

Wildcats scratch Warriors, 28-19

Anything can happen in high school football, even defeats for defending state champions.

And that is what happened to the Ruidoso Warriors Friday night, as they lost a 28-19 game to host Lovington.

The defending state AAA-division champions lost a 13-7 halftime lead, as the Wildcats scored three times in the second half for the victory.

"We just didn't perform like we know we can," said Warrior head coach Cooper Henderson. "You'll see a much better Warrior team in the next couple of weeks."

Lovington, now 2-0 on the season, hurt Ruidoso with a lot of stunting in the first half, sometimes sending half the team after Warrior quarterback Jeff Willingham.

Still, the Warriors managed their 13-7 halftime lead on a four-yard run by Willingham and a 10-yard pass from Willingham to Brian Davis.

Lovington scored first after recovering a Warrior fumble at the Ruidoso five.

Wildcat quarterback Robert Arreola scored on a keeper from six yards out. The extra point kick was good and Lovington led, 7-0, with 8:08 remaining in the first quarter.

That lead held up until early in the second quarter.

Willingham picked off a Lovington pass and returned it to the Wildcat 34.

From there, the Warriors scored in three plays.

Chuck Daniels got five yards to the Lovington 29, fullback Billy Harrison blasted up the middle for 25 yards to the four, and Willingham took it over on a keeper on the next play.

Garret Henson's extra-point kick

was good and the game was tied, 7-7, with 10:54 remaining in the first half.

The Warriors went ahead late in the second quarter.

Eric Eastep recovered a Lovington fumble and the Warriors drove 49 yards in seven plays for the go-ahead touchdown.

Willingham and Bubba Miller each ran for seven yards to put the ball on the 35.

Two running plays got just two yards, but Harrison then picked up 10 to the 23.

Willingham then connected with Bryan Richardson for a 13-yard pass to the 10.

On the next play, Willingham found Davis over the middle for the touchdown.

Henson's extra point kick was blocked, but Ruidoso still took a 13-7 lead into the lockerroom at halftime.

But Lovington took the second-half kickoff and drove 63 yards in seven plays for a touchdown.

The big play in the drive was a 28-yard run to the five by Wildcat fullback Jerry Dodd. Ruidoso also was hurt by a personal foul penalty.


Shay Wise finished the drive with a five-yard run with 7:49 left in the third quarter. The extra point kick was good and Lovington had the lead for good, 14-13.

The score remained the same for the rest of the third quarter and much of the final quarter. Neither team could mount a sustained drive.

But the hosts put together a 60-yard drive in the final five minutes to put the game away.

Arreola sparked the drive with a 34-yard run to the 23. Dodd then rambled for 17 yards to the six.

On the next play, Arreola found Lance Foster in the left corner of the end zone for the touchdown.

The extra point kick again was good and Lovington led, 21-13, with 3:30 left in the game.

Ruidoso was stymied in its next series, and after the Warriors failed to make a first down on fourth down, Lovington took over at the 25.

Three plays later, Dodd went over from the two for the final Lovington touchdown. The extra point kick was good and Lovington led, 28-13.

The Warriors salvaged some pride when Davis ran 88 yards for a touchdown on the ensuing kickoff. The 6-3 senior sprinted down the left sidelines for the score with 11 seconds remaining in the game.

Ruidoso went for a two-point conversion, but the ball fell incomplete and the game ended two plays later.

The Warriors could only gain 131 yards total offense, 77 running and 53 passing.

Richardson led the Warrior receivers with four catches for 42 yards. Harrison was the leading Warrior rusher, gaining 54 yards in nine carries.

Ruidoso will attempt to get back in the win column against Goddard Friday, September 12, in Roswell.

Goddard fell to Roswell (the state's top-ranked AAAA-division team), 42-6, last Friday.

WARRIOR NOTES—Davis was named the Warriors' offensive player of the week, junior Sean Moore was the top defensive player and junior Todd Morris was the top kicking team player. Other games Friday involving District 3-AAA teams saw Silver City edged by Bowie, 21-20, Deming lose to Socorro, 7-0, Cobre lose to Tularosa, 28-10, and Hot Springs defeated by Clint, 30-18.

Benefits rider Steve Harris

Status of jockey's fund has sparked questions

Injured jockey Steve Harris was to benefit from a party and auction conducted at The Barn on Sunday June 1, but his wife, Dalene, said Sunday Harris is unsure of how much money was deposited in his trust fund at Ruidoso State Bank.

Although it was reported last June that over \$15,000 was raised for Harris on June 1, Roy Browning revealed that a bank official told Harris Wednesday that only \$10,000 was in the trust account.

Mrs. Harris said her husband contacted the bank Wednesday to see how much money is in the trust fund after a Ruidoso friend was concerned that some of the funds might be missing.

Mrs. Harris said Preston Isaacs of Ruidoso State Bank agreed to send them information on how the trust fund was set up, whose name is on it and what the balance is.

"The bank hasn't sent us that information yet," said Mrs. Harris.

Isaacs was unwilling to discuss the trust fund, when contacted Friday. He said information on trust accounts is available only to those whose names are on the accounts.

Isaacs said a trust can be set up a number of ways, according to the wishes of the person establishing the account.

The news reported on June 2 that the benefit at The Barn "raised over \$15,000 ... to help Harris in his time of need." The report continued that Erik Satie of The Barn was still accepting contributions for the fund.

In addition to the funds raised at The Barn, Mike Fones, publicity director at Ruidoso Downs, said Thursday he supplied the trust fund account number to several racing publications. He said he knew that other donations were made to the Harris fund.

"It was my idea to have the benefit," said Fones, who added the account should have had a balance of near \$23,000.

Fones said Satie and Raymond Reeves, manager of The Barn, set up the account. He said he helped only with publicity.

"Erik and I set it up kind of together," said Reeves. "I never even thought of it since then," he added.

Reeves said the first deposit was \$13,000 to \$14,000.

Donated items were auctioned and half of The Barn's profits were pledged to the Harris fund for the evening of the party.

"They had such an overwhelming response that they couldn't auction it all off," said Fones.

Reeves said another auction was conducted later, and another deposit was made in the Harris account. He said items that weren't auctioned were returned to the donors.

"I don't see any problem," said Reeves early today. "Whatever's supposed to be there is there," he added.

Reeves said he'll contact the bank today to check on the account. Mrs. Harris, too, said she and Steve are anxious to hear from the bank.

Mule races, Apache ceremony are scheduled this weekend

Ruidoso Downs Race Track will get "muleish" this weekend for the seventh year of mule races Friday through Sunday, September 12 to 14.

Mescalero tribal members also plan activities for this weekend as the Centennial Commemoration gets under way Friday and Saturday on the reservation.

According to Ruidoso Downs Muleskinners president David McMath, a few hundred mules and their owners are expected to arrive here for the races and assorted events surrounding the races.

Also scheduled during the mule races will be an auction of mules at the test barn at Ruidoso Downs at 7:30 p.m. Saturday. McMath said mules of all descriptions, including racers, will be up for sale.

Auctioneers will be Tommy Maricle of Snyder, Texas, and Verna Moening of Electra, Texas.

Roping competition involving mules will take place during the meet. Roping all three days of the event will take place at the Beavers Arena in Ruidoso Downs.

Races will be run at several

distances, and fun races, like a balloon bust, Pony Express race, and relay races also will be conducted.

Post time will be 1 p.m. each day, and about 12 races a day will be run.

Admission will be \$2.50 for adults and free for children under 12.

McMath said race sponsors and program sponsors are being sought. Deadline for sponsors is Tuesday.

The event benefits the Shriners and Ruidoso High School Distributive Education Club of America (DECA). DECA students will operate a concessions stand during the races.

Village found liable in 1984 fire

District Judge Sandra Grisham has granted a motion for summary judgment which holds the Village of Ruidoso liable for a home destroyed by fire on April 6, 1984, according to attorneys in a court case.

Steve Bell of Roswell, attorney for the insurance company carrying the Village of Ruidoso liability policy in 1984, said Judge Grisham granted the motion by John A. Sheldon, and denied a motion Bell filed which would have held the village not liable.

"She has verbally ruled in our favor," said Charles Currier, Sheldon's attorney. He said the judge will sign a formal document after an amount of liability is

established during a hearing in District Court in Alamogordo.

Bell said Grisham will rule today (Monday) on the value of the property and contents at 102 Quince Circle. He said New Mexico state law limits that liability to \$100,000, within the range of coverage the Compass Insurance Co. had on the village at the time of the fire.

Currier said his client claimed that the fire hydrant the firefighters were required to use to fight the blaze in the Ponderosa Heights Subdivision had very little water in it. He said the hydrant had less than a third of the minimum required by law.

"The judge based her decision on

the fact that the city had a duty to maintain fire hydrants in Ponderosa Heights," opined Currier. He said an expert witness for the village testified the hydrant in question could have pumped no more than 174 gallons per minute, while the minimum required by law is 500 gallons per minute.

He said the witness, from Boyle Engineers, said many, if not all, fire hydrants in the village were in that same condition (in 1984).

The news reported on April 8, 1984, that two homes were destroyed by fire on Saturday, April 8, in spite of efforts by firefighters from Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs, Bonito and the U.S. Forest

Service. It was reported that firefighters responded at 9:30 p.m. and fought the blaze for 90 minutes.

A house at 100 Quince Circle also burned to the ground, according to the report.

"We're still in court," said Sheldon, contacted by telephone Sunday. He said he won't comment on the case until it is resolved.

Ruidoso Fire Chief Virgil Reynolds, in a telephone conversation Sunday, recalled the area didn't have enough water to fight the big fire. Reynolds said the Water Department has done some work in that area since 1984. He said his department has an ongoing hydrant-testing program.

Ruidoso Village Council

First six months in office have been challenging

Superstitious citizens might want to avoid Tuesday's meeting of the Ruidoso Village Council. It will be the 13th regular session for this administration, sworn in just six months ago on March 10. Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr. and

four members of the six-member council were elected on March 4 by a record number of voters. The five joined councillors Ray Dean Carpenter and Jerry Shaw after ceremonies at Village Hall. Mayor Davis took over from former Mayor George White, but he was no newcomer to village government. Davis served as Ruidoso

mayor in the 1970s.

Issues identified during the campaign were water and a new airport—and those subjects have recurred in most of the past 12 meetings. But problems between the council and the Planning and Zoning Commission (P&Z) were not so predictable—with this council overturning all but one appeal it has heard on P&Z actions. Mayor Davis at one meeting offered two citizens \$100 to take their appeals to the Supreme Court, but the council itself overturned the P&Z denials. Last week three members of P&Z resigned, with two citing problems with the mayor and council as reasons for quitting.

Economics, too, have worried the council, as they've heard reports from the village manager of declining revenues. The governing body has been called upon to meet in several workshops to slash expenditures. This administration is the first to have a full-time village engineer, and he has been called upon during most meetings to report on a variety of subjects—traffic lights, the Grindstone Canyon dam project, the dam intake structure, the Eagle Creek well field, a leaky water storage tank and the trash compactor.

For three meetings in a row trash was a major topic for discussion, with the council finally adopting an open policy on the municipal trash transfer system when it was put into operation after three years of planning and talk. This council has wrestled with how to pay for the Ruidoso Municipal Airport land so that the village can keep that tract when the air facility moves to Fort Stanton mesa. Although all agree the land should remain in the hands of the village, the six were split down the middle on a proposed .50 cent tax increase to pay the \$2.6 million needed to keep the land. Mayor Davis broke the tie, passing the sales tax increase that will

put Ruidoso's tax rate ahead of all other New Mexico cities—to 6.5 percent.

A negative referendum petition calling for an election on that tax hike has apparently placed that question in the hands of the voters. The mayor said Sunday that six months may be a little too soon to evaluate the governing body. He said several "good things are in the mill."

The Eagle Creek water project is one of those good things. "I thought the airport looked good until the negative referendum," said Davis.

"I'm very alarmed about the number of village employees we're losing because of the attitude of the council," remarked Davis.

The council has been faced with an assortment of personnel questions and problems over the past six months. It has heard complaints from citizens regarding the Police Department during several meetings.

An item on the agenda for Tuesday's meeting is a proposed personnel ordinance, drafted at the request of the council.

Councillor Simon said Sunday the personnel changes are probably the most important accomplishment of this governing body. He said better training and a good job classifica-

"We are buying time while we are considering the possibility of going public (with a stock offering)," said Ferd Slocum, president of Ruidoso Sunland, Inc. and a director of the Jockey Club.

Slocum said the move is an attempt to put a short-term fix on the track's financial difficulties, which he blamed on a poor economy, particularly in West Texas.

He noted that the \$3.75 million will solve all the "due and payable obligations" of the track.

Slocum signed a letter Jockey Club members received Friday that sought the financial support. In a letter accompanying Slocum's, Bank of Ruidoso President Ralph Petty Jr. indicated the bank would agree to the loan, provided it is secured by personal guarantees, according to the Journal.

Chamber committee sets historical guidelines

The Historic Committee for the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce began the work of selecting historical sites in the Ruidoso area by setting a cutoff date to designate what is and isn't historical.

Committee chairman Dan D. Swearingin suggested the date of December 7, 1941, to be the cutoff point, with structures built prior to that date qualifying to be termed "historical." After discussion, the 11 group members present agreed to the date.

The committee continued to set criteria defining historic areas by determining that the "Ruidoso area" shall be made up of the area that makes up the "Ruidoso recreation area." Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs, the Hondo Valley, Lincoln, Captain, Nogal and White Oaks were mentioned as towns in that area.

The committee then adopted draft criteria for designation of historical sites or properties, as proposed by Swearingin.

In addition to a description of the Ruidoso area and setting a cutoff

date, the draft:

—Defined a Ruidoso Historic Property as a historic site and building or buildings; a Ruidoso Historic Site as the location of historical activity with the historical building/buildings demolished; a Ruidoso Historic Building as a historic building improvement that has been moved to another site; and a Historic Site as an improvement that consists of historic site improvements.

—Determined that a "Ruidoso Historic Property or Site, et cetera, must be established via personal observation or experience and/or by oldtimers to adequately establish the authenticity of the RHP or RHS, et cetera."

—Determined that the committee shall maintain permanent records of historical sites and properties in the Ruidoso Public Library, available for perusal by the public.

Also during the meeting, the group agreed, after a presentation by Barbara Downs, to help organize a historical museum for this fall's Aspenfest celebration.



Warrior jv griders defeated by Lovington



Inside the Capitol

SANTA FE—In a democracy, would-be political leaders often lag behind those they say they would like to lead. That's a political truism, graphically illustrated in New Mexico this year.

The average citizen of our state has a pretty good grasp on what's the difficulty here and what must be done to solve our problems. He or she is able to accept the fact that some taxes must be raised to generate the funds necessary to keep state government operating. Such a person will support reasonable, fair and evenly distributed increases in the burden of taxes if the new governor we get in 1987 and the Legislature first demonstrate that they have cut state spending as much as it can safely be cut.

In short, the ordinary New Mexican is a realist, and much more willing to live with the facts than candidates for high office give him or her credit for.

Neither of those who want to occupy the governor's residence, for example, is so far willing to discuss honestly with us either detailed plans for spending cuts or proposals for increased taxes. They apparently think such talk will spook us, like a herd of steers on a stormy night.

Instead, they persist in telling us only what good boys they were and otherwise praising their own pasts, when what we need to know about are their plans for our future.

We will undoubtedly soon be treated to the obligatory but hackneyed scenes on our TV sets: candidate in hard hat talking to a gaggle of laborers; candidate smiling at teen-agers and old folks; candidate with happy family; and any number of "ordinary" citizens, just like us, telling us what a super chap the candidate is.

There's not much meat there. In fact, the thrust of all that television exposure will only reinforce the belief that these guys think we are a lot dumber than we really are.

Why do they act that way? One reason is their own native caution, or lack of courage. The other is the packs of advisors they gather round themselves, who are much more voluble in their counsel about what must not be done than they are about what kind of information the voters need and are hungry for.

The polls always show one candidate ahead, and his clue is telling him, "Don't blow this thing now

by saying anything you will regret later." As a result, he talks a lot but says almost nothing. The other candidate, inevitably behind in the polls, is being told, "You need to do something dramatic, but be sure it doesn't work to your disadvantage." Following that advice, he proceeds to flounder around and ride off in at least two directions.

And while all this dancing from foot to foot goes on, the ordinary voter stops to scratch his or her head and wonder why those of high ambition continue to be recalcitrant about facing up to what all the rest of us know is the plain truth.

It would appear we who are humble but realistic must carry with us the uncourageous "leaders" who have so far demonstrated a great propensity for running along at the back of the parade.

Last Monday began the two-month period during which some OPEC members have pledged to practice self-denial and cut their oil production as a help toward stabilizing the price of their product.

Professional observers of the oil industry express "cautious optimism" that some good may come of all this, with per-barrel prices now in the range of \$12 to \$15, up from \$9 to \$9 a barrel in July.

The major point of worry at the moment would seem to be that Iran, headed by the Mad Mullahs, appears to be the key player in this worldwide drama. It's hard to feel good about the Ayatollah having a measure of control over the discretionary buying power (if any) left to families in Lea, San Juan and other counties in New Mexico. Khomeini probably cares little about the newly gray hairs in the heads of those who run our state's Department of Taxation and Revenue.

All that's just one more reason for reconstructing our state's tax system (if "system" is even the accurate word for it) to find more stable sources of revenue.


