## The dam has a crack

Final inspection on Grindstone Canyon Dam revealed a one-eighth-inch crack in a joint, but village engineer Mike Davalos said it was no big surprise.

"It's a little larger than we expected," said Davalos.

He said such cracks can be compared to a crack in a sidewalk, and can be sealed to make the dam waterproof.

"We didn't find any other problems," said Davalos, but he added a number of questions still need to be answered by design engineers with Boyle Engineering.

Davalos said that although A.S.I. did the actual construction, design engineers are expected to certify that the structure is working properly before the final construction payment is released.

"Their design is technically sound," said Davalos. He said the village is still holding some of the contractor's money until Boyle can certify and verify that the dam is according to the plans.

When the final payment is released to A.S.I., Grindstone Canyon Dam will have cost the village \$7,543,683, said Davalos.

He said designs are complete for the estimated \$100,000 tower and valve system the State Engineer is

requiring on the structure. Davalos said Boyle Engineering is not charging for the tower designs.

Davalos said Boyle Engineering is now negotiating with the village on two outstanding contracts signed in 1982, one for the water treatment plant and the other for the five-million-gallon reservoir that will complete the Grindstone Canyon Dam project.

A meeting between Boyle Engineering and Village of Ruidoso representatives is planned for Wednesday, March 25, in Albuquerque, and those contracts are expected to be among items discussed.

## Trade shows are talked up during lodgers' tax meeting

The Ruidoso Lodgers' Tax Committee (LTC) talked trade shows during Wednesday's regular meeting.

Members saw a videotape showing Ruidoso's booth at a San Antonio, Texas, show, got reports of shows from Nancy Radziewicz and LTC member Dan Kelley, discussed an upcoming event in San Antonio and reviewed trade show funding.

Early in the meeting Radziewicz questioned Chairman Rod Adamson as to whether money used for trade shows put the overall advertising plan in jeopardy.

"Trade shows in no way jeopardized the media advertising fund," said Adamson.

He said a report in The News of a Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce Advertising Committee meeting gave the impression that funds allocated by LTC to trade shows infringed on advertising funds allocated to the chamber. Adamson said that was not the case.

The LTC budget established at the beginning of this fiscal year included an \$80,000 line item for media advertising, and a \$20,000 media advertising contingency fund, said Adamson. He said the \$20,000 was budgeted as a buffer in case lodgers' tax collections didn't meet projections.

It was learned that both those line

items were administered through the chamber Advertising Committee and included in the overall advertising plan for the year. Later in the meeting, chamber executive director John Jeffers heard that the \$20,000 is expected to be available, and told the committee the Advertising Committee included it in the summer advertising budget.

Adamson explained that trade show allocations came from another contingency fund, one administered by the LTC. He said that fund had \$11,000 at the beginning of the year, but grew to \$22,000 when last year's unspent funds were brought forward.

Radziewicz enthusiastically explained the benefits of trade shows as she showed a videotape of visitors to the San Antonio show visiting the Ruidoso booth, asking questions and greeting Smokey Bear and Woodsy Owl.

Radziewicz stressed that the Smokey and Woodsy characters are provided by the U.S. Forest Service to promote fire safety, but she added the life-size characters are a draw to get people to the Ruidoso display. As youngsters got Smokey and Woodsy handouts provided by the Forest Service, their parents were handed brochures promoting Ruidoso.

At the recent Dallas, Texas, show, Smokey made a tour of newspapers, radio and television stations, said Radziewicz.

Radziewicz said brochures were in short supply for the Dallas show,

but she was able to gather enough Ruidoso brochures from local businesses. She said Ski Apache was out of hand-outs but paid to have a newspaper insert-type brochure printed.

"It's typical Ruidoso—in a time of need everybody rallied together," said Radziewicz last week.

Radziewicz provided LTC with a written report on 1986-87 trade shows. Included in that report were:

—Ski Group-Dallas and San Antonio; end of May, one-day show in each city; cost, \$670.12 per show; attendance by invitation only with 902 on mailing list.

—Ski Fest-Austin and Dallas; end of September, first of October; cost, \$700 per show; open to the public.

—San Antonio Sports Show; January 13-18; cost, \$2,161; open to public with paid admission; attended by 200,000.

—Albuquerque Sports Show; February 20-22; cost, \$850; open to public with paid admission.

—Dallas Sports and Vacation Show; March 3-8; cost, \$2,040; open to public with paid admission; estimated attendance, 100,000.

Kelley, who worked the Albuquerque show, said the response to the Ruidoso booth was positive and encouraging. He said Albuquerque is an area that should be considered in future promotional plans.

Tonight will be partly cloudy, with diminishing winds after midnight. Winds will be from the southwest at 10 to 20 miles per hour.


Friday will be variably cloudy and windy. Winds will be west at 15 to 30 miles per hour and gusting.

"People that attended the show were interested in our town," said Kelley.

Barbara Downs, who worked most of the trade shows with Radziewicz, also extolled the benefits of promoting the area through trade shows. Downs, Radziewicz, Pat Morrison of Ski Apache and Carla Beasley of the Advertising Committee made a visit to The News last week to talk of past successful trade shows.

Morrison said Ski Apache plans to do more such shows.

"The more we get the name out the more people are going to know who we are, what we are and what we have to offer," said Morrison. She said Ski Apache participated in a trade show in Tucson, Arizona, and already has seen results.

The four trade show veterans discussed promoting Ruidoso as a destination for family vacations, not just for skiing and horse racing. And members of LTC apparently agree.

"We're not stressing family vacations enough," said committee member Bill Rawlins Wednesday.

Adamson told Radziewicz that trade show funds will be allocated through the chamber Advertising Committee next year, and advised her to present a proposal to them. He invited her to come back to LTC if she's unable to get enough funds.

"I'm concerned about the September show," said Radziewicz. She said Ruidoso has been

given four booths, valued at \$1,800, for the San Antonio Sports Show, but show planners need to know very soon how the village will participate. She and members of LTC discussed a number of ways the free booths can be used, but all agreed the complimentary space should be utilized.

Radziewicz said she is helping the show promoter with lists and information in exchange for the space, which will be in a prime location. She said the chamber might want to staff one booth, ski shops and restaurants another and the village still another.

Rawlins suggested asking Lincoln County to participate, and Radziewicz agreed.

"It needs to be done now," said Radziewicz, asking LTC to consider per diem and transportation for two or three people for the six-day show.

Adamson suggested she talk with the chamber, and assured Radziewicz that she would get "no negative feedback" from the LTC.

Adamson thanked Radziewicz and Kelley for their work.

Also Wednesday, the LTC:

—Heard that lodgers' tax collections were down 14.9 percent last month, after showing a decline of 17.5 percent the month before and a decline of 24 percent last August. "The drop's been coming up," noted Kelley.

—Got the word from Jeffers that bids are out on a new brochure, budgeted at \$15,000 by LTC.

—Accepted an Advertising Com-

mittee report from Jeffers, and agreed to release the \$20,000 media advertising contingency fund. "This year's advertising budget was made including that \$20,000," remarked Jeffers. He said Advertising Committee recommendations will be available next week.

—Was informed by Jeffers that a Texas Media Day, sponsored by the state office for Economic Development and Tourism in cooperation with the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, is scheduled April 2. Cost to pre-register for the seminar is \$25, with registration \$20 at the door. He said locals may attend for \$18.

—Heard that the chamber is cooperating with McSween dig promoters, and has asked the public relations firm to prepare a news release.

—Instructed village clerk Tammie Maddox to tell a representative of the New Mexico Association for the Deaf and Hearing Impaired who asked LTC to purchase advertising to send that request to Epstein Advertising Agency.

—Agreed to use \$150,000 as the "bottom line" when planning next year's budget.

—Listened to a request for funds for the Alpine Shifters Bicycle Club presented by Harvey Foster. Foster asked for \$1,000 to help promote a 12-mile bicycle climb on Aspentest weekend. He said \$150 is needed this fiscal year and the rest next fiscal year. Foster said as many as 120 cyclists are expected for the event.

## P&Z can't meet, no quorum

With just four of nine members present, the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission cancelled Monday's regularly scheduled meeting for lack of a quorum.

Commissioners J.D. James, Marie Rooney, Jess Stinson and John White waited patiently through the hour scheduled for a workshop, but when fellow members didn't arrive for the meeting at 3 p.m., they gave up and announced the meeting was cancelled.

Two items were scheduled for review.

Chairman David Smith, vice chairman Pete Thompson and commissioners Eddie Nichols, Ken Carr, Ellen Long and Ken Carr were absent from the meeting.

Besides the two agenda items, U.S. Forest Service fire management officer Steve Makowski was

on hand to discuss parts of a proposed zoning ordinance dealing with forest hillside protection. Makowski distributed a written proposal containing his recommendations.

Makowski noted that a requirement in the proposed zoning ordinance that a site plan showing all mature trees on a lot would cost property owners from \$50 to \$100.

"The requirement to replace trees over the 50 percent removal limit as stated in the proposed ordinance is excessive," said Makowski. He said most area property already has too many trees for healthy growth, and the ordinance would have homeowners placing trees in a situation where healthy growth couldn't be maintained.

He said a requirement to plant trees two inches in diameter could be very expensive.

Makowski proposed that a minimum of 25 percent of a lot

unoccupied by structures or improvements be landscaped with trees over 12 feet high.

"The majority of homeowners in this area will preserve every tree they can so the proposal will pose no hardship on them," noted Makowski.

He said his proposal maintains a forest environment while allowing individuals to remove existing trees and replace according to varying preferences.

Members of Planning and Zoning adopted the zoning ordinance during a recent public meeting, but agreed to recommend some changes before the ordinance and comprehensive plan are adopted by the Ruidoso Village Council.

Both a workshop to discuss proposed changes and a public hearing set for the council have been cancelled while members await a legal and administrative review.

Work began on the plan and ordinance more than two years ago.

## Complaints douse plan to burn Racquet Club


Assistant fire chief Jesse Reynolds said Monday that plans to burn the Sierra Swim and Racquet Club were scrapped because of complaints from the public.

for everyone without regard to race, color, national origin, sex, age or handicap.

## March is Mental Retardation Month

The month of March has been proclaimed Mental Retardation Month by President Ronald Reagan and locally by the Lincoln County Commissioners.

Retardation is not a disease, nor should it be confused with mental illness. By definition, a person with mental retardation is one who develops at a below average rate and experiences difficulties in learning, social adjustment and economic productivity. In terms of tested IQ, the person scores below 70.

The Association for Retarded Citizens (ARC) of Lincoln County

was founded in 1983 and works to increase awareness, public knowledge and understanding of mental retardation.

Mental retardation can be caused by any condition which impairs development of the brain before birth, during birth or in the early years. All individuals who are mentally retarded have the capacity to learn, develop and grow.

During March, ARC of Lincoln County has launched an awareness campaign to call attention to the needs and abilities of children and adults with mental retardation.

Phyllis Schlegel, president of

ARC, noted that approximately 300 people in Lincoln County have some degree of mental retardation. The local chapter of ARC attempts to assist all ages of people with mental retardation and their families.

ARC of Lincoln County meets quarterly. The next meeting will be at 7 p.m. April 27, at the New Horizons Development Center in Carrizozo. Timely programs with updated information are presented at these meetings. Parents, family members and anyone interested are invited to attend.


Lovelace said Weinbrenner, charged with burglary of the Sing-

### Happy Birthday To Brother Miller

This will reach you on the birthday of Brother Miller, born March nineteen, 1903, in Tularosa to Fountain Miller and the former Alice Burditt.

As an infant, he was brought with his parents to where the Elk's Lodge now stands. Here his mother had the Ruidoso Post Office and general store and trading post.

Brother remembers that the Navajo Indians came down from their home up north in their wagons with their native blankets which they traded for coffee, sugar, flour and other things.

Meanwhile his father worked for pioneer cattleman, Lord Cree of Scotland, whose herds numbered between ten and twelve thousand, and ranged from Tularosa to Roswell. Brother's father worked for seventeen years for the Crees beginning at the age of fifteen, and was most of the time foreman.

The center of the vast Cree cattle empire was Ruidoso. Lord Cree established the settlement of Angus, named after the Angus cattle he

brought from Scotland. Memories of the early days of Brother's boyhood are vivid in his mind, and as he talks of those times many interesting things come to light. He remembers that in his boyhood there were only two or three Anglo families in Ruidoso, that the rest were Spanish. Lincoln was the county seat, later moved to Carrizozo on account of the railroad.

The first Ruidoso post office was in Dowlin's mill, now The Old Mill, owned by Carmon Phillips.

After several years, Brother's mother sold her store to Dr. Johnson who took over the post office. Dr. Johnson later moved to what is now Ruidoso Downs and built the White Mountain Inn. The building is still there. The post office was here for a year or so, and then Dr. Johnson tried to give it up but no one would have it. Finally Ike Wingfield took over the job, and the office was in his home. This building also stands today.

Brother's father was a rancher, and Brother and his brothers grew up in the ranching tradition. His

brothers are Yule, Ulrich, and Ira.

On December twenty-seven Brother was married to the former Maide Wilson. They have a daughter Joelyne Wright; a granddaughter, Carol Lynn Phelps; and three great-grandsons: Shane, Corey, and Rees.

For fifteen years Brother and Maide ran the Hollywood Post Office. The building is still there, beside Bones Wright's building supply store, hidden under the giant spruce trees. The trees were six inches tall when planted and are now forty feet high.

Brother served two terms as mayor of Ruidoso Downs, and was cattle inspector for forty years.

Brother's nickname fits him well. After all these years he is like a brother to us. We congratulate him on reaching this milestone along life's pathway, and we wish him many happy returns of the day and all God's blessings.

Patrick's Day and will reach you on the eve of the first day of spring. Last night winter paid us a farewell visit in the form of sleet, freezing rain and light snow; and today at noon every bit of snow has been blown from the ground and the trees by the first March wind of the month. It is a beautiful March day with trees bending low in the wind and clouds flying overhead. And the world is turning green before your eyes in honor of dear Saint Patrick.

I wish to thank Mel and Monica O'Reilly for the boutonniere of green carnations. Also many thanks to Linda Graham "The Big Springs Blue Bonnet" for the bouquet and card. And a big thank you also to Harold and Gayla Matlocks for the beautiful St. Patrick's card. And special thanks to all of you for personal greetings.

Another winning, but frustrating season has ended for the University of New Mexico (UNM) men's basketball team. The Lobos lost to Oregon State University, 65-62, last Friday in the first round of the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). UNM ended the season with a 25-10 record, its most victories ever. But even that record was unable to get the Lobos into the National Collegiate Athletic Association Tournament (NCAA). The Lobos lost a chance for the NCAA tournament when they were edged by Wyoming, 64-62, in the Western Athletic Conference Tour-

ament championship game earlier this month. Against Wyoming, the Lobos deliberately fouled an opposing player with the score tied and time running out. Against Oregon State, UNM fouled a Beaver player with just over a minute left and trailing by one point. Those questionable tactics may have cost the Lobos the games and a chance for the NCAA tournament. But in retrospect, fouling a player who is a poor free throw shooter may not have been that bad of a move. At most (and that's only when the player gets two shots), the Lobos would have been just two points down with time still left to tie or win the game. In this era of three-point buckets, that doesn't seem like such a bad risk. But the season was still frustrating for the Lobos. A team can't get real exposure going to the NIT tournament. Only the NCAA tournament offers the kind of media and television exposure that can help a team lure recruits to its campus. But UNM has most of its players returning next season. Maybe 1987-88 will be the season the Lobos win the conference crown and gain an NCAA berth.



## Inside the Capitol by Fred McCaffrey

**SANTA FE**—The babble of legislators will reach new heights during this final week of the regular 1987 session. It's too bad they can't listen as well as they talk.

Here, for instance, is what they could hear from the state's own Department of Finance and Administration, expressed in good, plain language in that department's latest general fund report:

"Gross receipts tax revenues mirror the New Mexico economy. Most recent data indicate that at year's end, the state economy was at a standstill. A major loss in oil and gas employment slowed growth in the manufacturing sector, and the end of the Albuquerque construction boom kept state unemployment rates over 9 percent in 1986. Rates of growth for 1986 in almost every sector were less than for 1985. The most adversely affected sectors include mining, manufacturing, construction and wholesaling, construction and the most recent estimate for New Mexico personal income growth in 1987 is 3.2 percent, the weakest since 1960. The New Mexico economy is expected to be weaker than the U. S. economy in 1987 and 1988."

As you read those words, can you find any hint of a reason for believing state government should plan to expand once again next year? To put the question starkly: When the economy that supports government is at a standstill, should government itself continue to be expansionist?

If, like me, you believe the answer to that query must logically be "no," you have to wonder why our Governor and our legislators are at this moment entirely taken up with arguing over details of how much and

where government is going to grow. The wild carrying-on that presently goes on here makes you want to grab somebody by the shirtfront and say, "You have to pay attention to reality!" But whom should one grab?

Recent changes in the White House can be a help to New Mexico. The chief of staff who got the sack there, Don Regan, had more than once said, as family newspapers must express it, "(Expletive) the Senate!" It's no secret that one of those in that body whom he wanted most to see expletived is New Mexico's Pete Domenici, a man who has repeatedly disagreed with Regan and Regan both over their all-too-evident unwillingness to do anything constructive about cutting the nation's deficits.

Regan has now disappeared in a puff of black smoke, to be replaced by Howard Baker, whose attitude toward our senior Senator is of a quite different nature. Baker and Domenici are friends, who mutually respect one another's aims and abilities.

If Jeff Bingaman can keep our state in good shape with the Democrats on the hill and Domenici has renewed good relations with Pennsylvania Avenue, some of the greater-than-ordinary potency our small state has in the nation's capital may be on the rise again.

The various localities in the state should be preparing "welcome home" festivities for their legislative representatives. If those worthies hit town at the end of this week after having enacted the kind of spending

## Sunland schedules concert series

Sunland Park Race Course opens its spring concert series on Sunday, March 22, with "Southern Pacific"—the rock/country sensation featuring former members of the Doobie Brothers, Credence Clearwater Revival and Pablo Cruise.

The concert series continues on Saturday, April 4, when Sunland features classic country & western artist John Conlee. Both performances are scheduled from noon to 1 p.m. in the forecourt at the race track. Tickets are \$1 and include admission to both the concert and the afternoon horse racing program. Tickets are available the day of the concerts at the track's admission gates.

Live entertainment follows the Southern Pacific and John Conlee performances on the track's north lawn, where Texas-style barbecue will be served throughout the afternoon. Southern Pacific, who were

recently chosen best new country group by Billboard Magazine, have been hailed by critics as a potential supergroup. The quintet was formed nearly two years ago by Tim Goodman, John McFee and Keith Knudsen. As members of the Doobie Brothers, both McFee and Knudsen contributed to some of that group's most popular work. McFee added Credence Clearwater Revival bassist Stu Cook a short while after forming Southern Pacific, and then recruited keyboardist Kurt Howell and guitarist David Jenkins, who co-wrote all of Pablo Cruise's chart-topping hits. In a relatively short period, Southern Pacific already has made an impact on both sides of the rock/country divide. Their first album produced two Top 10 singles—"Reno Bound" and "Thing About You." They're currently recording the theme for "Police Academy III" and have just released a second

single from their follow-up album called "Kilbilly Hill." The tune, "Don't Let Go of My Heart," entered Billboard's charts less than a week after its release. The Southern Pacific sound has been compared to a number of rock/country bands that have changed the direction of popular music over the past few decades... legendary performers like the Eagles, Flying Burrito Brothers, Byrds and others. Reviews of Southern Pacific's performances, however, indicate a sound that is both uniquely their own and completely modern. In a recent review, Bob Oermann of "The Tennesseean" says "Put simply, this newborn supergroup" is the most exciting new country-rock act to appear since the demise of The Eagles. It's a band with a sound as powerful as a diesel locomotive, as magnificent as a clipper ship in full sail, as soaring as a seagull in flight."

## Grandstand upgrade planned at Sunland

Lloyd Shelhamer, president of Sunland Park Race Course, announced Friday that improvements to the track's grandstand will get under way before the end of the current racing season.

Shelhamer was in El Paso to host ribbon-cutting ceremonies Friday for the opening of Sunland's renovated Turf Club. The festivities marked the completion of the first phase of a half-million dollar improvements plan approved last December by the New Mexico State Racing Commission.

"We're going to take a little breather and then go right ahead with plans for the grandstand," Shelhamer said. "The next phase will see the installation on suspend-

ed ceilings, fluorescent overhead lighting and a heating system."

Sunland had planned to begin construction on the grandstand at the completion of the current meeting on May 3.

"Our customers are responding extremely well to the recent improvements," Shelhamer said, "which gives us every indication that we should continue immediately with our renovations to the grandstand."

Friday's festivities centered on the official opening of the Turf Club lounge, which offers convenient table-side betting through portable wagering machines.

The carry-around terminals (CATE) were developed by United

Tote Inc., the Montana-based company that purchased Sunland last November. After field testing the machines last December at Sunland, the company has expanded the service to nearly all of the Turf Club seating.

"We've been overwhelmed by the response to CATE," Shelhamer said. "The portable terminals now handle about 40 percent of the wagering in the Turf Club. We think that a good percentage of that money would not be wagered without the machines. Many people who are reluctant to go to the mutual windows feel very comfortable using the machine at their table."
