## Warriors dump Socorro

Ruidoso High School's varsity football team still has state playoff dreams after a 21-8 win over host Socorro Friday night.

The Warriors, 1-2 in District 3 AAA action (2-7 overall), must beat visiting Cobre Friday, November 6, while Silver City loses to Socorro if Ruidoso is to make the playoffs.

Ruidoso would be tied with Socorro and Silver for second place, but would make the playoffs because of a better point difference between the three teams.

Ruidoso did not leave any doubt that it was the better team in its victory over Socorro (also named the Warriors).

The Ruidoso Warriors drove 74 yards in seven plays on their opening series to take a 7-0 lead.

A 28-yard pass from quarterback Michael Swanner to Jeff Arvizu and a 31-yard run by Matthew Griego to the Socorro three were the big plays in the Ruidoso drive.

After Griego's big run, he scored in two plays, going over from the one.

Shay Sims added the extra point and Ruidoso led, 7-0, with 6:03 left in the first quarter.

At the beginning of the second quarter, Ruidoso struck again, driving 62 yards in 11 plays for a touchdown.

Swanner completed two passes to Kirk Ryan in the drive, one of them a 15-yarder on a fake punt, which

put the ball on the Socorro 23.

Five plays later, senior tailback Rusty Shelton swept around the right end for a nine-yard touchdown.

Sims again kicked the extra point and Ruidoso had a 14-0 lead with 9:21 left in the half.

Near the end of the first half, Socorro drove to the Warrior two before a run was stopped short of the goal line as time expired.

Both teams battled to a scoreless third quarter. However, the Warriors had one good drive that ended at the Socorro seven.

The Warriors added their final touchdown on a two-yard run by Griego with 9:30 left in the contest.

Another Swanner-to-Arvizu pass play set up the touchdown.

From the Socorro 26, Swanner hit Arvizu and the split end ran down to the host's two.

Griego banged over for the score on the next play. Sims kicked the extra point and Ruidoso had a secure 21-0 lead.


Socorro drove for its only score of the game on the ensuing series.

The hosts drove 75 yards in nine plays for the score, James Rosa running in from the six with 6:38 left.

Rosa then ran over the left side for the two-point conversion and Ruidoso's lead was narrowed to 21-8.

Ruidoso rolled up 358 yards total offense, 200 rushing and 158 through the air.

Swanner completed 10 of 21 passes for 143 yards, while Logan Stirman completed a 15-yard pass to Swanner.

Griego had an excellent game, running for 95 yards in 13 carries.

Shelton added 55 yards in 16 carries.

Arvizu caught three passes for 66 yards and Eric Ford grabbed three passes for 53 yards.

Socorro gained 229 yards total offense. The Warriors had 118 yards rushing and 111 passing.

"We've looked good in our past three games," said Warrior head coach Cooper Henderson. "It's just that the outcome was better in this one."

Ruidoso used the shotgun formation occasionally in the contest, catching the hosts off guard.

"That confused them," said Henderson about Socorro's defense against the shotgun, "until they adjusted to it later on."

scored one touchdown as the Warriors won, 21-8.

Bubba Lane at cornerback was a defensive standout for Ruidoso.

Now the Warriors must prepare for first-place Cobre, which clinched a playoff berth with a 21-0 win over Deming Friday night.

Cobre is 3-0 in district play, followed by Silver City at 2-1, Ruidoso and Socorro at 1-2 and Deming at 1-3.

Silver City dumped Cathedral of El Paso, Texas, 27-0, in a non-district game Friday.

## Interest builds for MainStreet program's potential pluses

"I'm not here to talk you into anything," said New Mexico MainStreet Project Director Ursula M. Boatright Thursday.

Boatright told more than 100 people who gathered in two separate meetings at Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center that she was in the village to offer information on the unique revitalization program.

Both audiences responded enthusiastically to Boatright's audiovisual presentation, asking lots of questions over MainStreet and what it might do for Ruidoso. By Friday afternoon more than two dozen Midtown business operators had agreed to meet next Wednesday to form a MainStreet task force.

Such action is the first step in

assuring a MainStreet project in Ruidoso, according to Boatright. She stressed Thursday that local commitment is the major ingredient needed to be chosen for one of three MainStreet slots available in New Mexico for 1988. While just three applications are expected for the three projects, Boatright said that doesn't make any applicant a "shoo-in."

Boatright explained that New Mexico MainStreet is a part of a National Heritage Trust program begun in 1980. New Mexico is entering its second year of participation, and is among 28 states involved. She said 400 communities are in the program nationwide.

In New Mexico, Silver City, Gallup, Raton and Las Vegas are beginning their second years of the three-year project; with Aztec, Deming, Carlsbad, Taos, Ber-

nalillo, Clovis and Tucumcari in their first years.

"A well-run MainStreet program can lead to a change in negative attitudes," said Boatright, stressing the importance of the project manager who receives intensive training through state and national contracts.

Boatright and architect Ed Boles, both of the Santa Fe MainStreet office, make site visits and instruct project managers in the program's four-point approach. That is:

1. Organization.
2. Promotion.
3. Design.
4. Economic restructuring.

"We work in all areas of downtown," said Boatright. She said MainStreet is basically a self-help program utilizing a \$38,000 Community Development Block Grant to provide \$12,000 toward a

project manager salary; \$10,000 to fund a contract with the state; and \$16,000 for a contract with the National Heritage Trust.

She said successful MainStreet communities have formed a public/private partnership to provide funds needed to take advantage of the resources available through the state and national contracts. While the communities are asked to make a three-year commitment, with no further CDBG funds after the first year, Boatright said there is no problem if a participating entity has to drop out. She said Socorro was unable to stay in the program after one year.

Applications for the three openings are due in Santa Fe by December 1.

"A good application is a commitment from you people here and the other people with a stake in

downtown," said Boatright. She said towns will be selected in mid-January.

Boatright said the whole process begins with a site visit by a state and national resource team, and the hiring of a manager. The local board chooses and hires its own staff person, she said.

After viewing a videotape of three successful MainStreet towns, Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr. commented the program "psychologically and philosophically brings people together... you put a psychological mall over your downtown."

The afternoon group included the mayor, councilors Jerry Shaw and Elmer Pirelli, several members of the Planning and Zoning Commission and staff and board members of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce.

Midtown business people made up most of the evening audience, and they were the ones with plenty of questions for Boatright. They questioned her about what area would be included, whether a theme would be used and how specific needs in Ruidoso would fit into the program.

"We don't come in with a canned program," said Boatright, who continued to stress that most decisions rest with the participating community. She said the group would be required to fund the program after the first year, estimating the budget would be about \$30,000 a year, depending on the salary of the project manager.

Problems noted for Midtown include a need for more people, better

sidewalks and other amenities on main street, lighting and trash containers.

"Why doesn't the state just give us the money to improve downtown?" asked Bill Andrus of The Barefoot Contessa. "That will

buy a lot of garbage cans," he added.

"Maybe you need more than garbage cans," responded Boatright,

explaining, again, that the funds are for a "program we know will work."

"If we don't go along with this will the city help us with our lighting?" asked Mary Parsons of Mary's Fashions.

Village manager Frank Potter described problems with lines and poles in Midtown, and went on to pledge his commitment to the MainStreet program. He said he'll ask for the support of the village governing body.

Discussions of cost led Ovella Estes of the Artisan's Gallery to offer to write a check right then. Boatright said the typical cost is from \$150 to \$300 per merchant over the three-year contract.

"Not everybody ever buys into a project," warned Boatright. She said "the possibilities are out there" on funding MainStreet.

Boatright, who took a stroll through Midtown on Friday, said what is needed over the next month is "the strong support of the community." She suggested contacting Planning Officer Margaret Lahey at Village Hall.

El Paso Division as a separate entity under present Safeway management, for at least 30 days until the comments can be reviewed and final approval decided.

Bob Hurmence, vice president of public affairs for Furr's, said the consumer will see little difference as the change is made. This week,

when the partial takeover takes place Saturday, November 7, very little will change as Safeway management continues to take action on such items as pricing and advertising. But payroll and other logistic decisions will be made by Furr's.

Present employees of Safeway have been interviewed, said Hurmence, and will be given word

next week if they still have jobs.

When final approval is given, which Furr's expects in about 30 days, the new owner will exercise more direct control, but much still will stay the same.

"We never thought the Safeway stores were badly operated," said Hurmence. He said Furr's hopes to continue to offer some of Safeway's private label items, and may even

acquire the right to use the Safeway name.

Details of the takeover, however, still must be ironed out.

"We've still got a great deal of uncertainty," said Hurmence, noting consumers' and employees' concern about the takeover. "We're sympathetic to that situation."



## Real estate 'showing improvement' says Paxton

## TNMP leads Gatekeeper Program for elderly

Buddy Bundick, TNMP's local District Manager, believes meter readers and servicepeople are ideal participants in the Gatekeeper Pro-

gram because of the frequent public contact they have.

TNMP would like for other community organizations and businesses with public contact to also become involved in the program. Interested organizations can get more information by calling the local TNMP office, at 258-5511.

"This would be an ideal project for civic organizations wanting to adopt a community service program," Bundick said. "The program is relatively easy to implement, and the rewards are far-reaching."

## Editorial

The Ruidoso Public Library, center of activity that it is, has added another dimension to a visit to the library.

Display cases at the library have been filled with a distinctive display of rocks and fossils, mostly from the Southwest, that have been collected over the years by Capitan residents Jack and Virginia Pogue.

Jack seems truly fascinated with the science of rock collecting, and added that the experience is "an excuse to get out in the hills" for he and Virginia.

"Rocks are kind of interesting," Jack says. "They're pretty basic."

The collection at the library features the cool green-blue of turquoise to cupriferous opal from a mine worked by Indians from 1100 to 1400 A.D.

The rocks tell tales of geologic activity of the past, with some indicating a lava flow reaching the edge of a reed-choked waterway while another shows signs of a volcanic eruption that covered a swamp, encasing all plant and animal life in a timeless recording of rock.

With Lincoln County spotted with old mines, and a tremendous amount of petrified wood in the area, Jack and Virginia have plenty of collecting to do here, although they take frequent trips to Arizona for other specimens.

The exhibit will be on display for some time, so take a few minutes to stop by the library. You may find yourself staying longer than expected. As Jack says, "It's good stuff."—DJP

## Inside the Capitol

**SANTA FE**—We all worried when the terse cablegram from Fred McCaffrey arrived saying that he and Jan had left their tropical retirement paradise of Montserrat and would let us know of their new whereabouts as soon as they were relocated.

That was a week ago. Today, the following letter arrived, dated October 13, explaining in his inimitable way the further adventures of Fred McCaffrey:

"Jay, you said in a column I left the political-commenting game there at just the right moment. You were right about that.

"But when you pictured me on a cool verandah somewhere in the tropics, clapping my hands for the houseboy to bring me another stengah, you had that wrong. Here is the real scoop on the latest adventure of the McCaffreys.

"One of my first friends on Montserrat was part of a group organizing a new political party aimed at turning out the island's entrenched rulers. He welcomed me as somebody who evidently knew something about politics as well as someone who might help to improve his party's weekly newspaper. As a result, I found myself happily teaching layout and newswriting to an almost totally amateur staff, as well as writing an occasional commentary, just like back home.

"In one of these, I said building gambling casinos wasn't likely to solve the economic problems of Caribbean islands because the high-rollers in the U. S. now have Atlantic City to flock to. That's true, as I see it—and I even quoted statistics to prove it.

"That apparently irked some of the nation's powers-that-be, who want to go into the casino business, and alerted them to keep an eye on this potential troublemaker.

"A week later I did a straight news story (as factual and objective as one of Bill Feather's, as God is my judge) about a decision handed down by a Supreme Court justice. In it, I quoted complaints of local citizens about the way the case had been managed.

"That gave the government a chance to move in. The nation's Attorney General accused me and the proprietors of the paper of contempt of court—not formally, which would have given us a chance to reply, but simply in remarks made in open court. Since the proprietors of the paper are local citizens and I am not, he further made it clear that McCaffrey, the outlander, was going to be made the political football.

"Suddenly, two cops appear at our apartment early one morning, looking very grim and heavy. That's not a very pleasant experience when you're thousands of miles from home.

"All they want to do, they say, is inquire whether I have a work permit from the government. It turns out I do not need one, partly because I am not a 'worker' but a volunteer and partly because their own law says journalists may work for a full year without such a permit. That brings that matter to a close, but it leaves two United States citizens full of the realization that they can be pushed around, even if the nation in question is not Cuba or Nicaragua.

"Just at that point, Jan's and my 90-day visitor's visas expired. We went to the police station to have them renewed, expecting an automatic extension, which almost all visitors are routinely given. That didn't happen.

"Instead, government pounced. We were brusquely told, with no further explanation of why, that we would be expected to leave the country within seven days, 'banished' more or less from one of the crown colonies of Elizabeth II for the offense of believing it lawful to practice freedom of the press.

"Our friends on Montserrat rallied round. One member of parliament insisted we not comply with the deportation order while a local attorney (there are four in private practice in the country) fought to have our departure delayed.

"During all this time, I was anxious to go public with a bang—tell the whole story to AP in Puerto Rico, invite '60 Minutes' to investigate the bullying of an American newsman, and the whole nine yards. To do that, however, would more or less tear it for us all over the Caribbean and end our tropical idyll forever. So we stood mute, though with lots of mumbling under our breath and side remarks made to one another.

"All this was very tough on Jan. She hadn't done anything offensive, yet here she was getting a kicking-around anyway. When her dander's up, she is a whirlwind of a fighter, yet we were forced to hold ourselves in because we couldn't beat a whole national government. Apparently they can do what they did; it may be lousy, but they can do it.

"So we are now off to look at other islands, specifically Nevis and St. Kitt's, as possible places in which to lay down our heads. I'm feeling much like a second John Peter Zenger, martyr to freedom of the press; and both of us feel abused, disenchanted and ever so much wiser about the workings of closed societies.

"Tell people there not to worry about us. Jan and I are both resilient. In fact, we're tougher than small-minded officials appreciate. We'll get along—but things being what they are, it won't be on Montserrat.

"Watch for further reports on the adventures to follow."


I attended the Ruidoso Warrior Football game of Friday October 23, 1987.

## A word from the chamber

We have all heard it said that Ruidoso is the best kept secret of the Southwest.

For it is truly an oasis among the vast barren deserts of New Mexico, where cool mountain streams flow freely and nature grows unbounded.

Ruidoso is the perfect spot for a family vacation or for a quick weekend get-away. By all rights, Ruidoso should be a household name. Why then, are not more people aware of us?

The key to this awareness is advertising, which is the topic of this article. Last March, the Convention and Visitors Bureau was

created in order to perform certain tasks.

The first is to organize and coordinate special events. Another function of the bureau is to attract conventions, thus stimulating Ruidoso's economy during the off seasons. The final area of concern is the "promotion" of Ruidoso.

The bureau works closely with Ruidoso's Advertising Committee and the Phil Price agency, our advertising firm, in order to market our product—Ruidoso.

The promotion of Ruidoso, as a tourist destination, is done through advertising and public relations.

Advertising is the placement of

ads in a variety of media, while public relations is a cost-effective way to reach the public through press coverage, editorials, newsletters, calendar mailing, trade shows and FAM (familiarization) trips.

The initial process of marketing Ruidoso is long and complicated. The first step is making a "Marketing Situation Analysis" ... what is Ruidoso's marketing history, what outside factors affect the Village and its tourism, who is Ruidoso's competition and what does Ruidoso have to offer that our competition does not?

In effect, what makes us unique? The end result of the Situation Analysis is the creation of a message which best conveys Ruidoso to the general public. The 1987-88 message created for Ruidoso is upbeat and catchy—"On the Run to Ruidoso."

Perhaps many of you have heard it on the radio or have seen it in our print media advertisements.

Once the message has been created, the next stage is devising a marketing plan. Who do we want

our message to reach?

Out of the millions of people living in the Southwest, who will most likely respond to our advertising and eventually come to Ruidoso?

The demographics of the "target market" chosen by the committee are ages 25 to 54 years old with a family income of \$35,000.00 and above.

Due to the high cost of marketing, the committee was forced to be very selective. The target market was divided into two separate groups, "reach cities" and "reinforce cities."

"Reach cities" are new markets with untapped groups representing new visitors and future growth. The message for reach cities is an aggressive campaign of awareness—an introduction of Ruidoso.

Reach cities include Dallas/Fort Worth, Austin, San Antonio and Tucson/Phoenix.

The message for a "reinforce city" is one of reminding old visitors to return, thus maintaining their

business. A few of these cities include Amarillo, Lubbock, Midland/Odessa, El Paso, Las Cruces, Carlsbad and Alamogordo.

Since timing is critical, the next question we must address is, "When do we advertise?"

In addition, one needs to consider where the ads should be placed in order to reach as many people as possible in each city.

Only after the committee knows the message, the target market, source of media and the time elements, can an effective advertisement be created.

Since July, the following advertisements for Ruidoso have been placed.

Four large dioramas featuring year-round activities in Ruidoso are displayed in the Albuquerque and El Paso airports.

Two, a comprehensive Aspenfest—Ruidoso radio schedule was aired in KKIK in Lubbock, during September and October. A direct mailer and coupon fun-pack was released in conjunction with these aids.

Three, "Think Snow" radio spots will be released in reinforcement markets, later this fall.

Four, the 1988 issue of the New Mexico Vacation Planner will have a half page, four-color advertisement geared toward Ruidoso's reinforcement markets.

Five, two island half page, four-color, advertisements will appear in "Southwest Spirit," the in-flight magazine for Southwest Airlines, during November and December. This ad will be targeted toward our reach markets.

Marketing Ruidoso to the general public demands a lot of commitment. I would like to thank those on our advertising committee: Robert Boverie, Chairman; Tony Wilcoxson, Carla Beasley, Bill Hirschfeld, Roland Ramos, Mike Warren, Barbara DiPaolo and John Jeffers, for spending endless hours in an outstanding effort to make Ruidoso a household name.






