House OKs airport road \$, budget bill battle brews

House Bill 2 (HB2), containing \$7 million in funding for an access road to Sierra Blanca Regional Airport (SBRA), passed the New Mexico House of Representatives Saturday.

But the airport road funding is just a small part of the complex "budget" bill, a measure that has Democrats and Republicans taking strong party stances on issues that will affect the entire state.

Representative Ben Hall, representing parts of Lincoln, Chaves and Eddy counties, said the measure, which he opposed, may have tough times ahead. It will be presented in the Senate as early as today (Monday), but Hall said even if it passes it probably won't be signed by Governor Garrey Carruthers unless it undergoes major changes.

Hall, a Republican, said he voted against HB2 bill, even though it included funding for the airport road, because of other problems he saw with the budget bill.

"I was against the total bill because of the concept," said Hall. He said it contained too many losses for education and other areas important to the state.

Hall said House Democrats claim the bill includes pay raises for educators, but said he and other House Republicans didn't read the measure that way.

Governor Carruthers doesn't like HB2 because of cuts in funding for

the Attorney General and State Land Commission, both headed by Republicans, said Hall. He said agencies headed by Democrats weren't cut.

Those cuts would spell the end for about 310 top-level Santa Fe jobs, explained Hall. He said it could cost the City of Santa Fe as much as \$40 million in revenues.

"If the governor is forced to do it, I'm sure I know where he'll cut," said Hall, predicting there will be many fewer Democrats in Santa Fe if HB2 is signed into law in its present form. "If I was in his shoes I would sure threaten the Democrats," added Hall.

"If it goes on through, I guarantee it will ruin state government," said Hall.

But Hall is sure the bill will be changed in the Senate and then face a conference committee on those changes before being sent to the governor's desk.

"I think things will get resolved," said Hall.

A bill to provide \$250,000 for the Water Defense Association's fight against claims to water rights by the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe will be heard in the Judiciary Committee today, said Hall.

He said he and State Senator James Lee Martin have located funds for the allocation, but it will also need to pass the House Appropriations Committee. Hall said Martin was able to get the measure through the Senate Conservation Committee.

Education bills are currently

working their way through committees, but Hall, who spent much of last week in hearings, said he hasn't heard many of them yet.

Hall said two workmen's compensation bills are being reworked, and a compromise measure is expected to be unveiled on Tuesday.

Also on this week's legislative schedule are tax proposals, with \$78 million in new revenues needed to cover the \$1.5 billion HB2 budget. That budget includes an increase of about \$78 million, said Hall.

"That's not much of an increase over last year," remarked Hall. He said the inflation rate for state government is about \$40 million a year.

Although right-to-work is reportedly dead for this 60-day session, Hall said legislators still may revive the issue. Hall favored the unsuccessful right-to-work proposals.

Interstate banking, passed through the House and killed in the Senate, won't be discussed again this year, said Hall. He said he favored the proposals as a possible new source of income for the state. "I couldn't see how it could harm little banks," said Hall.

With just 20 more days in this session, Hall said a lot of things hinge on what happens with HB2. While it's too soon to tell if a special session may be needed, Hall said HB2 holds the key to that question.

Hall is taking a wait-and-see attitude.

Airport commission senses urgency in making plans for transition

Airport commissioner Conrad Buchanan, during a meeting Thursday, pushed Sierra Blanca Airport Commission (SBAC) Chairman Tim Morris to move ahead on an airport transition team approved

last month.

Although Morris, Ruidoso's representative to the SBAC, agreed last month to report at February's meeting on a group he'll recruit to draft plans for the operation of the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport (SBRA), he apparently has not gathered a transition team, and had

no such report at Thursday's regular meeting.

Discussions during that meeting included when, how and who will move and construct T-hangars at the new airport, as well as who will pay for moving the hangars. That

and other operational problems were greeted by questions on the advisory group.

Buchanan, who represents Ruidoso Downs on the SBAC, said many of the operational decisions will require input from whomever will operate the regional air facility on Fort Stanton Mesa. He said with an operational target date of November 31, work must begin immediately to draft procedures.

Commissioner Buchanan recalled that past discussions have included the possibility of the Village of Ruidoso operating the new airport, but added that decision has not yet been made. He noted that Morris, manager of the Ruidoso Municipal Airport, is in a touchy

position as he may be considered for manager of the SBRA.

But with so many questions still unanswered, Buchanan reiterated the need to move ahead with the transition team.

"Frankly, whoever's going to do this, I don't know where they're going to get the money," remarked Buchanan.

"Tim (Morris) needs to accept that challenge and get it done," said Buchanan, and Commissioner Benny Coker, representing Captain, agreed.

"We'll attack this issue and have an answer by next meeting," assured Morris.

SBAC attorney Steve Sanders cautioned commissioners that at least one public hearing will have to proceed final decisions as to the operation of the new airport.

Also Thursday, Sanders reported on water issues, and the commission approved an agreement with Fort Stanton Training Hospital in which the SBAC will arrange for paving part or all of the Fort Stanton quadrangle in exchange for using water from a Fort Stanton well.

Sanders and engineer Earl Cook, in a separate report, revealed progress on obtaining rights and access to water at Fort Stanton to be sold to the contractor on the airport construction project.

When Sanders reported the cost of paving the Fort Stanton street as \$11,000, airport contract administrator Fred Heckman asked that that figure be removed from official records of the meeting. "The figure was estimated and should not appear on the record," said Heckman.

"Whatever," replied Sanders, continuing his report.

Commissioners authorized Heckman, Sanders and Cook to negotiate for the sale of water to the contractor, with a minimum acceptable price set at 50 cents per 1,000 gallons.

"I feel 50 cents is certainly too cheap," said Coker, adding that the three should be able to negotiate for a better price.

In other regular business Thursday, the commission:

- Adopted a joint resolution with the Village of Ruidoso asking legislators to support funding for an airport access road, and voted to send a cover letter stating that Captain, Ruidoso Downs, Lincoln County and the Mescalero Apache Tribe join in the request.
- Agreed to design and print a

brochure to describe what facilities will be available at the new airport.

—Heard a financial report from Lincoln County manager Suzanne Cox who assured commissioners that bills are paid in a timely fashion if they are approved and sent to the county.

—Approved a resolution authorizing the payment of members' travel expenses according to travel regulations of each members' own governing body.

—Authorized the following bills to be paid after a review by Heckman, and if the funds are available:



—Answered a number of questions from Commissioner Bill Karn on past actions. Karn said a representative of New Mexico State University (NMSU) approached him on a number of issues, and the commission assured him of its continued cooperation with NMSU. Heckman noted that cooperation should be reciprocal recalling payments of more than \$2 million to NMSU for the loss of the Fort Stanton land and possible impacts to range experiments.

Mescalero Apache Indian Tribal President Wendell Chino, who is the tribe's SBAC member, was absent from the meeting. Chino has not attended a SBAC meeting in well over a year.

KREE manager Jim Biggs rebuts News account of dispute

Jim Biggs, general manager for KREE Radio, said Friday he disagrees with parts of a report in Thursday's issue of The News over a dispute involving Walton Stations (KREE Radio), John B. Walton, The Bank of Ruidoso and Ed Hyman.

Although Biggs didn't dispute a flurry of filings in District Court that began when The Bank of Ruidoso foreclosed on Walton property, he claimed the report's headline was misleading.

"Interest: battle over rights to KREE radio," was the headline for the story detailing the foreclosure and a string of court documents. Biggs said KREE Radio, the station itself, is not under dispute. He said the radio station license, issued by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has been moved to Alto Hill, the location of Walton's FM station license.

"The most salient point is there is no battle over KREE Radio," said Biggs. He said the radio station has no problems with its licensing agency and has received temporary authority to operate from a transmitter on Alto Hill.

Court documents indicate the dispute involves the property where KREE Radio's transmitter was housed. Ed Hyman purchased that property from The Bank of Ruidoso when Walton failed to exercise his one-month redemption right, according to District Court reports.

Walton's attorney filed a petition of redemption on December 8, and Biggs said he thought it was within the one-month redemption period. But District Judge Richard A. Parsons ruled the petition was untimely and ordered that it be dismissed.

Hyman purchased the property on October 31, and on February 10, his name was entered as a party to

the case when he filed a counterclaim in the action, according to court documents.

"On February 2, 1987 and February 3, 1987, without authority, Petitioners entered upon the premises foreclosed in District Court of Lincoln County Cause No. CV-88-207 and removed electrical fixtures and other equipment. Said property was expressly the subject of the mortgage and was foreclosed and sold by the Special Master to Edward D. Hyman," reads one section of Motion No. CV-88-490 Div. III.

Hyman said the electrical fixtures and equipment named in the motion include the radio transmitter. He filed a report with Ruidoso Police, but Detective Lanny Maddox said the missing property is a civil, not a criminal, matter.

Biggs confirmed taking the transmitter, but disagreed with

Hyman's contention that it was part of the original mortgage. Biggs said the transmitter was not attached to the building, was free-standing, and compared it to a property owner removing a refrigerator after a residential foreclosure.

"We didn't take the tower, and we didn't take the ground equipment," said Biggs.

Judge Parsons, in dismissing the redemption petition, ordered that "this matter proceed upon the counterclaim for forcible entry and unlawful detainer."

Wording in the original mortgage interpreted by one side to include the transmitter, but by the other to exclude that equipment, reads in part:

"Together with all and singular the lands, tenements, privileges, water rights, mineral rights, fixtures, to include but not limited to all carpets, cabinets and display

cases, draperies, interior and exterior lighting and electrical fixtures, plumbing, heating and air conditioning ducts and equipment, and all decorations, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining, and the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents, issues, and profits thereof..."

Biggs confirmed that KREE Radio was off the air for several days, but said the transmitter in question is not being used even now. He said a borrowed transmitter was called into service.

KREE Radio recently was named in a pay dispute with several employees. Biggs confirmed that a case filed in Magistrate Court last July has been settled.

Magistrate Court records indicate that in that case 10 people filed charges naming John B. Walton,

doing business as KREE Radio. Petitioners and the amounts they claimed they were owed were:

Biggs noted that some of the parties to that case are still KREE Radio employees, but was unwilling to discuss whether he and other employees are now being compensated for their work.

"I've invested about 12 years of my life in this radio signal," said Biggs. "I don't want to see it go dark," he added.

Wanted

Area law enforcement agencies are on the look-out for a suspect in an attempted rape reported February 6, by a 23-year-old victim assaulted on Highway 37 north of Alto. Maddox said the suspect was reportedly drinking beer and smoking "MORE" brand cigarettes. Time-share suit settled, refunds are offered

A lawsuit filed by the attorney general's office in 1985 against the developer and marketing agent of Chateau de la Shay in Ruidoso and Timberon has been settled in district court in Alamogordo, allowing about 100 time-share purchasers to be eligible for refunds or rescission.

North American Developments President Johnny Mobley said settlements already have been reached with 37-38 purchasers.

"We have to satisfy the people on it," he said. "We're working it out as fast as we can."

The lawsuit alleged deceptive practices were used by North American Developments, Inc., developer of Chateau de la Shay, and New Professionals, the former sales agent, in the sale of time-share interests and recreational-vehicle park memberships in 1985, according to the attorney general's office.

According to Assistant Attorney General Kenneth Cassutt, New Professionals sales agent Frank Bullard must pay \$25,000 in civil penalties, investment costs and attorney fees as a partial settlement in the suit.

Cassutt confirmed that Bullard and Mobley, both listed as a principal defendants in the suit, must make a series of payments to a trust account. The first payment, of \$20,000, is due today (Monday), March 2. Additional payments and their due dates include \$30,000 by July 1, \$40,000 by January 1, 1988, \$50,000 by July 1, 1988, and the

balance, if any, by January 1, 1989. Cassutt explained that the amount of the payments depends on the number of purchasers who decide to rescind and the amount they are owed. All who are paid also will be paid interest.

Cassutt noted that only those who have filed written complaints with the AG's office, or who have complained orally or in writing to North American Developments or to Bullard, and have some documentary proof of their complaint, and whose complaints fit the terms of the suit, will be offered refunds or rescission.

Some purchasers were offered vacations to Hawaii. Cassutt said those people instead will be offered a vacation to Ruidoso, Mazatlan, Mexico or Las Vegas, Nevada. The offer will include airfare to Mazatlan or Las Vegas for one person, or accommodations in Ruidoso for one or two persons.

Exchange and rescission offer letters must be sent within 60 days of the settlement, and vacation offer letters must be sent by the beginning of June, said Cassutt.

Mobley pointed out that it was Bullard who was required to pay a civil penalty.

"They fined him," he said. Mobley indicated he is cooperating fully in the settlement.

"It's just an unfortunate thing that happened," he said.

Bullard, apparently now of Florida, could not be reached for comment.

As a major sponsor of Save Your Vision Week, Marquardt is launching a month-long celebration of community and public service activities planned to focus everyone's attention on good vision and its care.




Computer wizards

Lenten drama begins Wednesday at Shepherd of the Hills church

Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church, on Hull Road, will keep Lent with the presentation of Lenten dramas during the traditional 40 days commemorating the death of Christ. Lent begins Ash Wednesday, March 4.

Commemorating the Passion History of Christ through plays is an ancient Christian practice, dating back to the early centuries of the Christian era.

Parts have been written for each night's drama, as well as Scripture readings assigned to involve about 70 of the congregation's people in keeping Lent.

Schmidt is third in state wrestling tourney

"We wrestled very well" was Ruidoso Warrior boys varsity wrestling Coach Gerald Ames' way of summing up the team's performance in the weekend state tournament in Belen.

Top wrestler for the Warriors was junior Jeff Schmidt, who took third in state 107-pound competition. In team competition, the Warriors' 39.5 points placed them about midway in the pack of 24 AAA teams at the tournament, said Ames.

Schmidt pinned a Kirtland Cen-

tral wrestler, then pinned a Taos grappler before meeting the eventual state champ in the third round. In that match, Schmidt lost, 8-2.

The Warrior wrestler then topped the District 1-AAA champ, 3-0, and finished with a victory over the District 2-AAA champ by a score of 5-1.

Other Warriors at the tournament included Heath Wood at 119 pounds. He lost to a Las Vegas Robertson wrestler, 10-2, and was pinned by an Aztec grappler.

At 126 pounds, Cory Garner lost to Albuquerque Academy, 3-2, beat a Taos wrestler, 8-2, and lost to Navajo Academy, 8-4.

Bubba Lane, at 145 pounds, upset the number three seed in the tournament by a pin, then was pinned by a Penasco wrestler, pinned a Fort Wingate wrestler, then was defeated, 12-4, by the same wrestler he met in his first match.

At 167 pounds, Dusty Beavers was pinned by a Las Vegas Robertson wrestler, topped a Kirtland Central wrestler, 8-6, then was pinned by a grappler from New Mexico Military Institute.

Augustine Apache, at 185 pounds, had a bye in the first round, lost 8-3 to the eventual third-place grappler, pinned a Penasco wrestler, the was defeated, 10-3, by Fort

Wingate.

At heavyweight, Jason Hill pinned his first two opponents, from Aztec and Las Vegas Robertson. In his third match, he was pinned by the eventual champion. He was defeated, 4-1, by a Taos wrestler in his final match.

"For being such a young team, I was very pleased," said Ames. He noted that sophomores Lane and Beavers, and juniors Schmidt, Wood and Apache, all seasoned wrestlers, will return next year.

"We're looking real good," Ames said of next year's team. The team ended the season with a 2-4-1 record.

Cobre Indians mangle Warrior hoopsters

Tuesday the Warriors will travel to Truth or Consequences to take on the fifth-ranked Hot Springs team, and Friday they'll play in Silver City.

The Warriors are 10-11 for the season, already matching last year's 10 wins.

In girls varsity action Saturday, the Cobre Indians beat the Warriors, 47-33. Just coming off two disappointing losses, 43-40 against Deming Friday, and 59-28 against Hot Springs Wednesday, the Warrior girls finished the season at 0-8 in District 3-AAA.

"We didn't play well at all," said coach Sergio Castanon after Saturday's game. He said the Warrior girls hit just five out of 28 free throw attempts.

Amy Osborne scored 10 points Saturday and 11 points Wednesday and Veralyn Platta hit for 10 points on Friday to lead the team.

"Wednesday we played hard, but we just couldn't buy a basket," said Castanon. "Friday we played bad enough to lose," he added.

The girls district tournament begins Tuesday in Truth or Consequences.





THE IRAN-CONTRA AFFAIR...



Inside the Capitol by Fred McCaffrey

SANTA FE—"Cute" might be the way to describe what the 1987 Legislature has tried to be—and that may explain why we are now at the start of March with few if any real accomplishments to list for it.

In what some of us have come to think of as the good old days of yore Legislature-wise, committee chairmen had the courage to take positions on the bills that came before them. Some actually sat down with the measures as they came in and divided them into three piles. There was a group of bills that had little or no merit, or little or no chance of passage anyway. There was a pile of marginal measures, which might or might not get enacted eventually into law. And there was a third pile made of truly essential measures, of the kind that absolutely have to be acted on if the session is to have any meaning at all. All committees, no matter what the year, get bills referred to them that fit into one of those categories—and the pile that contains the bills that are more or less useless in every fashion is always by far the highest of the three.

Nowadays, alas, committee chairmen don't seem to have the courage to act in that fashion.

That's why, this year, we have had more bills reported out with no recommendation than ever before in legislative history. Committees take their lead from the person who sits at the head of the table, and if that person won't make up his or her mind, the group isn't likely to do it either. Since the very simple purpose of a committee is to save the complete body of which it is part the work of hearing every bill in detail, taking a stand—"we like it" or "we don't"—is the heart of the matter. "No recommendation," given that fact, is a gutless failure to function.

Another thing we have far too much of here nowadays is that sentence about how we will "lay this on the table till the proponents and the opponents have time to work out their differences." Legislators are elected to do that; and to turn it over to the paid lobbyists, and to say in effect, "We won't function until these people tell us what to do," is another dereliction of duty.

And then there are the sheer acts of inanity that have grown increas-

ingly common here.

You want an example? It would be hard to think of a better one than having the House Appropriations and Finance Committee, chaired by a Democrat and with a Democratic majority among its members, act to cut in half the number of exempt positions in state government employment.

What that would lead to is a chance for the Governor to fire all Democrats in such jobs, keep all Republicans, and say to those he discharges, "Don't blame me. The Democrats ordered me to do this."

The chairman of that committee, Santa Fe's Max Coll, files a demurrer to those charges. He solemnly assures anyone who makes such charges that HAFIC had no such thought in mind at any time.

To those who hold such exempt jobs, however, that isn't an adequate answer. Those people, many of who live in Coll's House district, are less than cheered by the thought of having their jobs used as a political ploy to speed interaction between Governor and legislators. "I don't want them playing games with my livelihood," is the way one of those people put it to me. That should be crisp and clear enough for Coll and his Democratic allies on the committee to understand—if they aren't too busy applauding themselves for their cuteness.

Coll, of course, says the only purpose of this move was "to get the Governor's attention." That isn't much of an explanation either. There has never been a governor, not even one as innocent of the inner workings of the job he took on as Garrey Caruthers, who thought for a moment he could fall to heed the House Appropriations and Finance Committee, the most powerful group in the Legislature no matter what year it is.

Sorry, Max, but you're straining a little too hard this year, and that isn't very satisfactory conduct for the man who has the heavy responsibilities you have.

Maybe if these people would give up the notion of showing us how clever they are, there would be time for them to get the job done and go home when they are by law bid to do so.





Keeping greens green, golf carts rolling is a big job

Being a groundskeeper on a golf course is really a year-round job.

Just ask Henry Vega.

Vega is the head groundskeeper at Cree Meadows Country Club and has been at his current job for six years.

"We have to take care of the whole course," Vega said. "We have to cut the greens, fairways and the roughs and mow the T-boxes.

"We also have to change the cups (on each of the 18 holes) so they won't get worn out.

"We change the cups about every other day in the summertime. During the wintertime, we change them according to how much play we have on them."

However, Vega and assistant Moses Bryan keep busy during the wintertime fixing golf carts and getting other equipment ready for the busy spring and summer seasons.

The club has 52 electrical carts that golfers can use on the 96-acre golf course. There are a number of vehicles that Vega and his assistants use to get around with on the course.

Before coming to Cree Meadows, Vega was the head groundskeeper at Carrizozo Golf Course for 11 years.

He started at Carrizozo in 1970 and received training at other New Mexico golf courses.

"I got some training while the Carrizozo course was being built," remarked Vega. "Joe Holt at the South Campus course in Albuquerque helped me, as did Ted Martinez (now at the Inn of the Mountain Gods) at Four Hills Country Club in Albuquerque and Mike Apodaca at Terra Del Sol Country Club in Belen."

Before becoming a groundskeeper, Vega was a truck driver for a number of years, working with his father.

The busy golf season is ahead for Vega.

During the spring and summer, he usually has a couple of other assistants besides Bryan.

"During the wintertime, we could have 15 or 20 people play on the course during a good day," Vega commented. "During the summertime, we usually have a lot more people. It's hard to say how many."

Vega enjoys everything about his job at Cree Meadows.

"I meet a lot of different people," he said. "The people are really nice and I've made a lot of friends."

And Henry Vega is a popular figure himself at the Cree Meadows Country Club golf course.
