Downs mayoral election spat will be decided in court

The ultimate winner of the March 4 Village of Ruidoso Downs mayoral race may be named in court.

Don Dutton, attorney for the Village of Ruidoso Downs, said he will file a legal "answer" to a summons served on Downs Mayor Carlton L. "Bones" Wright. The summons is a result of a court complaint from unsuccessful mayoral candidate J.C. "Jake" Harris.

The March 24 complaint filed in District Court by Harris, which alleges at least six election violations took place in the March 4 election, must be answered within 30 days to enable mayor Carlton "Bones" L. Wright to stay in office, Dutton said.

Wright said he would meet with attorneys to decide the proper response to the summons before the 30 day time limit expires.

The answer must be filed with the clerk of the District Court within 30 days. The District Court judge is Richard A. Parsons.

Wright said it will be business-as-usual in the Downs until "they (Harris) run me out or I find out I can stay, and they are going to have

hell running me out."

Charles Hawthorne, attorney for Harris, said he had "no comment" on the summons. He said the summons spoke for itself.

Harris could not be reached for comment.

Dutton said he would like to represent Wright if the election had to be resolved in court.

However, Dutton said he had to check with the New Mexico Municipal League to see if it was proper for a municipal attorney to represent a municipality and an individual named in a complaint.

Dutton said state and municipal election laws had recently been changed, and were "very complicated."

The complaint lists Carlton L. Wright and the Village of Ruidoso Downs as the contestees.

Dutton said his first legal action might be to ask that the name of the Village of Ruidoso Downs be removed from the complaint.

"The law says the winners of the suit are entitled to costs from the opposing court contestants," Dutton said.

Dutton said Downs residents should not be liable for any costs should they lose in court.

The Village of Ruidoso Downs should not have their name on the complaint because they had nothing to do with the voting procedures in the election itself, according to Dutton.

Dutton said he would appeal the decision, which would allow Wright to stay in office longer, if the court ruled in favor of Harris.

Harris' complaint alleges 14 votes were wrongfully counted in the election. Wright's status as a write-in candidate was not valid, that pollsters counseled voters improperly at the election and that non-residents voted in the mayoral election.

"Their summons is absolutely ridiculous. The whole complaint is erroneous," Dutton said.

"If I were Jake Harris I would shake Bones' hand, say good luck, and try to get him in the next election," Dutton said.

"This summons is going to cost the people involved and the village a whole lot of time and money over nothing," Dutton said.

"I think it reflects well on the American system that a person can run as a write-in and win. I think Bones' victory represented the will of the people," Dutton said.



School bond election is Tuesday

All registered voters in the Ruidoso Municipal Schools (RMS) District Number 3 are being asked to approve a \$2.6 million school improvements bond issue on Tuesday, April 8.

Eligible voters may cast their vote from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. in the Ruidoso Middle School office lobby on Tuesday.

Voters will be asked to approve additions and improvements to Nob

Hill Elementary School, Ruidoso Middle School, White Mountain Intermediate School and Ruidoso High School.

W.D. Horton Stadium also is scheduled to be upgraded if the bond issue passes.

The bonds will be sold in two installments.

Property owners should not see a property tax increase until 1987, with the second sale of the bonds.

If a person has property which is valued at \$60,000 on tax rolls, their yearly tax increase would be \$14 based on an average yearly mill levy tax increase of \$.70 per \$1,000 of assessed value.

"The bond issue is necessary to maintain the quality of education in our school district and to allow us to improve our physical facilities," said Mike Gladden, associate superintendent of RMS.

Court to decide candidates' fate

A provision in Ruidoso's municipal code restricting village employees from seeking public office without first resigning was the subject of a special meeting of the Ruidoso Village Council Thursday.

Councillors voted unanimously to instruct village attorney John Underwood to seek a District Court

declaratory judgment of whether the municipal code provision is constitutional.

The councillors' action apparently is a result of Ruidoso Police Captain Dave Pfeffer's bid for the office of Lincoln County Sheriff in the upcoming election.

"If I have to resign I will," Pfeffer said when contacted Friday.

"It's that important to me.

"No one has given me any special

direction as to what to do at this time," Pfeffer said in a Sunday statement. He said he has submitted the municipal code provision to a local attorney to determine whether it will prohibit him from staying a village employee while seeking the office of sheriff.

Pfeffer has been a Ruidoso Police officer for 10 years, and currently serves as operations commander for the department.

One found not guilty in gambling trial

A District Court jury Thursday found Bobby Guy Thomason not guilty of commercial gambling charges after a short period of deliberation.

"I feel real good about it," Thomason said after the trial. When asked whether he felt he had

been unjustly charged, Thomason responded, "I know I was."

Assistant District Attorney Harry Wilcox Jr., representing the State of New Mexico, reported that no appeal of the decision is planned.

Thomason's attorney in the one-day trial was Albert Rivera. The trial was a result of a sum-

mer State Police gambling raid in Ruidoso that resulted in 22 arrests. Thomason was the only one arrested who was charged with commercial gambling.

"I hadn't done nothing wrong to start with," Thomason commented Thursday.

Dead/down wood is generally scarce and hard to locate with the exception of juniper bush areas in the Jicarillas. The green wood areas presently open are predominantly pinon. Another green wood area will open this spring with both pinon and juniper

available.

Cost of a permit is \$10 per cord for dead/down and \$14 per cord for green wood. Fuelwood must be removed with a permit in possession and from the designated area shown on your permit. Maps of the open areas and fuelwood permits are available at the district office at 901 Mechem Drive. Office hours are 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Pfeffer bids for sheriff

Dave Pfeffer is a candidate for the position of Lincoln County Sheriff.

Pfeffer, a Democrat, has spent 10 years as a Ruidoso Police Officer, beginning as a communications officer and working his way up to his present position as operations commander. In that role, Pfeffer supervises the operations of all branches of the Ruidoso Police Department, public relations, the training of officers and internal affairs. The candidate said 30 officers are under his direction.

Pfeffer hopes to bring his long list of accomplishments to the sheriff's office, especially in the formation of a "metro unit."

Such a group, made up of top officers from all law enforcement agencies, would cooperate work on major crimes. Information gathering would flow from agency to agency, and jealousies of who would get the credit for solving cases would not come up since the metro unit would take the credit jointly, Pfeffer indicated.

He said such a unit and spirit of cooperation would be a big step forward in solving major crimes quickly.

Although Pfeffer said no drastic changes would be made in the way the Sheriff's Office currently operates, he would like to make some changes. Changes Pfeffer would bring to the Sheriff's Office include stricter guidelines on

deputies' uniforms, equitable treatment of all who come in contact with the office, having deputies spend more time out in the county in contact with the people and a greater emphasis on professionalism.

"It's going to be the best sheriff's office around," he said.

Pfeffer's qualifications for the job include being the Senior Deputy Medical Investigator for this area, a Command level certification from the State of New Mexico for 500 or more additional hours of training beyond the training all officers receive at the law enforcement academy (Pfeffer actually has more than 600 hours), a certification as a forensic hypnotist, and his responsibilities as a hostage negotiator and in organizing bank training programs.

Pfeffer is a member of the Ruidoso Sertoma Club, the 12th Judicial Law Enforcement Association, the Sheriff's and Police Association and the International Society for Forensic and Investigative Hypnotists.

Prior to police work, Pfeffer was a managing partner and district manager for Sambo's Restaurants, where he was in charge of 50-60 employees at a time. He is married to Roxann Pfeffer, also a Ruidoso Police officer, and has lived in Ruidoso for 10 years. The Pfeffers have four children: David, 10; Brandy, 9; Crystal, 8; and Billy, 7.

Ruidosoan Jerry Roy Propsner is trying to start a community self-help program that would benefit troubled teens as well as senior citizens in the Ruidoso area.

After viewing a television program on troubled youth, Propsner thought back to the relationship he had with his grandparents when he was growing up.

Propsner said he feels teens can benefit from senior citizen's wisdom and ability to cope with trying situations.

Propsner has contacted the Children In Need of Service (CHINS) program in both Roswell and Alamogordo to help facilitate a teen-to-senior-citizen communication program in Ruidoso, he said.

Juvenile probation officer Jane Parnell and Ruidoso Care Center director George Loveless have also been contacted by Propsner concerning his plans to better communication between these two diverse

segments of the population.

Propsner, who would like to sponsor a teen support organization called the "Polar Friends Program," envisions teens in the area and residents of the Ruidoso Care Center communicating by exchanging recorded cassettes with each other, he said.

If the teens become interested enough in the person they are exchanging cassettes with, Propsner said he hopes they will eventually want to visit their "friends" at the care center.

Propsner hopes the senior citizens will be buoyed by communication with the teen-agers,

and the teen-agers will learn coping skills in life as well as to keep their personal problems in perspective, he said.

Cox is a native of New Mexico, served two years in the U.S. Army and was recalled to serve another year during the Cuban crisis. He is bilingual, a member of First Baptist Church of Carrizozo, married and has six children.

Cox finished his sixth term as Sierra County Sheriff in 1982 and under New Mexico law could not seek another term. He was appointed chief deputy sheriff of Lincoln County by Sheriff Tom Sullivan in January 1983.

"Many successful and worthwhile programs have been started under this administration but have not been fully developed," said Cox. After having worked with these programs, Cox said his goal is to see them continued.

Cox states that good law enforcement is an important factor in the growth and development of Lincoln County.

Cox said he is qualified to seek the office of sheriff because of his experience and working knowledge of the county gained while serving as chief deputy sheriff for Lincoln County.



Inside the Capitol by Fred McCaffrey

SANTA FE—The big question mark in New Mexico elections this year is the alienated voter.

Will those who are in this category stay away from the polls in June and November? Or will they, in the alternative, turn out and vote in large numbers, intent upon overturning the plans of traditional politicians and their parties?

There is, Lord knows, plenty of reason for alienation. In recent years, we've seen a sufficiency of the kind of activity that turns voters off, and caught enough glimpses in to how things really operate in our statehouse for a wave of revulsion to sweep over the very voters whom we need most.

Do you know anybody at this moment who would call what we get from chief executive and lawmakers "prudent management"? Is there anybody who isn't disturbed when indictments fall, not once but repeatedly, on high-ranking officials of state government? Do you personally get the impression that anyone you can and want to depend on is really in charge here?

Who, in short, is satisfied with state government as we presently experience it?

But what matters is how voters respond to all those reasons for dissatisfaction. Will they simply stay home in a fit of disgust when faced with a chance to change these conditions at the polls? Will they blame all politicians, and so without their approval from any of that breed? Or will they make proper distinctions and blame only those who are responsible for the way things are?

It's tough to say what the answers to those questions will turn out to be. But those answers will govern to a large degree the turnout in primary and general elections this year, and the turnout could well control the quality of the replacements we get for those who have brought things to this pass.

Mention the word "alienation," as above, and somebody is almost sure to say, "It's you guys who write about government who are responsible for how people feel about it. If the voters are alienated,

you cause that to come to be."

Hey, not guilty. We didn't counsel or cause those activities by our Governor and those around him, or by our Legislature, that contribute most to the citizens' feelings of disillusionment. We publicize such actions, but that's a whole lot different from doing them ourselves.

And sharp readers will appreciate how much worse these very conditions might be if we didn't go around poking our nose in to what goes on and writing our words about it.

Toney Anaya's almost surely going to do some things certain of our citizens will see as flaky during the months remaining in his term.

For one thing, he's going to have too much time on his hands, and when he does, he comes up with some ideas that most of us think are doozies.

Declaring New Mexico a "sanctuary" state will rank in that category for some people, though others will be edified by the act and will praise him for his generosity. Your response on the particular point will largely depend on how you feel about symbols.

One attitude toward this step is to say, "It's only a symbol, after all, and has no real juridical or other force." In short, it really doesn't accomplish much more than waving the flag or pledging allegiance to it does; not much is noticeably different after the act is done from the way things were when it was started.

Others, however, of a more poetical cast of mind, will say that symbols are extremely important. That is why some of them, including Archbishop Sanchez, Bishop Trelease and the head of the organization that speaks for most of the ecclesiastical judicatories in the state, urged Anaya to do something like this.

Whichever side you take, it's pretty clear that there isn't going to be a suddenly increased flow of undocumented aliens into the state, despite the Governor's warm and friendly gesture toward them.

If he doesn't do anything wilder than this, we're lucky.

Commissioners hire attorney to aid grand jury investigation

Lincoln County Commissioners hired attorney Gary Mitchell on a short term, emergency basis during a special meeting Saturday.

Commissioners Bill Elliott, Ken Nosker and A. W. "Gnat" Gnatkowski decided, after a two hour executive session, to hire Mitchell to aid the county in the production of documents to aid in a grand jury investigation.

Mitchell said he is to handle this because of a conflict of interest between Lincoln County Attorney Steve Sanders, who was formerly District Attorney, and James Weldon current District Attorney.

"It is the duty of the grand jury to look into various functions of county government," said Mitchell.

"The commissioners want to aid

in every way possible to provide any information the grand jury requires," stated Nosker.

Commissioners approved hiring Mitchell at a fee of \$85 per hour, not to exceed \$5,000.

The commissioners would not comment on the subject of the grand jury investigation, or why a conflict of interest exists.

In other business, the commissioners:

—Tabled a bill from the Bank of Ruidoso for the services of bank attorney Mel O'Reilly on behalf of First National Bank of Ruidoso (formerly Moncor), in the amount of \$3,788. County Manager Suzanne Cox will contact the New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration to determine the

legality and procedure concerning the bill.

—Approved the purchase of a vehicle for the assessors office.

—Rejected proposals for an airport administrator and called for new bids. The rejected proposals will remain private until a bid is accepted.

"At that time all bids will become public," said Elliott.
