Alleged kidnappers claim innocence during hearing

A case against two accused kidnappers is on hold while authorities investigate an alibi offered by one of the two men during a preliminary hearing Thursday in magistrate court.

David DeFranza and Michael Kelly, accused of false imprisonment and robbery in a case involving the alleged abduction of Ruidoso resident Robert Vines, were returned to Lincoln County Jail Thursday after Magistrate Judge J.R. "Jim" Wheeler put their preliminary hearing on hold until the alibi is verified.

The two defendants are held in the Lincoln County Jail, but the Sheriff's Office dispatcher said Sunday he didn't have information on their ages or places of residence. Ruidoso Detective Lanny Maddox, contacted Monday, said DeFranza was born February 16, 1966; while Kelly's date-of-birth is listed as June 10, 1957. He said DeFranza is from Florida, but Kelly's last place of residence was unavailable.

On Thursday, Judge Wheeler explained the second- and fourthdegree felony charges to the two defendants who conferred with one another and their attorney in whispers throughout the hearing. Both DeFranza and Kelly were clad noted the case was slated for the in the orange uniform of Lincoln County Jail. The two bearded men, DeFranza with brownish hair and beard, and Kelly with a black beard and thinning black hair, listened intently as Wheeler said the preliminary hearing was merely to show probable cause—that is reasonable grounds to believe a crime has been committed and the accused might have done it.

Wheeler said the charges could result in fines of up to 18 months in jail and/or \$5,000 fine for the false imprisonment, and \$10,000 fine and/or nine years in jail on the robbery charge.

Judge Wheeler denied a motion to dismiss under the 10-day rule offered by acting public defender Scott Riedel. "State of New Mexico has no control over the weather," said Wheeler, after Assistant District Attorney Bob Laughlin grand jury Monday, but the jury didn't meet because of the weather. Laughlin said the delay was without prejudice and the defendants are still being held on charges out of Dona Ana County.

Thursday's testimony centered on an incident alleged to have happened on September 16, with Robert Vines telling of being kidnapped, tied and left in the back of his Jeep

for hours before escaping to get help at the U.S. Border Patrol near Oro Grande.

Vines and Ruidoso Detective Lanny Maddox described how composite drawings were formed using Vines' recollections of his ordeal. Vines and Maddox also explained how the subsequent arrest of Kelly and DeFranza, charged with kidnapping in Dona Ana County, led to their identification by Vines as his tormentors.

Vines said he was heading home about 8:15 a.m. on September 16, having gone out for breakfast, when two individuals knocked at his door, claiming they had car trouble and asking for a ride to their vehicle in ParadisesCanyon. He said they all three drove in his Jeep, and finding no vehicle, one of the two asked to be driven to Alamogordo

"I said no," said Vines. He said the man in the front seat then pulled a "fairly large, hunting-looking knife." Vines said he then headed for Alamogordo, but was told to stop near Mescalero, and the men tied him up, wrapped in him a sleeping bag and placed him in the back of the Jeep—where he said he remained for the next 30 hours. Vines said the men apparently drove for a long time, finally got out tattoos did you?" asked Riedel, and and left the car. He said it took him until 10 a.m. the next day to get

While stopped near Mescalero, the men took Vines' watch, gold chain and money clip with approximately \$160, testified Vines. When his right hand. asked who kidnapped and robbed him, Vines pointed out the two defendants seated with the defense attorney, saying: "the two gentlemen sitting over there in held him captive. orange coveralls."

Riedel questioned Vines over his

kidnappers was Mexican, one had reddish hair and one had an earring in one ear. He noted that neither of the defendants are Mexican, have reddish hair or have a pierced ear. Wheeler, leaning over the bench for a closer look, confirmed the men didn't have pierced ears.

"You didn't say anything about Vines admitted he didn't. The taller defendant, Kelly, displayed his tattoo-covered arms, with a picture of a scorpion on the back of his left hand. Kelly has the letters "F.T.W." tattooed near his wrist on

Federal funding OK'd for airport fire protection

it possible for federal funding of fire protection equipment at Sierra Blanca Regional Airport (SBRA), has passed in the U.S. Senate.

According to an announcement from the office of Senator Pete Domenici, the amendment changes

An amendment, which will make a Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) rule that requires airports to have scheduled service of aircraft carrying at least 30 passengers to be eligible for federal fire protection funding. The Domenici-sponsored amendment to the Airport and Airway Improvement Act of 1987 enables airports with

scheduled service using 20-seat or larger aircraft to be eligible, thus including SBRA.

Domenici spokesmen said the amendment may be signed by President Ronald Reagan as soon as a few days. After the FAA's 1988 budget is approved, SBRA officials

must apply for the funding. The spokesmen said funding of the SBRA fire protection equipment should occur in 1988.

The money is allocated on a 10 percent local/90 percent federal match. SBRA probably will qualify for funding of one fire engine.

Continued from page 1A his own character, noting he wasn't supposed to leave the county without his probation officer's permission. Vines admitted he is on probation for a drug-related

charge, but said he didn't leave the county of his own accord. "You have a history of being a compulsive liar, don't you?" asked

Riedel, to which Laughlin objected vehemently. Vines volunteered to answer the question, noting he did lie in the past over his drug problems.

"Day-to-day I'm not a liar," said Vines in a clear, firm voice.

Maddox then testified over the composites and the two line-ups, noting the two defendants look a lot like the composite drawings.

"The only thing you've got to go on are statements made by Mr. Vines," noted Riedel, questioning Maddox over why fingerprints weren't taken from the Vines vehicle.

Riedel then put his client, David DeFranza, on the stand.

Wheeler warned that defendants normally don't take the stand during preliminary, but DeFranza insisted. "I have nothing to hide," he

DeFranza then testified to being at work on September 16, in Daytona Beach, Florida. He offered as evidence computer printouts of his work schedule from Labor Force—a day labor operation. Riedel said he talked by long

distance to a woman at the Labor Force office who confirmed that DeFranza was there that day, working under contract to Accord Moving and Storage.

DeFranza told of meeting Kelly in April or May, and seeing him now and then in bars around Daytona Beach. He said the two met again on September 18, and began driving together from Florida to California.

It was learned the two were arrested on September 25, near Las Cruces. During DeFranza's testimony it was also learned that Kelly alleged he had been in the penitentiary in Virginia on or about the time the events took place.

DeFranza said his car "died somewhere in Texas," and the two bought another car, which turned out to be stolen. He said he didn't know the vehicle had been stolen, since he got a title and bill of sale.

DeFranza said he has never been convicted of a felony.

Riedel offered another motion to dismiss, noting if anything was taken it was in Otero, not Lincoln County. But Laughlin said he considered the offense as continuing from the time Vines was allegedly abducted.

"This doesn't even rise to the standards of probable cause," said Riedel. "I think they've got the wrong man."

Judge Wheeler asked Maddox to investigate the Florida alibi, and returned the two men to jail, still on \$50,000 bond.

Commission suspends race horse trainers

The New Mexico State Racing Commission suspended five race horse trainers after ruling they administered or allowed use of illegal drugs to stimulate their horses, according to published reports.

Suspended for five years for positive tests for the drug buprenorphine were Brooks Claridge, Jim-mie Claridge, Richard Fry and Bobby Willis. Trainer M. Brent Davidson was suspended for a positive test for oxymorphone.

Commission Chairman Harris Hartz said the five were suspended for five years, rather than life, because urine samples weren't handled properly.

The trainers' attorney, Joe Shattuck, argued that the cases should have been dismissed because of irregularities in handling the samples.

Earlier this month, the commission suspended for life trainers Richard Hill and Paul Oliver after they had horses test positive for Nubain, according to the reports.

Brooks Claridge was suspended for positive tests on George's Friend. Jimmle Claridge was suspended for positive tests on Pebble Rounder at Ruidoso Downs August 30. Fry received a positive test September 4 at Ruidoso Downs for Sam's Wish. Willis was suspended for a positive test at Ruidoso Downs for Mr Dance Man (August 21) and Fly Lark Fly (September 3). Davidson received a positive test on Make An Effort.

According to a press release from Mesa Airlines, the company got in-to the ski business in the winter of 1985-86, when it flew one route between Telluride and Denver, Col-


orado. The program proved to be successful and Mesa now enters its third year of ski flights with 13 routes to six ski areas in a three-







Inside the Capitol

LAS CRUCES—Was the muchtouted U. S.-Mexican border governor's conference a big success or a disappointing failure?

It all depends on who you talk to down here in Law Cruces.

For Gov. Garrey Carruthers it was another magnificent job of hosting a major event. If the first year of the Carruthers administration ends up being known for anything it may be for successfully hosting the King and Queen of Spain, the national Republican governors and the border governors during three consecutive months.

All three events came off with hardly a hitch. The biggest snafu was the flap over the guest list to see the Spanish royalty. That problem can't honestly be pinned on Garrey. He disagreed immediately with the lottery decision made by his chief of protocol but the die had already been cast.

In retrospect, the Spanish visit was the least important from an accomplishment standpoint and the most uptight from a protocol standpoint. So a minor stumble on that event is understandable and forgivable.

In the meantime, Carruthers and his staff are becoming experienced hosts. If Garrey's plans for higher political office don't work out immediately, there is always the hospitality industry which could take advantage of their talents.

Louis Sadler, a border historian and one of the organizers of the conference that ended Friday at the New Mexico State University campus, says, "The idea that this meeting was not significant, I find grossly absurd."

He goes on to say he thinks it has been "the most significant meeting of the border governors in a quarter century." That would make this meeting the most "significant" of all meetings because the first gettogether was 24 years ago during the first year of former Gov. Jack Campbell's administration.

According to the former U.S. Ambassador to Mexico Charles Pilliod. the conference was a success because the four U.S. and six Mexican governors endorsed the maquila, or twin plant, industry as a

vay to develop the border economy. In the maquila industry, U.S. companies move their assembly operations to Mexican plants to take advantage of the cheaper labor.

The companies often build "twin plants." The one on the U.S. side of the border manufactures the components and, after basic assembly in Mexico, performs final assembly and shipping.

John St. John, director of Mexican affairs for the U.S. State Department, feels the biggest accomplishment of the conference was its "institutionalization."

Since 1963, the conference has been an on-again, off-again affair. Critics have charged it is just a social gathering. At this meeting the governors pledged to make it an annual event.

The problem has been the relations between our two countries, which have so often been strained usually because of inconsistent U.S. foreign policy. Mexican officials see a possible beginning of better relations for the future.

An unspecified date of about a year from now has been tentatively agreed to. The Mexicans want it to be following our November 1988 elections in case the victor appears to be no better than the present administration at fostering improved relations across our southern border.

Texas Gov. Bill Clements was one of the detractors of the conference. Clements noted that the conferees had not even touched on environmental problems, economic problems and drug problems.

It is noteworthy that all four U.S. governors are Republicans—a factor which made it easier to get together on this meeting. Clements is the only governor to whom these conferences are not new so he is more impatient about producing some

Other detractors have mentioned the lack of addressing other problems such as smuggling, human rights, immigration and increased trade of farm and manufactured products.

Labor unions aren't too thrilled about the maquiladora program. They say the industry steals jobs from U.S. workers by moving assembly plants to Mexico.

The trade-off, which is hard to measure, is that the cheaper prices for which the goods can be produced makes them more competitive and allows the U.S. businesses to employ more U.S. workers.

California Gov. George Deukmejian and Arizona Gov. Evan Mecham both had kind words for the meeting. Mecham said he had enjoyed mak-ing new friends. Considering the problems he has been having with a recall election and possible impeachment back home, making new friends may be a completely unique experience.


