## Airport commission debates procedure for paying bills

"I can guarantee you I'm not going to jail for this commission or anyone on it," said Sierra Blanca Airport Commission (SBAC) Chairman Tim Morris during a special meeting interspersed with heated disagreements between Commissioner Bill Karn and the other three members.

Karn said the meeting was called because of problems with last month's bills he and Co-Chairman Conrad Buchanan authorized for payment.

Karn said he was disturbed because the bills were sent to the county manager for payment although not approved during last month's meeting, and reminded the commission of a policy adopted on August 7, calling for all bills to be authorized during meetings.

According to a report in The News on August 11, SBAC voted to authorize the county manager, acting as fiscal agent on behalf of the Lincoln County Commission, to pay bills through resolutions passed during commission meetings.

Commissioner Buchanan said the commission simply agreed with the chairman Ken Nosker's suggestion to approve bills during meetings, but never adopted such a policy. Commissioner Benny Coker and Morris agreed with Buchanan.

Buchanan said the SBAC joint powers agreement is the document binding the commission and it allows for bills to be authorized for payment by the chairman. He angrily questioned why Karn instructed the county manager not to pay the bills.

Karn reminded the group of discussions during last month's meetings over not paying the bills because they weren't submitted by administrator Fred Heckman until the meeting began. He said when he called Morris and Coker the two claimed the bills were approved during the meeting.

But Morris said he couldn't remember saying that and told of a decision made in executive session to pay the bills in accordance with the joint powers agreement.

And Karn said he didn't remember the conversation that other commissioners recall from that closed session. He reminded other members that the commission can't legally take action during an executive session.

Buchanan, Morris and Coker all agreed that no action was really taken, but a consensus was reached

on paying the bills during the executive session.

"Deciding to pay bills is action," said Karn. He wondered why bills were approved for payment during January and February meetings if the commission doesn't have such a policy.

Buchanan accused Karn of "creating the problem" by asking the county manager to call him if the bills were submitted. Buchanan said his intent was to get people, including the airport construction contractor, paid.

"People who have to work for a living," noted Buchanan.

"I don't want you sticking your nose in where it doesn't belong, Bill," said the red-faced Buchanan.

Coker said he resented Karn's insinuation that SBAC might be doing something to deceive taxpayers and further accused Karn of being dissatisfied because he can't control the group.

"I'll do everything in my power to make damned sure you're not chairman or co-chairman," averred Buchanan as Karn denied any wish to control the commission.

"Order, order, order," said Morris, pounding the desk, and putting a stop to the angry exchange.

Heckman explained that commission bills all are incurred according to the budget approved by all five governmental body members, through contracts or through monthly obligations. He said they are checked, verified and rechecked.

If the commission pays bills just once a month, it could pose a hardship on contractors and others awaiting payment, said Heckman.

"We're checked and balanced to death," noted Morris.

Although Coker said he, too, prefers that bills be approved in open meetings, Buchanan continued to push for going exactly by the terms laid out in the 1978 agreement.

He called for county commissioners to live up to that agreement, which says, in part:

"... no disbursements shall be made ... except by check issued by the county nor unless a proper voucher has been submitted ... and the same approved for payment by the chairman as authenticated by the signature of the chairman and co-chairman."

"The county clerk shall account for the funds and the custody of the cash and the bank checking account shall be in the hands of the county treasurer."

After reading that section aloud, Buchanan said he wants the elected

officials to be involved in paying SBAC bills. He said the clerk and treasurer, elected by the people, are not "beholden" to anybody. The manager, hired by the county commission, is "beholden to that commission," said Buchanan.

"I want the county manager out of our bill paying procedure," stated Buchanan.

The commission unanimously approved a motion to pay bills according to the joint powers agreement.

In a telephone conversation after the meeting, Cox said she questioned last month's bills because of the policy established last August. She said when that policy was established, calling for authorization to pay bills to be a part of the official minutes, it served as a directive to her office.

The county commissioners, who sit as the Board of Finance for Lincoln County, serve as SBAC's fiscal agent, and Cox works for them. State statutes list fiscal director and budget officer as two areas of responsibility for a county manager.

Cox said commissioners are charged with financial administration, the county treasurer keeps the cash and the county clerk keeps an accounting of those records. Cox said "account" is the key word to explain the clerk's area of responsibility.

Before the commissioners hired a county manager, and at the time the joint powers agreement was drawn up in 1978, the clerk did perform some functions now assigned to the manager's office, said Cox.

But, under the current organization, the manager is designated by the commission to pay the bills, said Cox.

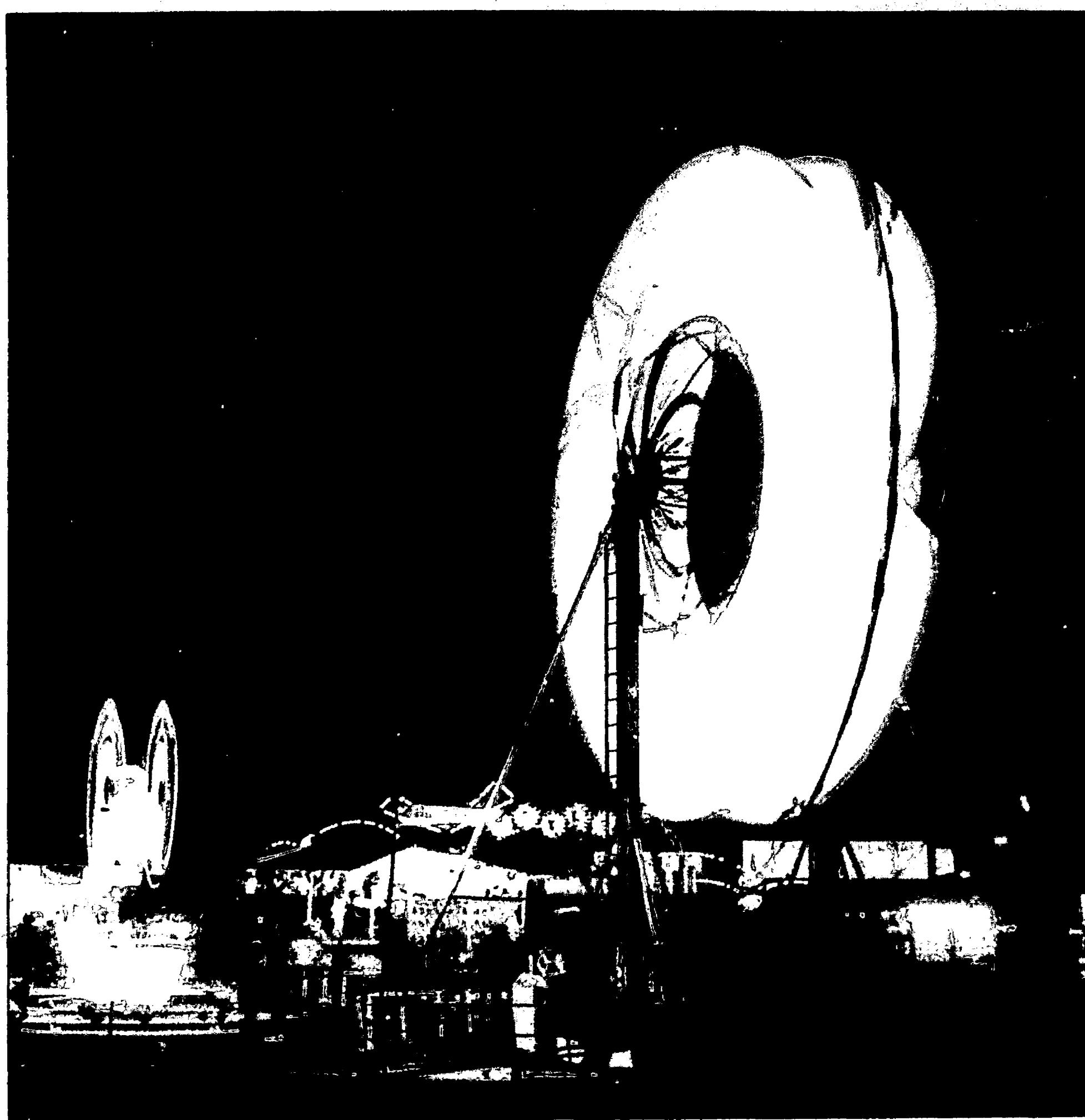
"They (SBAC members) just don't understand county government," said Cox, who was apparently not invited to the special meeting.

In discussions during a workshop after the special meeting Thursday, Heckman suggested if The News reporter "was really doing her job" she could fill an entire page by reporting all bills paid by the county.

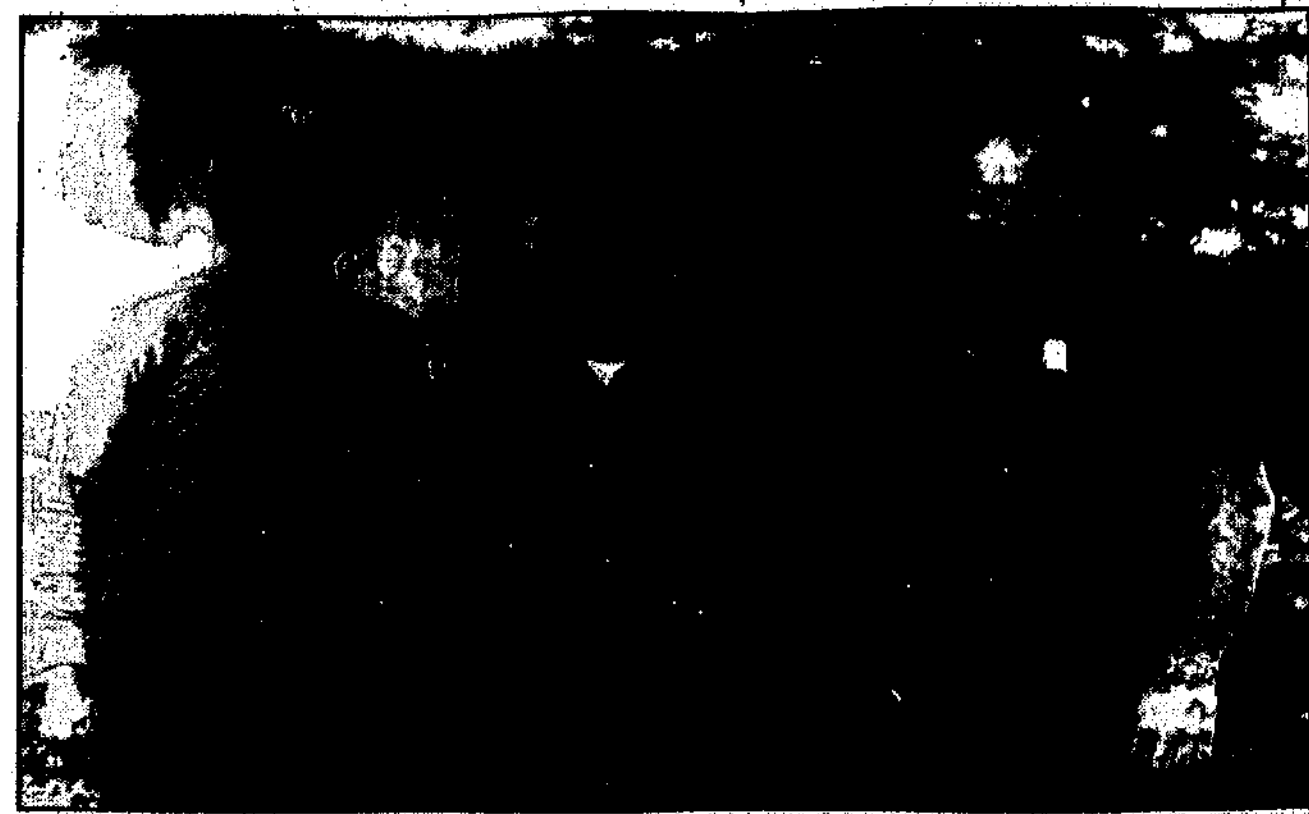
Kendra Eggleston won third all-around in that group, placing second on vault, third on bars, fourth on the floor and sixth on bars.

ty and the villages of Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs and not "single out" SBAC.

Also during that workshop commissioners heard from engineer Earl Cook of Leeds-Hill-Herkenhoff that he is ready to advertise for bids on runway paving and airfield lighting and equipment. After Heckman cautioned Cook not to discuss engineer's estimates in

front of the press, commissioners agreed to go back into session to call an executive meeting to hear those numbers.

After discussing a \$5,000 change order and agreeing to meet again at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, April 8, Morris quietly suggested to Buchanan that he call for the executive session.

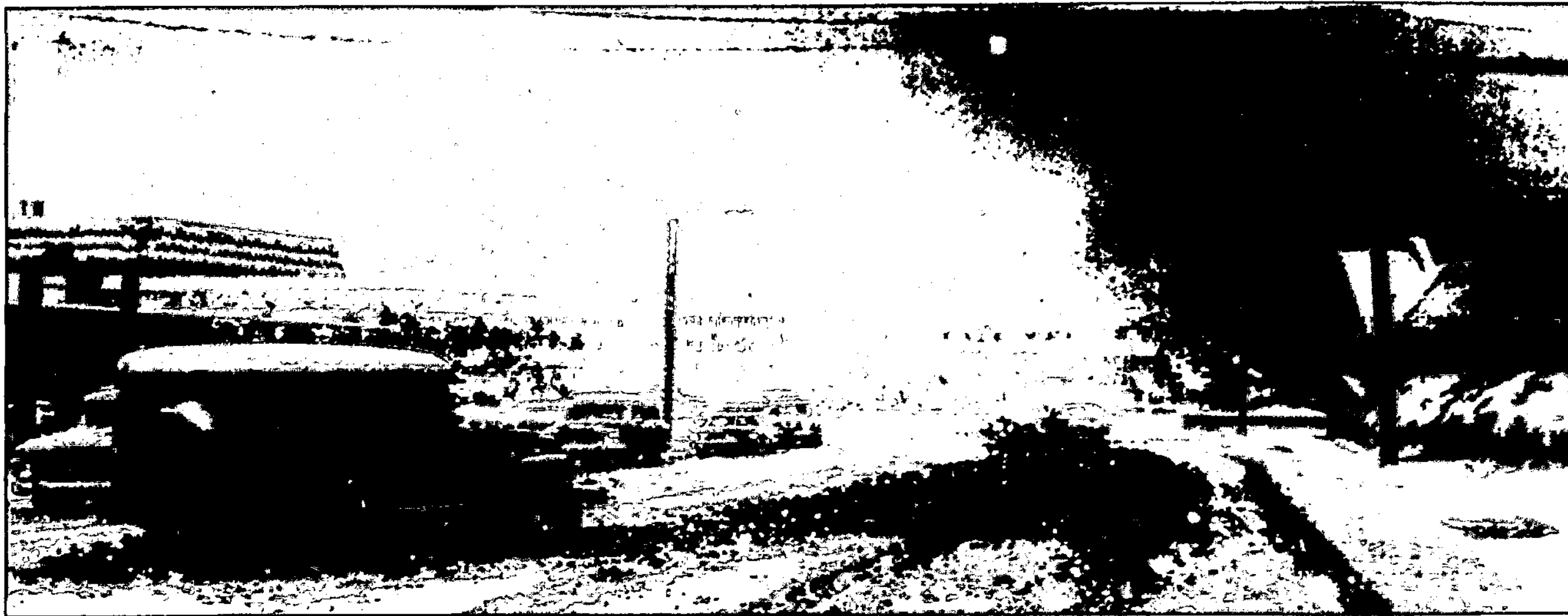
But after reading a note from attorney Sanders, Morris instead called for a recess.

When the meeting was reconvened Sanders explained that the New

Mexico public meetings act is very specific on reasons for closed sessions.

"In my opinion, discussing estimated costs is not one of the reasons," said Sanders. He said he agreed that open discussion could jeopardize the bidding process, and suggested that members could individually discuss the figures with Cook.

Commissioner Wendell Chino, representing the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe, was absent from Thursday's meeting.

A Capitan man was injured Friday in a one-vehicle rollover on Mechem Drive near the Swiss Chalet.

Kevin Bond, 21, was treated and released at Lincoln County Medical Center with injuries he received when his 1977 Ford pickup went off the roadway, up an embankment, collided with a boulder and overturned, according to Ruidoso Police reports.

Police said Bond was northbound when he went into the curve just past Mont Blanc Drive and his vehicle went left of center.

Bond, cited for driving under the influence, reckless driving and no proof of insurance, was in-

carcerated and appeared Friday in Municipal Court, according to official reports. Police said he was released after his court appearance.

Municipal Court records indicate Bond pled guilty and his sentence is pending.

In a separate accident about 5 p.m. Saturday, four people were injured, according to police records. The four were treated and released at Lincoln County Medical Center, according to hospital records.

The New Mexico State Police responded to the accident, two and a half miles east of Fox Cave on U.S. Highway 70. However, the accident report was not available early today (Monday).

At the services his presence could be felt among us; telling us to be glad for him, and thanking us for this memorial service, and for all the shared blessings in our lives together.

Yes, George Perry Jr. looks down from Heaven smiling and saying, "Thanks dear ones and friends. Be happy and trust the Lord. I am alive in the true life, the eternal life in Heaven."

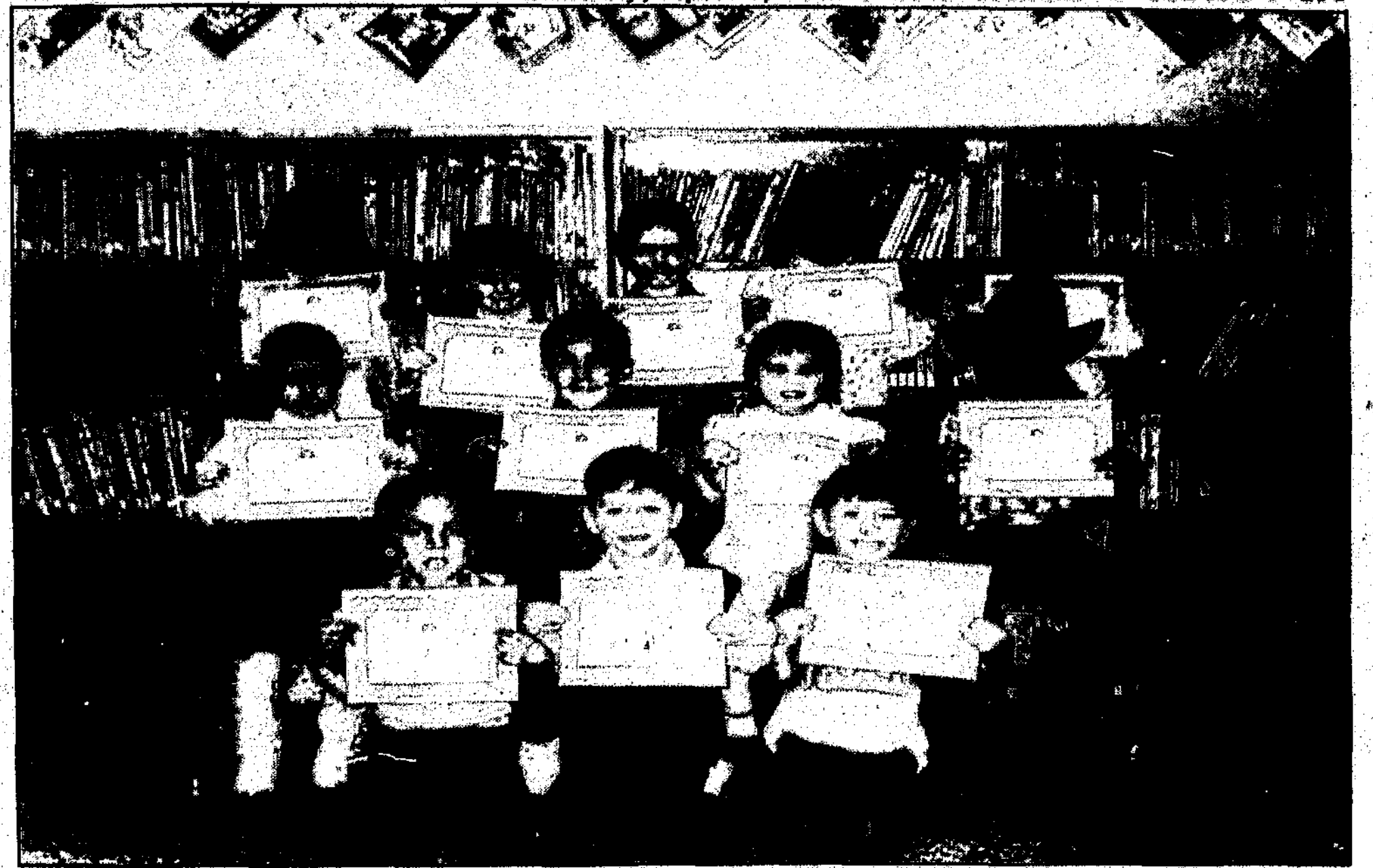

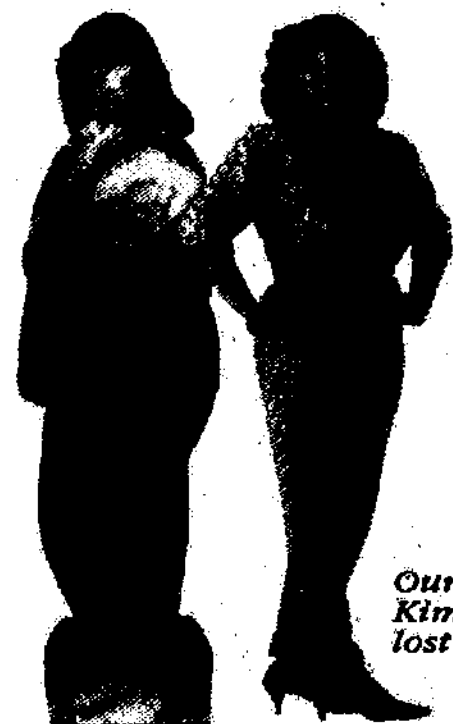

## Warrior tracksters place high at Carlsbad meet

The Ruidoso High School boys and girls track teams took second and fourth, respectively, in a Carlsbad meet Saturday.

Ruidoso's boys took second, scoring 67 points to winner Alamogordo's 117. The Warrior girls were fourth out of six teams, setting three school records.

The Warrior boys got five first places, two from distance runner Gabe Tam, to gain second.

Tam won the 1,600 meters in 4:40.7 and the 3,200 meters in 10:09.36 on the cold, windy day.

Other Warrior first places went to Jeff Willingham in the javelin (174-4), Brian Davis in the 200 meters (23.04) and the 800-meter relay team (1:33.81).

Rusty Shelton, Chuck Daniels, Garret Henson and Davis made up the 800-meter relay quartet.

Ruidoso's only second place was in the medley relay where the quartet of Billy Harrison, Bubba Miller, James Hall and Sergio Hernandez ran a 3:58.29.

Third places came from Rusty Shelton in the 110-meter high hurdles (15.65), Todd Morris in the

javelin (151-5), Mark Arlington in the high jump (6-0) and the 1,600-meter relay team (3:37.08).

Miller, Daniels, Hall and Davis made up the 1,600-meter relay quartet.

The 400-meter relay team of Shelton, Daniels, Henson and Davis took fourth in 45.31. Hall took fourth in the 400 meters (55.35) and Ira Sago took fourth in the 3,200 meters (10:45.83).

Sago also was fifth in the 1,600 meters (4:53.28).

Hall took a busy day. The junior took fourth in the 400 meters, ran on two scoring relay teams, and ran a heat in the 400 meters.

Ruidoso scored 21 points in the last three events (200 meters, 1,600 meters and 1,600-meter relay) to cinch second place.

"I am very proud of the kids," said Warrior boys head coach Ronny Maskew. "We had to score a lot in the last three events and we did."

After Alamogordo and Ruidoso in the team standings, Hobbs had 64 points, Roswell had 54 and Carlsbad had 36.

In girls action, freshman Dorley Patton took first in the 300-meter hurdles, running a school-record 49.51.

Other Warrior school records were a 6:01.25 for second in the 1,600 meters by freshman Ardena Comanche and a 1:55.59 for third in the 800-meter relay.

Kristin Tidmore, Patton, Amy Thornton and Stacy Lee made up the quartet. The same quartet also ran a 54.47 for third in the 400-meter relay.

Comanche also took a second in the 3,200 meters, running a 12:47.62.

Ruidoso's 1,600-meter medley relay team of Kristin Tidmore, Patton, Trina Martin and Eva Montano finished third and freshman Chantel Bowen was fourth in the high jump with a 4-8 effort.

Warriors who took sixth place were Tara Miller in the long jump (14-8), Linder Rad in the 100-meter hurdles (17.66), Lee in the 100 meters (13.11, 13.05 in the trials), and Charmaine Rue in the 400 meters (64.49).

"I was really happy with them this week," said Warrior girls head coach Jim Hofstad. "A lot of people had their best times of the year."

Ruidoso now will compete in the Roswell Invitational at the Wool Bowl Saturday, April 11. It will be an afternoon-evening meet.

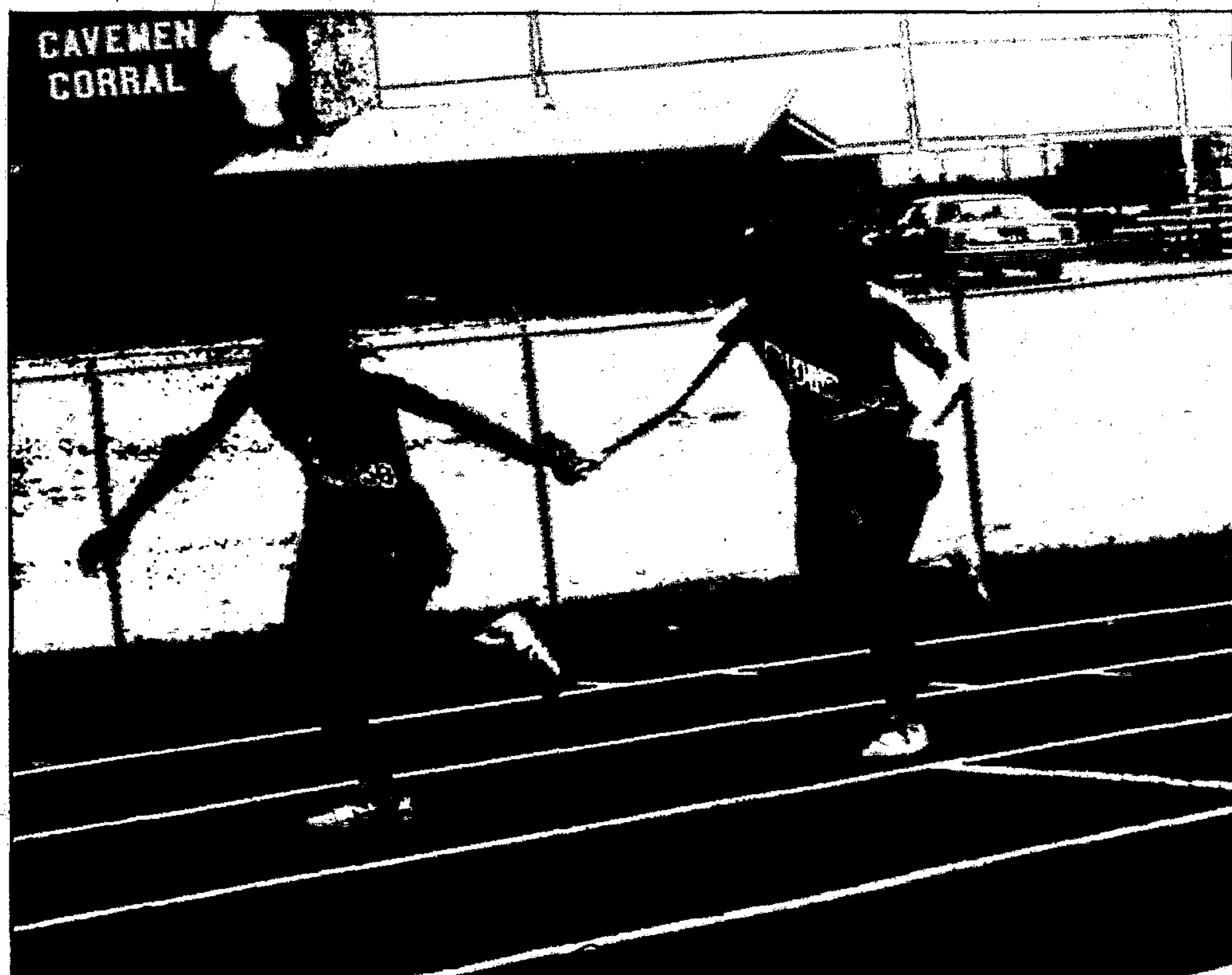

## Inside the Capitol

**SANTA FE**—Look for fireworks over a change of course reportedly on its way from the Carruthers administration.

At issue is \$13 million the state was awarded by the federal government as its share of overcharges to New Mexicans by major energy companies in the past. Like other states, we were directed to choose a way to get this money back to our citizens in programs that had something to do with energy consumption.

After holding hearings all over the state, the outgoing Anaya administration set up a program that would have had the largest share of the money devoted to weatherizing homes of the poor.

Now that the Carruthers folks have taken over, we hear a decision is forthcoming to change that plan and put a large share of the funds into improving energy use in state buildings.

Does that decision reflect policy—the Anayas for the poor, and the Carruthers for the bureaucrats?

One group specializing in defending the interests of the "little people" is already poised to go to law over this development.

A new phenomenon this year is the number of phone calls and letters to the office of the Governor from individual citizens who want to express a view on actions that should be taken or abstained from. There has been a trickle of such communications in every previous year, but never anything like what is going on now.

As a veteran newsman and I listened to one end of the phone calls in the governor's office, he speculated that this much activity may manifest dissatisfaction with the quality of representation the people are getting. Voters don't bother to take such drastic action, he clearly implied, unless they are seriously disappointed with the sort of thing they saw taking place here earlier this year.

Admittedly there has been more organized effort of late to encourage citizens to pass on their views directly to the chief executive. Still, people seldom take such action unless they care deeply about the subject at hand.

Smart politicians will not fail to heed the existence of this phenomenon.

The latest schedule put out by the office of Governor Carruthers speaks of a weekly luncheon meeting between him and Lieutenant Governor Jack Stahl. That word "weekly" gets thrown around loosely by some new governors, who later find they can't deliver on such promises.

Still, if the two can meet that regularly, it's a good thing.

Some will perhaps remember that Stahl has been assigned to discover how to lighten the burden of government on individuals and businesses. He has asked that those who experience particularly strong or unreasonable demands from any part of state government communicate that fact to him.

If the Lieutenant Governor gets caught up in that project, he may not be able to keep down the number of hours he spends in Santa Fe. That desire to return the job he holds to the part-time position our constitution contemplates is what led some New Mexicans to support him for it. To lose that impetus now would be too bad.

Still, there is a need for what Stahl says he plans to deliver.

As he undoubtedly knows, bureaucrats at every level have a vested interest in maintaining the complexity of government, not in simplifying it. That, as much as any other single element, helps to account for the proliferating rules and regulations which plague almost all our lives. If Stahl's study runs counter to that trend, it will be resisted in every agency of the state.

At the other end of the spectrum is that observation of columnist George Will that one of the distinguishing marks of a true Republican is a thorough dislike for government. That's carrying things a little too far, and we trust Stahl will not reach that far-out position.

It's possible that the Governor and the Lieutenant Governor discuss just such subjects as this during their weekly luncheon at the Palace restaurant in Santa Fe.

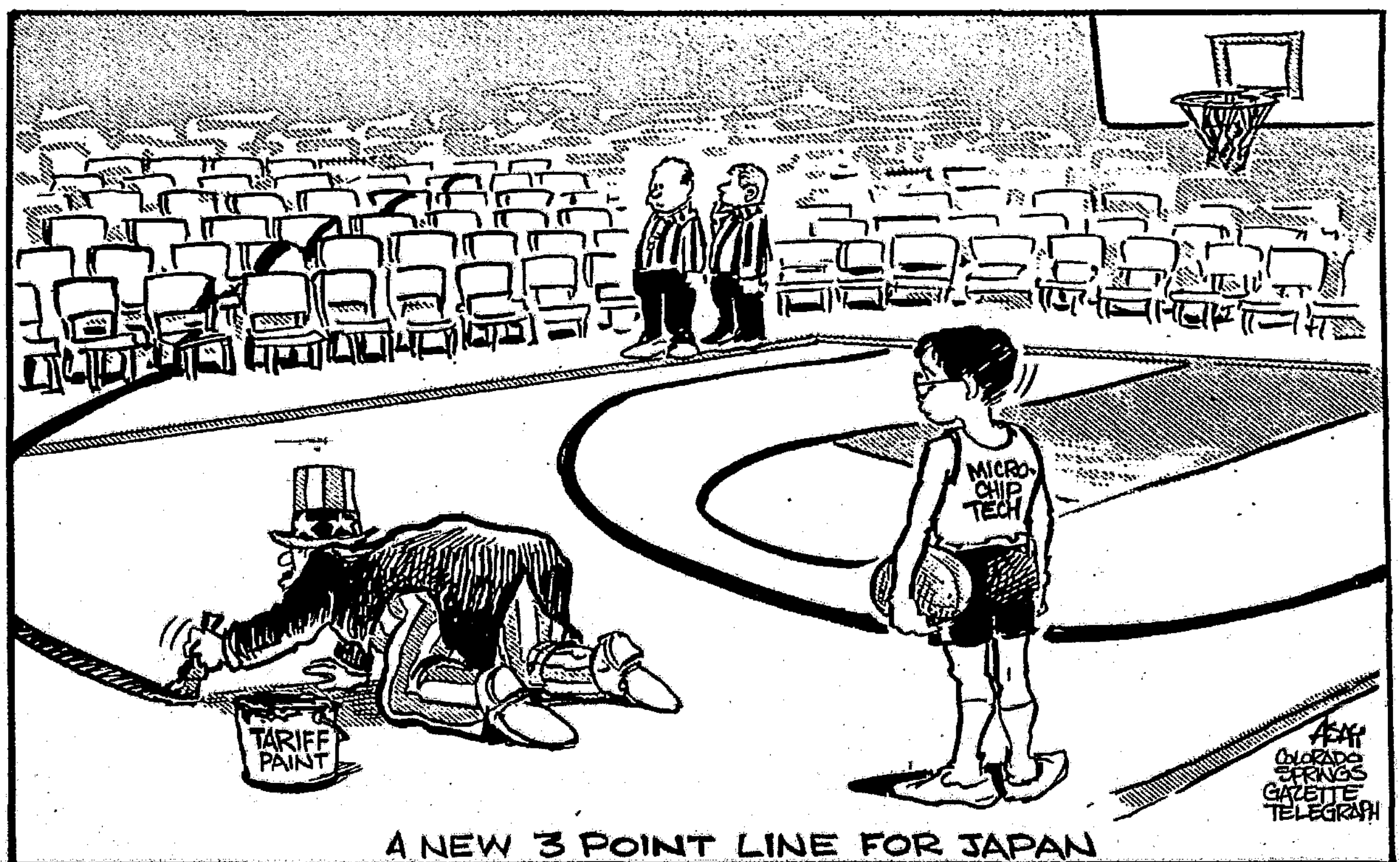

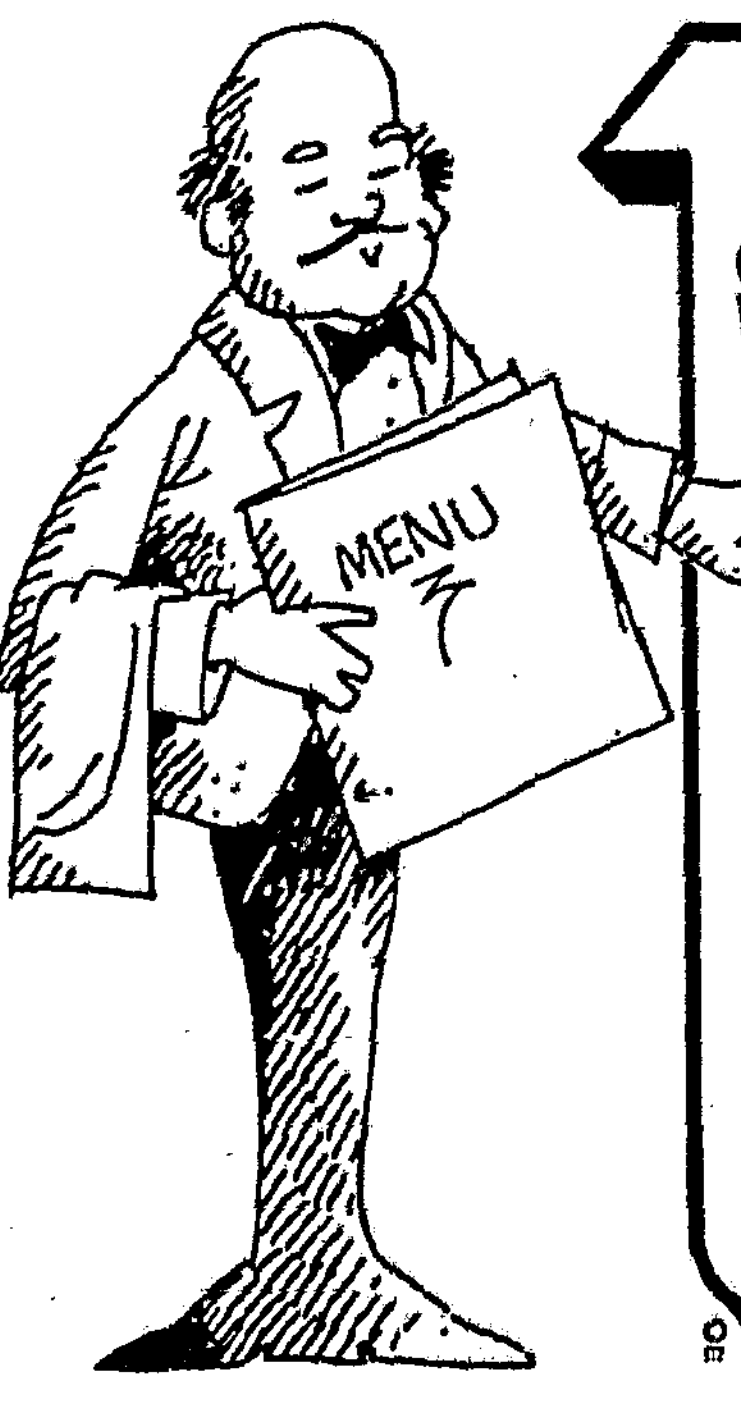
