County reassigns \$ duties

The Lincoln County Board of Commissioners, sitting as the county Board of Finance, appointed the county manager as an investment officer and reviewed county funds to be invested in county banks this week at a special meeting Thursday morning in Ruidoso.

Commissioners Bill Elliott and Ken Nosker named Suzanne Cox as the officer to work with County Treasurer Flora Vega to invest county funds in the qualified banks in Lincoln County. \$3.5 million in county funds are available for short and long-term investments.

Vega, who was present at the meeting to assist in determining amounts of county funds, said she thought the appointment was a "power struggle." She added that having to report investment changes was "a routine" in her office.

"I know how to handle my office," Vega said.

Nosker said that Cox would serve as liaison between the treasurer and the board of finance. "We need to be informed," he said.

"We were as much to blame as anybody," Nosker said, referring to the recent bank failure and subsequent near loss of county funds. Elliott agreed with Nosker adding that the commission wanted to be "sure we're on top of things as set forth in the state statutes."

The commissioners met with the treasurer and local bank representatives to restructure the county finances after the failure of the First National Bank of Lincoln County (FNBLIC) on December 13. More than \$1 million in unsecured county funds were in jeopardy, but were saved when the First National Bank of Alamogordo purchased the bank Monday.

Thursday the commissioners established a 90-day non-interest-bearing warrant account (to pay county bills) and a 90-day interest-bearing checking account with Ruidoso State Bank (RSB). Richard (Buz) Browning, president

of RSB, said the 90 days would indicate whether the accounts would be financially feasible for the bank. After the 90 days RSB will negotiate the accounts with the county.

The commissioners said they selected RSB because of the proximity of the branch bank in Carrizozo to the courthouse, eliminating the need for a county bank runner. Nosker said that he thought the delay in depositing county funds in FNBLIC, because of the distance the former county bank runner had to travel, contributed to not knowing how much money was in FNBLIC when it failed. Vega disagreed with the statement, saying the runner was bonded and not responsible. Vega also said the runner had quit her job the previous Tuesday.

Prior to meeting with the banks representatives, Vega and Cox reviewed the county funds and accounts in county banks on Thursday morning. The county had \$1,276,801.43 in the newly formed FNBR, including \$6,659.06 for the Nogal water grant. FNBR has assured the county that funds up to \$2 million will be secure.

In RSB the county had \$232,654.49. United New Mexico Bank in Carrizozo handled \$209,470.65 in county funds and an additional \$103,883.71 for the Corona schools, for which the county is the fiscal agent. There was no county checking account in the Bank of Ruidoso. The total amount of county funds in checking accounts is \$1,822,820.28.

The county had \$2,429,300.17 invested in three county banks on Thursday morning: \$410,000, including \$10,000 for the Carrizozo Health Clinic was invested in FNBR; \$1,719,300.17, including \$719,300.17 for the Ruidoso-Hondo Valley Hospital was invested in RSB and \$300,000 was in the Bank of Ruidoso.

Vega and Cox determined that \$773,034.21 in outstanding checks and warrants written from FNBLIC is to remain in FNBR. They also determined that the county would need \$394,000 available to cover the next ten days. The ten-day need ac-

count will be handled by RSB.

Ralph Petty, president of Bank of Ruidoso, told the commissioners they should contact the state treasurer's office for a daily rate of interest before determining what banks in which to invest county funds. He said the banks had to abide by the minimum rate, but had the option to give higher rates.

By state statute the county is required to keep interest-bearing accounts in all county banks unless the banks do not qualify (have unsecured accounts). Security is based upon the capital structure of the financial institutions which by law are required to secure 50 percent of investments.

Representatives from the two savings and loans in Ruidoso, Pioneer Savings & Trust and First Federal, were told that their institutions will be considered for investments if they can show that deposits in the Lincoln County branches are sufficient to secure the funds.

Cox will have authority as investment officer to determine which qualifying financial institutions offer the best interest rates, the commissioners said. The commissioner also instructed Vega to report the activities of the treasurer's office to Cox.

Nosker requested that Vega present current treasurer's reports to the commissioners at their regular meetings. He said that the reports were not current in the past. Vega replied that "we (the treasurer's office) don't get credit for the times when we're on time."

County attorney Steve Sanders reported to the commissioners and the bank representatives that he is working with the state attorney general, the state board of finance and the financial institutions on an investment collateral policy for the county. Sanders said the county policy will be based upon the state policy and will be available in rough draft to the banks by this week.

Elliott concluded by commenting that the bank failure situation is a "landmark situation" in the state.

FAA airport funding report awaits village action on present airport land

Progress on the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport (SBRA) may depend upon the Village of Ruidoso's prompt disposition of the current municipal airport site.

Fred Heckman, chairman of the Sierra Blanca Airport Commission (SBAC), told commissioners in a regular meeting Thursday that the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) is holding up on a final funding report until the end of January, partly to give "Ruidoso time to catch up on its process."

Although Heckman told the group during November's meeting that the FAA funding report would be available by the middle of December, he reported Thursday that FAA officials told him they would wait for Ruidoso's decision on the airport land before sending funding recommendations to Washington, D.C.

Heckman reported that the Ruidoso Village Council has initiated the required process by calling for appraisals on the land, and added that the Uniform Standards for Airport Appraisal will be the standard applied in valuing the land.

He said the village administration has asked him to sit on the airport land appraisal proposal review committee, and the commission issued approval for him to serve in that capacity.

In spite of the funding report delay, Heckman reported "no major roadblocks," and added that the airport project is on schedule. However, it was learned at the

meeting that the environmental assessment (EA) identified several areas that will require further study, and possible mitigation before the final EA will be published, paving the way for FAA funding.

The EA report of finding an endangered plant, the Kuenzler hedgehog cactus, near the proposed airport site and reports of a fault area in the vicinity of the airport site could impact the projected schedule.

Published reports of a fault on Fort Stanton prompted engineers to contract for a detailed fault fracture analysis on Site B of Fort Stanton Mesa.

The SBAC authorized Heckman to commit funds to contract for a complete site search for the Kuenzler's hedgehog cactus, after he explained that the research will cost about \$4,700. Heckman said he knows of just one expert on the endangered cactus.

"FAA is afraid this is the most critical factor we're facing in the environmental assessment," noted Heckman, in recommending the study.

"The FAA will not be able to offer you a tentative allocation of funds until the EA is complete," remarked Earl Cook, project engineer with Leedshill-Herkenhoff. Cook, during an engineering report, also opined that it would not be appropriate to advertise for bids until funding is set.

Original schedules called for final design and engineering plans to be completed on December 20, and a call for bids to be issued on January 6, 1986, with bids to be opened on

January 31.

The final public hearing on the EA was conducted on December 16, but Heckman reminded the group that written public comments will be accepted until December 31.

Jerry Trujillo, FAA environmental specialist, said in a recent interview that a final assessment will be published after all comments have been reviewed.

Heckman also reported that about 40 people attended a final EA hearing last week. He said comments during the meeting were all made by Lincoln residents.

Also Thursday, Heckman revealed that some airport funds were endangered during last week's closing of the First National Bank of Lincoln County (FNB).

"We need to make sure that Ruidoso State Bank remains our depository," said Heckman, who announced plans to draft a letter to that effect to the commission's fiscal agent.

"I just want to make sure that the fiscal agent understands that she's got to follow our instructions," said Heckman, after revealing that some SBAC funds were in the process of being moved, without commission approval, from RSB to the FNB when the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency declared that bank insolvent.

Commissioner Ken Nosker said the county will soon have an investment officer, and Heckman said that agent's services might benefit the SBAC in seeing that funds are deposited in an institution where they will earn the highest possible interest.

"I've got a little bit different

view," said commissioner Conrad Buchanan, who praised both Ruidoso State Bank and the Bank of Ruidoso for their community spirit in working to protect the interests of Ruidoso during the recent banking crisis.

"I feel like we owe them a debt of gratitude," said Buchanan, adding that funds shouldn't be moved strictly because of interest rates. "We owe it to those two banks to deposit our monies with them," he added.

In other business Thursday, the SBAC:

—Heard Heckman report that the state is immediately allocating \$300,000 for the airport.

—Was told of a memorandum from Heckman to C. Patrick Montoya of the state Department of Transportation in which he reminded that agency of funding needs for an access road to the SBRA.

—Greeted State Representative Ben Hall and State Highway Department district engineer Lou Medrano.

—Heard Heckman present a Bureau of Land Management report in which he said the land patents on the airport land will be issued soon.

—Received information to review the minority business enterprise program.

—Approved for payment a Leedshill-Herkenhoff engineering bill of \$189,660.

—Signed individual travel vouchers to be reimbursed for mileage to and from meetings and to claim per diem payment for meetings that last over six hours.

—Conducted an executive session.

Crime Stopper telephone tips solve crimes

Richard Sandoval, president of Ruidoso Crime Stoppers, announced Thursday that telephone tips resulted in solving two recent "crimes of the week."

During Crime Stoppers' regular meeting, the board approved paying a \$600 reward on a tip that resulted in the arrest of four people charged with burglarizing Ruidoso Middle School, the municipal swimming pool, Carrizo Lodge and several mobile homes.

"It probably solved a lot more

burglaries than we'll ever know," said Sandoval.

Sandoval said last month the board approved a \$300 payment on another tip that contributed to solving a "crime of the week" burglary. During November five calls were received on the crime stoppers line, he said.

Wilma Sandoval presented plans for a New Mexico State Crime Stoppers meeting planned for Thursday and Friday, May 1-2, 1986, in Ruidoso. She said Attorney General

Paul Bardacke will be the banquet speaker during the annual meeting.

"We will make this the best meeting Crime Stoppers has ever had," said Richard Sandoval, who estimates that 200 people will attend the seminar.

After hearing a resignation letter from board treasurer E.J. Fouratt, another board member, Jim Biggs, suggested "that more members be recruited."

"I would rather have very few board members that really work,"

said Richard Sandoval, who stated that the current small board can accomplish as much as other larger groups.

Jodie Brightman was accepted as a new member, and other members were encouraged to bring prospective members who are really willing to work.

Also Thursday, Sandoval recognized Policeman of the Year Skip Hazel, chief of the Ruidoso Downs Police Department.

Obituary

Harry Lee Whipple Sr.

Harry Lee Whipple Sr. died December 19 in El Paso, Texas. Whipple was born in Waco, Texas, on March 11, 1897.

Whipple owned Whipples Sewing Machine Center in El Paso and in Ruidoso in the 1960s.

Survivors include two sons in El Paso, Harry Lee Whipple Jr. and

James O. Whipple; grandchildren Craig Whipple, Ken Whipple and Chuck Whipple, all of Ruidoso, and Larry Whipple and Mary Ann Whipple, both of El Paso; and six great-grandchildren.

Whipple was preceded in death by his wife, Mary Louise, in 1985. Interment was to be in El Paso Saturday.

Safety belt, littering regulations to be enforced

The New Mexico Safety Belt Use Act, effective January 1, 1986, isn't the only new regulation that may affect Ruidoso citizens.

Commander Dave Pfeffer of the Ruidoso Police Department said Thursday that his officers will begin actively enforcing the "destructive or injurious material on roadway" ordinance as of January 1.

That five-part ordinance constrains people from littering public streets.

Pfeffer said the part of the ordinance dealing with covering loads in the back of trucks should be of

particular interest to local citizens.

"No person shall operate on any street any vehicle or combination or (of) vehicles with any load unless said load and any covering thereon is securely fastened so as to prevent said covering or load from becoming loose, detached, or in any manner a hazard to other users of the street," reads the fifth section of the regulation.

The safety belt regulation requires "each front seat occupant of a passenger car manufactured with safety belts" to buckle up "unless all seating positions equipped with

safety belts are occupied."

The act establishes a minimum fine of \$25 and a maximum of \$50 for non-compliance.

Ruidoso Police Chief Richard Swenor said recently that the seat belt requirement may have a significant impact on insurance settlements on automobile accidents.

Police report that they are already enforcing the child passenger restraint law that went into effect on July 1. That state law requires that all children under 11 years of age be restrained in a child passenger restraint device or by a safety belt "unless all seating posi-

tions equipped with safety belts are occupied."

Another act to begin on January 1, is the New Mexico Clean Air Act, and village manager Jim Hine has already taken steps to bring all municipal buildings into compliance.

The clean air law simply states that all state and municipal buildings must designate areas as "smoking" or "non-smoking."

The Ruidoso Village Council recently voted to designate council chambers of Village Hall as a "non-smoking" area.

Firefighters fight blazes

The Ruidoso Fire Department responded to two fires Friday, December 20.

Three units and 15 firefighters were dispatched at 1:24 a.m. to a structure fire at Course View and Mountain drives.

According to department reports, the fire was confined to the living room and kitchen areas of a house belonging to Glenn Lynch of Odessa, Texas. Department per-

sonnel remained on the scene for about two hours.

The fire is still under investigation, and neither a cause nor a damage estimate are available, said Kortney Hall of the Fire Department.

Hall said village firefighters also extinguished a chimney fire at 6:14 p.m. Friday at the 107 Monica's Court home of Lloyd Momon.

Ski resort says no connection with timeshares

Some of the local timeshare corporations advertise free ski lift tickets for taking a tour of the resort area. A recent display advertisement in The Ruidoso News states that Ski Apache Resort is not connected with real estate or timeshare promotions.

"We are in no way trying to sell timeshares," said Denny McCoy, a representative of Ski Apache.

According to the advertisement, Ski Apache does not accept promotional checks for lift tickets or services.

Representatives of Chateau de la Shay and Ruidoso Inn said that their companies issue a check or give cash to the person taking the tour. The tourist may use the money to purchase ski lift tickets.

Don Boss, a manager at Crownpoint, said his company has nothing to do with Ski Apache. He said Crownpoint brings approximately 3,000 people to Ruidoso each month (to tour the establishment), provides airfare and lodging, and

issues checks that the guests may use for lift tickets or whatever they chose.

"What's Ski Apache's problem?" said Boss. "Between now and January 15, we have 1,500 couples scheduled to ski at that cotton-

picking mountain."

Boss said his company spreads a lot of money throughout Ruidoso as it feeds and houses the guests. He said he is upset about the negative image that is associated with timeshare companies.

Santa Claus is arrested

Santa Claus went to jail the week before Christmas. On December 18, Willie Anderson, a Ruidoso man who was playing Santa Claus at the Bank of Ruidoso, was arrested for writing bad checks.

Lincoln County undersheriff Charlie Cox said he had a bench warrant issued by Carrizozo Magistrate Judge S.M. Ortiz. Cox said the warrant was issued for Anderson's failure to comply with stipulations previously applied by the court.

Cox said that Santa was in the

county jail for only a few hours while making arrangements to pay his debts. Judge Ortiz reported Monday that Anderson made full payment of his fine and court costs and made restitution on the bad checks.

How does it feel to arrest Santa Claus?

"We didn't have much choice," said Cox, about his work in the line of duty.

Anderson could not be reached for comment.



Berdine Smith scored five points, Tammy Osborne had five points and Lynell Scott scored two points to round out the Warrior scoring.


"The team is improving," Sanchez said. "We have a young group, but they really work hard."

Ah, the bowl games. They're starting in earnest now. The California Bowl was last week and the Cherry Bowl, Independence Bowl and Holiday Bowl were played this past weekend.

But the bigger, more established bowl games are coming up this week and New Year's Day.

Commission approves subdivision

The Lincoln County Planning and Zoning Commission (P&Z) recommended approval of the final plat for the Mountain Lakes Subdivision at its regular meeting Thursday night in Carrizozo.

Developer Gary Caughron and engineer Tim Collins presented the plat. The plat contained restrictive covenants revised to meet the recommendations dealing with the containment of horses, which the commission requested at its last meeting.

The subdivision, located off the Fort Stanton road, will feature three small lakes and 15 lots ranging from eight-tenths of an acre to two and six-tenths acres. The lakes will form behind three small dams, which Collins said were designed with the help of Greg Hausler from the Soil Conservation Service (SCS).

P&Z member Sid Goodloe questioned whether the proposed four-

foot spillways for the dams would be sufficient to handle a 100-year flood. Caughron said the dams, made of varying-sized rock held in place with wire mesh, are designed for a 100-year flood. He also said he would continue to consult with Hausler on the design and construction of the dams, including the spillways.

P&Z also recommended the horse corrals be limited to 100-by-100 feet, instead of the one-quarter lot size as stated in the covenants.

Collins also requested that he be given a variance for a portion of a proposed road, which joins an existing road. He requested that the road be 20 feet wide instead of the required 28 feet.

Collins said the existing road is only 20 feet and that the wider road would lead into the narrow existing road. P&Z told Collins that granting of the variance would depend on a review by county road superintendent Earl Kreigs.

P&Z questioned whether a geologic-hydrology report, showing

the location and depths of water, had been filed with the plat. Collins said the subdivision area was included in a report made for Alto Village in 1977. The information satisfied P&Z.

P&Z recommended approval of the subdivision with the stipulations that a letter from the SCS concerning the spillways and comment from Kreigs be included.

Also Thursday night, Ben Hall presented the final plat for the Salado Creek Flats Subdivision. Hall said he had the reports concerning sewer and water from the Environmental Improvement Division. He said that he received 37 permits for wells to comply with the variance that was granted to allow a community water association instead of the developer supplying water.

P&Z requested that Hall include a hydrological report showing the quality and availability of water wells before it approves the final plat.

ET commission denies rezone request

The Ruidoso Lincoln County Extraterritorial Zoning Commission (ETC) denied a request to rezone a plot of land in the upper Gavilan Canyon area.

Peggy Whatley, of P&K Realty of Ruidoso, represented Mavis and Thomas Montgomery. Whatley requested the Montgomery's residentially-zoned land be rezoned commercial.

ETC denied the request because the owner had no specific plans for

commercial development and because adjacent property owners disapproved (by letter) of the zoning change. ETC said it was opposed to "spot zoning," but would reconsider the decision if a specific commercial development is presented in the future.

Inside the Capitol by Fred McCaffrey

SANTA FE— There's good news and bad news about the funds in our state's investment portfolios.

You may think the dizzying new highs being reached by the Dow Jones industrial averages mean something only to big investors, but that's not so. Each of us, as the citizen-owners of the money our state puts into investments, has reason to smile quietly when the market climbs in this way.

That, in fact, is the heart of the good news. Thus far this year, our stock holdings, which make up only about 15 percent of the value of our investments, have earned more than \$10 million in realized profits. What's more, we have more than \$60 million more in "paper" or unrealized gains on the performance of our stocks alone. It is possible our realized and unrealized earnings on this portion of the portfolio could reach over \$100 million this year, which would be the most we have earned this way in something like 15 years.

And when our Investment Office asked brokers and others it deals with to predict how the economy is going to hold up, the comments, while not as wildly bullish as the market, were far from discouraging.

Asked about long-term interest rates, these folks predicted they would run somewhere between 9.25 percent on the low end and 11.5 percent on the high. They look for the inflation rate to range between 3.75 and 4.7 per annum, and for a relatively healthy increase of from three to four percent in the gross national product. None of that's phenomenal, but it's better than a poke in the eye with a sharp stick, and such pokes are what we've been getting lots of lately.

And in the further spirit of good news, how about this small sidelight? The insistence of a highly vocal minority of the state's citizens on divesting our holdings of stock in firms doing business in South Africa had a good effect; it forced the Investment Officer to sell our stock in Texaco just before that firm was hit by the most crippling judicial decision in the history of American business. Bully for us!

To be fair, let's also look at the bad side of the news about the state's investments.

Our state hasn't completely learned some of the things recent developments have shown we have to become expert in. For one, we never thought we would have to find out what the FSLIC and the FDIC mean when they say holdings on deposit are insured up to \$100,000. Like lots of depositors, we knew our money in banks and savings and loans was safe, since there hadn't been any bank failures of note since the dark days of the Depression.

That is a condition which no longer prevails, and we had to get a ruling on the important point we had not queried up till then: Does that \$100,000 policy apply to each separate state account, or are all state accounts in any institution counted as one for the sake of insurance?

It would have been wise to get the answer to that question before we made the deposits, instead of waiting till the first S and L turned up its toes before asking.

That very failure also taught us another thing we had not planned on knowing. It is that, no matter how much collateral has been set aside to protect our deposit, it does the state little good if: a.) the state can't get its hands on the collateral for years; and b.) it costs almost as much to collect on the collateral as it yields us after we assume control of the mortgages that make it up.

Thus, while we smile when we now reassure the citizens that all general fund money on deposit in CD's is fully collateralized, that is not actually as consoling a thought as it sounds on first hearing.

As for those CD's, some bankers and some savings and loan executives are now refusing to roll them over as they come due. So far, banks have told us to pick up about \$15.5 million of our money and S and L's another \$4.7 million because they'd just as soon pay lower interest rates than the state has been getting.

That brings us up to date on the bad news in the investment department. The only further worry here appears to be what comes when the governor continues to speak about "legislative proposals" still to be drafted on this topic. The more of those we get, the more time and attention legislators have to give to subjects like this that aren't, compared to our present shortage of cash, of much importance at all.

Program offers tips to alcohol servers

Richard Sandoval, owner of Cheers Lounge and M & S Liquors, has access to some tips about serving alcoholic beverages. He wants to offer the TIPS—Training for Intervention Procedures by Servers of alcohol—to all Ruidoso servers.

Sandoval said the program teaches servers how to recognize when someone has had too much to drink and how to handle the situation.

"We don't want people to abuse alcohol," he said.

The courts are beginning to hold restaurants and bars responsible for some alcohol-related accidents, said Sandoval.

"If someone gets drunk and has an accident, we're liable if it is determined that we were the cause of the person getting drunk," said Sandoval.

The TIPS program teaches servers when not to sell more alcohol to an intoxicated person. It also gives important information of the effects of alcohol.

The program is coordinated by Anheuser-Busch, who offers it to restaurant and bar employees at a reduced, nominal cost. The one-day program costs \$10.

Sandoval said he hopes to offer this program at Cheers in the near future. He urged anyone interested in taking the course to call him at 257-7057.


