Airport commission debates procedure for paying bills

"I can guarantee you I'm not going to jail for this commission or anyone on it," said Sierra Blanca Airport Commission (SBAC) Chairman Tim Morris during a special meeting interspersed with heated disagreements between Commissioner Bill Karn and the other three

Morris said the meeting was called because of problems with last month's bills he and Co-Chairman Conrad Buchanan authorized for payment.

Karn said he was disturbed because the bills were sent to the county manager for payment although not approved during last month's meeting, and reminded the commission of a policy adopted on August 7, calling for all bills to be authorized during meetings.

According to a report in The News on August 11, SBAC voted to authorize the county manager, acting as fiscal agent on behalf of the Lincoln County Commission, to pay bills through resolutions passed during commission meetings.

Commissioner Buchanan said the commission simply agreed with then Chairman Ken Nosker's suggestion to approve bills during meetings, but never adopted such a policy. Commissioner Benny Coker and Morris agreed with Buchanan.

Buchanan said the SBAC joint powers agreement is the document binding the commission and it allows for bills to be authorized for payment by the chairman. He angrily questioned why Karn instructed the county manager not to pay the bills.

Karn reminded the group of discussions during last month's meeting over not paying the bills because they weren't submitted by administrator Fred Heckman until the meeting began. He said when he called Morris and Coker the two claimed the bills were approved during the meeting.

But Morris said he couldn't remember saying that and told of a decision made in executive session to pay the bills in accordance with the joint powers agreement.

And Karn said he didn't remember the conversation that other commissioners recall from that closed session. He reminded other members that the commission can't legally take action during an executive session.

Buchanan, Morris and Coker all agreed that no action was really taken, but a consensus was reached on paying the bills during the executive session.

"Deciding to pay bills is action," said Karn. He wondered why bills were approved for payment during January and February meetings if the commission doesn't have such a

Buchanan accused Karn of "creating the problem" by asking the county manager to call him if the bills were submitted. Buchanan said his intent was to get people, including the airport construction contractor, paid.

"People who have to work for a living," noted Buchanan.

"I don't want you sticking your nose in where it doesn't belong, Bill," said the red-faced Buchanan. Coker said he resented Karn's in-

sinuation that SBAC might be doing something to deceive taxpayers and further accused Karn of being dissatisfied because he can't control the group.

"I'll do everything in my power to make damned sure you're not chairman or co-chairman," averred Buchanan as Karn denied any wish to control the commission.

"Order, order, order," said Morris, pounding the desk, and putting a stop to the angry exchange.

Heckman explained that commission bills all are incurred according to the budget approved by all five governmental body members, through contracts or through monthly obligations. He said they are checked, verified and rechecked.

If the commission pays bills just once a month, it could pose a hardship on contractors and others awaiting payment, said Heckman. "We're checked and balanced to

death," noted Morris. Although Coker said he, too, prefers that bills be approved in open meetings, Buchanan continued to push for going exactly by the terms laid out in the 1978

agreement. He called for county commissioners to live up to that agreement,

which says, in part:

"... no disbursements shall be made ... except by check issued by the county nor unless a proper voucher has been submitted ... and the same approved for payment by the chairman as authenticated by the signature of the chairman and co-chairman.

"The county clerk shall account for the funds and the custody of the cash and the bank checking account shall be in the hands of the county treasurer."

After reading that section aloud, Buchanan said he wants the elected

officials to be involved in paying SBAC bills. He said the clerk and treasurer, elected by the people, are not "beholden" to anybody. The manager, hired by the county commission, is "beholden to that commission," said Buchanan.

> "I want the county manager out of our bill paying procedure,"

stated Buchanan.

The commission unanimously approved a motion to pay bills according to the joint powers agreement. In a telephone conversation after

the meeting, Cox said she questioned last month's bills because of the policy established last August. She said when that policy was established, calling for authorization to pay bills to be a part of the official minutes, it served as a directive to her office.

The county commissioners, who sit as the Board of Finance for Lincoln County, serve as SBAC's fiscal agent, and Cox works for them. State statutes list fiscal director and budget officer as two areas of responsibility for a county manager.

Cox said commissioners are charged with financial administration, the county treasurer keeps the cash and the county clerk keeps an accounting of those records. Cox -said "account" is the key word to explain the clerk's area of responsibility.

Before the commissioners hired a county manager, and at the time the joint powers agreement was drawn up in 1978, the clerk did perform some functions now assigned to the manager's office, said Cox.

But, under the current organization, the manager is designated by the commission to pay the bills, said Cox.

"They (SBAC members) just don't understand county government," said Cox, who was apparently not invited to the special







Inside the Capitol

SANTA FE—Look for fireworks over a change of course reportedly on its way from the Carruthers administration.

At issue is \$13 million the state was awarded by the federal government as its share of overcharges to New Mexicans by major energy com-panies in the past. Like other states, we were directed to choose a way to get this money back to our citizens in programs that had something to

in programs that had something to do with energy consumption.

After holding hearings all over the state, the outgoing Anaya administration set up a program that would have had the largest share of the money devoted to weatherizing homes of the poor.

Now that the Carruthers folks have taken over, we hear a decision is forthcoming to change that plan and

theoming to change that plan and put a large share of the funds into

improving energy use in state buildings.

Does that decision reflect policy—
the Anayas for the poor, and the Carrutherses for the bureaucrats?

One group specializing in defending the interests of the "little people" is already poised to go to law over this development.

A new phenomenon this year is the number of phone calls and letters to the office of the Governor from individual citizens who want to express a view on actions that should be taken or abstained from. There has been a trickle of such communications in every previous year, but never anything like what is going on now.

As a veteran newsman and I listened to one end of the phone calls in the governor's office, he speculated that this much activity may manifest dissafisfaction with the quality of representation the people are getting. Voters don't bother to take such drastic action, he clearly implied, unless they are seriously disappointed with the sort of thing they saw taking place here earlier this saw taking place here earlier this

Admittedly there has been more organized effort of late to encourage citizens to pass on their views directly to the chief executive. Still, people seldom take such action unless they care deeply about the subject at hand.

Smart politicians will not tall to heed the existence of this phenomenon.

The latest schedule put out by the office of Governor Carruthers speaks of a weekly luncheon meeting between him and Lieutenant Governor Jack Stahl. That word "weekly" gets thrown around loosely by some new governors, who later find they can't deliver on such promises.

Still, if the two can meet that regularly, it's a good thing.

Some will perhaps remember that Stahl has been assigned to discover how to lighten the burden of government on individuals and businesses. He has asked that those who experience particularly strong or unreasonable demands from any part of state government communicate that fact to him.

If the Lieutenant Governor gets

municate that fact to him.

If the Lieutenant Governor gets caught up in that project, he may not be able to keep down the number of hours he spends in Santa Fe. That desire to return the job he holds to the part-time position our constitution contemplates is what led some New Mexicans to support him for it. To lose that impetus now would be too had.

Still, there is a need for what Stahl says he plans to deliver.

As he undoubtedly knows, bureaucrats at every level have a vested interest in maintaining the complexity of government, not in simplifying it. That, as much as any other single element, helps to account for the proliferating rules and regulations which plague almost all our lives. If Stahl's study runs counter to that trend, it will be resisted in every agency of the state resisted in every agency of the state.

At the other end of the spectrum is that observation of columnist George Will that one of the distinguishing marks of a true Republican is a thorough dislike for government. That's carrying things a little too far, and we trust Stahl will not reach that far out regition not reach that far-out position.

It's possible that the Governor and the Lieutenant Governor discuss just such subjects as this during their weekly luncheon at the Palace restaurant in Santa Fe.




