## Wildcats scratch Warriors

Some crucial turnovers and a host of penalties ended the Ruidoso High School varsity football team's dreams of repeating as state AAA-division champions Saturday night in Roswell's Wool Bowl.

The Warriors lost to Lovington, 20-7, in the state title game and thus ended the season with a 12-2 record. Lovington finished with a perfect 13-0 record, including an earlier 28-19 win over the Warriors.

It was the way Ruidoso lost which had many people on the Warrior side of the stadium in tears or anger.

Lovington scored the eventual winning points with 6:17 left in the second quarter after Wildcat lineman Aaron Ochoa tackled Warrior quarterback Jeff Willingham.

The ball was jarred loose and Lovington's Steve Shield picked it up and rambled 65 yards for a touchdown.

The touchdown caused some booing among Warrior fans, many who thought Willingham already was down when the ball got loose.

Ochoa kicked the extra point and Lovington had a 10-7 lead it never gave up.

The Warriors came out in the second half and tried to stop the run-oriented Wildcat offense.

After Lovington took the second-half kickoff, Ruidoso appeared to have stopped the Wildcats. However, the Warriors were called for holding on a fourth down punt and Lovington kept the drive going.

After two more Warrior penalties, the Lovington drive finally stalled at Ruidoso's nine.

Ochoa then kicked a 26-yard field goal and Lovington led, 13-7, with 47 seconds left in the period.

Lovington kept the ball for 11:13 of the third quarter, with virtually all running plays.

But the Warriors still had plenty of life left.

Early in the final period, Ruidoso drove to the Lovington 17 before fumbling.

Some excellent running by tailback Kirk Taylor and fullback Billy Harrison plus a 25-yard pass from Willingham to split end Brian Davis highlighted the drive.

Lovington quarterback Robert

Arreola then put the icing on the cake for the Wildcats.

His 30-yard dash for a touchdown with 3:17 left in the contest gave Lovington a 19-7 advantage. Ochoa's extra-point kick gave the Wildcats their final 20-7 lead.

Ruidoso had one last chance in the final two minutes, driving to the Lovington 18.

However, Jeff Dodd intercepted a Willingham pass and Lovington had its state championship.

The Warriors started the game like they were going to get revenge for their only defeat of the season.

On the opening series, Ruidoso drove 80 yards in just six plays for its only score of the game.

Taylor finished the drive by diving over from the one for the score with 8:06 left in the period.

Garret Henson's kick made it 7-0, Ruidoso.

Taylor had opened the drive with a two-yard run. Harrison then ran for 41 yards in two carries to put the ball on the Lovington 37.

Taylor then got one yard on a run.

## Village to delay Midtown construction until after holidays

Work on Center Street that could affect the flow of traffic on Sudderth Drive has been postponed.

Assistant village manager Frank Potter announced Friday that the contractor has been extended an additional 30 days to avoid any negative impact on the holiday season caused by disrupting the flow of traffic through Midtown.

He said the schedule change was made possible by an extension by the State Highway Department on funds that were due to expire on December 31. The village now has until January 31, 1987, to complete

the Center Street project and still be eligible for \$60,000 in state cooperative funds.

Potter said Don Shaw, vice-president of the Development Division of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, and chamber executive director John Jeffers were successful in getting that extension with the help of a number of people.

In his announcement Potter said the village wishes to thank, in addition to Shaw and Jeffers, State Representative Ben Hall, State Highway Commission Chairman Bill Lee, Highway Department Ad-

ministrator Larry Larranaga and District II Highway Engineer Lou Medrano.

Shaw said Russell Atrey, transition team director for Governor-elect Garrey Carruthers, also was helpful.

"It was just a matter of communicating with the people who had the power to make the change," said Shaw. "Basically, we just went up the line," he added.

Shaw and Jeffers were on hand for a merchants' meeting last Wednesday in which Sudderth business owners indicated they

would take the village to court if construction was started at Center and Sudderth drives during the busy holiday shopping season.

That meeting was filled with emotional outbursts, strong criticisms of the village's planning, and a cry for abandoning the street repairs and foregoing the \$60,000 in State Highway Department funds.

But Shaw asked for time to look for ways to solve the problem without abandoning the project or giving up the state monies.

"The (chamber) board sees the way we stepped in as part of our

function," said Jeffers. He said the project needs to be completed, but it would have been a shame to disrupt vital December shopping business.

Shaw agreed, adding the chamber should be able to help businesses with problems with government and government agencies.

"I felt it was important that the city cared enough about the (citizens') concerns to have the city manager, village engineer and chief of police there (Wednesday)," said Jeffers. "I think they showed

good faith," he added.

Shaw said the contractor was agreeable to the change and will continue on other phases of his overall contract.

Potter said construction will continue on Center Street from the river south to Sudderth Drive before crews move on to the bridge construction.

Several Midtown merchants contacted Saturday were pleased with the new plan.

"It sounds as good as we could get it," said Buddy Carter of Ruidoso Ski Rental.

## Rick Davis is choice for open council seat

Richard "Rick" Davis will be sworn in Tuesday as the newest, and youngest, member of the Ruidoso Village Council.

Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr. revealed Friday he'll appoint the 29-year-old Davis to fill the seat vacated by William A. "Dub" Holt who resigned to take a full-time job at Fort Stanton Training Hospital.

The appointee just barely missed winning in his bid for the council last March, racking up 457 votes—the fourth highest number in the seven-way race for three four-year positions.

"I'm really happy to serve," said young Davis Friday. He said he told Mayor Davis he was willing to serve soon after Holt resigned.

During his March campaign, Davis, vice-president and manager of Territorial Abstract and Title Company, said his young aggressive attitude would enhance the council.

He said Friday he'll vote his conscience in making village decisions, but feels he'll be able to speak for a segment of the community that may not have been heard in the past.

The New Mexico native grew up in Albuquerque, graduated from New Mexico Military Institute High School and earned a Bachelor of Science from New Mexico State University in 1979.

Davis, who is unmarried, has been a Ruidoso resident for more than two years and is a member of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, Ruidoso Rotary Club and serves as secretary of the village Parks and Recreation Committee.

Throughout his March campaign Davis stressed his commitment to continued, but controlled, growth

for the village. Friday he reaffirmed that view, adding he is firmly committed to the new airport on Fort Stanton Mesa.

Davis said he supports plans to keep the current airport land when the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport replaces the municipal facility. He said he favors purchasing and then leasing the land to broaden the village's economic base.

Although Davis has a number of issues he hopes to address, he said Friday he'll take his time.

"I have to do a little more research before I go in shouting about anything," said Davis.

ning play before Willingham connected with Davis for 35 yards on the right side to the Lovington one.

Taylor scored on the next play. Lovington cut the Warriors' margin to four points with a 32-yard field goal by Ochoa with 4:19 left in the first quarter.

The Wildcats drove 81 yards in 11 plays for the field goal. Much of the yardage was picked up by Arreola's brilliant running.

Ruidoso came back with a 44-yard drive that finally stalled at the Lovington 36.

Two series later, Shields ran for a touchdown with the fumble and Lovington had the lead for good.

Penalties plagued the Warriors all night. Ruidoso had eight penalties for 90 yards.

Not long before the fumble returned for a touchdown, Willingham found Chuck Daniels for a 40-yard completion to the Lovington five. However, the Warriors were called for holding and the play was called back.

Despite the loss, Ruidoso still outgained Lovington in total offense, 278 to 245.

Ruidoso had 185 yards rushing and 93 yards passing. Lovington had 242 yards rushing (including 183 by Arreola), but just three passing on two completions.

Willingham completed six of 17 passes for 93 yards. Davis grabbed three of Willingham's passes for 69 yards.

Harrison led the Warriors in rushing with 90 yards in 13 carries. Willingham added 54 yards in three carries and Taylor gained 36 in nine carries.

"I felt that third quarter with them keeping the ball a long time was a key to the outcome," Warrior head coach Cooper Henderson said. "But I really thought we had a chance until that last pass was intercepted."

"I guess that's because I really believe in them (his players) and they believe in each other."

"Our seniors have set a great example to the younger players. They all should be successful in life."

"I'd also like to thank our fans. They've been the best around all year."

The Warrior side of the stadium was virtually packed for the contest, despite the fact Ruidoso was the smallest high school of the four that played in the two championship games Saturday (the AAAA-division game also was played).

So the Warriors finished the season on an unsuccessful note, but anyone who has seen them play all year knows they have a great team.

# Parks and Rec, Adult Rec groups may be merged

Members of two village committees made plans Thursday to explore the possibility of combining the two groups.

Four members of the Parks and Recreation Committee attended a regular meeting of the Adult Recreation Advisory Board (ARAB) to discuss a possible merger. Just one ARAB member was present.

"The mayor doesn't really see any need in having the committee," noted W.O. Rucker, ARAB chairman. He said because of resignations and lack of interest he is the only active member of the group.

After members compared the two groups' functions they decided to propose a combined seven-member committee to replace both. All agreed that at least two members should be senior citizens, and Rucker said at least one should be

active in the Adult Recreation Center (ARC) programs.

The group suggested that ARC director Bette Romans be added to the new committee as a voting member since Parks and Recreation director Bobby Bailey already is a member of the Parks and Recreation Committee.

They'll ask the mayor to appoint all five current Parks and Recreation Committee members, Rucker and Romans to the joint group.

Bailey cautioned the group against asking for changes to village ordinances indiscriminately, explaining that any such change costs the village money.

Also during the meeting Rucker and Romans described activities currently taking place at the center.

"The newspapers don't give the true picture," noted Rucker. He

said Romans makes "telephone reassurance" calls to a list of senior citizens every morning. If she doesn't get an answer she calls back, and if the telephone is still not answered then someone goes to the residence to check on the person.

"Twice a week we go by and pick up the little old ladies and carry them shopping, to the doctors, beauty shop or anywhere they need to go," said Rucker. He said senior citizens may call the center for rides at other times in an emergency.

Covered dish meals are shared on Wednesdays at the center—twice a month with the Golden Age Club. Meal Care meals are served at and distributed from the center on Mondays and Fridays.

Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays the center is open in the afternoon for games, and Thursday

afternoon features white elephant bingo with 25 cent cards. Tuesdays and Thursdays dance exercise is conducted from 2-4 p.m.

A representative from the Social Security office visits the center every Tuesday, and special programs are planned periodically.

Rucker said many people stop in for a cup of coffee and visit.

Romans said she mailed out 237 copies of the monthly calendar for December.

Dick Shaw, a member of the Parks and Recreation Committee, said the intent of merging the two committees was not to change the current senior citizens program, but to add to it. He said by combining the two groups they should be able to get more money for both programs.

# SCC hears water suit talk

Ruidoso Service Clubs Council heard Mike Hurd and Dan Swearingin discuss possible outcomes Monday of the water suit involving the Mescalero Apache Tribe.

Hurd, a third-generation rancher in the Hondo Valley, told the council his grandfather arrived in the area in 1880 and was a water rights attorney.

Two years ago, Hurd continued, they got word of the Tribe's impending action. The Tribe has claimed 18,000 acre-feet per year of water, which is more water than is available in a year's time, said Hurd. Hurd, along with a group of interested people, developed the Water Defense Association to begin combating the Tribe's claim to the

water. "We have one goal in mind," Hurd said. "That's to fight the water suit with everything we have available. We don't feel the Tribe's claim is even a reasonable water request."

Swearingin has been involved in Ruidoso water since he became a village councillor in 1946. He gave a presentation on the water situation in Ruidoso over the years since then.

"We must protect our water," Swearingin said. "Everyone must get involved, because it will affect each of us."

In other business, the council: —Heard a report from Lanny Maddox about the Thanksgiving food disbursement. He said 350 people were served. The benefit will continue for Christmas.

# Mulholland is dead at 60

Vergil Burkett "Mike" Mulholland died suddenly Wednesday in the Lincoln County Medical Center (formerly Ruidoso-Hondo Valley Hospital).

The 60-year-old Ruidoso resident was born January 3, 1920, in Evanston, Illinois.

Mulholland retired as a mechanical engineer with L.T.V. Aerospace in Dallas, Texas, before moving to Ruidoso in 1972. He worked as a building contractor here until 1960.

Mulholland brought his dream for a narrow gauge steam railway for Ruidoso. He was president of Ruidoso and Territorial Narrow Gauge Steam Railway Co., the first railroad incorporated in the state of New Mexico since territorial days.

Over the past few years Mulholland has gathered investors and support for a four-mile steam railway ride. In an interview a year ago Mulholland said tourists want something to do when they visit this mountain village.

He said his railway plans include a combination shopping mall/depot, historical village, theme park and a hotel with convention facilities.

said Mulholland of his vision that he said would bring tourists to this town that he loved, and give them a reason to stay longer.

Mulholland's son, Mark, fears that railroad dream may have died with his father.

A member of the Episcopal Church of the Holy Mount and of Rotary International, Mulholland was vitally interested in the future of Ruidoso. He regularly attended meetings of the Ruidoso Village Council and was on hand for most forums and seminars on elections, taxes or other village issues.

Mulholland is survived by his son, Mark Mulholland, of Alto; his daughter, Shannon Adkins of Austin, Texas; and three grandchildren, Jamie Bee Mulholland and Matthew Mark Mulholland, both of Alto, and Claire Marie Adkins of Austin.

Funeral services were conducted Saturday at the Episcopal Church of the Holy Mount with the Reverend Burdette Stampley officiating. Burial was in Forest Lawn Cemetery.

Fallbearers were Alden Devo, Archer Wilson, M.R. Delhotal, Walter Rawley, Howard Tate and Gene Haden.

Since early childhood, he had been fascinated with railroads. He was working and planning to build several narrow gauge railroads into our most scenic regions so that people from all over the world could have a special enjoyment of our mountain land.

Mike was proud of his Irish heritage and was truly a worthy son of the old sod. His wit, humor and kindly smile lighted up the day for all of us. When we would meet, Mike would laugh and say, with a touch of the Irish in his voice:

ing in our hearts always, and we rejoice that our beloved friend, Mike, has gone on to meet loved ones in Heaven with Our Lord.



Despite the fact his team finished last in the Goddard Invitational in Roswell over the weekend, Ruidoso High School head girls varsity basketball coach Sergio Castanon felt his team played well.





## Inside the Capitol by Fred McCaffrey

**SANTA FE**—New Mexico has what is known as the "long ballot." That makes any kind of sweeping, across-the-board change in government, as implied in the phrase "a new beginning," difficult, though not impossible.

Such officers as our State Treasurer, our State Auditor, our Land Commissioner and others are elected separately from our governor, and therefore they may or may not decide to cooperate with him on such impetuses. If they choose, they can serve their four-year terms in a spirit of sheer independence.

During the coming four years here, for instance, only two of those elected to such constitutional offices below the governor—lieutenant governor level are of the same political faith as Garrey Carruthers. Those are, of course, the Attorney General and the Land Commissioner. All the others are Democrats, who can be expected to go their own way, coordinating with the fourth floor of the Roundhouse only to the extent that they personally choose.

A long-term, high-ranking staffer in the office of the Treasurer has protested to this writer that he should never be referred to as having served in the Anaya administration.

He has a point, since, as he properly observes, Anaya had nothing to do with staffing the office of any of the State Treasurers under whom he served.

The clumsy usage comes about because all those employees of state government who are not in the judicial or legislative branches can accurately be described as part of the administration. But they don't necessarily have to be tied by name to whoever is governor at the time—especially not to a chief executive whose popularity is less than spectacular.

That point is even truer when the governor and those in departments over which he has almost no say ran on opposite slates from one another. That is the condition that will prevail here after January 1.

Some who serve in those agencies whose heads are elective may be tempted to read that fact to suggest they are totally isolated from that change of power at the top, but that isn't so either.

What they should not forget is that

the budget for the job they hold and the way their agency is organized are directly subject to the combined will of the Legislature and the governor. When these act together, they can reach into any corner of state government, no matter how safe and protected those who serve there feel.

Take for example the state Insurance Department, which many observers feel has needed a total overhaul for several years. It is a division of the shop run by the Corporation Commissioners, independently elected, who might be seen as therefore independent of the governor.

Still, if the Republican governor and the two Democratically controlled houses of the Legislature we are soon to have can act in concert, they can—and in this case almost certainly will—cause a total reorganization of the whole department.

Or take the case of the state's "bank," the Treasurer's office. Because of their statute-enacting power, this combination of chief executive with a majority of lawmakers in each of two houses can change the shape of things there as well. Once this was the place responsible for cash management, along with its other duties. In Bruce King's time, that cash-managing job was stripped from the Treasurer and put into another office, created to perform no function but that one. Next year we are likely to see that independent agency wiped out, and the job given to the Treasurer again, though that may be with much more rigorous regulation of how it is to be operated than before.

It won't take the permission of the Corporation Commissioners or of the State Treasurer to cause either of these predictions to come true. The power to pass the laws and to sign them is vested in the legislators and the governor, and they can cause these things to come to pass as easily as they can affect such topics as the speed at which we are allowed to drive on the highways or the amount of money that may be spent to house a prisoner of the state.

As long as the chief executive and the lawmakers are content to move in the same direction, they have great power. When they are not together, at least to a reasonable degree, what results is governmental chaos.

Ruidoso's got the holiday look, and it's getting better every year.—DJP




## Where to contact your lawmakers

## AN AWARD WINNER

### Ruidoso News is awarded for design, typography

The Ruidoso News captured second place in the race for honors in the Creative Design, Typography competition among New Mexico newspapers of its size.

The award was made during the annual mid-October New Mexico Press Association Convention in Santa Fe. The Ruidoso News was outdone only by the Valencia County News-Bulletin, and narrowly edged out the Taos News, both of which are well-known for superior layout and printing quality.

Judges from the Idaho Press Association considered "Best use of photos and graphics, editorial and advertising layout, printing reproduction and best overall appearance of the paper."

"Good half-tone reproduction, layout and typography," commented the judges on The News' entries. The October 7, 1985, March 3, 1986, and May 15, 1986, editions of the newspaper were those selected by editor Darrell J. Pehr and entered in the contest.

The October 7 edition featured a solid blue headline signaling the Ruidoso Warrior football team's sixth victory in a row, and a blue screen across the boxes that appear on the top of page 1 on

each edition of The News.


Color often is used as a design tool at The News. The newspaper's Goss Community press has spot and full-color capability. Spot color is used frequently, and full color can be seen in several special editions throughout the year.

Top-notch Compugraphic typesetting equipment and a complete redesign of the newspaper may have contributed to The News winning the award, said Pehr.

A redesign was unveiled in August 1984 by then-editor Tim Palmer. Standing headlines, cutline style, page numbers, text style and even the newspaper's nameplate were evaluated, discussed, then redesigned through an 18-month period. Community input was welcomed and implemented in many cases.

The unveiling gave readers their first look at an all-new nameplate and headline style, in addition to other changes that were introduced along the way.

Pehr believes adhering to the changes brought about by the redesign, and the expertise of News pressroom and composing room staffmembers, furnished the building blocks leading to the award.
