Proposed gas pipeline raises hopes, sparks debate

The expected growth of Ruidoso, and the existing source of natural gas that cannot meet the demands of growth, has led a Hobbs company to propose that they build a new natural gas pipeline to the village, a group of citizens learned Thursday afternoon at the Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center.

Ruidoso Natural Gas president Bob Maddox addressed the group of about a dozen Ruidoso, Capitan and Carrizozo businesspeople and citizens in a meeting directed by representatives of the Public Service Commission.

He outlined his company's past and present attempts to keep Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs well-supplied with natural gas.

"We, of course, were well aware that we were approaching problems," said Maddox in an interview after the Thursday meeting. He explained that Ruidoso Natural Gas began to realize that the demand for natural gas in the village

was coming close to outstripping supply. About three years ago the company had a study of the situation done by an engineering firm. The results of that study verified what Ruidoso Natural Gas had suspected.

The gas company, the only pipeline supplier of natural gas in Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs, is serviced by just one line, a four-inch pipeline owned by Capitan Carrizozo Natural Gas Association. When the study was concluded, Ruidoso's need had already reached the capacity of the pipeline. Ruidoso Natural Gas installed a compressor on the line to help meet the need, and boost the pressure, but the need for more capacity still persisted.

The study illustrated the need for a new pipeline. Maddox said Ruidoso Natural Gas began to explore the possibility of a new, six-inch line. Finding a method of financing became a key goal, said Maddox.

The study estimated a six-inch pipeline would cost about \$3

million. The tremendous potential financial commitment caused Ruidoso Natural Gas to consider breaking the project into three parts, to be completed in 1985, 1987 and 1990. The company continued its search for some means of financing.

In the meantime, the slowdown in the oil business occurred. And while the slowdown spelled disaster for many, it had a telling effect on the Ruidoso Natural Gas pipeline project.

With the drop in oil prices, so dropped the costs of oil-related projects, like building pipelines. And suppliers who had been selling oil and natural gas as fast as they could produce it now had to go looking for customers.

Ruidoso Natural Gas was contacted by Estacado Inc. of Hobbs, who proposed putting in a pipeline to Ruidoso at their own expense.

"It was obviously an opportunity for a need to be served," said Dave McNab, vice president of Estacado.

Their plan called for a pipeline, costing \$2.5 million, to stretch from

one of the major east-west pipelines just south of Corona (owned by El Paso Natural Gas and Transwestern) 48 miles south to Ruidoso. They dubbed the proposed line the "Apache Mountain" line. McNab said preliminary plans call for construction "sometime late summer this year."

Maddox explained that Estacado would recapture the cost of the pipeline over 20 years through increased transmission costs paid by consumers. As the village grows, and more people use natural gas, the cost of the new line, per consumer, would go down.

In addition, the company would be establishing a new market for itself.

"They're looking for a place to sell their gas," Maddox pointed out.

Public Service Commission (PSC) utility engineer Gilbert Quintana, who coordinates cases for PSC in the Ruidoso area, told the gathering the commission became involved when Maddox contacted PSC, which governs certain activities of public utilities,

and began preliminary discussions on the proposed pipeline.

Quintana said the commission won't "take it seriously" until Maddox follows the steps to bring the change before the commission as a "rate case." Maddox indicated he'll do that when he gets a positive feeling from PSC and the Village of Ruidoso.

"I want to know that it's a viable project and that it's worth pursuing," he commented.

Quintana said the commission will be concerned with the effect the change would have on all ratepayers, and what effect the new pipeline would have on Capitan Carrizozo Natural Gas Association.

It was learned during the meeting that the association relies on the transmission fees it gains from Ruidoso-Ruidoso Downs gas use to help meet the debt service on the original loan used to build their pipeline. Without those users (which account for about 80 percent of the gas in the line) the burden of meeting the loan obligation would have to be passed on to Capitan,

Carrizozo and Nogal users in the form of increased rates.

"People have to understand what the consequences are," Quintana commented. He noted that the commission also would be concerned with rate increases for Ruidoso-Ruidoso Downs ratepayers if a new line was installed. They'd face increased rates based on higher transmission costs passed on by Estacado.

"You're going to be funding additional capacity for future users," Quintana pointed out.

Maddox and PSC staff attorney Charles Noble disagreed on exactly how much of an increase Ruidoso-Ruidoso Downs ratepayers would experience. After the meeting, Maddox said while ratepayers will pay \$2.75 per "mcf" on their April bills, they'd pay \$3.25 per mcf if the new line were in place.

But Ruidoso audience members strongly supported the proposal. Bank of Ruidoso President Ralph

Hospital may adopt no-smoking policy

A smoke-free environment in the Lincoln County Medical Center may become a reality by July 1.

The hospital board of directors heard reports from administrator Steve Keller at their meeting about the "smoke-free" campaign in the hospital.

"This is going on at many other hospitals and health facilities around the state," Keller explained. "Our cafeteria is already smoke-free and everyone seems to have adjusted with no problems."

He went on to explain that a task force in Albuquerque is working toward a January 1, 1988, deadline for a "no smoking policy" in all federal, state and health facility locations.

"We're further ahead than the Albuquerque hospitals already,"

Keller said. "We're not saying people can't smoke, we're just saying, they can't smoke here."

Keller discussed plans for helping hospital employees to stop smoking. Reformed smokers will be teaching classes in the hospital to assist them in stopping. Long-range plans will include classes for the general public, but that is for "later."

In other business, the board: —Learned the renovation committee will be seeking proposals from architects on the renovation project.

—Learned the Robert Wood Foundation Youth Involvement Program will begin at the hospital in April. The program is set up to involve young people between the ages of 14 and 19 in the hospital. Orientation will begin at 4 p.m. Tuesday, March 31, at the hospital.

—Discussed a hospital dress code

for most of the personnel.

—Inspected the new Lincoln County Medical Center signs that will soon replace the old signs.

—Approved involvement with the Community Work Program for cleanup of the grounds surrounding the hospital.

—Heard a Hospital Auxiliary report from Sally Avery. In her report, she pointed out the new flower cooler in the lobby where flowers and plants can be purchased for patients. She presented a slate of Auxiliary officers: President-Martha Higgenbotham; Vice President-Inez Tanner; Secretary-Louise Davis; Treasurer-Alma Russell.

—Discussed the possibility of a day-care center for the children of hospital employees on the premises.

Woman hospitalized after freak fire

A 16-year-old Ruidoso resident remains in the University of New Mexico Medical Center (UNMMC) in Albuquerque after suffering second- and third-degree burns Friday morning in a fire that destroyed the back half of a 1978 Chevrolet, according to Ruidoso Police reports.

Officer Robert Kinney said Michelle Linch was apparently us-

ing an electric vacuum cleaner to siphon gasoline from the car at 122 Nob Hill when fire erupted. He said the car is believed to belong to Linch's mother.

Linch suffered flash burns to her face and second- and third-degree burns on her legs, according to police reports.

Kinney said the victim walked to

a neighbor's and asked them to call the Fire Department. He said Fire Department personnel, who spent about half an hour at the scene, called an ambulance.

Linch was taken to Lincoln County Medical Center, and a hospital spokesman said Linch was in stable condition when transferred to UNMMC Friday morning.



"If they could get you gas, you could double your sales," an audience member commented.

"We have got to have a new transmission line, or we have got to quit hooking people in," Maddox said after the meeting. "We've reached the capacity of the existing facilities."

Warrior tracksters do well in Alamogordo meet

Ruidoso High School's boys and girls track teams came through with some good performances against tough competition at the White Sands Relays in Alamogordo Saturday.

The Warrior boys finished seventh with 18 points. The girls got a fourth-place tie from freshman Chantel Bowen in the high jump against tough competition.

Senior Gabe Tam gained the only Warrior first place with a seasonal best of 9:58.70 in the 3,200 meters.

He outran a tough field, raising his hands in victory as he crossed the finish line.

Tam also took second in the 1,600 meters, recording a 4:34.44 time in a close race.

Jeff Willingham, last season's state runner-up in the javelin, broke his school record in that

event with a second-place toss of 177-5.

Verlon Edwards took third in the pole vault with a 13-0 effort and Mark Airington broke the school record in the high jump with a 6-2 leap. He finished sixth.

Other good performances by the Warrior boys were a 2:09.28 for seventh in the 800 meters by Sergio Hernandez, Airington's 16.89 in the 110-meter high hurdles, Todd Morris' personal best of 144-10 in the javelin and Dusty Beavers' personal best of 115-10 in the discus.

Alamogordo won the 13-team meet with 64 points. Eastwood of El Paso, Texas, was second with 63½, Parkland of El Paso was third at 57, Las Cruces Mayfield and Los Alamos tied for fourth at 30, Ruidoso was seventh and Sandia was eighth at 17.

"I think our guys did very well," Warrior boys head coach Ronny Maskew said. "We only took nine

boys (the rest were away because of the spring break).

"They all had very good efforts," Bowen leaped 4-10 in the high jump to lead the Warrior girls' efforts. She did 5-0 the previous week.

She also did well in the 110-meter high hurdles, recording a non-placing 18.2.

Other good performances were freshman Ardena Commanche's 13:00.7 in the 3,200 meters, Cindy Harrison's 2:35.3 in the 800 meters, Berdine Smith's 6:23.0 in the 1,600 meters and Michelle Garrett's 6:27.0 in the 1,600 meters.

"I think we had some fine performances, particularly from our distance people," said Warrior girls head coach Jim Hofstad. "I think when we get all our people back from vacation, we're going to be a lot stronger than we looked."

The Warrior boys and girls will compete at Carlsbad Saturday, April 4.



"Working with plants, especially trees, is a different challenge than working with livestock," Ralph Romero said. "It's a very long-term process. A three- to five-year seedling will still take another five years before it's ready to market." Romero is a member of the Christmas Tree Growers Association. The association in New Mexico is making available trees that otherwise would only be available at a much higher price from

growers in the eastern states. "We are at an elevation and environment that can be good for transplanting to lower, warmer elevations in the state," he continued. "The majority of growers are in the cut tree business. I'm not. I'm in the live, ornamental tree business." He encourages people in Lincoln County to grow trees as a hobby or business. "With a little energy, anyone could grow up to 50 trees with ease," he stated. "Any spruce, fir or pine will grow easily here with

good profits." This summer, Romero will be entering a program with New Mexico State University on five acres he has set aside. The experiment will divide the five acres with different tests being conducted at the same time on each area. He began his Christmas tree business seven years ago and has been assisted in it by the National Tree Growers Association, the Soil Conservation Service, the Forest Service and county agent Barry Herd.

The livestock team with Russell, Townsend, Ty Jackson and Kyle Traylor was third with Traylor being fourth high individual.





Editorial

The Sierra Blanca Regional Airport may soon become one of the most important channelers of visitors to this mountain resort, and how the airport is managed will be vitally important.

Vitally important, too, is that we closely monitor how the management of the airport is organized. And the building blocks of that management are being set up now.

The Village of Ruidoso has proposed a reorganization of the membership to the Sierra Blanca Airport Commission, the group that worked to make the airport a reality and will continue in the future to have the last word on airport matters. Presently, the commission is made up of a single member from Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs, Capitan, Lincoln County and Mesalero. The Ruidoso proposal seeks membership based on population.

In that case, Ruidoso and the county would have two members on the commission, and Capitan, Mesalero and Ruidoso Downs would have a single member each.

In the proposal, Ruidoso also has suggested that it be both operator and fiscal agent for the new airport.

Other members of the commission will consider the changes over the next few weeks. Controversy over the changes already has started to bubble. The vital questions of who does what and who is best represented should be answered with the benefit of citizen input.

If you have something to say on the organization of the airport, contact your councillor or trustee, or attend their next meeting.

We've worked hard to make the airport a reality. Now let's make sure we run it right.—DJP

Inside the Capitol

SANTA FE—In politics, a "liberal" is a person who wants to spend government money to change society.

Here in New Mexico, part of that thought doesn't appear to have struck deeply. Our "liberals," or at least those in our Legislature, appear to have understood only the part about spending money.

For such people, the recent legislative session was counted a success exactly in proportion to the number and the dollar volume of the projects they approved and the spending that is essential to them. Some of those money-spending propositions are in a capital-improvements bill, while others were, for the first time, written into the general appropriations act for the coming year.

So proud are those whose districts will benefit from this use of public funds that one of them actually proposed to require by law that all such projects, while under construction, have a sign posted making it clear that it is the Legislature to whom we are to direct our gratitude for them. There was no mention in the proposed statute, which mercifully died on the floor when the session ended, that required the sign to be lighted at night, so we could experience this on-rush of gratitude 24 hours per day.

As we taxpayers ante up the additional \$158 million in new taxes this group helped lay on us this year, we may want to remember them all, though not necessarily in our prayers.

And lest you think only "liberals" are responsible for that hand that will now dip ever deeper into our pocketbooks, contemplate this little story, as told to a few of us after the session ended, by Governor Carruthers himself.

"By golly," the Governor said, in almost so many words, "we have to give credit where it's due."

He went on to say that Senator Les Houston, though he had suffered a shock to his system when the Supreme Court ended his attempt to run everything in the Senate again this year, had been remarkably cooperative during the Legislature's closing days.

"Why," Governor Carruthers went on, "he even called me one day to be sure I understood it was he who had arranged to get me the

five votes from conservative Republicans needed to pass one of my bills, and to joke that on another he had over-done things and gotten me eight votes when only five were necessary."

Yep, as the Governor says, let's give credit where it's due. The two bills he referred to were the ones that did most to boost what we each will pay in additional taxes next year. Their passage should, according to Carruthers' own words, be credited to Senator Houston and the "conservatives" he talked into voting for them.

That too is a heartwarming thought we may all wish to hold onto.

Public television has a hardy perennial of a program called "Upstairs, Downstairs." One of its themes is how different life looked in the early part of this century when seen from the point of view of a wealthy British family and when seen from the point of view of that same family's servants.

Similarly, when we write about what goes on in a Legislature, we really ought to speak about "forestage, backstage," because there is fully as much contrast between what appears on the surface and what is taking place where ordinary observers are not permitted to go.

If you would like a brief but explicit summary of what went on here this legislative year, try fitting these parts together:

—There was no way the session could end successfully without passage of a workers compensation law. Everyone who wanted lawmakers to go home on time had to see that this got done.

—But certain members of the "liberal" group were not going to go for that unless they got sufficient amounts of the kind of public works projects discussed above.

—In addition, Albuquerque lawmakers would not stand by and see higher education, specifically UNM, get cut too badly.

—Because the preceding three statements are true, capital expenditures and the general appropriations act had to be of such dimensions that those tax increases became essential.

Put that all together and play it on your violin, and you know the whole story.




County people

at work



Work tough but rewarding for county road supervisor

Lincoln County Road Supervisor Earl Krieg has been a county employee for six years, and road supervisor for three of those years.

He and his wife, Jimsey, moved to Lincoln County from Plains, Texas, where they had lived for 27 years.

With some 1,500 miles of county road to maintain and a crew of 19 men, Krieg is kept "busy enough."

There are three road districts in Lincoln County. Each district has three graders or "blades" assigned to it. In addition, the county owns seven dump trucks, two dozers and three loaders.

According to Krieg, a good blade man can make three miles of road a day, cleaning out the bar ditches on each side and doing the road right. Six miles a day can be maintained if all the blade is doing is knocking out the ruts.

Three crew foremen—Joe Vega in Corona and Carrizozo, Jimmie Stewart in Capitan and Fred Serna in Hondo and Ruidoso—concentrate on building roads, while the crews under them work at keeping the roads in shape and moving equipment.

During the first heavy snowstorm this year, each man logged more than 43 hours in overtime.

"There just weren't enough men or enough equipment to keep up with the storm," Krieg

remembered. "I got 89 phone calls in just a short time, then I went out to help the crew and don't know how many calls came in after that."

Working through the nights, the road crews battled not only the blizzard, but getting their own equipment unstuck time after time.

"Some of the old subdivisions were really bad," Krieg said. "There were no rules governing the roads in them and a lot of them don't have enough room to turn around in at the end of a road."

Problems like that can make a tough job even tougher. But the county has been taking steps the last few years to more closely control development in the county.

Krieg was glad to see the county planning and zoning committee formed to oversee this, as well as other problems, in the subdivisions.

"The subdivider has to keep up the roads in their subdivisions for two years now, before the county accepts them," Krieg stated. "It sure makes it nicer."

Property owners in the subdivisions also pay 10 cents per front foot tax each year. The tax collected is matched by the county and put back into the subdivisions.

Krieg is known as the "best blade man in the county." Although he seldom finds the time now to do any blade work, he still "really likes" his job as road superintendent.
