend an "update School of Instruction."

Siddens told the secretary of state of a workshop she held May 14, at Elliott's request for the LCDWC in which "eight people were instructed and given their packets and supplies."

"I did not pursue holding other schools at this time due to the busy schedules of everyone in Lincoln County during the summer months," the clerk continued.

The clerk related a conversation in which she told Jarratt that she would "give an individual a special school." Siddens said she told Jarratt "to let me know when she wanted to arrange this appointment."

To charges that she had refused to assign code numbers to deputy registrars, Siddens wrote:

"As I did not have my list of numbers available with me at the Democratic meeting, I informed all new registrars their code number would be supplied at a later date."

The letter stated that registrars were told to contact the clerk's office for the code number "if they did, in fact, register someone immediately." Siddens sent the

secretary a list of registrars on which she added code numbers.

Siddens was further charged with refusing to furnish registration materials to registrars. She answered that she had never refused to furnish supplies to registrars, but had limited the number because her office was running low.

Charges also were made that Siddens had rejected voter registration forms for inappropriate or no reason.

She answered, "There have been no rejections."

Siddens averred that the allegations "are unjust and unfair to me personally as I feel it is an attack on my integrity."

"They are unfair to me as Lincoln County Clerk as they reflect that I am partisan in my duties," she continued.

In an interview Wednesday Siddens said she was convinced the charges stemmed from the fact that the majority of registered voters in Lincoln County were Republican after she purged her records.

"I am going to attribute this to sour grapes," Siddens said. "I will not take that lightly."

Neither Elliott nor Jarratt had a statement when contacted Wednesday. Elliott, who said she had talked with the secretary of state earlier Wednesday, revealed that Jones told her the investigation is incomplete and ongoing.

"I don't have anything to add to what I told the governor and the secretary until Clara has a chance to finish her investigation and issue a report," said Elliott.

Jarratt, too, said she is awaiting the final report before commenting.

Tony Armijo, district compliance officer on elections, was in the Lincoln County Clerk's Office Tuesday.

"He brought back documentation," said Hoyt Clifton, director of elections. "Any statement would have to come from Clara Jones," said Clifton.

Jones was away from her office Wednesday and unavailable for comment.

## Diesel fuel is the culprit in well contamination

"There is an area in the aquifer around Hollywood well that is contaminated with diesel fuel," said engineer Jack Atkins Monday.

Atkins, a member of the engineering firm commissioned to investigate the contamination of the municipal well, had just finished speaking before an executive session of the Ruidoso Village Council. Representatives of the state Environmental Improvement Division (EID) were also included in the closed meeting, called to discuss threatened litigation.

"We do have a preliminary

report," said Atkins. "Due to the nature of the problem I had better not disclose any source," he added.

Right after the meeting, Mayor George White said EID spokesmen would make a statement, however an official statement wasn't provided.

Jim Edwards of the EID said councillors had formed a task force. "It will really be an action force," he added.

EID is responsible for the enforcement of ground water regulations, and is cooperating with engineers as they investigate causes of the contamination. Gary McCaslin of EID said their sampling is complete.

McCaslin issued a statement August 4 in which he reported that "there appears to be no immediate threat to public health."

"August 1 test results showed that the contaminant appears to be diesel fuel and some components of gasoline. The samples showed less than one part per million of fuel contaminants in the water," the statement continued.

McCaslin reiterated that although the water has been pronounced safe, there may still remain pockets of affected water.

"If you can smell it or taste it, don't drink it," he stressed.

Atkins explained that his firm is continuing core drilling tests. Once

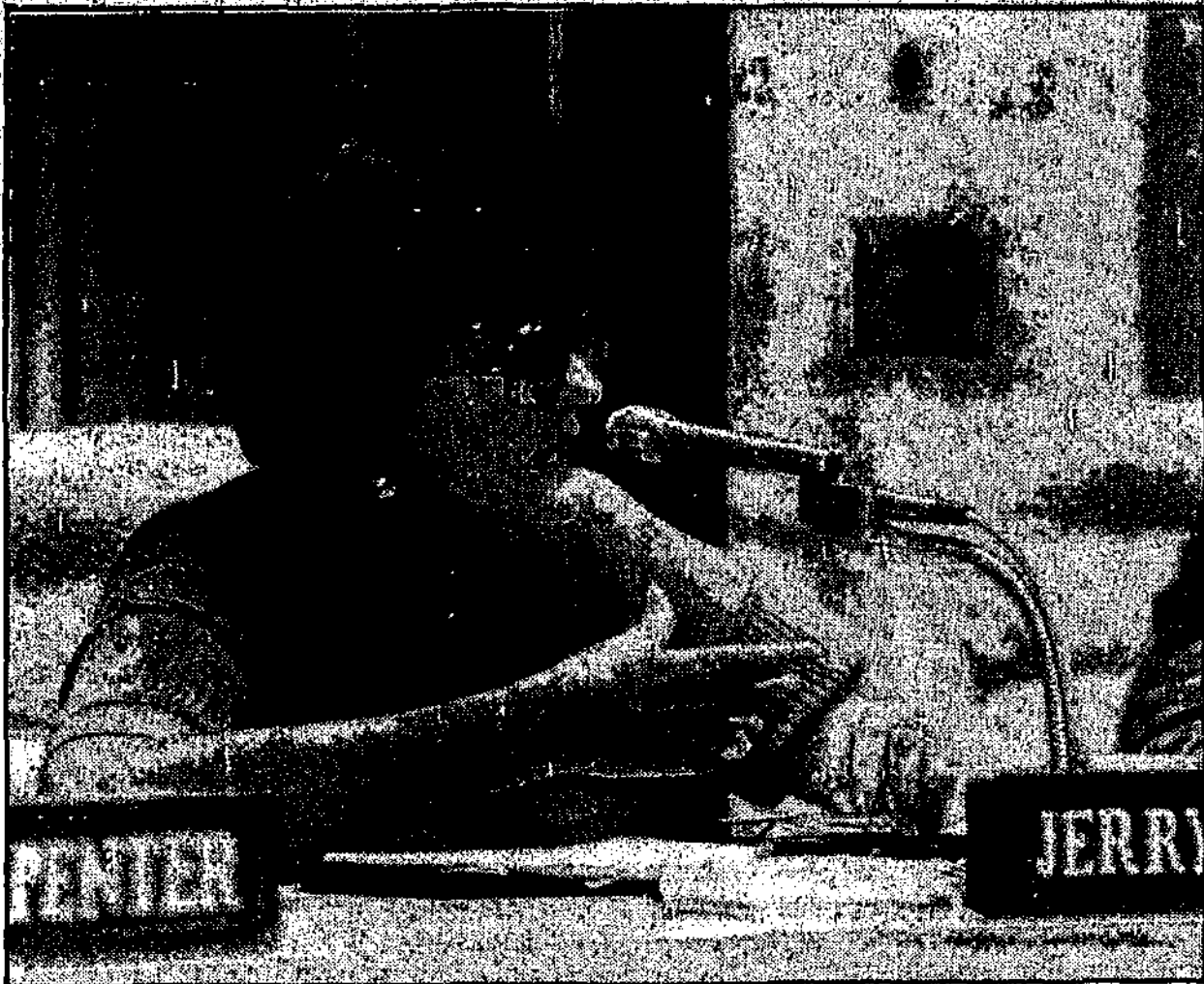
those tests are complete and all results are in, the cleanup will be the responsibility of the Village of Ruidoso and EID, Atkins said.

"The cleanup will be quite involved," he said. "We're talking about a lot of money."

"We're going to form a task force to inform the public as to the status of the well and as to the status of the water and what we are going to do about it," said Mayor White Tuesday.

Village Councillor Rick Evans said that Water Department employees will be on the task force and will be available to help citizens with difficulties caused by the water problems.

## Councillor reports to lodgers

Ruidoso Village Councillor Bill Karn spoke to the Ruidoso Lodgers Association Tuesday about the new airport, Grindstone dam and other local issues.

Karn reported that the federal environmental impact statement on the new airport site should be completed by January 1986. After that, the village could move on to find more funding for the project. He said he thought the runway would be completed by next spring, and the airport would be functional the following winter.

Karn said that the village will not be required to give all the money from the sale of airport land to the use of the new facility.

"I didn't think it was fair to have all the airport money going to the

new airport with Ruidoso having one vote," Karn said.

The new airport will service the whole of Lincoln County, including Carrizozo and Ruidoso Downs, and will serve the Mescalero Apache Tribe.

The new facility will handle corporate jets, DC-9's and other types of aircraft. Karn said the new airport would put Ruidoso within weekend range of Dallas, Fort Worth and Houston, Texas, and even San Diego and Los Angeles, California.

On Grindstone dam progress, Karn reported that the council is awaiting word on the funding and pay scale from a bonding company in Albuquerque.

In other business, the lodgers decided to have a float in the Aspenfest parade.

Assistant village manager Frank Potter said he had been working closely with Bette Romans, director of the center. He commended Romans for her work on mail-outs and activities, and added that the center sometimes serves as many as 50-60 people at one time.

Potter indicated that transportation services cannot be expanded without volunteer help.

"Why does it take two people to watch those games?" asked Shaw. She opined that since the center has two full-time staff members, one could remain at the center if the other was called upon to provide rides for elderly people to doctors' offices.

Councillor Rick Evans, citing unanswered questions, proposed a workshop between the ARC and the village council. A motion was finally passed calling for a report to the council from the committee "so that we can work out all those problems."

In a departure from the regular agenda, the council approved a

recommendation by Councillor Evans that the Grindstone Oversight Committee be restructured and reactivated with regular meetings, minutes and reports from Grindstone Canyon dam principals.

A major objective for the committee, according to Evans, will be to compare actual expenditures with cost estimates.

Alonso, who said the state auditor can audit any public account as often as once a month, suggested the addition of that step to the list of controls.

"Who is it that we don't trust on this?" asked Hine.

"What we're doing is saying to the people ... here's another safeguard," said Councillor Bill Karn. The council passed a motion calling for a quarterly audit by the state auditor.

In other business the council:

—Called an executive session after the regular meeting to discuss personnel matters at the request of Donald Hancock (see related story).

—Heard Jim Atwood, president of First National Bank of Lincoln County, report that his bank was "repossessed" by Albuquerque Federal Savings and Loan. "I can assure you that your money is still safe," said Atwood. He reported that the bank may remain a posses-

sion of Albuquerque Federal, may be sold to investors or may be made a branch of Albuquerque Federal.

—Discussed selling village property on Ski Run Road. Alonso made a motion that was later withdrawn.

—Heard Hine report that the village is complying with an Internal Revenue Service regulation requiring employees who take city vehicles home to pay \$3 a day for that privilege.

—Heard Carpenter report that the Annexation Policy Committee has met twice, and will meet next at 3 p.m. Wednesday, September 11, in Village Hall.

—Unanimously approved Carpenter's motion to annex village property—the cemetery, School House Park and the 40 acres of land on which the village hot mix plant is located.

—Instructed Underwood to draft an ordinance incorporating "isolated pockets" within the village limits that have never been officially annexed, even though residents are assessed municipal taxes. Included are areas in Ponderosa Heights, Town & Country and McDaniel Heights subdivisions.

—Discussed a sewer line owned

by Carrizo Lodge. Carpenter recommended that residents desiring connection on that sewer tie in before Carrizo Creek Road is paved.

—Heard Evans announce a joint meeting with Lincoln County Commissioners at 1 p.m. Wednesday, August 14.

—Heard village clerk Leon Eggleston announce a Lodgers' Tax Committee meeting at 1 p.m. Wednesday, August 14.

—Heard village enforcement officer Paul Davis announce a workshop between the Planning and Zoning Commission and BRW planners at 3 p.m. Tuesday, August 20, in the council chambers of Village Hall. Topics will be zoning recommendations that have been submitted and a proposed comprehensive plan draft.

—Issued a blanket itinerant vendor's license for the Aspenfest Committee.

—Heard Hine report that two applicants will be interviewed for the position of village engineer.

—Heard an announcement that 1985-86 requests for co-op funds from the state Highway Department were denied.

—Heard the mayor call a special meeting at 4 p.m. today (Thursday), August 15, for a public hearing on a beer and wine license request by La Lorraine Restaurant.

## Committee denies motorcycle festival police funding

The Ruidoso Lodgers' Tax Committee (LTC) denied a request from the Ruidoso Police Department to provide \$1,500 for per diem costs of New Mexico State Police needed to provide area coverage during the Ruidoso Motorcycle Festival.

The consensus of the committee at their regular meeting Wednesday was that the Ruidoso Motorcycle Festival, Inc. (formerly the Ruidoso Business Association) should pay for the additional protection because they are a profit-making organization. LTC made a formal motion that the police department submit a request to Ruidoso Motorcycle Festival, Inc. (RMF) for the funds they need.

LTC chairman Budgie Green told Deputy Police Chief Jim Alston that the police department could approach the Ruidoso Village Council for recourse.

According to member Phil Hamilton, RMF gave up lodgers' tax funds last year because they refused to show their bookkeeping to the committee.

Alston said the additional police protection is needed in the valley area and Ruidoso during the event.

"Should this be unresolved at the time of the parade, it would appear that the village would foot the bill," said Alston.

LTC approved a budget of \$4,600 from contingency funds for the upcoming Aspenfest. The money will be used to advertise the festival and provide necessities such as insurance.

The Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce sponsors the Aspenfest each year. Chamber executive director John Jeffers told LTC that the festival is an activity to bring tourists into the community.

LTC is now a five-member committee, due to a ruling from Mayor George White and the Ruidoso Village Council. The ruling was based on state law that states the committee "shall have five members."

Green, who prefers a larger group, said he interpreted the law to mean a minimum of five people, and requested a written interpretation from the state attorney general's office. Green said the village attorney interpreted the law in the same manner as the mayor and council, and did not write to the

attorney general.

After a discussion on committee size, LTC voted to let the issue rest as it is for now. They will request that the chamber's legislative review committee look into the matter.

The committee extensively reviewed the new fiscal year budget, making sure that every amount was on the correct line item. The total projected budget is \$165,000. Village clerk Leon Eggleston reported that \$9,340.62 was collected during July.

Hamilton, also a member of the chamber's advertising committee, reported that the committee is working on the fall advertising campaign, with planned advertisements in newspapers and other media.

## Joint agreement reached

With work on paving Gavilan Canyon Road "99 percent" complete, the village and the county Wednesday signed an agreement on the joint project.

Officials and staff members from both governing bodies gathered Wednesday to reach a final agreement on funding to pave both Gavilan Canyon and Carrizo Creek roads.

After reports from county engineer Joe Shain, village Street Department director Jack LaMay, state Highway Department project engineer Lou Medrano and State Representative Ben Hall, a final agreement was reached and signed.

A \$265,000 check from Lincoln

County was immediately paid to the village, as specified in the agreement. That cash advance will be returned to the county when the village receives the direct appropriation funds in the amount of \$583,500.

Discussion during the meeting centered on the best way to pave Carrizo Creek Road, with the engineer's recommendation being accepted at a cost of \$307,800. The group also discussed encouraging residents of the area to hook into the sewer before the road is paved.

LaMay, who has nearly completed the paving on Gavilan Canyon Road, questioned the group on how the Street Department will be repaid for basecourse used.

"Send us a bill," said County Commissioner Bill Elliott.

## Downs trustees meet

"It scares the heck out of me," said Ruidoso Downs Mayor J.C. Day about the recent water well contamination in Ruidoso.

Day discussed the diesel leak with the Downs village trustees at their meeting Monday night. Day said he discontinued use of the village's tank until a new one could be installed. Day said he had no documentation on when the present tank was installed.

The trustees discussed ways to prevent such an accident from occurring in the Downs. Trustee Conrad Buchanan said that old, unused tanks are hazardous and should be investigated. The board also will look into the possibility of requiring service stations (and businesses that use tanks) to measure their output daily, to make sure nothing has leaked out.

Engineer Barratt Atkins reported on the progress of the new water storage tank. Atkins said the tank was near completion, except for the paint job. To aid in water drainage, the council approved a motion for Atkins' company to install culverts where needed in the village.

In the area of road im-

provements, Day announced that the Lincoln County Commissioners have agreed to help the Downs obtain state funds for schoolbus routes. The county will submit requests now and in December, said village clerk Wilma Webb.

In other business, the board: —Approved the transfer of ownership and location of a liquor license for James E. Cardwell. Cardwell plans to re-open the Redmen Club, which has been closed for four years.

—Accepted Waste Control as the low bidder for poly-cart dumpsters. —Appointed Trustee Jackie Brannum as the voting delegate to the New Mexico Municipal League Conference.

—Voted to reduce Charlie Martin's water bill to the standby charge as he had requested when he left town in September.

—Passed a joint-powers resolution with the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office for the care and housing of prisoners.

—Heard Opal Armstrong report on the progress of the upcoming art show. More than 100 exhibitors will be in and outside the tents. The show is scheduled for Labor Day weekend.

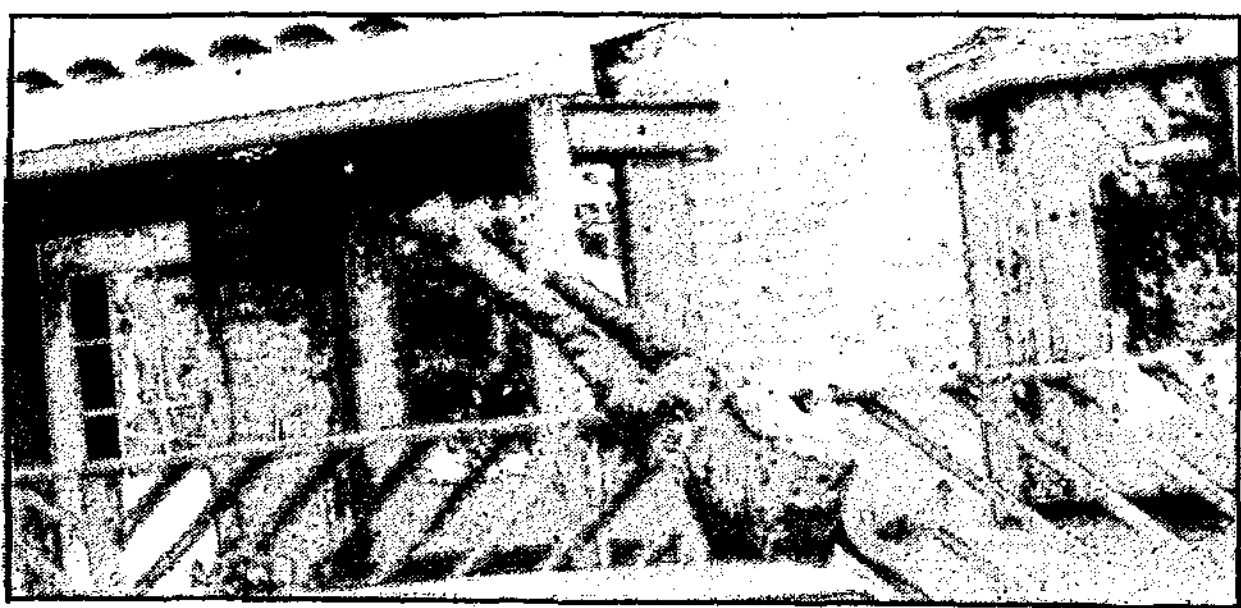

# White educated, espionnaged and was elected

Mayor George White "traveled the whole world" before settling in Ruidoso more than 20 years ago. He still feels that he made the right choice.

The mayor lists the people "first and foremost" as making the mountain village so special. White also likes the climate.

"And no mosquitoes," he said with a laugh. "I hate mosquitoes."

Mayor White said he and his wife, Ruth, will divide their time between Ruidoso and Tucson, Arizona, after his mayoral term expires next spring.

White was born in Wisconsin and received his bachelor's degree from the University of Wisconsin. He began his career in educational administration as a junior high principal in Neenah, Wisconsin.

The second world war interrupted White's career, and he entered the United States Navy in 1943.

"I never really served in the Navy, because they loaned me to the Office of Strategic Services (OSS)," said White. He was based in Washington, D.C., but served all over the world during his two and a half year stint.

The mayor explained that he was one of a group of 2,200 spies scattered throughout the world. Classified as a medical technician and meteorology informant, one of White's jobs was to issue "suicide pills" to OSS men.

"Everybody in OSS carried two of the quarter-shaped cyanide pills," explained White. That group had access to so much information, that they were instructed to take one of the pills if they were ever caught by the enemy.

"You'd be dead in 30 seconds," said White. Otherwise the men would have been tortured unmercifully, he added.

"One out of four didn't come back," he added. Another of White's responsibilities was maintaining dental and medical records of OSS members so that he could identify bodies. He said he did a lot of that.

"It was a very exciting experience ... one that I wouldn't want to go through again," said White.

Since his brother was director of personnel for Albuquerque Public Schools, White chose the University

of New Mexico as a logical place to pursue a master's degree after leaving the Navy in 1946.

"My first job in New Mexico was as assistant superintendent of schools in Grants," said White. He then served as assistant superintendent and director of instructions in Artesia.

In 1957, White became superintendent of schools in Santa Fe, and went on to work in the state Department of Education for two years.

"I had a month and a half stint in Washington, D.C., for the Department of Education," said White. "My wife and I hated it with a passion."

"I called Santa Fe and said the first job that comes up in New Mexico, I want," he said. That request led to a job in the Ruidoso schools in 1964.

"Things were at a low ebb in the Ruidoso schools," said White seriously. "They were packing guns and the whole shebang."

"I took them out of their doldrums and got them back on their feet," he said proudly.

White's first step in straightening out the Ruidoso school problems was to call a meeting of the Ruidoso High School student council.

"I asked questions," he said. White said he found that the students felt they had no rights and felt they were not allowed to talk and express themselves.

The school board had demoted several principals to classroom teachers, and the superintendent was acting as principal for several schools.

"They were doing some outlandish things," said White with a small shake of his head. Besides problems in the classrooms, White said the superintendent was using some questionable purchasing procedures.

One incident he recalled involved the purchase of roofing oil in old Mexico. The barrels were half full of rocks, and the purchase price was figured by weight, said White.

By the time White had been in Ruidoso a week, as acting principal of all schools, the old superintendent quit, most of the school board resigned and the state Board of Education appointed a "brand new school board."

"From then on we started to go," said White. "I think right at the moment we've got one of the better

schools in the state of New Mexico," he added.

Some of his accomplishments before he retired in 1970 included upgrading Ruidoso teacher salaries and improving buildings. White instigated the purchase of the White Mountain Elementary and Intermediate School site. Not everyone agreed then that the 40 acres he obtained for \$1,000 an acre was a good deal, he said.

"Lots are selling for \$10,000 or more now," he said, as proof that the \$40,000 deal was a bargain.

"I ran for mayor as soon as I retired in 1970," said White. After serving one term, he said he "dropped out of city affairs for two years."

White's next step in city government was to win a four-year term on the village council, closely followed by another four-year term.

"Right in the middle of that term I ran for mayor," said White. "I won that running away," he added. White won more votes in that mayoral race than "anybody has ever received in any city election."

White, who says he maintains a positive attitude in all things, said those two years as mayor were a "frustrating" experience, mainly because of the village council.

"The first thing they did was take away the powers of the mayor," he said. White said the council passed an ordinance taking personnel responsibilities from the mayor's office, and giving them to the village manager. As mayor, White said he would have delegated that authority to the manager anyway.

Disagreements over water, and the Grindstone Canyon dam initiated some problems with that council. "That's what started the ball rolling," he said. When village citizens recalled the village council, White hired an attorney to prove that the mayor was not included.

"I suppose it cost me \$500," said White. "But I was determined to win." And win he did. He is now finishing what he says will probably be his last term as mayor. He doesn't plan to run again.

"I'm trying to let the younger generation take over," said White. "After all, I'm 76 years old ... it's time for someone else to take over."

White, who has enjoyed most of his public service, says it has been a pleasure serving with the present council. But he's ready to spend

more time at home.

"I try to be a servant to my constituents," said the mayor. He spends an hour and a half in his Village Hall office every weekday, fulfills a variety of speaking engagements and is also available to citizens who call him at home.

He and his wife, Ruth, who have been married for nearly 50 years, want to spend more time gardening. White is well-known for his beautiful lawn and flowers. He also has a workshop, and builds furniture.

"I'm going to concentrate on my yardwork," said White, who is selling his woodworking equipment. White walks and rides his bicycle everyday, and when in Tucson he swims everyday.

"I want to be a homebody ... start enjoying more of my reading," White said.

The Whites also like to visit their daughter Dorothy, who is married to a fighter pilot and lives in Las Vegas, Nevada.

"We have two beautiful grandchildren, Heather who is nine and Tammy, 14," said the mayor.

White recounted how he has seen Ruidoso "grow from a little quaint village to a metropolis."

"I don't like it," he added. "I would hope never to see any industry in the community."

White is proud of his "controlled growth" philosophy. He says he has kept a 1976 campaign promise to maintain foliage and greenery, and to oversee village growth.

Good changes the mayor cites during the growth process include better streets and better water, "in spite of current problems with a well," he said with a small laugh.

White is also proud to have had a hand in obtaining a new airport, something he has worked toward throughout his years of community service.

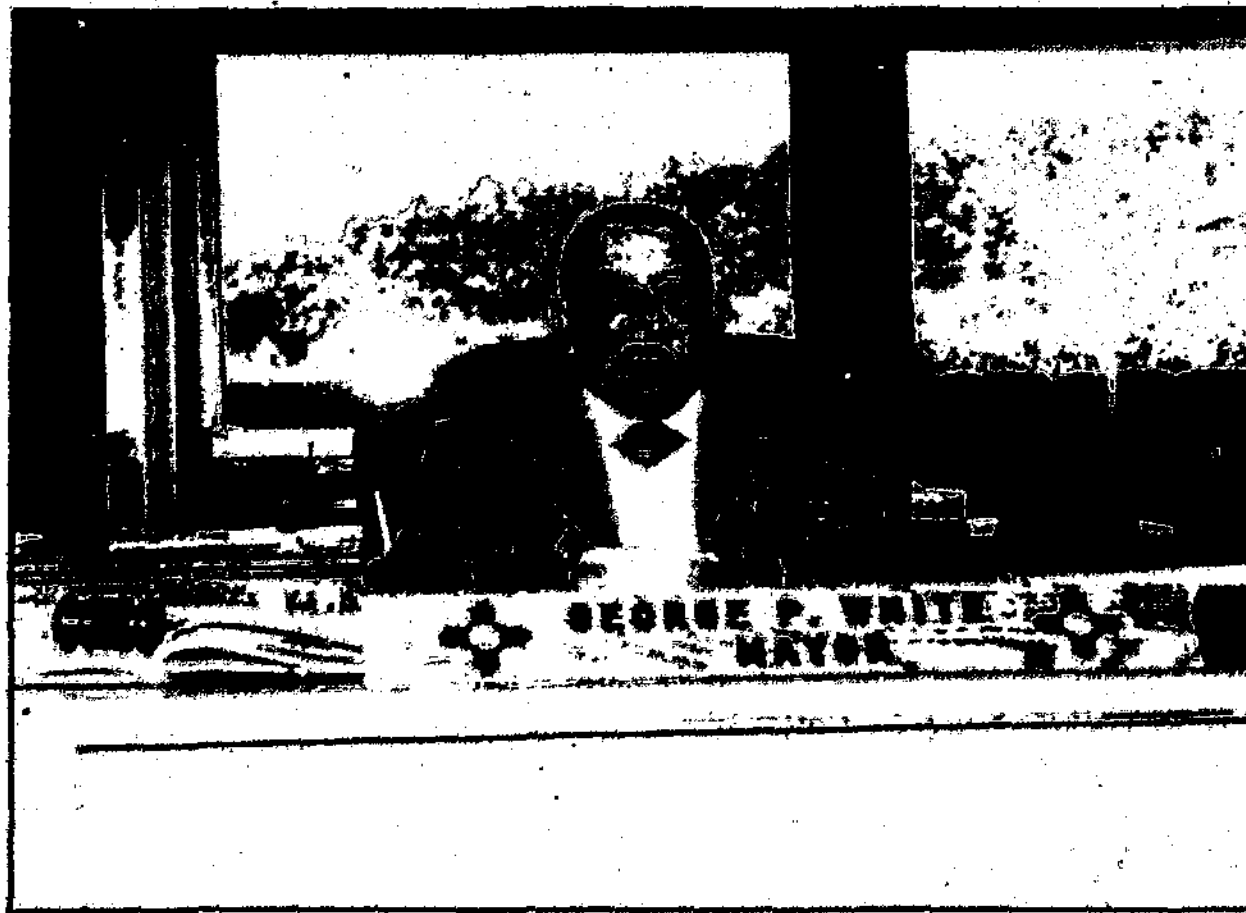
Not all his service has been as an elected official. White has been in the Elks Lodge, the American Cancer Society, Rotary Club, the American Legion and district director for Girl Scouts of America, just to name a few. He and Ruth also are active in their church.

How would the mayor most like to be remembered when he leaves office next spring?

"George White tried to improve the water situation," he said. "No community can stay alive without good water."

Senior quarterback Russell Easter leads an experienced offensive unit. He made the all-District 3-AAA first team last season despite missing the last three games of the season with an injury.

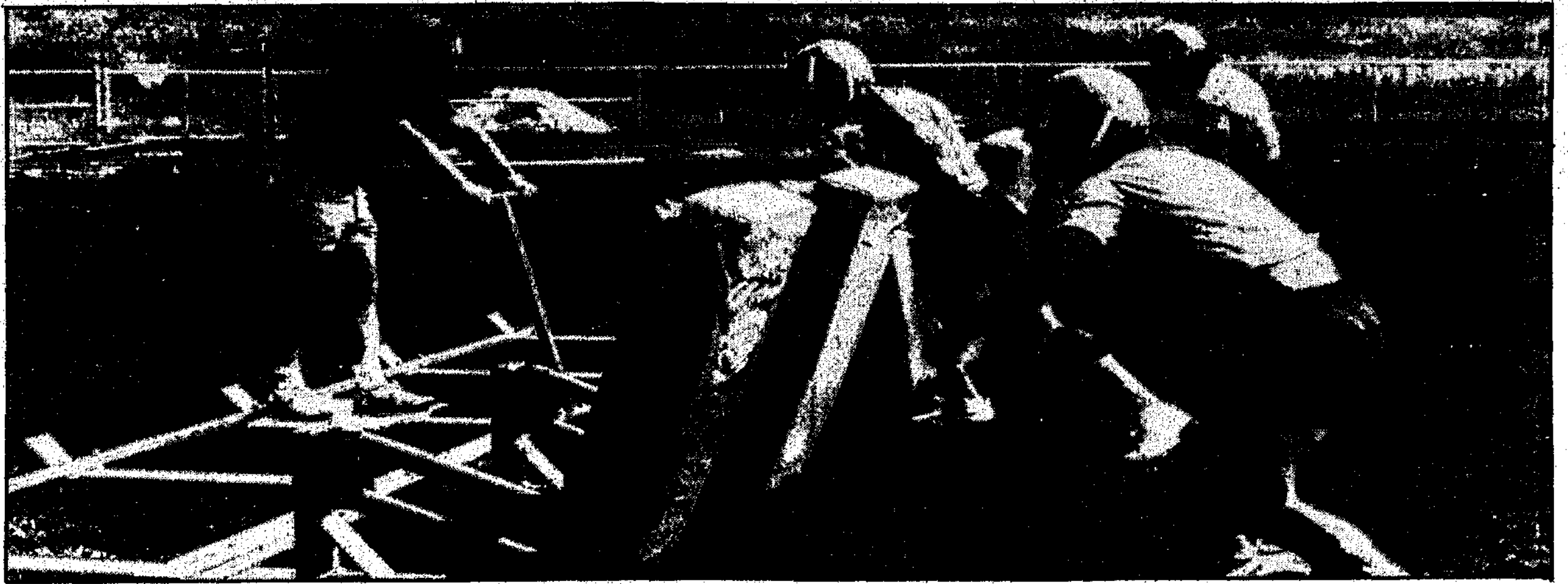
Ruidoso could have good size and experience in both offensive and defensive lines.

Could this be a long season for local National Football League (NFL) fans?

A lot of people in this area are fans of the Dallas Cowboys and Denver Broncos.

These teams have not had many losing seasons in recent years, but both teams will have very tough competition in their division races this season.

Dallas competes in the National Conference's Eastern Division and Denver competes in the American Conference's Western Division.

These divisions are probably the toughest in the NFL.

The Broncos will have to contend with the likes of Seattle, Kansas City, San Diego and the always-tough Los Angeles Raiders, who won the Super Bowl two seasons ago.

The Cowboys have some problems in the offensive line. Quarterback Danny White is not the best quarterback to play behind a questionable offensive line. He has not done well in playoff games, as Dallas fans well know.

But Dallas' biggest problem probably is the gradual improvement of the Eastern Division.

Washington has improved its pass defense and should be as good as ever offensively.

Quarterback Joe Theismann will be able to hand off to either John Riggins or George Rogers in the backfield. The Redskins got Rogers in a trade with New Orleans.

St. Louis could be the team to beat with a star-studded offense and an improved defense. They barely missed the playoffs last year when they lost a squeaker to Washington in the last game of the season.

New York made the playoffs last season. The Giants' defense will be tough again. If the running game can be brought up to the standards of New York's passing game, New York will be tough.

So, 1985 may not be a successful season for Denver and Dallas fans.

The teams should be competitive, but anything beyond a wild card berth probably is wishful thinking.

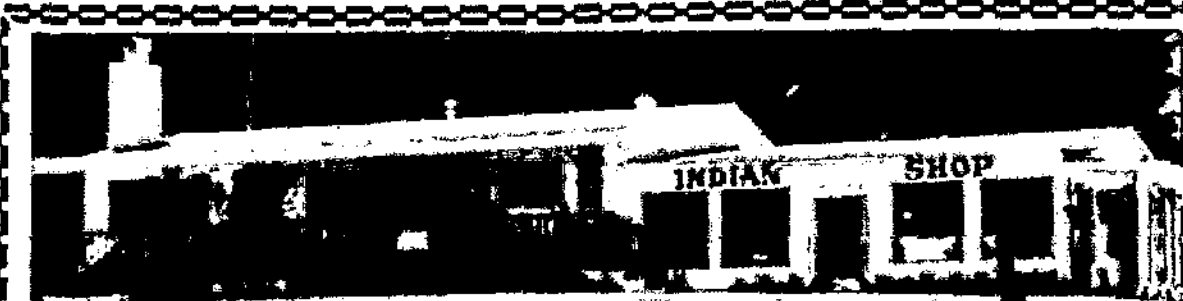

## Students to spend a year in Europe

Mike Smith and Mitch Rhodes, both Ruidoso High School graduates, will take a trip this summer that has been promised to change their lives.

Smith, 18, left Monday for Washington, D.C. At the end of the week, he will meet Rhodes in New York and both will board a plane for Germany. Smith will spend 12 months in Austria and Rhodes will stay in Germany.

As part of an exchange program organized and engineered by Rotary Clubs in Ruidoso and across the country, they were selected through a long process from a host of local applicants.

"We went to Roswell first," Smith said. "The Rotary Club there screened us and narrowed down the applicants. Then we went to El Paso for three days and they watched us, to see how we act and make sure we didn't do anything wrong." Not long after he returned home, Smith said he received the letter of acceptance.

"I'm pretty happy to be going,"

Smith said. "But it's starting to seem like a long way from home."

Smith will stay with an Austrian family for the year and will attend school there. He said the town is close to the German border and mountainous, not unlike Ruidoso. "The elevation is 6,000 feet and it's bordered by mountains," he said. "I'll get to do a lot of skiing."

Smith said he is excited about the trip, but also scared. "I won't be able to come home for Christmas," he said. "But I'm sure I won't be too homesick."

He said he decided to try for the exchange program after his family hosted a student all last year. "That kind of got me into it," he said.

Rhodes will leave for Hannover, Germany. "It's an industrial town with a lot of steel and mining," Rhodes said. "There's also a port. The population is about 542,000, so that will be a change."

Rhodes said he does not speak German "like, none at all," but wants to make a speech to the Rotary Club when he returns, entirely in German.

"I've always wanted to learn German, and I guess I will now," he

said.

He will stay with the Werner Windt family, he said. "Except it's pronounced Verner Vindt, with a vee," he said. "They have two sons, Chris and Eric. Chris is about 12 and Eric is about my age. He's leaving on an exchange program and will be spending a year in Alamogordo. I had hoped to meet him, but I won't be able to," he said.

Like Smith, Rhodes will attend school during his stay. "I'm already a month late," he said. "School there started on the first of August and I won't get there until the end of the month."

He said he had two reasons for going. "My main reason is the experience, of course. That and wanting to learn German."

"I'm not really scared. I promised my mom I'd spend at least five minutes being homesick."

Rhodes said he would live with two or three other families after staying with the Windts. "I'd like to spend some time touring around Europe during holidays or just before I come home," he said. "I'm really happy about going."

## Trustees cancel bid

Ambiguity in a legal advertisement and a petition with 253 names prompted the Capitan Board of Trustees to reject the bid for the lease of the Smokey Bear Museum at their regular meeting Monday night.

Willie Hobbs challenged the lease agreement bid proposal, which was awarded to Curtis Temple at the July 8 meeting. Hobbs, who had the lease for five years, said that the advertised legal notice stated that the bid would be awarded at the August 12 meeting.

Village attorney John Underwood told Hobbs that only one bid, Temple's, was received on the deadline before the July 8 meeting. Underwood said that according to state law, the bid had to be accepted.

Hobbs said she submitted a sealed bid before the deadline, but that the bid was given back to her, opened, before the July 8 meeting.

The villagers in attendance and Trustee Norman Renfro were concerned that the museum would become a "curio shop." Temple owns and operates the Broken Drum gift shop in Ruidoso.

Renfro asked Steve Makowski, a U.S. Forest Service representative present at the meeting, to comment on the museum. Makowski said the Forest Service has watched the "ups and downs" of the museum during the last 15 years. He said that the preservation of historic articles within the museum is important.

Renfro said that the museum was built by and for the people of Capitan. He said he did not want to see the museum, which he considered to be a landmark, become a curio shop.

Temple replied that he was not planning to place anything in the museum that was not related to Smokey Bear or fire prevention. He said that he could handle "more

volume with lower prices," than the current museum lessee.

"I'm not going to rip the customers off," Temple said about the current prices.

Renfro questioned whether Temple's museum employee would be as knowledgeable as Smokey Bear's history as is Hobbs. Temple said his employee would be a Capitan resident and could "learn the history in 15 minutes."

Hobbs challenged the deadline by having Underwood and the trustees review the legal aspects.

After an executive session, Underwood announced that the bid problem arose from the ambiguity in the legal notice. The legal notice read that proposals would be accepted until 5 p.m. Monday, July 8. The effective date of lease was August 12. It also read that the lease contract would be awarded at the regular meeting on August 12.

The trustees opened the only bid, Temple's, on July 8 and awarded it to him at that time.

Underwood said that according to state statutes, all bids and proposals must be cancelled by the trustees. Underwood recommended that the trustees reject the prior museum lease bid because of the ambiguity of the advertisement.

The trustees unanimously approved the bid rejection. They approved a new advertisement, calling for lease proposals for the museum to be at village hall by 5 p.m. Monday, September 9. The trustees will open the proposals and award the lease at their meeting that night.

Hobbs' museum lease, which was scheduled to expire August 15, will be extended on a monthly basis until the lease proposal is again reviewed and awarded.

Temple told the trustees the bid rejection was "unfair to me because of the merchandise I've ordered."

The trustees withdrew a budget increase resolution which allowed

for funds from the museum lease. The resolution was null and void because of the bid rejection.

The legal advertisement problem prompted Capitan resident Pat Huey to request that all legal notices be reviewed by the attorney before publication.

Also at Monday's meeting, the solid waste service contract was awarded to Wayne Hobbs, who previously had the contract. Hobbs' bid was chosen from five proposals because of his past service and his willingness to maintain the village landfill.

Prior to the regular meeting, the village personnel met with the trustees.

The employees requested and received permission to have a monthly open purchase order for parts at Virgil's Auto Parts. Terry Cox, village supervisor, said that the purchase order would eliminate the need to get a separate order for each part needed.

The employees also requested, and were granted, construction of a bathroom in the village shop.

In other regular village business, the trustees:

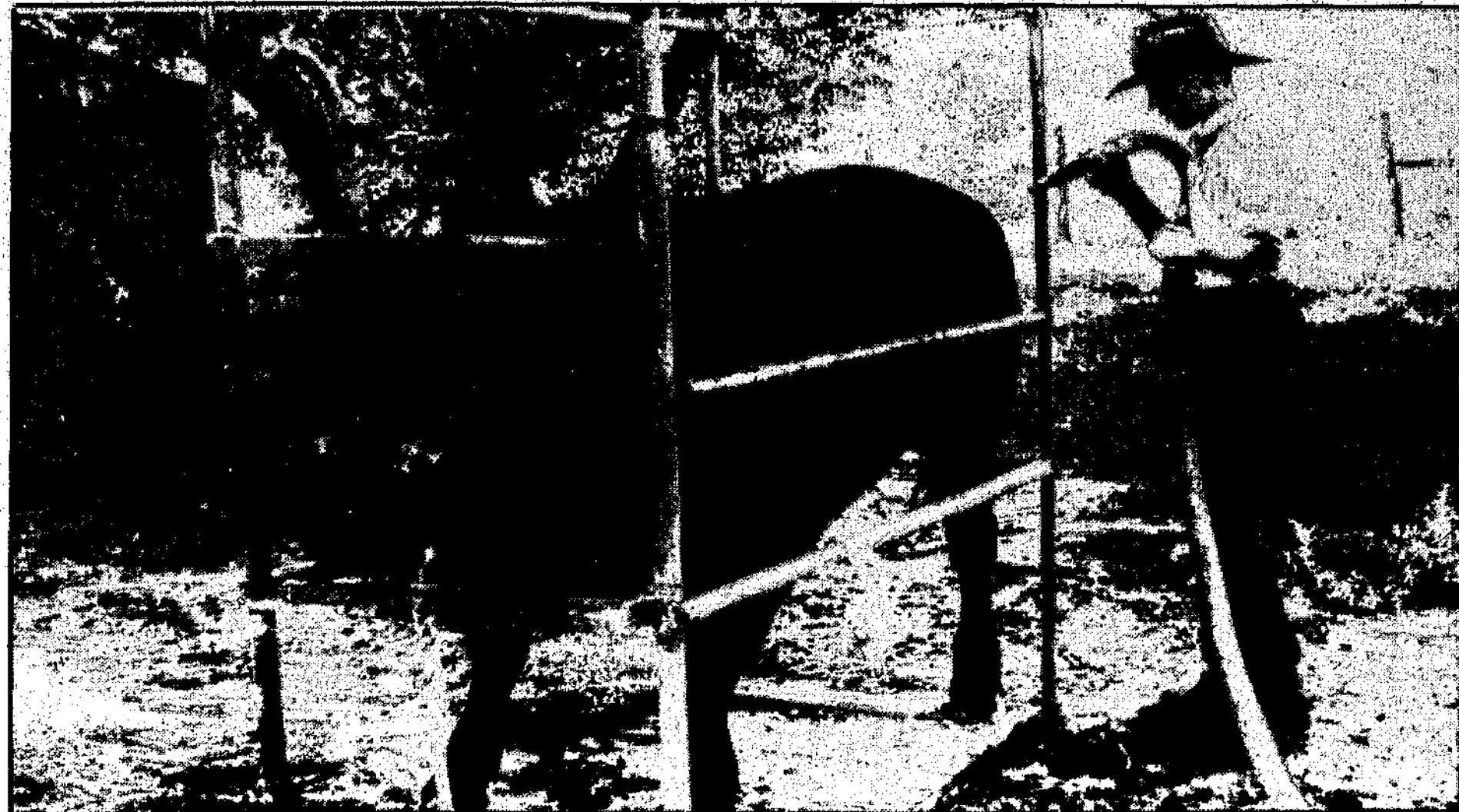
—Awarded the bid proposal for six months of gravel to H.N. LaRue and Sons of Capitan.

—Awarded the bid for a Fire Department truck to Monark Equipment Company.

—Directed Underwood to meet with the Capitan Planning and Zoning Committee at 7 p.m. Monday, August 26, to develop a Capitan subdivision ordinance. Copies of the proposed ordinance will be available for review at village hall.

—Selected Virginia Spall as a voting delegate for the annual Municipal League Conference in September. Randy Spears was chosen as an alternate.

—Approved a replat of lots 3, 4 and 5 in "C" Hills, changing two lots to three to allow for utility easements.

## County Fair retains atmosphere

The Lincoln County Fair has retained its quiet country fair atmosphere in the 30 years since it began.

The fair opened at its present location in 1955, but in a different building—the old gymnasium of the former school complex.

According to Ralph Dunlap, who was a new extension agent at the time, Charlie Jones organized the county 4-H achievement day into a county fair.

Jones was a county commissioner at the time. He introduced a resolution that would prohibit the commercialization of the fair (such as carnivals).

Ribbons were bought with money earned on the turtle races, Dunlap said. The races were run during the first three years to earn money.

After the old gym burned down in the late 1960s, the present metal building was constructed. Since that time more barns and show areas have been added. The livestock auction was started by LaMoyné Carpenter in the late 1960s.

"The auction was a way to reward deserving boys and girls," Dunlap said.

The fair and auction continue to attract many competitors. At the fair, the public may see projects completed by 4-H and FFA members, scouts and adults.

To get ready for the fair, 4-H members are busier than usual. Days, even hours, before the big weekend, many are hurrying about—grooming and clipping animals, and baking, sewing and doing last-minute things to finish projects.

Dawn Hill is a 4-H member in the Ruidoso Rangers club. She plans to enter a skirt she made for her spring sewing project. She now must prepare it for the upcoming show.

Dawn said she will bake either the morning she enters or the day before. She is enrolled in the Baking I project and plans to make flour tortillas and cookies.

Dawn also plans to enter a project which is done with a young child for the "fun with children" category.

Another member in the Ruidoso Rangers is Chad Kizer. Chad is an avid horseman, but he does other projects as well. To complete his rocketry project, Chad must build a rocket for display and a rocket that

shows the interior assembly. During the week before the fair, Chad was still working on the project.

Chad's horses keep him busy most of the time. Before a show he must clip the hair from the horse's nose and the back of the horse's feet. Then the horse must be washed and brushed and the mane and tail must be combed.

For the 4-H horse show at the county fair, as well as all other 4-H horse shows, Chad said he must wear nice western-style clothing. A hat and boots are mandatory for the western classes.

When Kizer enters the arena in the English riding classes, he must wear the required English clothing. His horse must have the appropriate English tack and saddle.

Kizer said he started riding when he was nine years old. He used to take classes, but he said he no longer does.

Erek Fuchs is a member of the Capitan 4-H club. Erek raised a steer named Jocko for his beef project this year. It was the first steer he has raised and he found that it was a lot of work.

The steer must be handled daily to accustom him to people. The livestock judging requires the handler (the 4-H or FFA member) to hold the steer's head just right and have his hind feet at a specific distance apart. The animals must be trained to be show quality stock.

To prepare the steer for the show, Erek walked Jocko a mile each

morning. After the walk, the steer is showered to keep his hair growing, instead of shedding as is normal in the summer. Erek kept records of the feed, the weight gain and the cost of the feed for his steer.

The week before the fair, the steer was weighed and registered. Then, with the help of county 4-H agent Rick Richardson, Erek learned how to clip and trim the steer to ready him for the livestock show.

The way a steer is clipped can affect the way he appears. Certain cuts can make him appear heavier or leaner.

Richardson said he helps students that have had animals for one or two years. After the first year, most 4-H'ers know if they like raising animals, he said.

Members who continue in beef and lamb projects find that a set of clippers is very important to prepare for the livestock show. Blow dryers are as common in the livestock barn at the fair as in a beauty shop.

"A bovine beauty shop," laughed Linda Fuchs, Erek's mother.

Richardson said the sheep, lamb and beef projects are the most difficult and expensive of the animal projects. He said that any student who wants to raise a big animal should start with pigs. They require very little preparation for the livestock show.

However, pigs do require work, such as setting a feeding schedule and keeping records of weight gain and cost of feed.

Saturday morning, the day of the livestock show, the exhibitors will be washing, clipping and drying their animals. The pigs will roll around their pens, watching the others. Then comes that nervous moment—the livestock arena.

The exhibitors must practice handling the animals they show. Each animal must be shown differently.

The judging may be the most nervous moment, but the most anticipated moment is the livestock auction. It is at the auction that the participants realize the year's hard work. When the auctioneer's gavel falls, the dollars ring up.

The Lincoln County Fair offers many things to see and do. Included in the festivities will be information and food booths and livestock and horse shows.

## Schools announce schedule, supplies

Classes at Capitan schools begin at 8:30 a.m. Monday, August 19.

Students in grades seven through 12 will begin the first day with a 30-minute assembly, said Jay Dark, high school principal. From the assembly, the students will go to their scheduled first-period classes.

The elementary students will go to their assigned classrooms after the first bell at 8:20 a.m. Because of the new cafeteria facility, elementary students will eat in two shifts, instead of the three shifts used in previous years.

Students in kindergarten through third grade will go to lunch at 11 a.m. Fourth- through sixth-grade students will eat at 11:35 a.m.

Classes end each day at 2:50 p.m. The kindergarten- through

fourth-grade teachers have compiled supply lists for their students. Kindergarten students will need a box of facial tissues, a 16-count box of crayons, one regular-size number two pencil, a four-ounce bottle of school glue, a pair of safety scissors and a child-size blanket for nap time.

First- through fourth-grade students need a 16-count box of crayons, a large bottle of school glue, a school box, at least one package of number two pencils, a large box of facial tissues and pencil-top erasers.

In addition to the preceding supplies, first graders will need one Big Chief tablet, a large eraser, scissors and a book bag or folder to carry papers home.

Also needed for second graders is a large eraser, two Big Chief tablets, pointed scissors and a spiral notebook. The second-grade teachers ask that students not bring binder notebooks or pencil sharpeners.

The additional supplies third graders need are scissors, a wide-ruler spiral notebook, a 100-count package of wide-ruled loose-leaf paper, two red grading pencils and a ruler with centimeter markings.

Fourth graders need the additional supplies of pointed scissors, two spiral notebooks and loose-leaf notebook paper.

Extra-curricular activities are already underway. Practice began for students in band, volleyball, football and cheerleading this week.

## Richardson to leave local 4-H

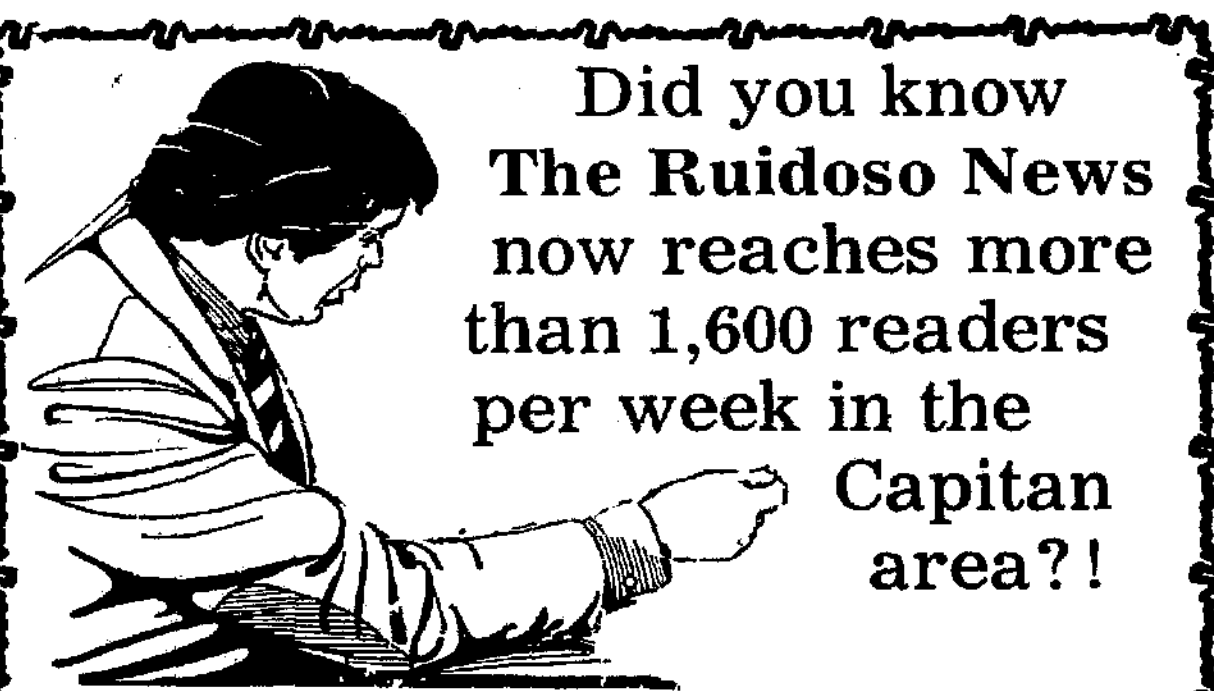

## The Silver Lining

### The Rains Bring the Mountain World into Summer Glory

The Rain Spirits, Jack Frost, and all the other weather people forgot to bring the usual July rains; but August, which nearly always makes up for a dry July, came through like a true friend in need for good Mother Earth.

The area of Lincoln has had unusually good August rains. Driving from Hondo to Lincoln, the countryside turns greener by the mile, with the hillsides shining with every shade of green, blending

from new green to the deepest emerald. The very air along the hill horizon glows with the magic color reflected from the hilltops, so that they are fringed with an airy, mystic outline of radiant green.

Here in the Vale, a good rain of just a week ago, reviving the thirsty ground with every drop, went down to the roots of all the children of Mother Earth, large and tiny. Then four days ago (this is being written to you on Wednesday, August 14), the gray clouds moved in from the plains of Texas, and there was a

great booming of thunder and flashing of lightning shafts and shimmering streaks of nature's fireworks of the sky, touched with purple, green, and lightest red—all through the approaching hosts of clouds marching through the summer sky.

Then, on the eastern breeze came the ever-welcome messenger, the moist forerunner of the drops themselves—the cool breath of the approaching storm. Soon came the drenching benediction from the sky; and all the hills and vales, the meadows were ready. They had put on enough plant growth—leaves, herbs, weed, flowers, grass—so that all the heavy rain was gratefully received, taken deep to the roots of the children of Mother Earth, and deeper still to the water storage places underground.

Pure white clouds float close overhead through a clean-washed sky of new summer blue, matching colors for the many hues of glorious summer's enchanting green. Hardly a spot high and low but pays its

tribute to the welcome rain. On top of the rocky cliffs on high are little crowns of velvet green.

Flowers have bloomed forth on every hand: the scarlet trumpets of the Rocky Mountain gilia; the golden morning primrose; the pink evening primrose; the purple wild verbena; the sky blue flax. All are saying, "Rejoice with us in sweetest summertime."

Apples Begin to Show Their Colors Generally throughout the county there is a fine crop of apples. And the recent rains have put color in their cheeks. You can see the light crimson and the gold shining and flashing amongst the leaves as you pass by the orchards.

A few of the very early apples like Early Harvest and Henry Clay will be ripening soon. # County computer

## System provides land information

Legal information about Lincoln County property is easily accessible, thanks to a specialized computer system. Ruidoso residents can access that computer from the Lincoln County Sub Office behind Ruidoso Village Hall.

Suzanne Cox, county manager, said that any citizen may use the system. Presently real estate agents, abstractors and developers are the main users of the information.

Other citizens, too, are taking advantage of the information on deeds, property owners and leases, said Evelyn Dobbs, secretary at the sub office.

"This will save a lot of time for people," Cox said. In the past, information on deeds and property was only available at the county

courthouse in Carrizozo. Before the purchase of a computer, that information had to be searched out in bound volumes.

That system was improved by adding the computer in 1982, and the overall system has been enhanced by a dedicated telephone line to the sub office. The computer terminal in Ruidoso, added in May, is actually on-line at all times with that line.

Cox explained how information can be retrieved. In order to find out the owners of property, all that is required is a legal description of the land. Specific information must be input, such as subdivision name, block number and lot number, she said.

By keying in a last name, the computer will list all property owned by people having that name. That list will include specific legal descriptions.

Further information on deeds and property transfers can be obtained, too. The computer can tell requestors whether or not a lot or subdivision is within the village limits or in the county. It also contains codes revealing in what school district the property is listed.

Further enhancements are being prepared for the system, including a way to call up information on all phases of a subdivision. At present, if a subdivision is divided into units and phases, those numbers are needed to access specific parts of the development.

Cox said her office in Carrizozo will also provide paper copies of property information for a small fee.

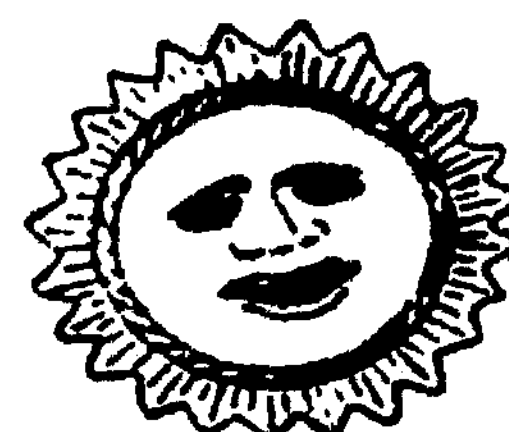

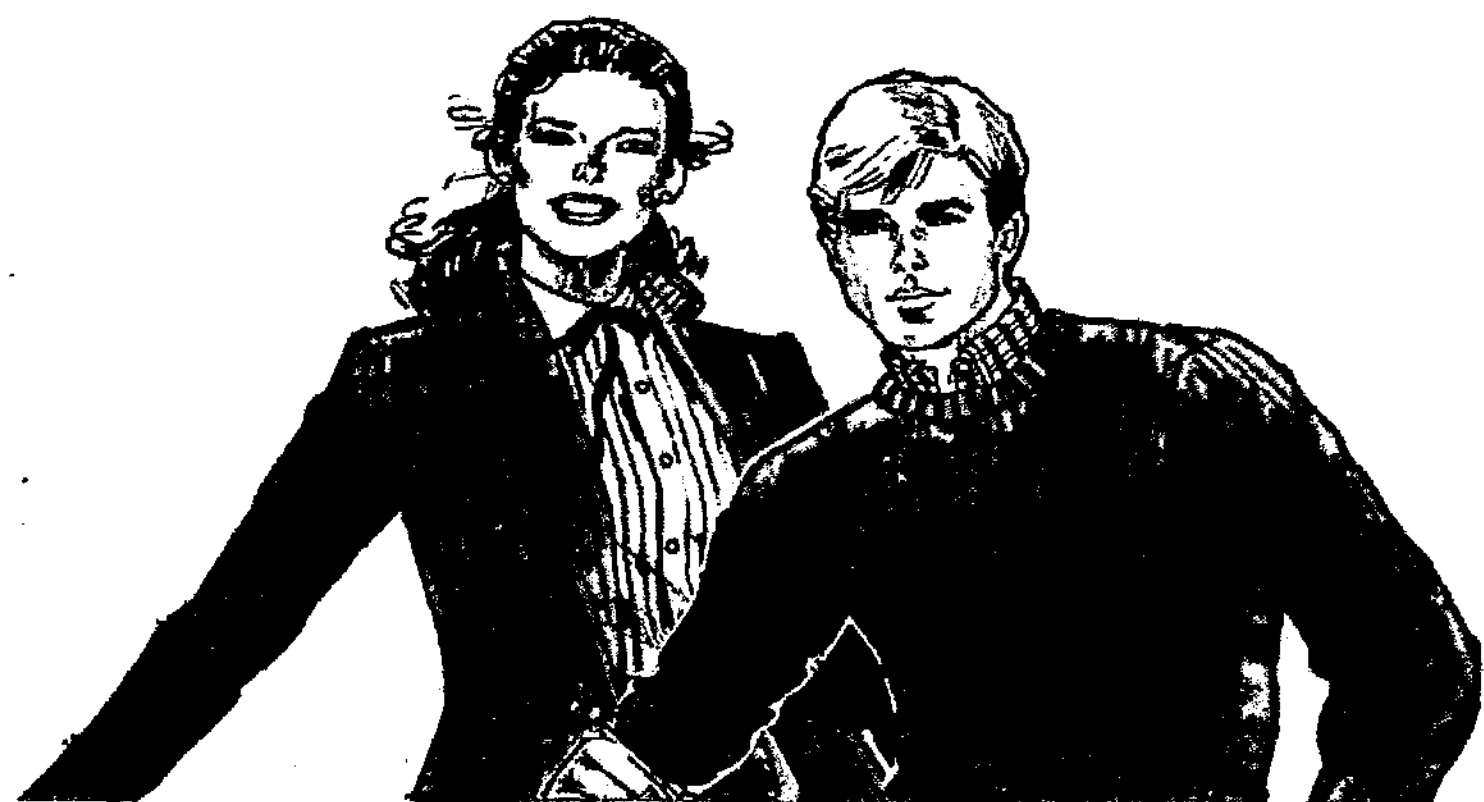

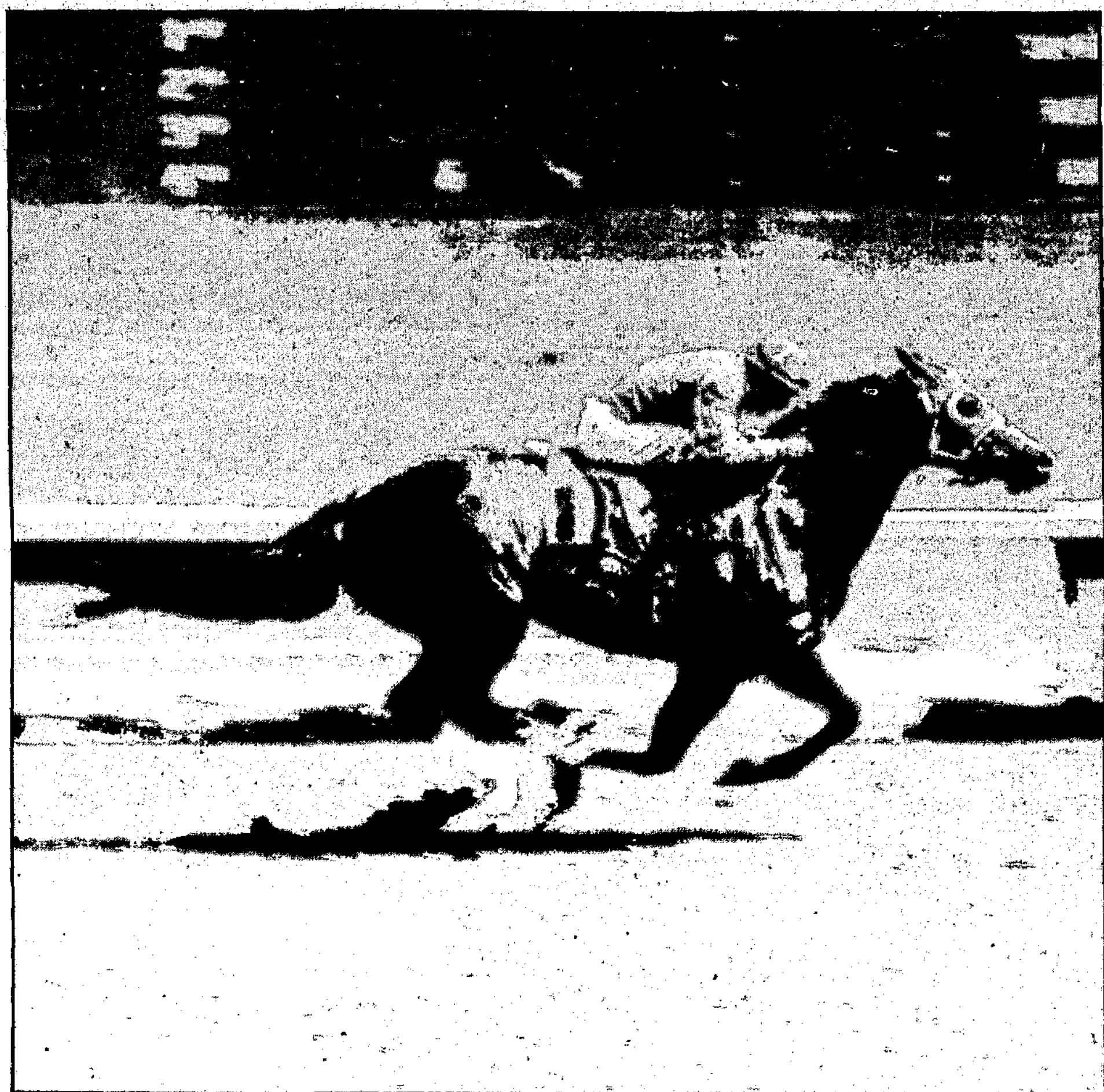

### Dashing to a dream

Dashes Dream races to a two and three-quarter-length victory in trials for the \$275,000 All-American Gold Cup Saturday at Ruidoso Downs. The daughter of Dash For Cash stepped the 440 yards in 21.04 seconds—only two-hundredths of a second off the world record held by Truckle Feature since August 1973. Dashes Dream heads into the final of the Gold Cup Sunday as the leading contender to capture the Grade I event.

She's only been beaten once in 14 lifetime starts and was named World Champion in 1984 by the American Quarter Horse Association. Danny Cardoza is the jockey. Michael Robbins trains the mare for Joe Kird Fulton of Lubbock, Texas. Other top qualifiers are Meganette with a time of 21.29 and Bar Forth with a time of 21.38. Top finisher Sunday will take home \$137,710, while the second place horse will win \$46,821.

MORE THAN a quarter-century after he rode in the inaugural All-American Futurity, jockey Elbert Minchey was back at Ruidoso Downs last week, riding in first-round trials for the 27th All-American.

Minchey, 49, was a youthful 22 years old in 1959 when he rode Mary Sunshine to an eighth-place finish in the All-American, which in its early days was contested at 400 yards. The purse was \$129,686 that year, a far cry from the \$2.53 million bonanza offered today.

The distance of the All-American was increased to a quarter-mile in 1973, just in time for Timeto Thinkrich to post a three-quarter length win over Flaming Jet.

Minchey has ridden in three All-Americans in all, and has finished eighth each time. He rode Christy Go in 1962 and Kent's Boy Creek in 1968, but has not had a mount in the final since then.

Ironically, he was the regular rider of Easy Jet for much of that horse's two-year-old season, only to be replaced by Willie Lovell for the All-American. That was in 1969, and Easy Jet went on to win the race for owner and trainer Walter Merrick.

Minchey's shot at the '85 Labor Day classic will come with Sneaky Sin, a colt trained by Bobby Willis and owned by Vincel Carlisle of Midland, Texas. Minchey booted Sneaky Sin to a third-place finish behind Racin Image and Josies Super Sound in last Friday's first race.

Sneaky Sin and Minchey will compete next in the All-American time trials on August 21. That will be Minchey's sixth mount aboard the colt. Sneaky Sin has started seven times, with two wins, three seconds and a third, and sports earnings of \$55,215.

ELBERT MINCHEY WAS NOT the only familiar figure to ride in the first All-American Futurity back in 1959. Up on the winner, Galobar, was Cliff Lambert Sr., now a prominent trainer at Ruidoso Downs and throughout the Southwest.

Finishing second that day was Panama Ace, with Bruce Brinkley in the irons. Brinkley is now a

steward at Ruidoso Downs, and he provided the details on the other seven jockeys who took part in that historic race.

According to Brinkley, three of those riders are now deceased. Richard Lujan, who rode favored Miss Olene to a third-place finish, died in a training accident, while Darrel Banks, who was fifth on Bar Flirt, died "sometime in the early 1970s." Jacky Myers, who finished ninth with Explosive, has also passed away.

Robert Strauss, one of a small group of black riders, piloted Quick Mistress to a fourth-place finish. He now ponies horses at Los Alamitos. Also working at tracks in California is Robert Ford, who finished seventh on Real Gone.

Now training horses in the Southwest are Harold Baker and Ramon Figueroa. Baker, who rode sixth-place finisher May's Pilgrim, was seen at Ruidoso Downs recently during the annual thoroughbred yearling sale, according to Brinkley.

Figueroa, who now trains quarter horses on the Arizona fair circuit, was thrown from his mount, Tonta Lass, shortly after the start of the 1959 All-American. Thus, Figueroa has a special place in All-American history as the only rider to fail to complete the entire running.

Figueroa never got another chance to ride in the All-American, but retains his place, along with the other nine jockeys who rode that day, as one of the pioneers of the greatest of all quarter horse races.

LAST WEEK'S FIRST-ROUND trials for the All-American Futurity were dominated by favorites. Of the 36 races, 21 were won by the wagering choices.

Leading the "chalk" parade was Brigand Silk. The undefeated colt

was hammered down to 1-20 odds in Wednesday's fifth race. His across-the-board returns were \$2.10, \$2.10 and \$2.10. The place horse, Always A Native, paid \$2.10 and \$2.10, and Highhoher Too paid \$2.10 to show.

The heavy betting on Brigand Silk led to minus-pools for win, place and show. A minus-pool is created when there is not enough money remaining after the "takeout" to pay off each winning ticket with the legally allowable minimum return of \$2.10.

In such cases, the track must pay the amount needed to satisfy each winning ticket. For Brigand Silk's race last Wednesday, that total was \$7,471.58. Most of that was needed to pay the minus-pool for show which totalled \$8,822. Of the \$32,606 bet to show on the race, \$29,817 was wagered on Brigand Silk.

Large show bets were the rule rather than the exception last week. In the three days of trials, minus-pools for show were created in 16 of the 36 races.

WINNING FRIDAY'S tenth race impressively was Dash Together, a filly by Dash For Cash out of the Brazos Bar mare Go Together.

Ruidoso Downs racing fans might recall Go Together as the winner of the 1970 Rainbow Derby and the 1970 World's Championship Classic. Go Together also made the finals of the All-American Futurity in 1969. The winner that year was Easy Jet. Go Together finished fifth at 8-1, beaten by 3 1/2 lengths. She raced for Harriet Peckham of Roswell, who also campaigns Dash Together.

Go Together is also remembered each year when Ruidoso Downs presents the Go Together Handicap, a 350-yard dash for fillies and mares. This year's edition carried a purse of \$8,000-added and was captured by Game Doll on May 26.

## Whose That Guy attempts comeback

Whose That Guy, a disappointment of late after winning his first three starts, attempts to bounce back on Friday when he heads the \$10,100 Hondo Valley Handicap at Ruidoso Downs. First post time is 1 p.m.

The Hondo Valley Cap is contested at 5 1/2 furlongs, and carries an additional \$6,000 in Breeders' Cup premium awards.

Whose That Guy, a Texas-bred colt, began his career on May 24 with an 11-length romp over maidens. He then added two allowance wins, both wire-to-wire, to his perfect record, before tasting defeat for the first time in the Jockey Club Handicap in mid-July.

After an unsuccessful journey to Santa Fe, Whose That Guy returned to the mountain track for a Ruidoso

Derby trial on the last day in July. He broke sharply and was with the leaders until the backstretch, then was forced to check badly and dropped from contention.

Lining up against Whose That Guy are six other 3-year-olds with designs on the Hondo Valley winner's share of \$6,060. Those challengers are Barrtime, Naskra's Star, Kelly Crimson, Golden Table, Liberty Rullah and Trade Dancers.

Barrtime has not raced at Ruidoso Downs since July 5, when he was second to Judge Jack Frost in a three-quarter mile allowance test. Earlier, Barrtime had failed as one of the favorites in the Norgor Derby after breaking poorly.

The high-weight for the Hondo Valley, at 120 pounds, is Naskra's

Star. He was second in the Memorial Day Handicap early this season, and narrowly missed catching Whose That Guy in an allowance race on June 22.

The filly Kelly Crimson is perfect in two starts this year. She devastated a field of maidens on July 3, then came back eight days later to down a good allowance field by a length. The Hondo Valley will be her first stakes try.

Racing will continue through the weekend. Saturday's feature is the \$15,000-added Isayolboy Handicap for older horses at seven furlongs. On Sunday, World Champion Dashes dream will take aim at Truckle Feature's quarter-mile world record as she tops the field in the \$275,000 All American Gold Cup. Post time each day is 1 p.m.

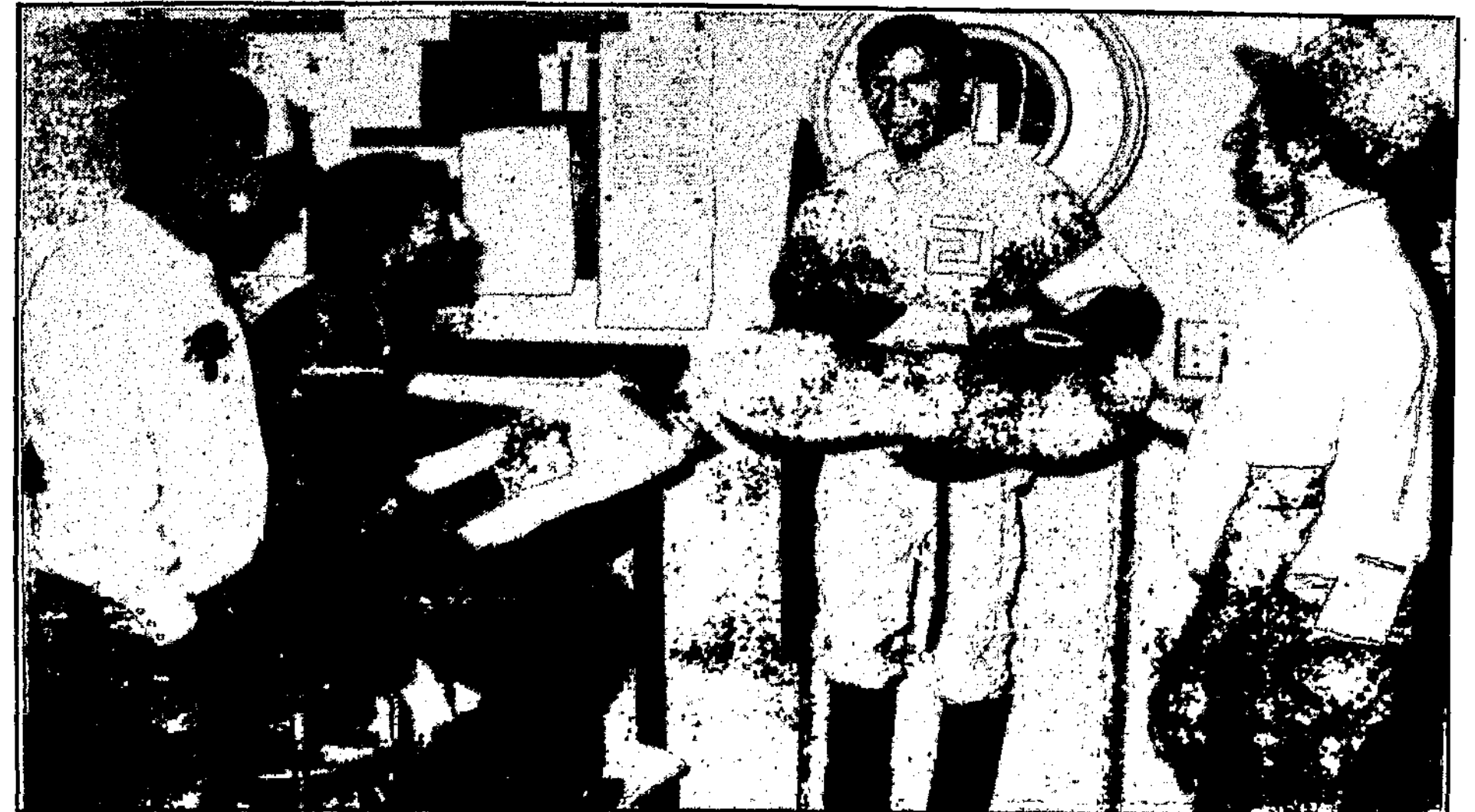

## Jockey / Trainer Of The Week

Joe Martinez rode four winners Sunday at Ruidoso Downs, including Sounds Sharp in the \$32,476 Ruidoso Thoroughbred Derby, and was named jockey of the week for his efforts.

On the trainer front, Bill Leach, who saddled Sounds Sharp, won the trainer of the week award by sending out four winners over the five-day racing week (Aug. 7-11). Also saddling four winners were quarter

horse specialists Dwayne Gilbreath and Charles "Bubba" Cascio, although they sent out more starters on the week than Leach.

Both Martinez and Leach have led in the standings for the entire season, and with three weeks remaining they appear to be in a good position to win their respective titles. Martinez, 24, has won two previous Ruidoso riding titles, in 1980 and 1983. He was second to Mike Lidberg last season.

Currently, Martinez leads second-place Jacky Martin 63-37, with Lidberg in third with 32 wins.

Martinez' performance last week came on the heels of a two-day hospital stay the previous week, which he said was due to stomach flu and a bacterial infection. He was forced to miss four days of

riding, which seriously hampered his efforts to break Larry Byer's all-time Ruidoso single season riding record of 90 wins.

In addition to his Ruidoso Derby score, Martinez also won Sunday's inaugural running of the Gene Hensley Handicap aboard My Going Jesse.

Also enjoying a good week in the irons were Bruce Pilkenton (four wins), Casey Lambert (also with four) and Nicky Wilson, who rode three winners last Friday.

For trainer Leach, the title is well within reach. He leads runnerup Dwayne Gilbreath 39-32. Jack Brooks is third with 25 wins.

Leach has won the training crown at Ruidoso each of the past three seasons. In just under four years,

he has saddled 195 winners at the mountain track. His four wins last week came from 11 starters.

Cascio, who campaigns primarily in California, won the title at Ruidoso in 1972 and 1975. His four

wins last week all came in first-round trials for the \$2.53 million All-American Futurity, a race he has won twice. Cascio trained 1968 winner Three Oh's and 1970 champion Rocket Wrangler.

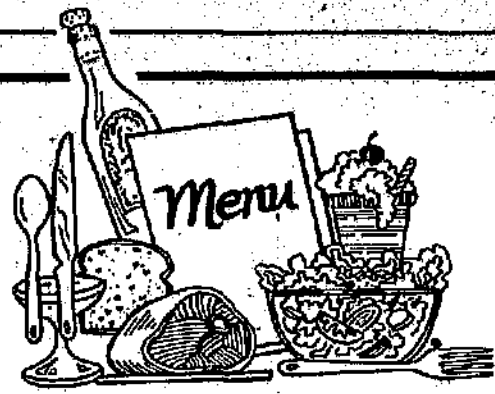

Daughtry is busy in her tiny, organized kitchen—baking bread and preparing her "homemade meals."

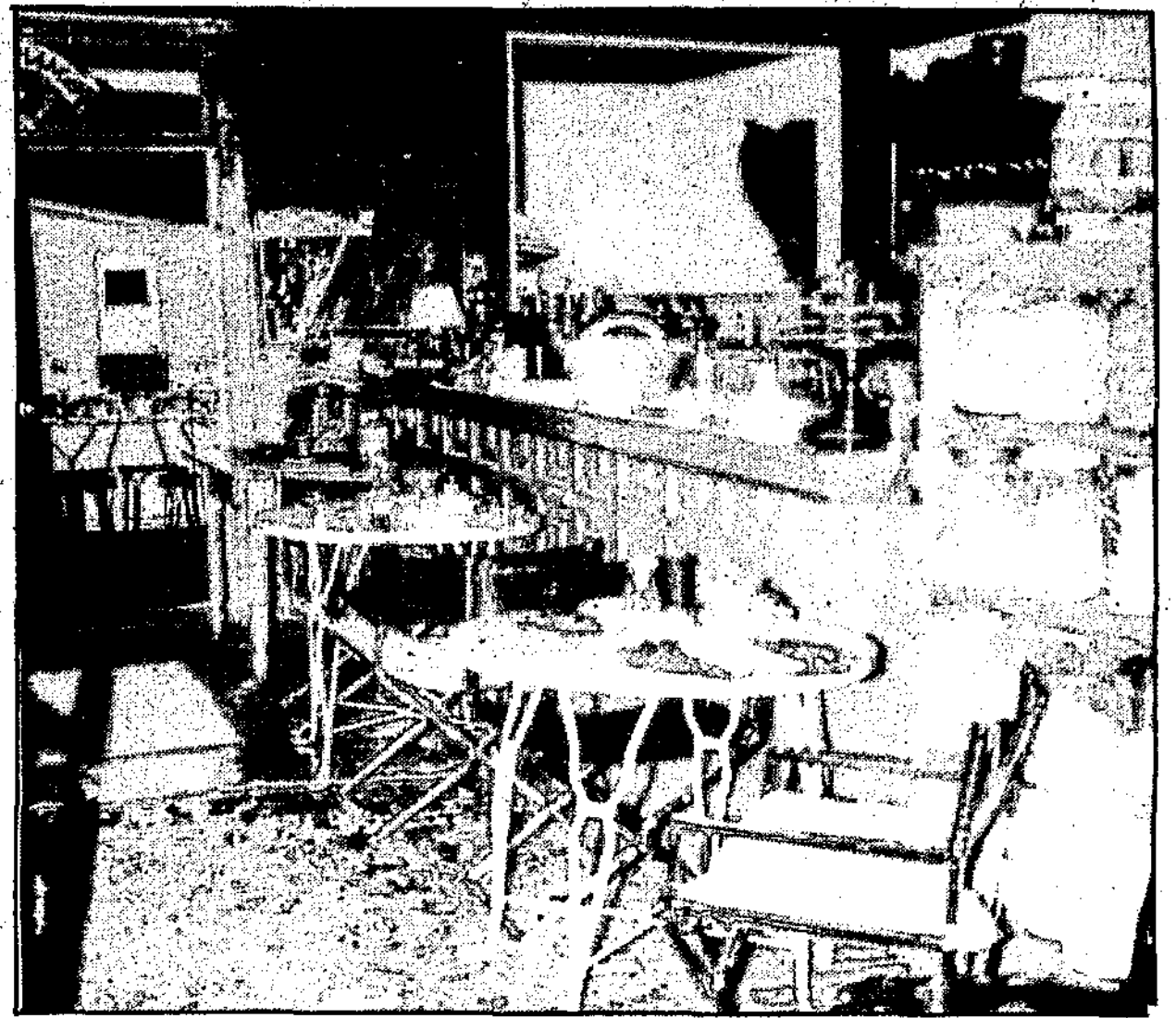

## Editorial

Let's make sure all that is in Ruidoso is truly "in" Ruidoso.

Ruidoso Village Councillor Ray Dean Carpenter reported at Tuesday's village council meeting that parts of the village—including School House Park, the hot mix plant and the cemetery—have never been annexed and so are really not parts of the village.

The "startling fact," discovered through the work of the newly created Annexation Policy Committee, was an example of a long series of such findings recently of areas that were never annexed or areas that were thought to have been annexed, but documentation of those annexations was never properly recorded.

Identifying such areas is important work since these areas receive village services but are sometimes not paying the proper taxes due the village, and those taxes help cover the cost of the services.

The most recent findings of unannexed areas came as a sideline task of the committee, as their central reason for being was to form an annexation policy. But since they have begun to bring to light these discrepancies, we encourage them and the Ruidoso Village Council to continue the important work of rectifying this problem once and for all.

Let's make sure what is in Ruidoso, is really here.—DJP

## Inside the Capitol Reporter's Round

**SANTA FE**—If you want a quick flash of how things stand between New Mexico citizens and their Governor, you can't beat that argument Anaya has been using lately. "You can support this proposal because I won't get any benefit out of it," he has been telling us of such things as building a new governor's residence or adopting an appointive state school board.

That's about as close as you can get to a head-on admission that his advocacy of any project can be the kiss of death, no matter what its objective merits may be.

It was good to see UNM president Tom Ferrer warning, after a speech on education by Senator Les Houston, against oversimplification when discussing the topic.

It's an error to which Senator Houston is prone, along with many of his cohorts in House and Senate. Sometimes that's just a rhetorical device. Politicians, after all, know they will get a positive response when they speak about "getting back to the basics" or cutting education back to just those famous "three R's."

Trouble is, in some instances the auditor most prone to start believing what the speaker says is the speaker himself, and politicians fall into that trap more easily than others.

No students in the present day can go back to the time of the one-room schoolhouse, no matter how much nostalgia Senator Houston and others may be able to elude from audiences on the topic. If education has one clear purpose, that has to be to prepare young people to live in the world—which means the real world they are going to inhabit, not some mythical golden age to which those hoping for a quick fix to educational problems would return them.

It's odd to retire from state government after 31 years and eight months. Why not at least go for a round 32 years?

But that's when State Police Chief Maurice Cordova decided to cash in his state-employment chips, for the usual "personal reasons" that get cited so often in letters of

resignation to our present Governor.

The Chief's letter to tell the boss he was quitting was a long one, listing all the major accomplishments of his time as head of the force. Those who leave during Anaya's term seem to feel the need to do that—which must be about as pleasant as writing your own obituary.

(One also notes that Major Kingsbury, public-relations man for the state cops, retired the day before Chief Cordova, as though he didn't want to have to stay around to explain the latter's departure.)

Land Commissioner Jim Baca never thinks this column says enough good things about him.

The following won't change his views on that topic.

But it does seem worth pointing out that some people are very hard to please. Baca, like all political candidates, came voluntarily to the citizens back in 1982, asking us to allow him to take on a relatively important public post.

He was only there for a few weeks when he began to agitate for legislation to raise the salary for the job, which he had taken knowing full well what it paid.

A short time later, he was talking about pushing to change the Constitution to allow himself and others holding like posts to run for reelection, instead of serving a single four-year term, as he also knew he was committed to do when he solicited our votes.

Now, still short of the four years for which he contracted to serve, he has decided he wants instead to be mayor of Albuquerque.

Surely he can understand why some of us feel constrained to point out that he appears a tiny bit fickle.

Our Governor, in Boise, Idaho, spoke with the vehemence that seems to take over when he is interviewed outside our state.

Republicans, he says, are "prepared to use any institution to destroy Democrats and take over the country."

That sounds a little like Daniel Ortega describing the *contras*.

In what way does that differ from the aims of his own party?

For a relatively small town, Ruidoso has a lot going for it, people-wise. Over the past year, I've noticed that our microcosm holds its own and speaks for itself quite well.

What got me going on this train of thought was reviewing the newspapers from last August through this one. Monday was the deadline for the New Mexico Press Association awards. To choose articles and pictures to submit, we spent time poring over the books of past issues.

Dull moments have been rare in Ruidoso during the last year. From the airport to the trash compactor to lodgers' tax to the Grindstone dam, Ruidoso has seen a lot of activity and controversy.

The town is a good example of democracy in action and people making things happen. "Apathy" is not a word I'd use to describe Ruidosians. "Committed" and "dedicated" are more appropriate terms.

When problems face the village or issues face the council, townspeople usually show up to voice their opinions and stand behind their beliefs. Packed gymnasiums for special town meetings attest to that fact.

I know that the citizens of the United States would not fit into a hall or gymnasium for a special meeting, but sometimes I wonder if things wouldn't run better if our government followed Ruidoso's lead in getting things done. Sure, sometimes things are slow, but at least they are usually accomplished.

And people care—that's the important thing.

Something else I noticed in reviewing a year's worth of papers is the high level of involvement in Ruidoso. The papers are packed with stories about service clubs and civic organizations—Altrusa, Lions and Lionesses, Rotary, Optimists, sororities, Spirit of Ruidoso, Ruidoso-Hondo Valley Hospital Foundation, Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, Ruidoso Downs Ladies Auxiliary, Sertoma and Elks, to name a few.

These organizations do not exist in name only. Their members are hard workers at many events throughout the year.

Ruidosians (actually, residents county-wide) do keep busy. When I moved here from California, I was afraid I'd be bored, but my life in Ruidoso is just the opposite.

I'm involved with Ruidoso Little Theatre, which takes up whatever free time work leaves me. Other people participate in league sports and other things.

Parents seem to be more involved out here than in other states in which I've lived. In Capitán, I saw people help their children with 4-H, Future Farmers of America and other activities. In Ruidoso, it seems that scouting is the big thing. Whatever the activities, parents spend time with their kids, and I think that's great.

I've speculated on the reasons why Ruidosians become so involved. Maybe it's because this isn't a big city, so each voice can be heard and appreciated.

Whatever the reasons, Ruidosians are actively involved. I hope we remain that way, even as our little village continues to grow.

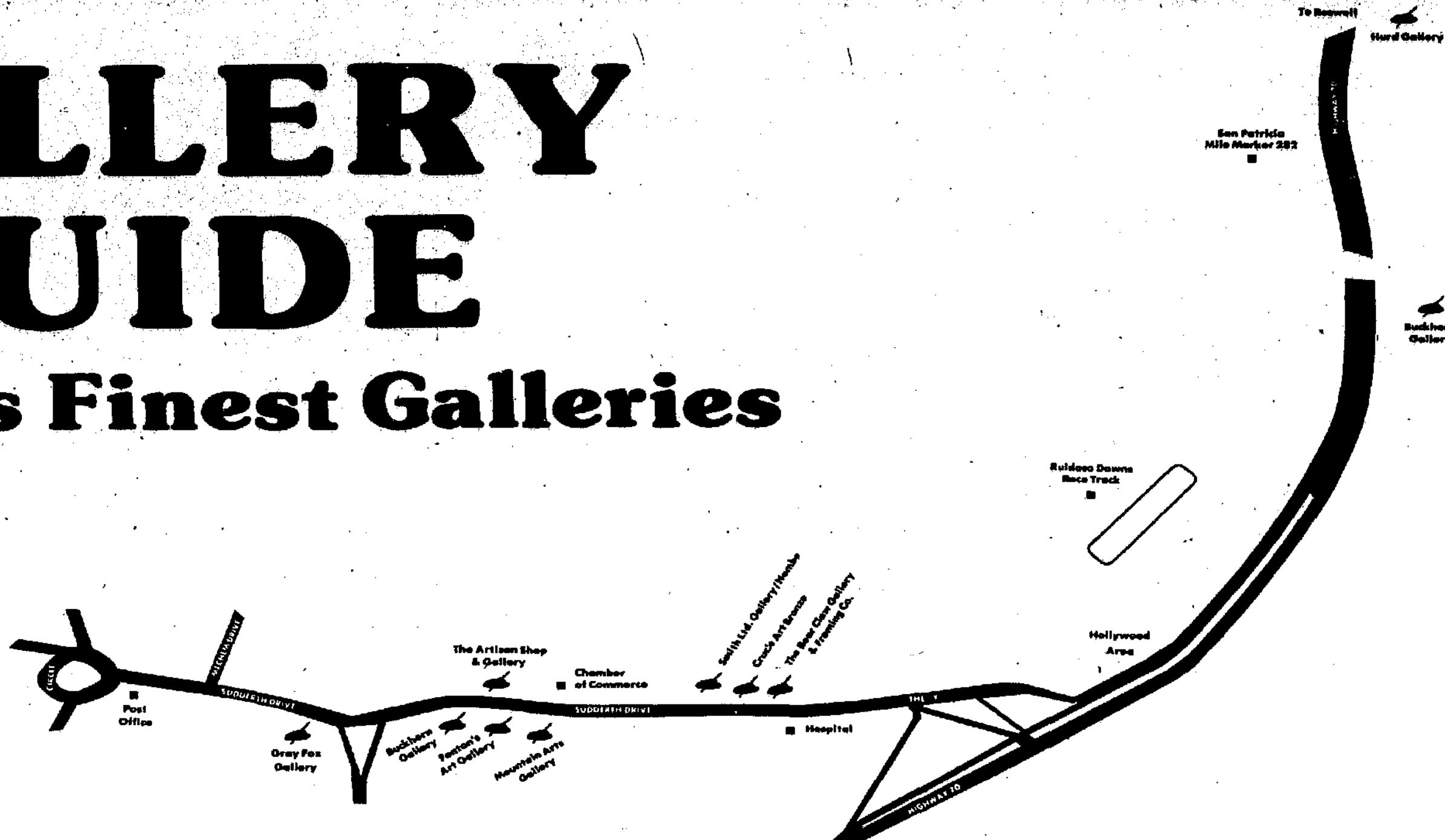
