Pyramid scheme

AG aims for 'plane' scam

A pyramid scam, in the form of a game called "Airplane," has surfaced in the Ruidoso area, according to Assistant Attorney General Ernie Pacheco of the Consumer Protection Division.

Pacheco said his office received a tip that Airplane, a gambling game with multi-level designations, is being played in the area.

Airplane players: a pilot, two co-pilots and four passengers gather at pre-determined, but constantly changing, locations to play a game using air travel terms, said Pacheco. Players are expected to recruit eight new players who pay the pilot \$1,500 each.

Pacheco said the pyramid group then splinters and the co-pilots become pilots, the passengers co-pilots, the new players take the place of the passengers and the recruitment process is repeated.

Airplane, along with a multitude of other pyramid schemes, is illegal in New Mexico, said Pacheco. He said it is covered by section 57-13-3-C of the Pyramid or Multi-level Sales Act.

Legitimate multi-level marketing businesses operating in New Mexico have to register, said Pacheco. He said participants should question a multi-level plan in which there is no real product.

"Eventually someone has to lose," noted Pacheco.

Airplane, and similar games, have appeared in most of the 50 states, said Pacheco. He said a similar scheme, called "Infinity," appeared recently in Santa Fe.

Infinity was promoted as a support group whose members used assumed names and met in various locations, said Pacheco.


"Infinity was a pretty good con game because people were talking about how they were going to help each other," said Pacheco.

While the Attorney General's office has had no complaints about Airplane, Pacheco said he had received information that the game is being played around Ruidoso.

Violation of the state statute on pyramids is a misdemeanor, but because of the amounts of money involved, Airplane players could be charged with a felony, said Pacheco.

"Ultimately the courts will have to decide the legality," said Pacheco.

Special session? Maybe, says Hall

"We may be here a long time," said State Representative Ben Hall Saturday.

With less than a week left in the 60-day legislative session, none of the "big bills" and none of Governor Garrey Carruthers' proposals have reached the governor's desk. Hall, a Republican representing parts of Lincoln, Chaves and Eddy counties, predicts legislators won't go home without acting on several key issues. He said bets are going 60-40 in Santa Fe that a special session will be called.

"I don't think we're going to leave here without a Workmen's Compensation bill the governor can live with," said Hall in a telephone interview Saturday.

Hall said when the Senate made its changes to House Bill (HB) 2, the huge funding bill that contained nearly \$8 million for the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport access road, those road funds were reduced by one-third. He said State Representative Dick Knowles of Capitan is on the conference committee reviewing the bill and is trying to get the road money restored.

Unhappy that Lincoln County lost in the Senate version of the major spending bill, Hall said he is pleased with overall changes the Senate has applied to the legislation. Hall originally voted against HB2.

"Nothing is final till it's signed by the governor," reminded Hall.

Another Lincoln County funding request, \$250,000 for the Water Defense Association, is still alive. Hall said that request has a good chance, but funds may come out of next year's budget rather than the current fiscal year.

Hall said he was among a group of lawmakers who wanted to set back parts of the school reform bill passed last year. He said they wanted to delay anything that would cost money.

"We'll just have to wait and see," said Hall.

Hall said legislation he's sponsoring to have state monuments taken out of the museum system and placed in historic preservation is stalled in committee.

Monuments, including old Lincoln Town, are so far down on the priority list under museums that they have a hard time getting funds, said Hall. He said Lincoln Heritage Trust and other state monument groups are in favor of the bill.

But the proposal has angered some people in Santa Fe, including the museum division.

"All of a sudden I'm trying to

steal their favorite child," said Hall.

While in Santa Fe, Hall said he plans to find out more on the status of a wallet that has become the center of controversy between Lincoln County Clerk Fran Siddens and Lincoln Heritage Trust. He said he'll talk to the state archives about a wallet belonging to Bob Ollinger who was killed when Billy the Kid made his escape from Lincoln in 1881.

Siddens refused a request by Lincoln Heritage Trust to display the wallet, saying it is part of a probate file and must, by law, remain in her possession.

"I never saw it take a county clerk 106 years to probate a will," said Hall. He said the Ollinger wallet is more than just records, and is part of the old Lincoln Wars history. Hall said, if displayed, the wallet might attract tourists.

He suggested that the probate judge could dispose of the wallet if no relatives come forward.

"I'll find out for sure what the state wants to do with it," said Hall.

Another Hall project this session is to get the state law enforcement academy to move to donated facilities in Artesia. That, too, is on hold for now.

He spent time last week with members of the Lincoln County Food Bank board, in Santa Fe to make a plea for a food stamp office in Lincoln County.

"We're trying to get somebody from Human Services back in Lincoln County," said Hall, who arranged for food bank directors to meet with Human Services Director Lou Gallegos.

Hall said it takes from 45-50 days for Lincoln County residents to be processed through the Alamogordo office.

"You could starve to death by the time Human Services gets around to getting you any help," he added. But Hall is confident Gallegos will do what he can to alleviate the problem.

"He wants the job done," said Hall.

Tax bills were expected on the house floor Saturday, and Hall said tax increases from \$40 to \$78 million would be discussed. He said the tax bill and the spending bill are interdependent.

The clock will run out on this session at noon Saturday, March 21. If the business of the state isn't complete, then legislators will wait for a call from the governor to get back to work.

Ranger warns of wildfire threat

U.S. Forest Service (USFS) District Ranger Steve Sams warned last week of the continuing wildfire danger in Lincoln County.

"In our opinion it's not a question of if it will happen, but when it will happen," said Sams, noting that 10 years have passed since this area experienced a major fire.

Sams and USFS fire officer Steve Makowski spoke Wednesday at a workshop for the Ruidoso Village Council, the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission, the Lincoln County Planning and Zoning Commission and representatives of area firefighting organizations.

Sams said the Lincoln County area is recognized by the USFS as having the highest fire potential in New Mexico, and perhaps in the Southwest.

"We are part of a national phenomenon of increasing that risk by building in an area subject to wildfire," said Sams.

Sams showed two videotapes provided by the National Fire Protec-

tion Association (NFPA), and told the group that a series of three is available for viewing by interested groups. The films showed the devastation of a Florida fire, and stressed that a group effort is needed to deal with wildfires.

James C. Smalley, president of NFPA, stressed in the films the national scope and potential consequences of wildfires. He said in 1985 1,400 homes were consumed by fires in "wildland urban interface" areas.

Those fires took the lives of 44 people, including many firefighters; destroyed property valued at \$500 million, burned 300 million acres and cost \$400 million in fire suppression expense.

"More and more families are moving closer and closer to our forests...that's why if you're not careful you could burn a lot more than trees," warned Smalley.

Sams said the problem must be attacked by a base of leadership comprised of homeowners, fire managers and municipal and county planners, developers and lawmakers. He said fire managers

have done just about all they can do, and the next step is up to homeowners and lawmakers.

"Prevention is the key," said Sams, advocating strict controls on building materials, location of structures and overall development in wildland urban interface areas, such as Lincoln County.

"We believe that the support has to come from the ground up," said Sams, asking for input from the group.

Noting that ignorance is the biggest problem in fire prevention, Sams said he'll make the fire safety videos and video equipment available to anyone wishing to view the films.

In discussions of past fire prevention programs, Makowski said the red flag alert program will be coordinated this year by the Noon and Evening Lions clubs.

He said the fire safety videos will be aired at 6:30 p.m. today (Monday), Tuesday and Wednesday, March 16-18, on Lincoln Cablevision.

Fire damages Dawg House, grassland

Fire Department records list "suspicious" as the cause of a fire reported at 5:51 p.m. Friday at the old Libby's Dawg House stored on village property on Hull Road.

Damage was estimated at \$1,500 to the A-frame structure donated to the Village of Ruidoso when Libby's Dawg House discontinued

operations. Six men and three units spent 50 minutes at the scene of the fire, according to reports.

The Ruidoso Fire Department responded at 10:41 a.m. Sunday to a grass fire at the Charles Dean property on Carrizo Canyon Road, said firefighter Barry Cole.

Reports indicated that neighbors had that blaze under control by the time 10 firefighters with four units arrived. The crews spent about 45 minutes at the scene.

"Fire was started by ashes that were dumped, 'possibly' by neighbors," according to the official report.

Ruidoso Board of Education approved a trial tutoring service at its meeting Wednesday.

Mother Earth Prepares For Two Great Days

This is being sent about a half-hour before high noon on March fourteen. Last night was the warmest of the year—a truly spring-like night with moon, two days away from rounding into the full, shining down bringing a peaceful radiance all through the night.

This morning the world awakened eager to make the most of a blue sky and warm sun. Right now, just before noon, the temperature is an even 70 in the shade.

A gentle west wind drifted in at midmorning, singing and humming through the evergreens. It began carrying a breath of snow from off the white mountain, but it has warmed itself as it floated over the sunny mountain meadows along the way. For all that, you can smell and taste just a trace of the snowy mountain

up to the west as the wind carries tiny cool gusts along with its warm waves.

This very faint trace of late winter in the air reminds us that although spring is only six days away, the snow on the mountain will still have a little something to say about how cool or how warm it is down here in the valley.

I have been telling you about the apricot blossoms for the past two or three messages, because they are a guide to the type of spring we will have.

Since early morning the bees have been working around the little apricot tree where half the blooms are now out, all in one day. The large apricot tree has sent out about half of its blossoms, and it stands a pink and white giant bouquet twenty-feet tall in the little meadow south of the house. It is an advance guard

messenger of spring, there with the green wintery hillside in the background.

On the lea side of the tree, the gentle wind brings you a great flood of spring's first blossom sweetness. As you inhale breath after breath of this essence of apricot-blossom honey, your heart thrills with rejoicing.

Saint Patrick's Day

Every year Saint Patrick's Day arrives on the seventeenth just in time to give us a little head start in the celebration of spring which arrives soon after on the twentieth.

Saint Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland, was born in England when that country was under Roman domination in the year 389. At the age of fourteen he was captured by Irish pirates and taken to Ireland where he was a shepherd for several years. Since earliest childhood the mark of his destiny was plain in his nature, because he was a very devout and spiritual child.

He taught the early Irish much about Christianity, using the shamrock to illustrate the principal of the Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. The shamrock, along with the harp, has been handed down, a symbol of the Emerald Isle.

Saint Patrick escaped from Ireland and studied to be a priest in Europe. In time he began hearing voices from Ireland saying:

a fond tradition of Saint Patrick. The story goes that years ago just when the church was being established, a young Irish priest who happened by said:

"This country is as green as Ireland. You should name your church for Saint Patrick."

And so it was. The old church of San Patricio still stands in the historic little village of the same name in the Ruidoso Valley.

In times past special services were held at the old church of San Patricio, and folks came for miles around to pay special tribute and reverent homage to the patron saint of green Ireland. And today, Saint Patrick receives special veneration at the Church of Saint Jude.

Happy Saint Patrick's Day

The Irish have played such a large role in our history that we all feel we have a drop of Irish blood, especially on Saint Patrick's Day. In a thousand ways we are indebted to the Irish for some of our deepest happiness, especially in the world of music:

We all remember "When Irish Eyes Are Smiling," "Mother Machree," "Danny Boy" and many

many others.

The folks of Irish descent have been outstanding in all walks of life. Three of our four presidents have been of Irish extraction, including our president of today, Ronald Reagan. Let us wish him a special happy Saint Patrick's Day.

Let the fond love of all Irish for this Nation Under God, flow forth on Saint Patrick's Day all among us. And let us say a prayer of thanks for blessing of Saint Patrick throughout the world.

Lee also took third in the 200


meters with a 28.6 time. Bowen was fifth in the 100-meter low hurdles in 19.2.



Capitan Village Trustees discussed budget problems with the village Police Department at a regular meeting Monday.

Mayor Benny Coker said overtime and compensatory-time have been a continuing problem in the Capitan law enforcement department. He said with more work than

two officers can handle on a standard 40-hour week the overtime keeps growing.

Trustee Kelly Beavers said the overtime was "excessive," adding he hoped "something could be done about it."

"I feel that there is a solution," Coker responded. "That's why I had a quite lengthy discussion today with the sheriff. He feels like

his dispatcher can pick up calls when our men are off. That will cut down on the overtime our department is putting in," said Coker.

In further discussion, trustees Beavers, David Rouleau, Dave Strickland and Norm Renfro learned there are three deputy sheriffs living in the Capitan area available to respond when needed by the village.

In other business, the council: —Attended to swearing in Debra Cummins as deputy village clerk. —Approved a village holiday schedule.

—Discussed communication repeater problems with Eddy County representatives Bob Stockwell and Bob Hazelwood. It was learned the Capitan repeater has been placed in a position that allows interference with Eddy County frequencies. The two Eddy County representatives said Eddy County is willing to pay for any changes needed.

—Tabled a joint powers agreement with the Lincoln County Sheriff until all trustees can read it.

—Welcomed Boy Scout Troop 124, with scout leader Larry Bandy. The troop is working on a Citizenship in the Community Badge. Scouts thanked the council for the \$300 grant they receive each year from the village.



Unless you enter your appearance in said cause on or before the 10th day of April, 1987, judgment will be rendered against you by default, and the Plaintiff will apply to the Court for the relief demanded in the Complaint filed herein.

The entire community came to the aid of the Lincoln County Food Bank. But that's no surprise.

Inside the Capitol

SANTA FE—One well-meaning person, in an obvious effort to articulate his view that I should not discontinue writing this column, told me I should be bronzed. I'm not sure I appreciate that idea.

The best way for a writer to be preserved, which is what bronzing attempts to do, is for his words to have made some change in the thinking of his readers. One of those—a man who is a public servant of the kind I hammered on most frequently—lifted my spirits considerably when he took the time to list in writing the things he says he has learned here.

This is not somebody hoping to curry favor with me so I'll say nice things about him in the time still remaining to me in this space. He makes that point clear by an observation early in his communication: "I will miss about 85 percent of the opinions in your column," he writes. "You can take the other 15 percent with you to the Caribbean."

I'll settle gladly for the percentage break. If I have managed to score with what I said that frequently, I can say my farewells when the time comes as a very satisfied man.

But what's best about what this gentleman had to say is the list of specifics he provided as an illustration of the conclusions he has drawn after thinking over what he reads here. I give you what he said just as he said it, with no comment from me. Obviously, I agree with his statements and hope other public servants think in something of the same way.

Here's his exact wording:
 "The power that people bestow on our public employees is to carry out their wills and nothing else."
 "Public officials are not experts simply by virtue of an election or appointment."
 "Listening to the people about their needs is far more effective than telling people what their needs are."
 "One's own knowledge and integrity are not nearly as crucial as the knowledge and integrity of the people we surround ourselves with."
 "Overnight solutions usually mean long-term problems."
 "And it is wiser to admit to

mistakes than to try to defend them."

As for me, I think any public employee worth his or her salt could find in those observations material for meditating on for many months to come.

If all of those who are on the public payroll are not fortunate enough to be possessed of the wisdom those sentences encompass, it is a pleasure to be able to pass along this kind of thinking. It is doubly pleasant to be given credit for having helped it come to be.

Those Republican Lujans are a pretty good gang.

Nobody who knew Manuel Lujan Sr. could ever have a doubt on that score. He was an outstanding businessman, an exemplary member of his parish, a dedicated politician and a true gentleman. What's more, he was one of that small group of Republicans who kept a party alive here during the 1930's and 1940's when that was not an easy thing to do.

So for his sake, if for no other, it's good to see one of his sons serving in the Congress of the United States, the kind of honor he himself deserved but could never attain because of the period of New Mexico history into which he was born.

It's also good to see another son, Edward, deciding to have another term as state chairman of the Republican party. He has done a good job in that post in the past, and deserves more time in which to carry out some of the programs he has been so successful with.

Whether you are registered in the party he heads or not, you ought to be behind Ed Lujan when he says our state will be the better for it if we can develop a true parity between the two major political parties here. I agree with him that something like a 50-50 split would be a good thing to aim for.

What's more, even the most diehard Democrats will tell you they find Edward a fair and dedicated opponent, in the tradition his father laid down for his sons and daughters to follow.






